ON FORREST: The winningest player in school history with 104 wins as Florida State's starting point guard for the final three seasons of his career...helped lead the Seminoles to three NCAA Tournaments, the 2020 ACC Championship, 104 overall wins, 50 ACC regular season wins and 53 total ACC wins (regular season and ACC Tournament)...earned All-ACC Second-Team and ACC All-Defensive Team honors as a senior in 2020...graduated from Florida State University in December of 2019 as he finished his undergraduate degree requirements in just 3.5 years...began work on his master's degree in Sport management in January of 2020...named to the Emerald Coast Classic All-Tournament Team, Bob Cousy Award Watch List, the Tallahassee Democrat FSU Basketball All Decade Team (2011-20), as a finalist for the John Wooden Citizenship Cup, a CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 First Team, CoSIDA Academic All-American Third Team and won an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship as a senior...the winner of the Skip Prosser Award as the 2020 ACC Men's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year...earned West Regional All-Tournament team honors as one of the top players in the 2019 NCAA Tournament...in leading the Seminoles to the Elite Eight of the 2018 NCAA Tournament and to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament, he has averaged 30.3 minutes played, 10.6 points, 4.1 assists and 2.3 steals as the Seminoles point guard in seven NCAA Tournament games...the Seminoles were 5-2 in 2018 and 2019 in seven NCAA Tournament games...finished his career ranked third at Florida State in career steals (224), third in career games played (137), fifth in career assists (455), 10th in career free throws made (336), 13th in career free throws attempted (449) and 25th in career rebounds (562)...finished his career tied for 22nd in ACC history with 224 career steals...helped the Seminoles defeat 25 ranked teams during his career...five wins over top-five ranked teams include victories over No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4, 2017, 83-66), No. 3 ranked Xavier (March 18, 2018, 75-70) and No. 2 Virginia in the semifinals of the 2019 ACC Tournament (March 15, 2019, 79-69)...his performances in the 2018 NCAA Tournament led the Seminoles to a 3-1 record with wins over No. 8 seed Missouri (March 16, 67-54), No. 1 seed Xavier (March 18, 75-70) and No. 4 seed Gonzaga (March 22, 75-60) and helped solidify his place among the top players in the best conference in all of college basketball...a spectacular player for the Seminoles in the 2018 NCAA Tournament as he averaged 9.5 points, 5.3 rebounds, 4.8 assists and 2.5 steals as Florida State advanced to within one game of the Final Four for the second time in school history...led the Seminoles in assists, steals, free throws made, free throws attempted and defensive rebounds as Florida State tied the school record with three wins in the 2018 NCAA Tournament...Florida State defeated No. 8 seed Missouri (March 16, 2018, 67-54), No. 1 seed Xavier (March 18, 2018, 75-70) and No. 4 seed Gonzaga (March 22, 2018, 75-60) to advance to the Elite Eight before falling to Michigan (March 24, 2018, 57-54) only one win from reaching the Final Four for the first time since 1972...double figure scoring came against both Missouri (10 points and six rebounds) and Xavier (14 points and four steals) as Florida State steam-rolled its way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011...was exceptional in the 2019 NCAA Tournament as the Seminoles won two of three games and advanced to the Sweet 16...the No. 3 seeded Seminoles defeated No. 14 seeded Vermont (March 21, 2019, 76-69) and No. 12 seeded Murray State (March 23, 2019, 90-62) before falling to No. 1 seeded Gonzaga (March 28, 2019, 72-58)...totaled eight points on a perfect six of six performance from the free throw line in the Seminoles' opening round win over Vermont...scored eight points and added two steals in the Seminoles' win over Murray State...scored his NCAA Tournament career-high of 20 points in 36 minutes of play in the Seminoles' game against the region's top seeded team in Gonzaga...ranked in the top 10 of three different ACC statistical categories during the 2017-18 season – fifth in assist:turnover ratio (2.3:1), eighth in steals (1.6 spg) and 10th in assists (4.1 apg)...with Forrest in its lineup, Florida State has won 78 of 107 games (.729 winning percentage)...Florida State has a winning percentage of .729 percent (78-30) in the first three seasons of his career...helped Florida State to one of the most successful seasons in school history in 2016-17 as Florida State finished with a 26-9 overall record, a 12-6 mark in ACC play, a second place finish in the ACC standings, a school-record tying No. 2 seed in the ACC Tournament and a school-record tying No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament...helped Florida State to one of the most exciting finishes in school history with a 29-8 overall record and a 13-5 record in ACC play...the Seminoles' 28 overall wins and their 13 ACC wins are both school records for wins (overall and ACC) in a single season...the Seminoles won 23 games during his sophomore season of 2017-18...Florida State won 26 games during the 2016-17 season and fell one win short of tying the school record for wins, while its 12 ACC wins during the regular season tied the school record for ACC wins in a single season...the Seminoles won a school record 29 games and a school record 13 ACC games during his junior season...included in the Seminoles' record 29 wins and 13 ACC wins during the 2018-19 season was a school-record eight game ACC winning streak that ran from January 22 (against Clemson) through (February 19 (also against Clemson)...helped Florida State to a school-record tying seven wins over nationally ranked teams including wins over five nationally ranked teams in a six-game stretch in December and January of 2018...a leading member of Florida State's self-proclaimed Boom Squad that gained national recognition as one of the top bench bunches in all of college basketball...the Boom Squad was the popular nickname for the Seminoles' players who brought high energy off of

the bench and combined to score nearly 40 percent of Florida State's points during the 2016-17 season...the Boom Squad moniker began during the team scoring report for Florida State's game against Florida (Dec. 11)...a consensus top 50 prep player who was ranked 45th among all prep players by ESPN.com entering college with the class of 2016...ranked as the seventh best player in the state of Florida, the 11th best shooting guard in the nation, the 48th best player in the country and was a four star player by Sports Illustrated... ranked as the 62nd best high school player in the nation by scout.com...the all-time leading scorer in Chipley High School history with 3,103 career points...broke the all-time scoring record in Chipley's run to its second consecutive state championship in 2016...a standout player for the AAU Georgia Stars...led the Stars to the championship of the 2015 Peach Jam – the most important event on Nike's EYBL Summer Season...named to the All-Tournament team at the Nike EYBL and was the Most Valuable Player at both the Nike EYBL and Las Vegas Classic Championships...Participated in the 2015 Nike Global Challenge where he led his team to the championship...named to the 2014-15 MaxPreps Boys Basketball Junior All-American Team...nominated to be a participant in the prestigious McDonald's All-American game in 2016...a member of the 2017-18 Student Athlete Advisory Council at Florida State...honored with the Mr. Inspirational Award by the Florida State LYFE (Leaders Yearning For Excellence) Program in 2018...named to the 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 ACC Academic Honor Roll...*named to the All ACC Academic Basketball team in 2017, 2018 and 2019 and 2020*...named to the 2019 NABC Academic Honors Court...because of his academic success as a freshman, the Seminoles were named one of the Academic Teams of Excellence by the NABC for the 2016-17 season...presented with a Senior Sensation Award at the 2020 Golden Nole Banquet hosted by the FSU Student Athlete Advisory Council...the Senior Sensation Award honors the Florida State *senior student-athletes that are most likely to make an impact after graduation*...presented with the First Year Academic Achievement Award and the Sixth Man of the Year Award as a member of the Boom Squad at the Seminoles' 2017 Basketball Honors Banquet...earned an incredible and team-leading five awards at Florida State's Honors Banquet in 2018: named the Seminoles' Outstanding Student-Athlete, earned the Sixth Man of the Year Award for the second consecutive year, won the Otto Petty Most Assists Award, named the Charlie Ward Defensive Player of the Year and shared the Dave Cowens Chairman of the Boards Award as the Seminoles' top rebounder...*earned three awards at the Seminoles' 2019 Honors Banquet...was presented with the Academic Achievement Award, the Charlie Ward Defensive Player of the Year Award and the Otto Petty Most Assists Award...won or shared a team five awards at the Seminoles' 2020 Honors Banquet...earned the Academic Achievement Award, named an Outstanding Academic All-Star, presented with the Otto Petty Most Assists Award, the Charlie Ward Defensive Player of the Year Award while earning a special recognition award for scoring his 1,000th career point during the season.*

AS A SENIOR (2020): Averaged a career-high 11.6 points (second on the team), 4.4 rebounds (third), 4.0 assists (first) and a career-high tying 1.9 steals (first) as Florida State's starting point guard...led the Seminoles to a 26-5 overall record, a 16-4 ACC record and a program-best No. 4 ranking in the final Associated Poll of the season...helped Florida State win the regular season ACC Championship with its 16-4 record for the first regular season ACC Championship in school history...earned All-ACC Second-Team and ACC Defensive Team honors in leading the Seminoles to one of the greatest seasons in school history...the Seminoles set school records for regular season wins (26), ACC wins (16) and weeks ranked in the nation's top 10 (10 consecutive weeks)...the Seminoles were ranked No. 4 in the final AP Poll and No. 5 in the final USA Today poll to mark the third time in Forrest's amazing Seminole career that he had led the program to a top 10 final national ranking...The Seminoles were ranked No. 16 nationally at the conclusion of his freshman season, No. 10 nationally at the end of his junior season and No. 4 nationally at the end of his senior season...Florida State's season and potential deep NCAA Tournament run was cut short by the onset of the Coronavirus...Florida State's team captain...named to the Bob Cousy Award Watch List as one of the nation's top point guards...a preseason All-ACC Second Team selection by the voting media at Operation ACC Basketball on Oct. 8, 2019...named to the Emerald Coast Classic All-Tournament Team in leading Florida State to the team championship with wins over Chattanooga (89-53, November 20), Chicago State (113-56, November 22), Tennessee (60-57, November 29) and Purdue (Nov. 30)...established career-highs for field goals made (130), field goals attempted (283), 3-point field goals made (16), 3-point field goals attempted (57), free throw shooting percentage (.722), points scored (359) and points scored per game (11.6)...earned his career-high of eight steals at Duke – the most steals every by Blue Devil opponent in Cameron Indoor Stadium and tied for the fifth highest number of steals in a single game by a Seminole...the most steals in a single game since 10 by Chris Singleton against UNC Greensboro on November 14, 2010...his career-high free throw percentage of .822 during his senior is the 19th best single-season free throw shooting percentage in school history...his 59 steals as a senior are tied for the 24th highest single season total in school history...a game-high 19 points, two rebounds, two assists, two steals and one blocked shot in Florida State's season opener at Pitt (Nov. 6)...totaled eight points, eight rebounds, seven assists and one steal in Florida State's 63-51 victory over No. 6 Florida in Gainesville (Nov. 10)...Forrest never lost to the Gators in his career as a Florida State basketball player winning all four of the meetings between the Seminoles and the Gators...scored 16 points to go along with two rebounds, two assists, one blocked shot and one steal in the Seminoles' victory over Western Carolina (Nov. 15)...scored 13 points to go along with five rebounds, four assists and two steals in Florida State's victory over Saint Francis (Nov. 23)...totaled 12 points, six assists, three steals and two rebounds in Florida State's victory over Chicago State in the second round of the Emerald Coast Classic in Tallahassee (Nov. 25)...scored nine points to go along with four rebounds and four assists in Florida State's victory over No. 16 Tennessee in the semifinals of the Emerald Coast Classic in Niceville, Fla. (Nov. 29)...totaled a game and team-high 17 points, four rebounds and three steals in Florida State's overtime championship clinching victory over Purdue in the Emerald Coast Classic (Nov. 30)...scored a team-leading 13 points to go along with four rebounds, two assists and one steal as the Seminoles' played at Indiana Assembly Hall in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (Dec. 3)...scored 11 points and pulled down three rebounds in Florida State's victory over North Florida in Tallahassee (Dec. 17)...scored 11 points to go along with three assists, three blocked shots and two steals in Florida State's victory over USF in the Orange Bowl Classic (Dec. 21)...double figures with 10 points, six assists, four rebounds and one blocked shot in Florida State's 88-71 win over North Alabama in Tallahassee (Dec. 28)...scored 20 points to go along with five assists, three rebounds and two steals in Florida State's victory at No. 7 Louisville on the road in the ACC (Jan. 4)...totaled his second career double double of 14 points and 10 rebounds with four steals and two assists in Florida State's victory over Wake Forest in the road in ACC play (Jan. 8)...totaled 12 points, five assists, three rebounds, two steals and one blocked shot in Florida State's overtime win at Miami...totaled 13 points, seven assists, five rebounds and four steals in Florida State's victory over Notre Dame...surpassed the 1,000 career point marks and 500 career rebound marks in the Seminoles' victory over the Fighting Irish (Jan. 25)...a team-high 14 points, four rebounds, three assists, two blocked shots and one steal in Florida State's victory over North Carolina in Tallahassee (Feb. 3)...scored 10 points to go along with six rebounds, six assists and two steals in Florida State's victory over Miami in Tallahassee (Feb. 8)...a near triple double with a team-high 18 points, nine rebounds and eight steals as Florida State battled Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium (Feb. 10)...totaled 13 points, six assists, five rebounds and two steals in Florida State's victory over Syracuse in Tallahassee (Feb. 15)...scored 10 points with three assists, two rebounds and two steals in Florida State's victory over Pitt in Tallahassee...moved into 25th place on the all-time ACC steals list with 219 and moved past Duke's Grant Hill with his two steals against Pitt (Feb. 18)...totaled 10 points, three assists and two rebounds in Florida State's 67-61 win over NC State at the PNC Arena in Raleigh, N.C. (Feb. 22)...a team-high 16 points, 5 rebounds, 3 assists and 3 steals in Florida State's 82-67 win over Louisville in Tallahassee (Feb. 24)...scored 11 points to go along with four rebounds, three assists and one steal in Florida State's game at Clemson (Feb. 29)...totaled 15 points 7 rebounds and 3 assists in Florida State's victory over Notre Dame in South Bend...scored the game-winning basket with 3.8 second remaining to give the Seminoles' the 73-71 win and 15th ACC win of the season (March 4)...scored six points and added three rebounds in Florida State's 80-62 win over Boston College...the win propelled the Seminoles to the regular season ACC championship with a 16-4 record (March 7).

AS A JUNIOR (2019): Averaged 9.3 points (third on the team), 4.5 rebounds (fourth), 3.7 assists (first) and a career-high tying 1.9 steals (first) as Florida State's starting point guard for the second consecutive season...named to the NCAA Tournament All-West Regional Team in leading the Seminoles to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament... established career-highs for games played (37), games started (36), free throws made (113), free throws attempted (145), defensive rebounds (136), and steals (69) while tying his career high for assists (138)...helped Florida State to one of the most exciting seasons in school history as he led the Seminoles to a 29-8 record, a 13-5 record in ACC play, a fourth place finish in the ACC standings, to the Championship game of the ACC Tournament for the third time in school history and to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament...the Seminoles' 29 overall wins rank as single-season program records...helped lead Florida State to a school record eight consecutive ACC wins from Jan. 22 (against Clemson) through Feb. 19 (also against Clemson)...the Seminoles advanced at least as far as the Sweet 16 in both his sophomore and junior seasons with Forrest as Florida State's starting point guard after advancing to the Elite Eight during the 2018 season...averaged 12.0 points, 3.3 rebounds in Florida State's three NCAA Tournament games...one of three Seminoles to average in double figure scoring in the 2019 NCAA Tournament...shot .565 percent from the field (13 of 23) and a team-leading .833 from the free throw line (10 of 12) in the Seminoles' three NCAA games...a team-leading six steals (2.0 spg) against Vermont, Murray State and Gonzaga...ranked sixth in the ACC with a career-high 1.9 steals per game average...helped the Seminoles rank third in the ACC in steals with a team average of 7.2 steals per game...his 69 steals rank as the 14th highest single-season total in school history...earned his season-high of five steals against UConn in the Seminoles' victory over UConn in the Never Forget Tribute Classic (Dec. 8) and in Florida State's regular season victory over Louisville (Feb. 9)...earned at least one steal in 28 of Florida State's 37 games (.757 percent), totaled multiple steals in 22 of 37 games (.595 percent), earned at least three steals in 13 of 37 games (.351 percent), earned at least four steals in four games and five steals in two games...ranked eighth in the ACC with a career-best 1.9:1 assist:turnover ratio...totaled his career-high of 23 points in Florida State's victory over Southeast Missouri (Dec. 17)...also added his NCAA Tournament career-high of 20 points in Florida State's Sweet 16 game against Gonzaga...scored in double figures 15 times – nearly as many times as he scored in double figures in both his freshman and sophomore seasons combined (16)...led the Seminoles in scoring in both of his 20 point scoring games – 23 against Southeast Missouri and 20 in the NCAA Tournament against Gonzaga...also led the Seminoles in scoring against Villanova (11 points), at Pittsburgh (19 points) and at Wake Forest (11 points)...was Florida State's leader in rebounds three times – in victories over UAB (11 rebounds), Southeast Missouri (eight) and at home against NC State (six)...tied his career-high with 11 rebounds in Florida State's victory over UAB in the first round of the AdvoCare Classic...totaled his career-high of 11 defensive rebounds in Florida State's win over the Blazers...a starter with 13 points and five assists in the Seminoles' 81-60 win over Florida in Tallahassee (Nov. 6)...a complete game of 13 points, seven rebounds, five assists, three steals and two blocked shots in Florida State's victory at Tulane (Nov. 11)...tied his career-high with 11 rebounds to go along with five points and three assists in Florida State's 81-63 win over UAB in the quarterfinals of the AdvoCare Invitational in Lake Buena Vista, Fla. (Nov. 22)...totaled 10 points, seven rebounds and a season-high tying four steals in Florida State's 79-76 win over LSU in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational (Nov. 23)...tied the game against LSU at 68 and sent it into overtime with a layup with 0:02 seconds remaining in regulation...helped Florida State outscore the Tigers by an 11-8 margin in the overtime period to win the game for Florida State...totaled 11 points and two rebounds in the championship game of the 2018 AdvoCare Invitational (Nov 25)...scored nine points, added three assists and three steals in Florida State's come-from-behind 73-72 win over Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge (Nov. 28)...scored the game-winning basket with 5.2 seconds remaining to give the Seminoles the one-point win...scored 13 points and added five rebounds in Florida State's 83-67 victory over Troy in Tallahassee (Dec. 3)...totaled eight points, two rebounds and a season high five steals in Florida State's victory over UConn in the Never Forget Tribute Classic at the Prudential Center in Newark, N.J. (Dec. 8)...scored his career-high 23 points, and totaled eight rebounds, four assists and three steals in Florida State's 85-67 win over Southeast Missouri in Tallahassee (Dec. 17)...totaled 10 points, seven assists, four rebounds and four steals in Florida State's victory over North Florida in Tallahassee (Dec. 19)...totaled 10 points, five rebounds, five assists and three steals in Florida State's 81-59 win over Saint Louis in the Orange Bowl Classic (Dec. 22)...team-leading 19 points (on a career-high 11 of 12 free throws made), nine rebounds, three assists and two steals at Pitt (Jan. 14)...scored nine points to go along with eight rebounds and six assists in Florida State's game at Boston College (Jan. 20)...a solid all-around game with nine points, six rebounds, three assists, three steals and one blocked shot in Florida State's victory over Georgia Tech in Tallahassee (Feb. 2)...totaled two points, four rebounds, 10 assists and three steals in Florida State's victory over Syracuse in the Carrier Dome (Feb. 5)...totaled 15 points, six rebounds, four assists and a season-high tying five steals in Florida State's overtime victory over No. 16 Louisville at the Donald L. Tucker Center (Feb. 9)...in double figure scoring with 14 points, eight rebounds, three assists and one steal in Florida State's victory at Clemson (Feb. 19)...scored 13 points, added six rebounds, three assists, two steals and one blocked shot in Florida State's victory over NC State in Tallahassee (March 2)...Florida State's leading scorer with 11 points, five assists and four rebounds in Florida State's regular-season ending victory at Wake Forest (March 9)...totaled seven points, four rebounds, four assists and three steals in Florida State's 65-63 overtime victory over Virginia Tech in the quarterfinals of the 2019 ACC Tournament (March 14)...totaled 10 points, six rebounds and three assists in leading the Seminoles over No. 2 Virginia by a 69-59 score in the Seminoles' win over the Cavaliers in the semifinals of the 2019 ACC Tournament (March 15)...totaled nine points, three assists, two rebounds and two steals in the ACC Tournament Championship against Duke at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte, N.C. (March 16)...scored eight points to go along with three rebounds, one assist, one steal and one blocked shot in Florida State's 76-69 win over Vermont in in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament at the XL Center in Hartford, Conn. (March 21)...totaled eight points, five assists, two rebounds and two steals in Florida State's 90-62 win over Murray State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at the XL Center in Hartford, Conn...the victory sent the Seminoles to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season (March 23)...totaled a game-high 20 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals in Florida State's game against Gonzaga in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament at the Honda Center in Anaheim, Calif. (March 28).

PERSONAL: Born June 12, 1998...Trent is the son of Barbara Lee and Lester Forrest...both of his parents played basketball at Chipola Junior College...academically oriented as he graduated from Chipley with a 4.3 grade point average...from a family of Florida State students including his aunt and uncle -- Seminole football great Amp Lee (1989-91) who played for the San Francisco 49ers (1992-93), Minnesota Vikings (1994-96), St. Louis Rams (1997-99) and Philadelphia Eagles (2000)...Lee is still one of only 15 players in school history who rushed for over 2,000 career yards as a Seminole...played for head coach Mike Gates at Chipley – a 1983 graduate of Florida State...cousins of Terrance and Terrell Whitehurst who played tennis at Florida State (2015-18)...committed to Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff on May 5, 2015 – at the end of his junior season...selected Florida State over Wichita State, Georgia, Miami, Alabama, Wake Forest, Providence, Georgia Tech and Tennessee...graduate school major is Sport Management.
