SEMINOLES RETURN HOME TO FACE CHARLESTON SOUTHERN ON MONDAY

Florida State, which won its first nine games and was one of the last five undefeated teams in college basketball this season, plays host to Charleston Southern at the Donald L. Tucker Center on Monday, December 18, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. The game will be televised on ESPNU. The Seminoles enter Monday's game with a 25-game home court winning streak – the third longest in college basketball. Florida State has won each of its home games inside the Donald L. Tucker Center since Feb. 27, 2016. Against Charleston Southern, the Seminoles are playing their first home game since defeating Loyola of Maryland, 96-71, on Dec. 6. The Seminoles enter Monday's game having won 24 consecutive non-conference home games – a streak that began Dec. 6, 2014 with a 96-73 victory over UCF – it's the 11th longest non-conference home winning streak in the nation. Following Monday's game against Charleston, the Seminoles play host to Southern Miss on Dec. 31 at 2:00p.m. (please note the early start time) before taking a break for the holidays. The Seminoles begin ACC play on Dec. 30 at Duke in a game nationally televised on CBS Sports.

FLORIDA STATE VS. CHARLESTON SOUTHERN – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State will play host to Charleston Southern on December 18, 2017 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles' game against the Buccaneers will mark the sixth consecutive season and seventh time since the 2011-12 season that the two teams have played each other. Florida State and Charleston Southern had met six times since the 2008-09 season under Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton with each game coming in Tallahassee and with each game resulting in a Seminole victory. The Seminoles lead the all-time series against Charleston Southern by a 10-0 margin. The series began during the 1975-76 season with each of the first nine games of the series (including this season) coming in Tallahassee. The Buccaneers are coached by Barclay Radebaugh who is in his 13th season as the head basketball coach at Charleston Southern. Radebaugh, as is Leonard Hamilton at Florida State, is the winningest coach in Charleston Southern history with 185 victories. He was an assistant coach at Miami in 2004-05 and helped guide the Hurricanes to a 16-13 record in their first season in the ACC. Thomas Butters, who is in his first season as an assistant coach at Charleston Southern, was a manager and graduate assistant at Clemson for five seasons (2008-12). During that time, the Seminoles were 5-5 against the Tigers.

FSU PLAYS HOST TO CHARLESTON SOUTHERN WITH A 25-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Monday's game against Charleston Southern with a 25-game home winning streak – a streak that ranks as the third longest home court winning-streak in the nation. The Seminoles are 4-0 at home this season (with wins over George Washington, Kennesaw State, the Citadel and Loyola), were undefeated at home during the 2016-17 season (18-0) with wins over four ranked teams (No. 7 Duke, No. 12 Louisville, No. 15 Notre Dame and No. 21 Virginia Tech) and won their final three home games (against Notre Dame, Syracuse and Davidson in the NIT) to close the 2015-16 season. Florida State's current home winning streak began with a 77-56 win over Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. The Seminoles began the season with the fifth longest home court winning streak in the nation. Florida State moved up to fourth with its first three wins of the season and into third when Oregon lost at home to Boise State at home on Dec. 1. The Ducks entered the season with a 46-game home court winning streak. Cincinnati currently holds the nation's longest home winning streak. The Bearcats are home next against Arkansas Pine-Bluff on Tuesday (Dec. 19 at 7:00 p.m.) while SMU plays host to Boise State on Monday night (Dec. 18, 8:00 p.m. CST).

...Defeat Charleston Southern and win its 11th straight game against Charleston Southern. The Seminoles have won 19 straight against Jacksonville (current), 18 in a row against Stetson (current), 14 straight against Valdosta State (current) and 11 consecutive against UCF (current) – their longest unbeaten streaks against any opponents in school history;

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 254 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 9-1 (2017-18).

FLORIDA STATE'S WINNING STREAK TO OPEN THE 2017-18 SEASON

Florida State won its first nine games of the 2017-18 season and came within one win of tying the school record for best start to a season. The Seminoles began the 2003-04 season under head coach Leonard Hamilton by winning its first 10 games and racing out to a 10-0 record. The Seminoles' nine-game winning streak was their second winning streak of at least nine games in the last two seasons; Florida State won 12 consecutive games last season from Nov. 25, 2016 against Illinois (72-61) through its win over No. 7 Duke (88-72) on Jan. 7, 2017.

SEMINOLES' STEALING

Led by a career-high tying three steals by Phil Cofer, the Seminoles earned 10 steals in their game against Oklahoma State on Saturday in the Orange Bowl Classic. It marked the fourth time this season the Seminoles have earned 10 or more steals in a game with its season-high 12 steals coming in victories against Fordham (Nov. 17) and at Rutgers (Nov. 28). Florida State enters Monday's game against Charleston Southern ranked second in the ACC in steals with 89 and an 8.9 steals per game average.

SEMINOLES AMONG ACC LEADERS IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Florida State enters Monday's game against Charleston Southern ranked second in the ACC in 3-point field goal percentage defense and third in the ACC in overall field goal percentage defense. The Seminoles are one of only two teams in the ACC ranked in the top three of both defensive shooting categories and are joined in that top three by only Miami. Florida State is limiting its opponents to a .376 mark from the field and a .290 mark from the bonusphere. The Seminoles' .376 field goal percentage defense mark is its best leading the nation in 2010 (.377) and 2011 (.363) and its' 3-point defensive mark currently ranks as the best in school history.

FLORIDA STATE VS. CHARLESTON SOUTHERN – THE LAST GAME

Florida State's Dwayne Bacon scored 23 points and grabbed nine rebounds in the Seminoles' 88-67 win over Charleston Southern on Nov. 12, 2016 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Bacon was 4 of 6 on 3-pointers, including one off a ball screen, and 7 of 14 from the field. The rest of the Seminoles also shot well, going 33 of 67 from the field. Xavier Rathan-Mayes scored 12 points and freshman Jonathan Isaac added 10 as FSU improved to 14-1 in openers under Hamilton. Charleston Southern was up 17-12 early in the first half on a Cortez Mitchell 3-pointer before the Seminoles took the lead for good with a 20-5 run. FSU's largest lead was 22 with under a minute remaining. Freshman guard Christian Keeling led the Buccaneers with 16 points while Mitchell added 14 and Jamar Martin 12. They struggled on 3-pointers, making just 7 of 25.

THE JAM WITH HAM WINNERS

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton unveiled the 2017-18 team to the adoring Seminole crowd at the ninth annual Jam with Ham at Tully Gymnasium – complete with a 1980's themed program that included 80's music and Hamilton himself dressed in his best throwback suit blended with a kaleidoscope of colors that certainly drew the loudest cheers of the night. The night was highlighted by a dunk and 3-point shooting contests which were won by junior Terance Mann and senior Brian Angola.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.600 Senior Phil Cofer is shooting .600 percent (nine of 13 from the field) in the last five games. He made a career-high five 3-point field goals against Oklahoma State on Saturday.

.769 Sophomore Trent Forrest is shooting .769 from the field and averaging 8.0 points scored per game in the last three games. He scored his season-high of 12 points and made five of six field goal attempts.

.813 Freshman M.J. Walker is shooting a team-high .813 from the free throw line entering Monday's game against Charleston Southern. After missing the second free throw attempt of his career against George Washington, he has made 12 of his last 14 attempts (.857) since the second half of the Seminoles' victory over the Colonials.

.842 Senior Braian Angola is shooting .842 from the free throw line (16 of 19) in the last five games. He was perfect from the free throw line at Florida (four of four, 10 points), against Loyola (two of two, 18 points) and against Tulane (two of two, 18 points).

4 Florida State junior Terance Mann is one of four players in the ACC to rank in the top 20 in the conference statistics in both scoring (tied for 13th, 16.0 ppg) and rebounding (20th, 6.4 rpg). Only Mann, Marvin Bagley of Duke, Bonzi Colson of Notre Dame and Oshae Brissett of Syracuse are ranked in the top 20 of both categories.

4 Florida State has made more free throws than its opponent in four different games – in victories over Colorado State, Loyola (Md.), Tulane and Oklahoma State.

5 Florida State has trailed by no more than five points in its first 10 games. The Seminoles trailed George Washington (by two points), Fordham (by one), Colorado State (by three), Rutgers (by four, twice) and Florida (by one) and Oklahoma State (by five).

7 Freshman Ike Obiagu has at least one block in seven consecutive games and at least one blocked shot in nine of the first 10 games of his career.

9 Florida State is undefeated, 9-0, when it outscores its opponent.

9 Ike Obiagu has blocked 26 shots in the first 10 games of his career. His 26 blocked shots are tied for the ninth highest total by a freshman in school history. The school record for blocked shots by a freshman is 74 by Corey Louis (1994-95). Jonathan Isaac blocked 49 shots as a freshman during the 2016-17 season.

17 Sophomore CJ Walker is Florida State's leader in steals with 17 and a 1.7 steals per game average. He is tied for 10th in the ACC with his career-high 1.7 steals per game average.

21 Senior Brian Angola has made as many 3-point shots this season (21) in 10 games as he did in 34 games (21) as a junior.

COFER FROM THE BONUSPHERE

Senior Phil Cofer made a career-high five 3-point field goals in scoring his career-high of 22 points in Florida State's game against Oklahoma State on Saturday. It marked the second time in the last five games that he had made at least four 3-point field goals and second time this season he had scored at least 20 points in a game -- he scored 21 points in Florida State's victory over Kennesaw State (Nov. 22 in Tallahassee). Cofer enters Monday's game against Charleston Southern having made nearly as many 3-point field goals in 10 games this season (11) as he did in the first three seasons and 76 games of his career (12).

Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116, Central Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. Junior PJ Savoy, the team's top marksman from a year ago made four on the night, on the way to 19 points in the contest. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennesaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. Cofer scored the game's first six points on the way to a 9-of-11 shooting effort, and his 28 minutes were the most since he logged 29 at NC State on Jan. 17, 2015. And he did it from all over the floor -- Cofer threw down a dunk and a handful of layups, was 2 for 2 from the free-throw line and even drained his only 3-point attempt. Braian Angola (17 points, seven rebounds), Terance Mann (13 points), C.J. Walker (12) and M.J. Walker all joined Cofer in double-figures, and the Seminoles shot a season-best 42.3 percent from 3-point range. That includes a 2-of-3 mark from Angola and 3-of-5 effort from M.J. Walker, the freshman who has scored at least 11 points in three of his first four games. Feeling Healthy Again, Phil Cofer A Big Contributor To Florida State's Early Season Success

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Phil Cofer is finally making an impact for 19th-ranked Florida State.

The 6-foot-8 senior forward is healthy for the first time in a while and has been one of the main contributors behind the Seminoles' 9-0 start. He has been in the starting lineup for every game this season, averaging 12.3 points and 5.8 rebounds.

Cofer was limited the past two seasons due to ankle and back injuries, but he said this past summer was the first time he has felt completely healthy since his freshman season.

"Injuries are always going to take a mental toll, but the coaches have told me to play my game and not dwell on the past," Cofer said.

Cofer came to Florida State as a physical power forward who could also play some at center. As a freshman he started 24 games and was second on the team in rebounding (4.5 per game) while averaging 6.9 points.

But injuries would diminish his production the next two seasons. He started only five games while averaging 3.2 points and 2.0 rebounds.

Despite seeing limited minutes, Cofer continued to work on ball handling and improving his perimeter shooting. That work has paid off this season as he is making 55 percent of his shots from the field, including 6 of 15 3-pointers.

"Where some guys are always looking for reasons why they aren't being as successful and use excuses that is not the case with him," coach Leonard Hamilton said. "Even when he was hurt he was working on his game and studying our system. He has confidence in his shooting now that when he has the open look he can knock it down."

Going into Saturday's game against Oklahoma State, which is part of the Orange Bowl Classic in Sunrise, Cofer is averaging 13.8 points and 6.7 rebounds during the past six games along with hitting 56.9 percent from the field. His best game during that stretch came in the Dec. 4 win at then-No. 5 Florida when Cofer had his second career double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds.

Cofer, who had scored in double figures only seven times in 76 games the first three years of his career, has six this season.

The Seminoles switch in offensive philosophy has also meant Cofer has had to change his game. Florida State has evolved from a motion offense that relies on strong inside play to a team that is more up-tempo with versatile perimeter players, Cofer has refined his game to where he can play both small and power forward.

"This summer I was on the treadmill a lot more because of the way we play," he said. "I've been getting the ball more but also have been getting a lot of open shots. With an unselfish team like we have and this offense, it has been great so far."

Cofer and the Seminoles have also bought into Hamilton's philosophy of having to win by committee. Florida State returned only one starter from a team that went 26-9 last season and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in five years, but it can tie its best start in school history with a win on Saturday.

The Seminoles will host Charleston Southern on Monday and Southern Mississippi on Thursday before opening Atlantic Coast Conference play at Duke on Dec. 30.

Even though Florida State has been the conference's surprise team so far, Hamilton is trying to keep expectations in check.

"Our attitude and effort is good but still have some technique errors," he said. "We still have a ways to go. We need to attack defenses better and move the ball better."
