NO. 24 SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT NO. 15/17 MIAMI ON SUNDAY NIGHT

No. 24 Florida State, which has defeated nine nationally ranked teams in the last two seasons, travels to Coral Gables, Fla., to play No. 15/17 Miami at the Watsco Center on Sunday, Jan. 7, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. The game will be televised nationally on ESPNU. The Seminoles come into their game against Miami fresh from a win over No. 12/11 North Carolina, 81-80, in Tallahassee on Wednesday night. Florida State’s victory over the nationally ranked Tar Heels gave it a second victory over a nationally ranked team this season after the Seminoles defeated No. 5/5 Florida, 83-66, in Gainesville. The Seminoles will look to even their ACC road record against the Hurricanes after pushing Duke to its limit in Cameron Indoor Stadium On Dec. 30. Florida State enters Sunday’s game against Miami with a 12-2 record after winning its first nine games of the season. Following Sunday’s game against Miami, the Seminoles play host to both Louisville (Jan. 10, 9:00 p.m.) and Syracuse (Jan. 13, 2:00 p.m.) in two games that will be televised regionally by Fox Sports.

SEMINOLES’ WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS IN LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State has nine wins over nationally ranked teams in their last 39 games dating to its 83-78 victory over then No. 21 Florida on Dec. 11, 2016. During that stretch of games, the Seminoles are 29-10 (.744 winning percentage) overall and 13-7 (.650 winning percentage) in ACC regular season games. Florida State has two wins over ranked Florida teams and one over a ranked Miami team since topping the Gators on Dec. 11, 2016. The Seminoles have one win over a top-five ranked team, two wins over top-10 ranked teams and six wins over top 15 ranked teams during their streak. In the last two seasons, nine of Florida State’s 29 overall wins (.310 percent) and seven of their 13 conference wins (.538 percent) have come against ranked teams.

With the Seminoles’ victory over No. 12 North Carolina on Wednesday in Tallahassee, Head Coach Leonard Hamilton moved into a tie for eighth place in the ACC’s all-time career wins list for ACC Games (regular season and ACC Tournament). He moved into a tie with Duke legend Vic Bubas with 128 career ACC wins.

SEMINOLES GET OFFENSIVE AGAINST DUKE AND NORTH CAROLINA

Florida State, which enters Sunday’s game against Miami ranked third in the ACC in scoring offensive averaged 87.0 points scored against Duke and North Carolina in the last week. The Seminoles’ 93 points against Duke and their 81 points against North Carolina are the most points both teams have allowed in a single game this season.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 271 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 12-2 (2017-18).

FLORIDA STATE'S RECENT WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State has won nine games over nationally ranked teams in the last two seasons. The Seminoles' nine wins over ranked teams during that span are second only to Duke and North Carolina – who both have 10 wins against nationally ranked teams since the start of 2016-17 season.

SEMINOLES LEAD THE ACC IN 3-POINT FIELD GOALS MADE

Florida enters Sunday's game against Miami ranked first in the ACC in 3-point field goals made with 134. The Seminoles are shooting .386 from beyond the arc and have been especially accurate in the last three games with a .464 shooting marking since making a season-high 19 shots from distance against Southern Miss on Dec. 21. Florida State has made in double figures in 3-point shots in each of the last three games (19 vs. Southern Miss, 15 vs. Duke and 11 vs. North Carolina) and in six games this season (vs, the Citadel, Rutgers, Loyola (Md.), Southern Miss, Duke and North Carolina).

NOTING FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Through the first 14 games of the 2017-18 season, the Seminoles have made 134 3-point shots – five more than Florida State made during the entire 1997-98 season (129). The Seminoles made 233 3-point shots in 35 games last season (6.7 3-point field goals made per game) and have made 134 in the first 14 games of the 2017-18 season (9.6 3-point field goals made per season).

FLORIDA STATE GETS TO THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST NORTH CAROLINA

Florida State defeated No. 12 North Carolina, 81-80 at the Donald L. Tucker in Tallahassee. The Seminoles made fewer field goals than the Tar Heels (28-31), had the same amount of 3-point shots made (11-11) but made seven more free throws in winning the game. Florida State committed only nine fouls in the game which limited North Carolina to nine free throws during the game – the Tar Heels went to the line only five times in the second half (and made three). The Seminoles outscored North Carolina by an 8-3 margin from the line in the second half. The Seminoles committed only four fouls in the first half and only five in the second half – leaving them with one still to “give” at the end of the game.

SEMINOLES MADE MORE FREE THROWS THAN NORTH CAROLINA ATTEMPTED

Florida State made more free throws (14) than North Carolina attempted (nine) and outscored the Tar Heels from the free throw line (14-7) in winning Wednesday's game by one point (81-80). It marked the fifth time this season that the Seminoles had made more free throws than their opponents had attempted. Florida State has outscored its first 14 opponents by 28 points (187-159) from the free throw line.

FLORIDA STATE'S SCORING IN THE LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Miami ranked third in the ACC in scoring with an 85.4 points per game scoring average. The Seminoles have scored more than 90 points in two of their last three games and have totaled 90 or more points in six of their first 14 games of the 2017-18 season. The Seminoles are averaging 80.9 points per game in the last three seasons after not averaging more than 76.7 points during the first 13 seasons of the Leonard Hamilton era at Florida State. Florida State averaged 66.6 points scored per game during the 2014-15 season and have increased their scoring average by more than 14 points as compared to that average in the last three seasons. The Seminoles' 85.4 points per game scoring average is their highest since their 1998-99 team averaged 91.3 points per game in advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

Florida State's 66-57 victory over No. 25 Miami gave the 15th-ranked Seminoles a double-bye in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament and their first unbeaten home season in 41 years. Florida State earned the second seed for the tournament, at the Barclay's Center in Brooklyn, New York. It was their highest seeding since they were second in 1993. Florida State, Louisville and Notre Dame finished tied for second but the Seminoles earned the higher seed based on a better combined record over the Irish and Cardinals. The win also wrapped up the Seminoles' first unbeaten home season since 1975-76. They are 18-0 at the Tucker Center this season, with six wins against ranked teams. The first half saw five ties and nine lead changes as Florida State led 37-34 at halftime. Miami's Davon Reed, who had 22 points, started the second half with a 3-pointer to tie the game at 37 before FSU went on a 12-3 run to take control. Jarquez Smith, who was one of two seniors playing his final home game, had five of his 11 points during the run. A dunk by Bacon with 4:19 remaining gave the Seminoles a 59-48 lead but the Hurricanes went on a 9-2 run to close within 61-57 with 19 seconds remaining. FSU closed it out by scoring the final six points.

Florida State senior Braian Angola is one of Sixty NCAA men's and women's basketball student-athletes who excel both on and off the court was selected as a candidate for the 2017-18 Senior CLASS Award for college basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

.471 Freshman M.J. Walker is shooting .471 (eight of 17) from the 3-point line and averaging 10.7 points in his last three games.

.519 Senior Phil Cofer is shooting .519 (14 of 27) from the 3-point line and averaging 16.6 points in the last five games.

.889 Sophomore Trent Forrest has made eight of nine last nine free throws in the last three games. He was a perfect three of three against Southern Miss and a perfect two of two against Duke.

1 Senior Phil Cofer finished his career with an undefeated 4-0 record against rival Florida – the first player in Florida State history to finish his career without suffering a loss to the Gators.

3 Junior Terance Mann is ranked third in school history with his .592 career field goal shooting percentage.

4 Sophomore CJ Walker made his career-high of four 3-point field goals in Florida State's victory over North Carolina. His four 3-point field goals made allowed him to score his ACC career-high of 18 points.

5 Senior Braian Angola enters Sunday's game against Miami having made five consecutive free throws.

7 Florida State has trailed by no more than seven points in any its first 14 games. The Seminoles trailed George Washington (by two points), Fordham (by one), Colorado State (by three), Rutgers (by four, twice), Florida (by one), Oklahoma State (by five), Charleston Southern (by four), Duke (by seven) and North Carolina (by two).

8 Senior Braian Angola has scored in double figures in eight games during the 2017-18 season including his career-high of 23 points against Duke on Dec. 30 in Durham. He scored in double figures in four of 23 games as a junior in his first season as a Seminole in 2016-17.

9 Florida State blocked five shots in its victory over North Carolina on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. It marked the ninth time in the first 14 games of the season that Florida State has blocked at least five shots.

12 Florida State is undefeated, 12-0, when it outscores its opponent.

12 Junior PJ Savoy is tied for 12th in school history with a career 3-point field goal shooting percentage of .377.

14 Freshman Ike Obiagu has blocked at least one shot in 11 consecutive games, in 13 of the first 14 games of his career and has blocked multiple shots in seven games.

21.5 Senior Braian Angola is averaging 21.5 points in his last two games – he scored his career-high of 23 against Duke and added 20 against North Carolina. It marked the first time in his Florida State career that he has scored at least 20 points in consecutive games.

FLORIDA STATE'S HAMILTON TO FACE HIS FIRST TWO EMPLOYERS

Florida State has already played Oklahoma State (Dec. 16 at the Orange Bowl Classic) and will face Miami (for the first two times during the regular season) – the first two schools Leonard Hamilton was the head coach during his career.

SEMINOLES HAVE BEEN AHEAD ON THE SCOREBOARD MUCH OF THE SEASON

Florida State led its game against North Carolina for nearly 35 minutes, led by as many as 13 points and never trailed by more than two points in gaining its 12th win of the season over the nationally ranked Tar Heels. The Seminoles' largest in-game lead this season has been +57 in their 98-45 win over Southern Miss while its largest deficit of the season (minus seven points) came at Duke in its ACC season-opener on Dec. 30.

SEMINOLES AT THE HALF

Florida State has led each of its 14 games at the half and has only lost three halves this season (second half vs. Oklahoma State, second half vs. Duke and the second half vs. North Carolina). The Seminoles won each of their first 19 halves of the season and were the last team in college basketball to lose a half (second half vs. Oklahoma State).

ANGOLA WITH CONSECUTIVE 20+ POINT OUTINGS

Senior Braian Angola scored his career-high of 23 points against Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium (Dec. 30) and totaled 20 in Florida State's victory over North Carolina on Wednesday in Tallahassee and enters Sunday's game against Miami averaging 21.5 points per game in those two ACC games. It marks the first time in his Seminole career that he has scored 20 or more points in consecutive games and gave him a career-high three 20+ point scoring games this season – he also scored 21 points in Florida State's victory over the Citadel (Nov. 24).

ANGOLA IN HIS LAST TWO GAMES...

...Is averaging 21.5 points scored (43 total points), is shooting .481 from the field (13 of 27), is shooting .421 from the 3-point line (eight of 19) and is shooting .900 from the free throw line (nine of 10).

ANGOLA ENJOYING A SENSATIONAL FIRST HALF OF 2017-18 SEASON

Senior Braian Angola, who has started each of the Seminoles' last 11 games, has already scored more points (183-157), pulled down more rebounds (62-55) and made more 3-point shots (33-21) in the first 14 games of the 2017-18 season than he did in the 34 games during the 2016-17 season.

OBIAGU ON THE BLOCKS

Freshman Ike Obiagu, who has at least one blocked shot in 13 of Florida State's 14 games, has more blocked shots by himself (37) than do Florida State's first 14 opponents against the Seminoles (29). He blocked five shots in Florida State's victory over Rutgers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (Nov. 28) and has a total of four blocked shots in his first two career ACC games (two each against Duke and North Carolina). One of his two blocked shots came on a jump shot attempt by North Carolina's Theo Pinson near the free throw line early in the second half of Florida State's victory over the Tar Heels.

NOTING OBIAGU AND FLORIDA STATE'S BLOCKED SHOTS

Freshman Ike Obiagu is ranked fourth in the ACC and is the ACC's freshmen leader in blocked shots with 37 blocked shots and a 2.6 blocked shots per game average. He has the Seminoles ranked third in the ACC with a 5.7 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles have blocked nearly three times as many shots as their first 14 opponents and have blocked nearly nine percent (80 of 917, .087 percent) of their opponent's shots.

TAMPA, Fla. -- Braian Angola had 18 points and eight rebounds to lead Florida State to a 72-53 win over Tulane. Florida State jumped out to a 21-7 lead midway through the first half after a 10-0 run. Tulane answered with a 10-2 run to close to gap to 23-17 but the Seminoles scored the final six points of the half to take a 29-17 lead. Cameron Reynolds scored five straight for Tulane early in the second half to cut the deficit to eight but with Trent Forrest scoring back-to-back baskets, Florida State scored five straight points to put the lead into double figures for good. After a Reynolds bucket the Seminoles put the game away with 10 straight, four from Forrest, to lead 52-31 with 10:25 to play. Forrest and Terance Mann each had 12 points for the Seminoles. Reynolds led the Green Wave with 16 points and 11 rebounds. Blake Paul added 12 points and eight rebounds but got into early foul trouble in the second half. Florida State got its offense rolling in the second half, shooting 58 percent (15 for 26) from the floor, including 5 of 9 behind the arc. The Green Wave had 19 turnovers and Florida State scored 17 points off those mistakes. The Seminoles bench outscored Tulane 33-15.

After Summer With Colombian National Team, FSU's Braian Angola Evolves Into One Of The ACC's 3-Point Aces

Florida State basketball is off to a 12-2 start, and a big part of the team's success is one of the ACC's early-season breakout players: Braian Angola.

The 6-foot-6 native of Colombia spent most of the 2016-17 season as a reserve shooter (21-of-50 on three-pointers) for the Seminoles. However, he's taking on a much larger role this season. The departures of Dwayne Bacon and Xavier Rathan-Mayes opened a lot of playing time in Florida State's backcourt; Angola is shooting his shot — both literally and figuratively.

FSU features a balanced scoring attack; five players average nine or more points. But the proficiency of Angola — in two of the money areas on the floor — is imperative for the Seminoles.

No Such Thing As Faux Deep

Braian Angola has played 370 minutes across Florida State's first 14 games — making 11 starts. Angola played 402 total minutes all of last season. His playing time has leapt — up to 26.4 minutes per game — as has his usage rate: from 18 percent to 21.5 percent.

The increased workload doesn't faze Angola, though. He's thrived with more opportunities. After a summer spent with the Colombian National Team in the Four Nations and 2017 FIBA AmeriCup Tournaments, Angola is making the most of his final college season.

In back-to-back games against Duke and North Carolina, Angola played 64 minutes, scored 43 points and connected on 8-of-19 three-pointers (42.1 percent).

Angola is one of the best shooters currently in the ACC, and he knows where he's best — beyond the arc: 63.4 percent of his field goal attempts are three-pointers. According to Synergy Sports, over 36 percent of his possessions are spot-ups. The senior wing has connected on 28-of-54 (51.9 percent) catch-and-shoot jump shots, and scored 1.56 points per possession — No. 34 in the nation, No. 2 in the ACC.

It's important to keep good company, and Angola is one of only five ACC players currently shooting at least 42 percent from downtown on at least five three-point attempts per game. He's joined on that last by four of the best sharpshooters you will find in college ball: Grayson Allen, Kyle Guy, Jordan Chatman and Ahmed Hill.

Unafraid of Traffic: Bring On Rush Hour

While Braian Angola prefers to snipe from 21 feet, the senior can finish around the cup, too. Angola is 27-of-45 on two-point field goal attempts. A big part of that efficiency is his ability to score at the rim — the other money area for offensive players.

On non-post-up attempts at the basket, Angola is 14-of-22 (63.6 percent) and has scored 1.32 points per possession. That ranks 30th in the ACC amongst players with at least 20 possessions; most of the players above Angola on that list on frontcourt players, too.

This efficient scoring augments some of the other facets of his game, too; Angola has some nice two-way skills. While on the floor this season, Angola has assisted on 20 percent of his teammates' made field goals — third best on Florida State's roster
