NO. 24/25 FLORIDA STATE OPENS ACC SEASON AT NO. 3/4 DUKE ON SATURDAY

No. 24/25 Florida State, which has won 11 of its first 12 games of the year for the second consecutive season, opens its 27th season of ACC Basketball as it travels to play No. 3/4 Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium on Saturday, Dec. 30, 2017. The game will be televised nationally by CBS. The Seminoles’ game against the Blue Devils marks the fourth time in their ACC history that they have opened their conference schedule against a nationally ranked Duke team (also 1996-97, 2000-01 and 2008-09). Florida State enters Saturday’s game ranked 24th nationally in the Associated Press poll and 25th nationally in the USA Today Coaches poll. It marks the third consecutive week and 18th week in the last two seasons the Seminoles have been nationally ranked. Florida State has won each of its last two games (over Charleston Southern and Southern Miss) after opening the season with nine consecutive wins – its second longest winning streak in the last two seasons after winning a school-record 12 consecutive games and vaulting to the nation’s No. 6 ranking during the months of December of January last season. Following Saturday’s game against Duke, the Seminoles play host to No. 13/14 North Carolina (Jan. 3 in Tallahassee) and travel to play at No. 15/16 Miami (Jan. 7 in Coral Gables).

SEMINOLES OPEN ACC PLAY WITH A STRING OF THREE CONSECUTIVE RANKED TEAMS

No. 24/25 Florida State opens ACC play with games at No. 3/4 Duke (Dec. 30), a home game against No. 13/14 North Carolina (Jan. 3), at No. 15/16 Miami (Jan. 7) and with consecutive home games against Louisville (Jan. 10) and Syracuse (Jan. 13). The Seminoles’ opening stretch of games brings to mind the gauntlet the Seminoles ran through to open the 2016-17 season with games at No. 11 Virginia (Won, 60-58) against No. 21 Virginia Tech (Won, 93-78), No. 7 Duke (Won, 88-72), at No. 11 North Carolina (Lost, 96-83), against No. 15 Notre Dame (Won, 83-80) and No. 12 Louisville (Won, 73-68) in what is the most successful streak of success against six consecutive ranked teams in ACC history. Florida State’s 5-1 record in those six consecutive games helped them to a 26-9 overall record, a 12-6 record in ACC play, a second place finish in the ACC standings and a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

SEMINOLES OFF TO BEST START SINCE ... LAST YEAR

At 11-1, Florida State is off to its best 12-game start since the beginning of the 2016-17 season (last year) when the Seminoles also won 11 of their first 12 games. The Seminoles improved to 15-1 in 2016-17 before suffering their second loss of the season. Florida State begins play in its 13th game of a season with an 11-1 record for the fifth time in school history. The Seminoles have been 11-1 five times in school history – most recently during the 2016-17 season.

SEMINOLES AND HAMILTON AGAINST RANKED DUKE TEAMS

Florida State enters Saturday’s game against No. 3/4 Duke with 39 wins over ranked teams during the 16-year tenure of Leonard Hamilton at Florida State. Included in those 39 wins over ranked teams are seven wins over nationally ranked Duke teams including a win over the No. 6 ranked Blue Devils (March 10, 2012, 62-59) in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament at Philips Arena in Atlanta. The Seminoles defeated No. 4 North Carolina one day later to win the first ACC Championship in school history.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 270 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 11-1 (2017-18).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat No. 3/4 Duke and gain its second win of the season over a nationally ranked team. The Seminoles defeated No. 5 ranked Florida (in Gainesville), by an 83-66 margin – their largest margin of victory (+17) over a top-five ranked AP team since joining the ACC for the 1991-92 season;
 ...Defeat No. 3/4 Duke and gain a true road win on the home court of a top-10 ranked for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles won at Florida in Gainesville (Dec. 4, 2017) earlier this season;
 ...Defeat No. 3/4 Duke and win its ACC opener for the second consecutive season. Combined with its victory over Wake Forest to begin ACC play a season ago, it would mark the first time (and second time in school history) that the Seminoles had won their ACC opener in consecutive seasons (1998-99 at Virginia and 1999-00 at Wake Forest);
 ...Defeat No. 3/4 Duke and gain their eighth win over Duke in the 16-year tenure of Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles defeated Duke three times before Hamilton became Florida State's head coach to begin the 2002-03 season.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICS

Florida State enters Thursday's game against Southern Miss as one of only seven teams nationally with a winning percentage of 90 percent or better. The Seminoles are ranked in the top-35 teams nationally for field goal percentage defense (tied for 12th, .375), blocked shots per game (15th, 6.2 bpg), scoring margin (tied for 17th, +17.4 points per game), steals per game (tied for 21st, 9.0 spg), turnovers forced per game (27th, 17.4) and scoring offense (34th, 83.9 ppg).

FLORIDA STATE AS A RANKED TEAM THIS SEASON

Florida State, which enters Saturday's game against Duke ranked 24th nationally by the Associated Press and 25th in the USA Today Coaches Poll, will play as a ranked team for the fifth time during the 2016-17 season against the Blue Devils. The Seminoles are 3-1 and have won two consecutive games as a ranked team this season. Florida State's game against the Blue Devils marks their second road game of the 2016-17 season as a ranked team. Florida State was ranked as high as No. 6 in the Associated Press poll during the 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST THE TOP FIVE IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER

Since Florida State joined the ACC for the 1991-92 season, the Seminoles are 3-2 against Top 5 ranked teams in games played in the month of December. The Seminoles won their first ever ACC game against No. 5 ranked North Carolina in the famous "wine and cheese" game at the Smith Center in Chapel, Hill, N.C. on Dec. 15, 1991.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S VICTORIES

Florida State has earned 10 of its 11 victories by double figures with and enjoys a +20.3 points per game scoring margin. The Seminoles' 53-point victory over Southern Miss in their last games (98-54) is tied for the ninth-most lopsided win in school history. Florida State has gained 10 of its 11 victories by double figures with five of its wins coming by at least 20 points.

FLORIDA STATE BY HALF

Florida State has outscored its first 12 opponents in 23 of 24 halves of basketball this season (.958). The Seminoles have been outscored by only one team (Oklahoma State) in one half of basketball (second half, 32-37) entering Saturday's game against Duke.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE SCORING COLUMN

Florida State has been led in scoring by seven different players in the first 12 games of the season and enters Saturday's game against Duke with three players averaging in double figure scoring (Terance Mann, 15.1; Phil Cofer, 13.4 and Braian Angola, 11.7 ppg), five players averaging at least 9.5 points per game and nine averaging at least 5.5 points per game.

FLORIDA STATE VS. DUKE – THE LAST GAME

Frank Jackson scored 22 points and Duke beat Florida State 75-70 on Feb. 28, 2017 at Cameron Indoor Stadium. Amile Jefferson, playing in his final game at home, added 14 points and 11 rebounds while Luke Kennard finished with 17 points for the Blue Devils. Jayson Tatum added 15 points for Duke, which avenged a 16-point loss in Tallahassee earlier during the 2016-17 season. Dwayne Bacon scored 19 points and Xavier Rathan-Mayes had 15 for the Seminoles who had their two-game winning streak snapped. Florida State pulled to 71-63 on Bacon's free throw with 2:23 to play before Tatum countered with a jumper to put Duke up by 10 points. Jackson then rebounded Jonathan Isaac's missed 3 and Duke went to work on the clock, with Tatum grabbing a key rebound of his own miss to help the Blue Devils keep the ball away from the Seminoles until there were about 50 seconds remaining.

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton unveiled the 2017-18 team to the adoring Seminole crowd at the ninth annual Jam with Ham at Tully Gymnasium – complete with a 1980's themed program that included 80's music and Hamilton himself dressed in his best throwback suit blended with a kaleidoscope of colors that certainly drew the loudest cheers of the night. The night was highlighted by a dunk and 3-point shooting contests which were won by junior Terance Mann and senior Brian Angola.

.452 Senior Braian Angola is shooting .444 from the 3-point line in the last eight games (19 of 42). He made his career-high of seven 3-point field goals in the Seminoles' victory over the Citadel (Nov. 24) in Tallahassee.

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Duke ranked fourth in the ACC in both assists per game average (17.6 apg) and in turnover margin (+3.5 per game). In part because of those numbers, the Seminoles are ranked third in the ACC in scoring margin (+20.3 ppg), fourth in the ACC in field goal percentage (.500) and fifth in the ACC in scoring (85.1 ppg).

SEMINOLES MAKING HALF OF THEIR FIELD GOAL ATTEMPTS

Florida State is ranked fourth in the ACC and is one of only four conference teams with a .500 or better field goal shooting percentage. In totaling nearly 60 percent of their point total against the Eagles from beyond the 3-point line (57 of 98 points), the Seminoles shot a season-best .538 from the bounsphere. TAMPA, Fla. -- Braian Angola had 18 points and eight rebounds to lead Florida State to a 72-53 win over Tulane. Florida State jumped out to a 21-7 lead midway through the first half after a 10-0 run. Tulane answered with a 10-2 run to close to gap to 23-17 but the Seminoles scored the final six points of the half to take a 29-17 lead. Cameron Reynolds scored five straight for Tulane early in the second half to cut the deficit to eight but with Trent Forrest scoring back-to-back baskets, Florida State scored five straight points to put the lead into double figures for good. After a Reynolds bucket the Seminoles put the game away with 10 straight, four from Forrest, to lead 52-31 with 10:25 to play. Forrest and Terance Mann each had 12 points for the Seminoles. Reynolds led the Green Wave with 16 points and 11 rebounds. Blake Paul added 12 points and eight rebounds but got into early foul trouble in the second half. Florida State got its offense rolling in the second half, shooting 58 percent (15 for 26) from the floor, including 5 of 9 behind the arc. The Green Wave had 19 turnovers and Florida State scored 17 points off those mistakes. The Seminoles bench outscored Tulane 33-15.

6 seconds left and Oklahoma State knocked No. 19 Florida State from the unbeaten ranks in the Orange Bowl Classic. Florida State went ahead on Terance Mann's follow with 10 seconds remaining, but Oklahoma State needed only four seconds to go the length of the court to score for the 14th and final lead change. Following a timeout, the Seminoles' CJ Walker drove into the lane but collided with Solomon and was called for the foul, sealing the Cowboys' win. Florida State (9-1) missed a chance to match the best start to a season in school history. Oklahoma State (8-2) ended a streak of seven consecutive losses against ranked teams since February. The Seminoles' loss left only four unbeaten teams in Division I: Villanova, Arizona State, Miami and TCU.

FSU Forward Terance Mann Credits Mother For Turning Him Into Strong Leader, Floor Coach

When Florida State forward Terance Mann roamed his mother's college basketball practices, he had one simple job he took to be extreme.

Mann's duty growing up was to just be a ball boy and give basketballs to the players when requested, but he took his work to another level.

"He would protect that ball rack like it was his life, and the girls literally had to come up to him and ask me nicely for a basketball before he would give it to them," said Daynia La-Force, Mann's mother who has spent 22 years as a Division I women's basketball coach.

"He felt like those were his prized possessions and he would not give them up. He thought the ball boy was supposed to protect the basketballs."

Mann added with a smile, "Yeah, I guarded that ball rack with everything. I remember those days. They were fun."

As coach Leonard Hamilton and the Florida State men's basketball team prepares for Tuesday's season opener at home against George Washington University, the Seminoles will rely heavily Mann to lead by example and from experience this season.

Behind Magic rookie forward Jonathan Isaac, Hornets rookie guard Dwayne Bacon, Knicks G-League guard Xavier Rathan-Mayes, fifth-year center Michael Ojo and Mann last season, the Seminoles (26-9) went undefeated at home, finished second in the ACC and were a win short of tying the school record for victories in a season.

While their first trip back to the NCAA Tournament in five years was spoiled by a second-round exit to Xavier at Amway Center, the Seminoles hope Mann can be a pillar on a team that will be without a clear-cut NBA prospect and depending on a cast of developing players to compete in the vaunted ACC.

FSU will need Mann to shoot more from the outside, but his gritty multi-faceted play combined with his firsthand knowledge from his mother's practices make him an ideal candidate to lead the Seminoles.

"He was pretty much born on a court, and raised on a court," La-Force said. "He's learned everything from being on a basketball court, everything about life."

After playing at Georgetown, La-Force climbed up the women's coaching ranks up and down the East Coast at Long Island University, St. John's, New Haven and Northeastern. She is now entering her fourth season at the University of Rhode Island. Mann, 21, and his younger brother Martin, 19, have been fixtures on the practice courts, learning along the way.

During quiet moments together, La-Force would ask Mann which players were wearing certain jerseys so he could learn his numbers.

As practice was underway, Mann and his brother were on the sidelines imitating the players' actions. When La-Force blew her whistle to coach up a player, Mann listened to the yelling intently until it was time for him to also resume practicing.

When it was time to head back home after road games, Mann and his brother would ask if they could go sit in the back of the bus with the girls on the team.

As they got older, they would travel with La-Force on her recruiting trips to scout for new players — something Mann surprisingly loved. More than the traveling to new places and going out to dinner, Mann enjoyed sitting in basketball gyms for high school and AAU games like a coach himself.

“Believe it or not, I like going recruiting with her,” Mann said. “Since I was younger, I would give my mom little tidbits of players I would see.”

If La-Force’s team suffered a loss on a certain day, Terance and his brother knew to keep their distance. Mann said he would often check in with his mother after the games, hear her “coaching spiel” about the unfortunate outcome and then head back to his room to play video games to let her finish stewing.

“If I lost a game, he may not have had dinner or help with his homework,” La-Force said with a laugh. “They knew to give me at least an hour after a loss to cool off.”

As Mann has gone through prep school and is now entering his third season at FSU, he and La-Force have to stay connected from afar.

Before every FSU game, La-Force loves to send Mann a special text letting him know it is game day. While they might speak briefly before tipoff, they like to save their 20-minute debriefing for after the games.

“He always listens, wants to talk, sometimes giving me his side of the story. Then I have to say, ‘No, no, no, this is what I saw,’” La-Force said.

Mann admits there may be times when he’s not ready for his mother’s honesty. But it’s more than appreciated.

“I wouldn’t say it’s like a coach and player relationship. I feel like she’s my mentor,” Mann said of his mother. “She’s my mom of course. But I feel like she’s always trying to give me life lessons like a mentor.

“Whatever happens, I’ll go to her and ask her for advice and she’ll have the right answer. Sometimes it’s not the answer that I want, but it’s always right.”

Luckily for Mann and his mother, La-Force’s schedule lined up perfectly, allowing her to visit FSU for the team’s two exhibitions. She will also be in the stands for the season opener after her first two games of the season, but she won’t be able to see Mann in person again until the ACC or NCAA tournaments later in the year.

“It just worked out that way — it’s God giving me an opportunity to watch him grow, watch him play,” La-Force said.

She said her proudest moments as Mann’s mother are when she hears how respected and valued he is as a leader in FSU’s program.

Mann hopes to make her even more proud this season, with high hopes for the Seminoles and himself this season. “I have to step it up this year, definitely, on both sides of the ball,” Mann said. “I’m trying to not only get defensive player of the year, but I’m definitely trying to get on the ACC All-Defensive Team. That’s one of my big goals.

“I definitely have to step it up.”
