FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT BOSTON COLLEGE MONDAY ON ESPNU

Florida State, which defeated Syracuse in double overtime by a 101-90 score on Saturday in Tallahassee, travels to play at Boston College on Monday, Jan. 15, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. The Seminoles’ game against the Eagles is the first between the two teams during the 2017-18 regular season with Florida State playing host to Boston College on March 3 – Senior Day in Tallahassee. Florida State arrives in Chestnut Hill having won six consecutive games against Boston College – each game played in the series since a 69-66 win on Feb. 16, 2013 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles are also looking for their third consecutive victory in Conte Forum. Florida State’s six-game winning streak against the Eagles is its longest current winning streak against an ACC team. Following Monday’s game against Boston College, the Seminoles will play at Virginia Tech on Saturday, Jan. 20, 2017. It will mark the Seminoles only game of the regular season against the Hokies. Florida State begins a two-game home stand against Georgia Tech on Jan. 24 and plays host to Miami on Jan. 27.

FLORIDA STATE’S HAMILTON MOVES INTO EIGHTH PLACE IN ACC HISTORY

With Florida State’s 101-90 win over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee, Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton moved into sole possession of eighth place in ACC history with 129 conference wins. He moved past Vic Bubas of Duke who won 128 ACC games during his career with the Blue Devils. Hamilton enters Monday’s game against Boston College needing only 11 ACC victories to surpass Lefty Driesell of Maryland as the seventh winningest coach in ACC history.

ANGOLA CONTINUES TO PUT ON SCORING DISPLAY

Senior Braian Angola scored his career-high of 24 points in Florida State’s double overtime win over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee. He has scored in double figures in each of Florida State’s first five ACC game of the season and is ranked third in ACC games only scoring with a 20.2 points per game scoring average. Angola is one of only four players averaging 20 or more points in ACC play and is the leader of the quartet with 17 3-point field goals made in conference play.

SEMINOLES LEAD ACC IN 3-POINT FIELD GOALS MADE PER GAME

Florida State, which made 11 3-point field goals in its 101-90 victory over Syracuse on Saturday, enters Monday’s game against Boston College as the ACC leaders in 3-point field goals made per game (9.3). The Seminoles have made 69 3-point field goals in their last six games and are tied with Virginia Tech with 158 total 3-point field goals made. The Seminoles have made twice as many 3-point field goals (158-79) than Georgia Tech, which averages 4.7 made 3-point field goals per game.

NOTES FROM FLORIDA STATE’S VICTORY OVER SYRACUSE

Florida State’s 101-90 victory over Syracuse on Saturday produced a number of notable statistics for the Seminoles. The Seminoles’ 11-point margin of victory ranks as its largest ACC win of the season. In addition, the Seminoles made their ACC season-high of 33 field goals, attempted their ACC season high of 82 field goals, attempted their conference best of 32 3-point field goals, made their league-high 24 free throws on their league-high of 34 attempts, pulled down their ACC high of 50 rebounds and were credited with their conference high of 23 assists.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO GO TO THE BOARDS

Florida State totaled its ACC season-high of 50 rebounds in its 101-90 win over Syracuse as they outrebounded the Orange by a 50-43 margin. The Seminoles have outrebounded each of their last three opponents and are enjoying a +10.0 rebound margin in those three games. Florida State’s 50 rebounds against the Orange ranks as its third highest total of the season after 53 rebound against the Citadel and its 51 rebounds in its win over Florida.

...Defeat Boston College and win its seventh consecutive game against the Eagles. The Seminoles have defeated the Eagles in each game played between the two teams since Feb. 16, 2013;

...Defeat Boston College and win its third consecutive game against the Eagles at Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill. The Seminoles have won the last two games (74-70 on March 4, 2014 and 72-62 on Jan. 26, 2016) played between the two teams on the Eagles’ home court.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 271 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 12-4 (2017-18).

SEMINOLES OVER THE CENTURY MARK IN ACC PLAY

Florida State surpassed the century mark on the scoreboard in its 101-90 win over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee. It marked the third time in the last two seasons the Seminoles have scored at least 100 points in a conference game. The Seminoles enter Monday's game against Boston College having scored 101 or more points in three of their last 13 regular season ACC games. Prior to the Seminoles scoring 109 points against Clemson on Feb. 5, 2017, the Seminoles had not scored 100 or more points in an ACC game since a 111-108 loss to Georgia Tech on Feb. 1, 1999.

FLORIDA STATE GET TO THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST SYRACUSE

Florida State made 24 free throws (including 12 of 18 in the two overtime periods) in its victory over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles 24 free throws made ranks as their high watermark for the season and was the third time this season they have made at least 20 free throws in a game. Florida State made 20 free throws each in its back-to-back wins over Rutgers (Nov. 28 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge) and then No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4 in Gainesville).

Florida State, which has made at least 11 3-point field goals in four of its last six games, enters Monday's game against Boston College as the ACC leaders in 3-point field goals made (9.3) and the ACC co-leader in total 3-point field goals made (158, tied with Virginia Tech). Florida State has made 69 3-point field goals in their last six games (Southern Miss and first five ACC games) and average 11.5 made 3-point field goals made per game since connecting on a season-high 19 made shots from the bonusphere in its 98-45 win over Southern Miss (Dec. 21).

Florida State enters Monday's game against Boston College with more than twice as many blocked shots (94-41) as their first 17 opponents. The Seminoles totaled five blocked shots to two by Syracuse in their win over the Orange on Saturday.

LOOKING INSIDE THE SEMINOLES' REBOUNDING NUMBERS

Florida State has significantly improved its rebounding numbers in its last three games – three games that coincide with the return of junior Christ Koumadje to the Seminoles' lineup. The Seminoles have nearly doubled their offensive rebounding numbers while increasing their total rebounding numbers by more than seven per game.

FLORIDA STATE VS. BOSTON COLLEGE – THE LAST GAME

Dwayne Bacon had 16 points and 13 Florida State players had at least four points, helping the 19th-ranked Seminoles to a 104-72 victory over Boston College on Feb. 20, 2017 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Bacon became only the second sophomore in school history to go over 1,000 career points. He reached the milestone with a 3-pointer early in the second half. PJ Savoy came off the bench and added 15 points as FSU's reserves outscored the Eagles 59-2. Jonathan Isaac (14 points) and Jarquez Smith (10) also scored in double figures. The Seminoles never trailed and led by 34 (75-41) six minutes into the second half. They also dominated in the paint with a 52-16 scoring advantage. Florida State moved into a tie for fourth in the conference standings with Notre Dame as both teams have three games remaining. The Seminoles have reached double-digit wins in conference play for the first time since going 12-4 in 2011-12. FSU won the ACC Tournament that same season. This was the fifth time this season the Seminoles have scored 100 or more points in a game, which is the first time that has happened since 1992-93. It is the third time they have had two or more 100-point games in ACC play and the first since 1992-93.

SEMINOLES ASSIST EACH OTHER AGAINST SYRACUSE

Florida State recorded its ACC season-high of 23 assists in its 101-90 win over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles totaled 23 assists on 33 baskets – an average of nearly .70 assists per basket. The Seminoles totaled a season-high 27 assists on 37 baskets (.729 assists per basket) in their win over Southern Miss (Dec. 21).

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.500 Redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele is shooting .500 from the 3-point line (five of 10) in his last six games – since making two of two shots from the bonusphere against Southern Miss on Dec. 21. For the season, he has made seven 3-point shots and is shooting .438 from distance.

.778 Sophomore CJ Walker is shooting .778 from the free throw line (seven of nine) in the last four games. He enters Monday's game against Boston College shooting a career-high .773 from the free throw line for the season.

.810 Sophomore Trent Forrest is shooting .810 from the free throw line (17 of 21) in the last six games. He made a career-high eight free throws in Florida State's game against Miami on Jan. 7.

2 Senior Phil Cofer and sophomore CJ Walker are the only two Seminoles to start all 17 games for the Seminoles this season. Eight different players have started at least one game for Florida State this season.

3 Senior Braian Angola has led the Seminoles in scoring in three of the last four games (20 against North Carolina, 16 against Miami and his career-high of 24 against Syracuse). He has led the Seminoles in scoring a team-high six times this season.

5 Senior Braian Angola enters Monday's game having scored in double figures in each of Florida State's first five ACC games of the season. He is averaging a team-leading 20.2 points scored per game in ACC play.

9.5 Senior Phil Cofer is averaging a near double of 9.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in the last two games. He scored 16 points against Syracuse and pulled down 10 rebounds against Louisville.

11 Sophomore Trent Forrest pulled down his career-high of 11 rebounds in the Seminoles' victory over Syracuse – as many as he had pulled down in his previous games (four vs. North Carolina, five vs. Miami and two vs. Louisville).

11 Redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele scored 11 points in 14 minutes during Florida State's victory over Syracuse on Saturday. He tied his career-high with two 3-point shots made against the Orange.

13 Florida State is undefeated, 13-0, when it outscores its opponent.

30 Sophomore Trent Forrest has been credited with 30 assists in the last six games for a 5.0 apg average. He totaled his career high of 12 assists in Florida State's victory over Southern Miss on Dec. 21. He enters Monday's game against Boston College as Florida State's leader in assists with 66 and a career-high 4.1 assists per game average.

36 Junior Terance Mann will play just 36 minutes from his hometown of Lowell, Mass., when the Seminoles travel to play Boston College in Chestnut Hill on Monday.

SEMINOLES' MANN ENJOYING AN ALL-ACC SEASON

Florida State junior forward Terance Mann, who scored his ACC career-high of 25 points in Florida State's game against Louisville on Wednesday night in Tallahassee is enjoying one of the top seasons of any player in the league and is a bonafide All-ACC Candidate. Mann, who is expected to play against Boston College after missing Saturday's game against Syracuse, is among the ACC leaders in scoring, rebounding and field goal percentage shooting while leading the Seminoles in each of those three categories -- scoring (career-high 15.1 ppg), rebounding (career-high 6.2 rpg) and field goal shooting (.615). Mann's 25 points against Louisville marked his career high scoring total for an ACC game and tied his career-high (he also totaled 25 points in Florida State's win over No. 5 Florida on Dec. 4, 2017). His scoring marked the career-high fifth time he has scored at least 20 points in a game this season. Mann has now scored at least 20 points in six different career games – five as a junior and one as a sophomore.

BRAIAN ANGOLA IN ACC PLAY (HIS LAST FIVE GAMES)...

...Has scored 101 points and is averaging 20.2 points scored per game. He has scored at least 20 points in three of the Seminoles' first five ACC games of the season (20 against North Carolina, 23 against Duke and his career-high of 24 against Syracuse);

...He is shooting .425 from the 3-point line (17 of 40) and averages 3.4 made 3-point shots in the first five ACC games of the season. He has made at least four shots from the bonusphere against Duke (five), Louisville (four) and Syracuse (four);

...He is shooting .880 from the free throw line (22 of 25). He made eight of nine free throws in the Seminoles' victory over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee;

...He is averaging 5.6 rebounds per game in ACC play with at least five rebounds in each of the Seminoles' first five conference games. He totaled his career-high of eight rebounds in Florida State's game against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium (Dec. 30);

...He has totaled 19 assists (3.8 apg) and nine steals (1.8 spg). He totaled his career-high of five steals against Miami (Jan. 7) and totaled eight assists against Syracuse (Jan. 13).

ANGOLA ON TARGET FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Senior Braian Angola has made 22 of his last 25 free throws (.880 percent) and enters Monday's game against Boston College shooting a career-high .811 from the free throw line. He made his career-high of eight free throws (including a perfect four of four in the two overtime periods) in leading Florida State to its second ACC victory of the season. Angola enters Monday's game shooting nearly 80 percent from the free throw line for his career.

FORREST IMPRESSIVE IN FIRST CAREER START AGAINST ORANGE

Sophomore Trent Forrest made his first career start in Florida State's victory over Syracuse on Saturday and his play was very impressive. He played his career-high of 40 minutes, scored seven points (including five of his seven in the first and second overtime periods), pulled down his career-high of 11 rebounds and was credited with seven of the Seminoles' 23 assists.

KOUMADJE IN THREE GAMES SINCE HIS RETURN TO THE SEMINOLES' ROTATION

In his three games since returning to the Seminoles' rotation after missing 11 games (Nov. 22 through Jan, 3), junior Chris Koumadje is quickly shaking off the rust of missing nearly two-thirds of the Seminoles first 17 games of the season. Since his return, he is averaging 12.0 points (36 total points) and 8.3 rebounds (25 total rebounds) while shooting .600 from the field (15 of 25) and making six of 12 free throws. The most impressive statistic for Koumadje may be the fact that he is averaging 23.3 minutes played per game and played his career-high of 35 minutes in the Seminoles' double overtime victory over Syracuse.

KOUMADJE SCORES HIS CAREER-HIGH OF 23 AGAINST SYRACUSE

Junior Chris Koumadje scored his career-high of 23 points in the Seminoles' victory over Syracuse on Saturday in Tallahassee. He scored eight points in the first half, 11 points in the second half, three points in the first overtime and one in the second overtime. It was his free throw that put the Seminoles up by an 83-82 margin to start the second overtime – giving the Seminoles a lead they did not relinquish in winning the game.

Florida State's Terance Mann's Versatility Makes Him Key Cog For FSU; Draws Comparisons To Michael Carter-Williams

Growing up in New England, Terance Mann gained a reputation for doing a little bit of everything on the basketball court. About five years before him, NBA player and former Syracuse star Michael Carter-Williams gained a similar reputation on the same courts.

While participating in the Boston Amateur Basketball Club program, Carter-Williams vaulted to national prominence. When Mann was in the program and Carter-Williams visited as an alumnus, the teenager gained an appreciation for the then-Syracuse guard's game.

Mann's favorite player as a middle schooler quickly became Carter-Williams, even before the eighth grader was nationally recruited.

"I loved how he did a lot," Mann said, "...and how his process (to the NBA) came about."

Seven years later, the junior's versatility has catapulted him to become Florida State's most valuable player. With the departure of last season's top-two leading scorers, Dwayne Bacon and Jonathan Isaac, Mann has had to redefine his game and vocalize his leadership, assistant coach Charlton Young said. The all-new Mann will be on display as the No. 23 Seminoles (12-4, 1-3 Atlantic Coast) host the Orange (12-5, 1-3) on Saturday.

Mann shouldn't struggle against Jim Boeheim's 2-3 zone because "he shoots the gaps and finds his spots in close," Young said.

"He's almost unselfish to a fault," Young said, "If you gave him the option to put up 40 points on a team or have a complete game, say 13 rebounds, nine assists and four blocks, he would choose the latter every time. I don't know a lot of kids that would say the same."

But more than just numbers, his willingness to take on numerous roles helps his team win on any given day, senior Phil Cofer said.

His desire to be versatile originates from his mother, Daynia La-Force. La-Force, who is the head coach of the University of Rhode Island's women's basketball team, molded her son to affect every aspect of the game, Mann said, because she desires that in all of her players.

"I didn't want to pigeonhole his game," La-Force said, "but he would hear me complain about or compliment players on my team and he would learn from that."

It started by accompanying his mom on road trips when she coached at Long Island University. Mann learned how to count by shouting the numbers on the back of basketball jerseys and while on team buses, he would always hang around his mother's players.

La-Force emphasized that Mann learned what kind of basketball player he wanted to become from being around the sport his whole life. Before and after every game, Mann always talks to her, La-Force said, and she offers him advice.

La-Force noticed the potential talent of her son the moment she saw him, as just an eighth grader, dunk for the first time. As La-Force started to realize her son's talents, she reached out to Young, then the head coach at Georgia

Southern, for advice. The two had once met at a Black Coaches & Administrators conference, and have been in contact ever since.

“I became his protection,” Young said, “His mom was hard on him, so I just told (Mann) to keep doing what he was doing.”

Young credits Mann for rejuvenating Florida State’s basketball program back in 2015. The No. 86 high school recruit in his class, according to ESPN, Mann was the first Seminole commitment in his class and helped convince players like Bacon and Malik Beasley to come to FSU.

Mann called Bacon and Beasley and pitched winning as an emphasis. It was his willingness to reach out to other top-tier players that helped lead his team to becoming a contender in the ACC, Young said.

This season more than ever, Mann has stepped up for the Seminoles. He’s increased his numbers in every statistical category across the board and his 61.5 percent mark from the field leads all ACC guards. When the Seminoles played then-No. 5 Florida on Dec. 4, Mann poured in 25 points along with eight rebounds to lead FSU to its first upset win of the season.

With three years of college experience under Mann’s belt, Young and Leo Papile, a former scout for the Boston Celtics and the founder of BABC, believe there’s a chance he can reach the heights of his childhood favorite player.

“You have to compare them,” Papile said. “Physically, (Mann’s) playing at the same level as (Carter-Williams).”
