WINNERS OF THREE STRAIGHT ACC GAMES, FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO WAKE FOREST

Florida State, which has won three consecutive and four of its last five ACC games, travels to play Wake Forest on Wed., Jan. 31, 2018 at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem, N.C. for the only meeting of the regular season between the Seminoles and the Demon Deacons. The Seminoles arrive in Winston-Salem straight from their overtime victory over Miami (103-94) on Saturday at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State has now won two overtime games this season with its win over the Hurricanes and a double overtime win over Syracuse (101-90) on Jan. 13 also in Tallahassee. Florida State’s game at Wake Forest begins a two-game road swing for the Seminoles. Following Wednesday’s game against Wake Forest, the Seminoles will travel to play at Louisville on Feb. 3, 2018 at 8:00 p.m. before returning home to face No. 2 Virginia on Feb. 7 in Tallahassee.

SEMINOLES’ MANN ENJOYS OUTSTANDING WEEK IN PAIR OF SEMINOLE WINS

Terance Mann averaged 22.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists in leading the Seminoles to two ACC wins with victories over Georgia Tech and Miami. The junior totaled 30 points for the first time in his career in leading the Seminoles over the Yellow Jackets and added 14 in Florida State’s overtime win over the Hurricanes. For the week, Mann shot .636 from the field (14 of 22) and .727 from the free throw line (16 of 22) as he led Florida State to a 16-5 overall mark and a 5-4 record in ACC play. Mann averaged 39 minutes played per game and played 78 of the 85 total available minutes in the Seminoles’ two victories. He played all 20 minutes in the second half against Georgia Tech and played every minute of the second half and the overtime period in the Seminoles’ victory over the Hurricanes. Mann scored his career-high of 30 points in Florida State’s 88-77 victory over Georgia Tech on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. Mann became the first Seminole to score 30 points in a game since Xavier Rathan-Mayes totaled 30 against North Carolina on Jan. 4, 2016. He became just the 23rd player in school history to score 30 or more points in an ACC game. Mann then scored 14 points (nine after halftime and four in overtime) to lead the Seminoles to the 103-94 win over Miami. He scored five second half points and four in overtime as Florida State won its fifth ACC game of the season.

MANN IN THE ACC STATISTICS

Mann enters Wednesday’s game against Wake Forest ranked seventh in the ACC with a career-high 16.0 points per game scoring average and is ranked 22nd in rebounding with his career-high 6.2 rebounds per game average. He is ranked fifth in the ACC with his career-high .598 field goal shooting percentage.

ANGOLA IN DOUBLE FIGURES IN ACC PLAY – AGAIN

Senior Braian Angola scored 18 points in Florida State’s victory over Miami and has now scored in double figures in each of Florida State’s nine ACC games this season (169 points / 18.8 ppg). He is tied for fourth in the ACC in scoring for ACC games only and is 15th in the ACC in scoring for all games (career-high 14.7 points scored per game). Angola has scored in double figures in 10 consecutive games against ACC opponents (nine ACC games in 2017-18 and the Seminoles’ ACC Tournament semifinal game against Notre Dame on March 8, 2017) and averaging 18.6 points per game in those 10 games.

SEMINOLES TIE SCHOOL RECORD FOR OVERTIME PERIOD SCORING

Florida State tied a school record as it scored 20 points in one overtime period in its 103-94 win over Miami on Saturday. It marked the fourth time the Seminoles scored 20 points in one overtime period. The Seminoles scored a Florida State overtime record 24 points in a double overtime, 79-69 win over Cincinnati on Feb. 29, 1980.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its sixth consecutive game against the Demon Deacons. A win for the Seminoles and a six-game winning streak in the series would be the longest in the 50-game series for Florida State;
 ...Defeat Wake Forest and win its fourth consecutive ACC games. It would mark the second consecutive season the Seminoles have earned winning streaks of four games in ACC play. The Seminoles defeated Wake Forest (Dec. 28, 2016; 88-72), Virginia (Dec. 31, 2016; 60-58), Virginia Tech (Jan. 7, 2017; 93-78) and Duke (Jan. 10, 2017; 88-72) in consecutive games on their way to a 12-6 mark and a second place finish in ACC play during the 2016-17 season;
 ...Defeat Wake Forest and win its second consecutive ACC road game. The Seminoles won at Virginia Tech (Jan. 20, 2018; 91-82) in their last ACC road game. The Seminoles have not won consecutive ACC road games since winning at Boston College (Jan. 26, 2016; 72-62) and at Wake Forest (Feb. 6, 2016; 91-71) during the 2015-16 season;
 ...Defeat Wake Forest and win its 17th overall game before the end of the month of January for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles ended the month of January with an 18-4 mark during the 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 275 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 16-5 (2017-18).

FLORIDA STATE ECLIPSES THE 100-POINT MARK AGAINST MIAMI

Florida State defeated No. 24 Miami 103-94 on Saturday in Tallahassee to earn its second 100-point ACC victory of the 2017-18 season. The Seminoles defeated Syracuse, 101-90, in double overtime on Jan. 13. The Seminoles' two 100-point games mark the third time in their ACC history (since the start of the 1991-92 season) that they have scored 100 points or more in multiple ACC games. Florida State scored 100 or more points twice during the 1991-92 (Feb. 8, 1992; 102-90 win over Clemson and Feb. 27, 1992; 110-96 win over North Carolina) and scored 100 or more a school-record three times during the 1992-93 season (Jan. 13, 1993; 105-65 win over Maryland, Feb. 10, 1993; 111-94 win over Wake Forest and Feb. 20, 1993; 102-92 win over Clemson).

SEMINOLES OFFENSE CLICKING ON ALL CYLINDERS AGAINST MIAMI

Florida State scored its ACC season-high of 103 points and shot its ACC best from the field of .600 (33 of 55) in its victory over Miami on Saturday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' 103 points scored against Miami is their seventh-highest scoring total in an ACC game (Florida State scored its ACC school record of 111 points against Wake Forest on Feb. 10, 1993). The Seminoles' .600 field goal shooting percentage is tied for the seventh best single-game team field goal shooting percentage in an ACC game in school history (Florida State shot its ACC school record of .661 against Clemson on Feb. 5, 2017).

FLORIDA STATE'S LAST FOUR ACC WINS

Florida State's last four ACC wins over Syracuse (101-90, +11), at Virginia Tech (91-82, +9), against Georgia Tech (88-77, +11) and over Miami (103-94, +9) have come by an average of 10.0 points per game (40 total points).

FLORIDA STATE'S TURNOVER STORY AGAINST MIAMI

Florida State committed a season-low seven turnovers in its victory over Miami on Saturday – and only one – in the final 32:25 of the game. Following a turnover at the 7:26 mark of the first half the only turnover the Seminoles committed was on a shot clock violation with 3:48 remaining to be played in the second half. The Seminoles' previous season-low for turnovers this season was nine in their 78-73 ACC/Big Ten Challenge win at Rutgers.

SEMINOLES SHOOTING THE BALL WELL DURING THEIR THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest ranked third in the ACC with a .479 field goal shooting mark as a team. The Seminoles have shot the ball especially well during their current three-game winning streak during which they have shot a combined .575 percent from the field and are averaging 94.0 points scored per game.

SEMINOLES SHOOTING WELL FROM THE FREE THROW LINE IN LAST FIVE

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest having shot 70 percent or better from the free throw line in each of its last five games. The Seminoles are shooting nearly 10 percentage points better from the free throw line in their last five games as compared to their first 16 games of the season. More importantly, the Seminoles are averaging 21.4 free throws made and 28 free throws attempted in their last five games as compared to 13.3 free throws made and 20 free throws attempted in their first 16 games of the season.

FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME

Florida State is 2-0 in overtime games this season with wins over both Syracuse (Jan. 13; 101-90 in double overtime) and Miami (Jan. 27; 103-94 in overtime). It marks the first time since the 2004 season that Florida State has won two overtime games (against North Carolina and Wichita State). The last time Florida State won three overtime game in the same season was during the 1992-93 season when it won four overtime games (vs. Temple, Wake Forest, Duke and Western Kentucky).

FLORIDA STATE VS. WAKE FOREST – THE LAST GAME

Florida State went on a run of 17 straight points over a four-minute span in the second half as they posted an 88-72 victory over Wake Forest on December 28, 2016 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Dwayne Bacon and Xavier Rathan-Mayes each scored 23 points and led the Seminoles during the decisive run as Bacon had seven points and Rathan-Mayes five. Florida State trailed 66-61 before making seven straight shots from the field and forcing Wake to commit four turnovers as it took a 78-66 lead with 4:50 remaining. Jonathan Isaac added 13 points and CJ Walker had 12 for Florida State which won its ninth straight game for the first time since 2003-04 and improved to 16-1 overall. The Demon Deacons were looking for their first road win in a conference opener since 2006-07 but couldn't contend with Florida State's size. Center Doral Moore suffered a leg injury 2 minutes into the game and did not return and leading scorer John Collins was held to two points. Keyshawn Woods and Bryant Crawford led Wake with 16 points each.

FLORIDA STATE RANKED SECOND IN THE ACC IN SCORING OFFENSE

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest ranked second in the ACC with an 85.5 points per game scoring average. The Seminoles have scored 458 points in their last five games and are averaging 91.6 points scored per game since scoring 101 points in their win over Syracuse. Florida State has scored 101 or more points three times in its first 21 games (113 vs. the Citadel, 103 vs. Miami and 101 vs. Syracuse) and have scored 90 or more points nine times including its 93-point total in Cameron Indoor Stadium against Duke on Dec. 30.

FORREST HITS FROM BONUSPHERE IN A BIG WAY AGAINST MIAMI

Sophomore Trent Forrest scored five points in Florida State's victory over Miami on Saturday as he made one field goal (a 3-point shot) and two free throws. Both scores for the Seminoles were extremely important. While the Hurricanes were throwing in 17 3-point shots of their own, Forrest connected from distance at the 10:04 mark of the second half to put the Seminoles up by a 67-59 advantage. The 3-point shot for Forrest was only his second of the season with his first one coming in Florida State's victory over Loyola (Md.) (Dec. 6). Forrest was also a perfect two-of-two from the free throw line with three seconds left to play in overtime to give Florida State its' final margin of victory at 103-94.

KOUMADJE IN DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING IN TWO OF LAST THREE GAMES

Junior center Christ Koumadje totaled 13 points (six points in the second half and three in overtime) as he helped lead Florida State to its 104-93 win over Miami on Saturday. He made six of seven field goal attempts (he was one of one from the field in the overtime period) including four of five in the second half and overtime period. Mann added a team and career-high

high eight assists in the victory.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. -- CJ Walker scored 24 points and Phil Cofer added 19 to lead unbeaten Florida State past Rutgers 78-73. Walker was 6 of 11 from the floor and made 10 of 11 free throws. Cofer was 7-of-11 shooting and made four 3-pointers. Ike Obiagu grabbed 10 rebounds and chipped in five points for Florida State. Eugene Omoruyi scored 22 points to lead Rutgers (6-1). Corey Sanders added 20 points, and Deshawn Freeman followed up his first double-double of the season with 15 points and 16 rebounds. Freeman energized the crowd when he was fouled by Mfiondu Kabengele, raising his arms several times to get the crowd to its feet with 14:35 remaining. Rutgers went on to take a 44-41 lead after Omoruyi converted the 3-point play and Freeman made a pair of free throws. Walker then scored the next 11 points for the Seminoles, hitting 5 of 7 from the line and a pair of 3-pointers. Trent Forrest made a layup and Florida State led 53-45 with 12:28 to play. The Scarlet Knights pulled to 69-66 after Omoruyi's layup with 1:56 to go, but they didn't get closer.

Mfiondu Kabengele: The Product Of An Unmatched Work Ethic

Results don't show if the work isn't put in. And it's maintaining that sort of mentality that has allowed redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele to thrive through the intensity of college basketball.

But he wasn't always like that.

That drive and hunger to persevere derived from his wanting to become one of the greatest that the game has ever seen. It eventually manifested well within the 6-foot-9 forward and transformed him into one of the toughest Seminoles in the locker room.

"When I was being lazy, I saw where I was; I wasn't that successful," Kabengele said. "When I went to prep school, it was the first time that I went a long period of hard work, like month in and month out. Once I saw the progression of how I grew from hard work, I just applied it when I came here."

Coming out of high school, Kabengele had instilled the thought of pursuing a college basketball career deep within his mind. Though the opportunity hadn't presented itself just yet, the Ontario, Canada native had paved himself a particular path that would ultimately land him on an ACC roster.

Following his graduating from Corpus Christi High School, where he averaged more than 14 points per game and nearly seven rebounds per game, Kabengele moved down to Indiana. The recent high school graduate enrolled in a post-graduate program—Don Bosco Preparatory—where he put himself on the radar of multiple top-tier college programs behind his stellar season averaging a double-double.

With Wisconsin, Georgetown and Boston College all among his top options, Kabengele ultimately elected Florida State as his new home.

"Tallahassee is similar to where I'm from. It's quiet, suburban; not too big, not too small," Kabengele said. "The only change really was the lingo and they type of people because back home, Canadians are just a little different from Americans."

His redshirt season did not see much playing time—any at all, in fact. Kabengele spent his entire first year at Florida State working closely with associate head coach Stan Jones with conditioning. His first year sitting out allowed him to observe and study the art of the game.

"It was great because I knew coach Jones really appreciated my kind of talent and he saw something in me that I didn't see in myself," Kabengele said. "He's always tried to compare me to Al Thornton and how I was in the same situation as him."

Investing hours and hours into improving his mind, body and on-court performance, Kabengele reinforced the reason behind his enduring such strenuous workouts. Coach Stan Jones surely tested Kabengele's limits, which resulted in his demonstrating significant improvements in his maturity and his overall performance.

"His workouts were a mixture of conditioning and ball handling. It was tough, the amounts of reps we got in and the hours we put in. It was tough, especially on the body," Kabengele said. "Every time we did the workout, I always felt like I got a little better."

The Seminoles, last year, enjoyed much success, making their way to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in a few years. Though not able to contribute on the court or on the stats sheet, Kabengele ensured that his presence be

felt on the bench and in the locker room. Oftentimes seen on his feet encouraging his teammates from the sidelines, Kabengele displayed a contagious type of energy that resonated well within his teammates as well as the fans in the stands.

"After a game, we watch film, and there's a little clip of me going crazy. Coach would stop it and say 'see Fi's energy?' That's the type of energy that helps ignite the offense or the defense," Kabengele said. "I'm generally that passionate in everything I do, whether it be in the locker room or on campus. I'm like that on and off the floor."

An entire year of observing, learning and studying the game concluded and Kabengele's opportunity to prove himself approached quickly. High expectations were set upon himself. His confidence in himself allowed him to take his first steps on the hardwood and create an immediate impact on a team that had lost key players to the NBA draft the season prior.

"My greatest asset is my confidence," Kabengele said. "There are some situations where I make terrible mistakes, but I can always go back the next day and forget about it and come into the next game ready to go."

Now in his first year of eligibility, Kabengele certainly has stunned many. Beyond the midway point of conference play, Kabengele and Florida State (16-5 overall, 5-4 ACC) are coming off a monumental victory over the Hurricanes and have set themselves up for an NCAA Tournament bid.

Among the most versatile players on this year's team, Kabengele has shown flashes of talent and potential. Averaging just shy of eight points per game and five rebounds per contest, the redshirt freshman has proven to be a tremendous asset coming off the Seminoles' bench.

When asked about Kabengele's greatest quality, junior forward Terance Mann responded with "his mentality." "He has always been able to shoot, he's always been able to be aggressive and rebound. In his redshirt year, he didn't know what he liked, he didn't know if he could play," Mann said. "But now he can see that he can play with us and with anyone in the country, so he knows he can compete."

With just half a year of playing eligibility in the rear-view, the young 'Nole has plenty to look forward to. With such a young, talented roster at the helm of the program's future, Florida State's winning years are certainly ahead. Hopes of a National Championship gleam in his eyes as he looks ahead into his next few years as a Seminole. A hopeful smile runs across his face as he discusses his future with the group that he calls family.

"My goal is to win a national championship before I leave Florida State because it's never been done in program history, so if I do that, my name is in the books forever," Kabengele said. "Everyone is together in everything we do and every activity so it's only a matter of preparation and work ethic."
