SEMINOLES CLOSE OUT ACC ROAD SCHEDULE AT CLEMSON ON WEDNESDAY NIGHT

Florida State, which has won four consecutive games against Clemson, travels to play the Tigers at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. on Wednesday, Feb. 28, 2018 at 9:00 p.m. The game between the Seminoles and the Tigers is the second of two regular season match-ups between the two teams with Florida State rallying from an 18-point deficit to win the first meeting 81-79 in overtime at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Clemson having won at least four straight games against the Tigers for the third time in school history. The Seminoles have won five consecutive games against the Tigers twice – during the 1994-95 and 1995-96 seasons and during the 2012, 2013 and 2014 seasons. The Seminoles and the Tigers have met at least twice every season since Florida State became a member of the ACC for the 1991-92 season. Following Wednesday's game at Clemson, the Seminoles will play host to Boston College on Senior Day on Saturday, March 3, 2018. Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff will honor seniors Brandon Allen, Braian Angola and Phil Cofer.

SEMINOLES GO FOR WIN NO. 5 AGAINST A RANKED TEAM THIS SEASON

Florida State plays Clemson looking to gain its fifth win against a nationally ranked team and its second against Clemson as a nationally ranked team when it travels to play the Tigers on Wednesday night. The Seminoles count victories over No. 5 Florida (83-66, Dec 4), No. 10 North Carolina (81-80, Jan. 3), No. 24 Miami (104-93 in overtime, Jan. 27) and No. 11 Clemson (81-79 in overtime) on their resume this season. The Seminoles have defeated 11 ranked teams (a school-record tying seven during the 2016-17 season and four during the 2017-18 season) in the last two years and 49 games. The Seminoles have gained victories over a nationally ranked team in 11 of their last 39 wins (.282 percent) since the start of the 2016-17 season. Florida State is 35-17 (.673 winning percentage) in the last two seasons.

SEMINOLES' ROAD WINS OVER NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against No. 18 Clemson looking for its second road win of the season over a nationally ranked team. The Seminoles defeated then No. 5 ranked Florida (Dec. 4; 83-66) in Gainesville.

OBIAGU BLOCKS SIX SHOTS AGAINST NC STATE

Freshman Ike Obiagu blocked a career-high six shots against NC State on Sunday night in Raleigh – the most by a Seminole in an ACC game since Jonathan Isaac blocked seven shots in Florida State's 83-80 win over No. 15 Notre Dame (Jan. 15, 2017) and the third highest blocked shot total by a Florida State freshman. Corey Louis blocked a Seminole freshman record nine shots against Maryland on Jan. 10, 1995.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Clemson and win both ends of the regular season series between the two teams for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles have earned six regular season series victories (1994, 1995, 2001, 2009, 2013 and 2017) against the Tigers since joining the ACC for the 1991-92 season;

...Defeat Clemson and win its 20<sup>th</sup> game of the season. It would mark the third consecutive season the Seminoles would have won at least 20 games. Most recently the Seminoles won 20 games in 2017 (26 wins), 2016 (20 wins), 2014 (24 wins), 2012 (25 wins), 2011 (23 wins), 2010 (22 wins) and 2009 (25 wins);

...Defeat Clemson and win its ninth ACC game of the season. It would mark the second consecutive season the Seminoles has won at least nine conference games. The Seminoles were 12-6 in ACC play in 2016-17;

...Defeat Clemson and win at Littlejohn Coliseum for the fifth consecutive time. The Seminoles won at Littlejohn on January 5, 2013 (74-66), January 9, 2014 (56-41), January 19, 2015 (59-55) and February 25, 2017 (78-74).

**FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS**

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 276 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 19-9 (2017-18).

**FLORIDA STATE WITH WINS OVER RANKED CLEMSON TEAMS**

Florida State has won three consecutive games against nationally ranked Clemson teams entering Wednesday's game against the No. 18 ranked Tigers. The Seminoles are 6-3 against a ranked Clemson team since first playing the Tigers when they were in the national top-25 on Jan. 17, 1996. The Seminoles are 2-1 against Clemson in games when the Tigers are nationally ranked and the game is played in Clemson.

**FLORIDA STATE ON THE BLOCKS AGAINST NC STATE**

Led by its twin towers – Christ Koumadje and Ike Obiagu – the Seminoles blocked seven shots against NC State on Sunday night. Specifically, Koumadje (one blocked shot) and Obiagu (a career-high six blocked shots) combined to block seven shots against the Wolfpack. Florida State is ranked sixth in the ACC in blocked shots with 134 and a 4.8 blocked shots per game average. Florida State's seven blocked shots against NC State marked the 17<sup>th</sup> time in 28 games this season the Seminoles had blocked five or more shots in game and were the most blocked shots in a single game since they also blocked seven against Oklahoma State on Dec. 16, 2017 in the Orange Bowl Classic.

**SEMINOLES WITH SIX STEALS AGAINST NC STATE**

Sophomore Trent Forrest led Florida State with three steals and the Seminoles earned six steals in Florida State's game against NC State on Sunday night. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Clemson with 190 steals and need only 10 steals to finish the season with 200 or more steals for the third consecutive season. Florida State has earned at least 200 steals in 14 of Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton's first 15 seasons and are looking to improve that list into 15 times in the last 16 seasons.

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE BONUS SPHERE**

Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Clemson with 224 3-point shots made as a team in the first 28 games of the season. The Seminoles' 224 made 3-point field goals are the fifth highest single season team total in school history. Florida State averages 8.0 made 3-point shots and have made at least five shots from distance in 27 of its 28 games.

**FLORIDA STATE UTILIZING ITS SIZE**

Florida State outscored NC State by a margin of +20 (54-34) in the points scored in the paint category on Sunday night in Raleigh. It marked the eighth time in the last nine games (with one tie) that Florida State had outscored its opponent in the paint. The Seminoles' current streak began when it outscored Georgia Tech by a 44-28 margin in the paint in defeating the Yellow Jackets by an 88-77 margin (Jan. 24).

**FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME**

Florida State is undefeated, 3-0, in its three overtime games this season. The Seminoles have defeated Syracuse (Jan. 13; 101-90), No. 24 Miami (Jan. 27; 104-93 in double overtime) and No. 11 Clemson (Feb. 14; 81-79). The Seminoles are shooting .571 (20 of 28) from the field and averaging 11.8 points in four overtime periods. Florida State tied its school record with 20 points and scored on all 12 of its possessions in overtime in its 103-94 victory over Miami.

**SEMINOLES RANK THIRD IN THE ACC IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE**

Florida State, which is ranked third in the ACC with a .476 team field goal shooting percentage, is shooting a combined .518 from the field in the last three games. The Seminoles shot a season-high 60 percent from the field in beating Miami in overtime in Tallahassee (Jan. 27, 103-94).

**FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST GAME**

Leonard Hamilton's 500th win as a college head coach will be one he is going to remember for a long time. Hamilton's Florida State team trailed 11th-ranked Clemson by 18 early in the second half but rallied to send it into overtime before winning 81-79 on February 14, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State tied the game twice in the second half but didn't take its first lead until 1:05 remaining in overtime when Trent Forrest made a layup to put them up 75-74. The 6-foot-5 sophomore guard, who came into the game averaging 6.0 points, scored a career-high 16 with eight coming in the final 5:08 of the game. After Clemson was called for a 5-second violation on the inbounds, Forrest came up big with another driving layup to put Florida State up by three. Clemson scored four of the next six points to get within 79-78 but Forrest made both free throws with 5.3 seconds remaining to extend the margin to three. Reed was fouled with 3 seconds remaining. He made the first and missed the second. Clemson was unable to get off a last-second shot though to send it to another overtime. Phil Cofer scored all 17 of his points after halftime. An Aamir Simms 3-pointer gave the Tigers a 49-31 lead with 18:06 remaining before Florida State was able to start battling back as it went on a 17-2 run. Clemson would score four straight to go up 55-48 but the Seminoles eventually fought back to tie it at 59 on Cofer's jumper with 6:59 remaining. The Tigers scored seven straight points and appeared to regain control. They were up 70-64 with 2:24 remaining, but missed their final four shots in regulation. Florida State made its last three shots to send it into overtime, including a driving off-balance layup by Forrest with eight seconds remaining. Marcquise Reed scored 23 points while Gabe Devoe had 11 and David Skara had nine for Clemson.

**Florida State Men's Basketball  
By The Numbers**

**1** Sophomore Trent Forrest led the Seminoles in scoring with 16 points at NC State. It marked the first time in his career that he has led the Seminoles in scoring.

**2** Senior Phil Cofer and sophomore CJ Walker are the only two Seminoles to start all 26 games for the Seminoles this season. Eight different players have started at least one game for Florida State this season.

**3** Sophomore Trent Forrest has scored in double figures in three consecutive games and is averaging 14.7 points in that stretch of games (career-high 16 against Clemson and NC State and 12 against Pittsburgh).

**3** Florida State has won each of its three overtime games this season with victories over Syracuse (Jan. 13) Miami (Jan. 27) and Clemson (Feb. 14). The school record for overtime wins in a single season is four during the 1992-93 season.

**5** Senior Phil Cofer has made five consecutive free throws entering Wednesday's game against Clemson. He has made each of his free throw attempts in the last four games and was a perfect two of two from the free throw line against NC State.

**7** Junior Terance Mann is ranked seventh in school history with his .579 career field goal shooting percentage. He has shot .584 (as a freshman), .575 (as a sophomore) and is shooting .574 (as a junior) this season.

**8** Sophomore Trent Forrest has earned eight steals in the last four games (2.0 spg) with three steals coming at Notre Dame (Feb. 10) and at NC State (Feb. 25).

**9** Senior Braian Angola is ranked ninth in school history with his .385 career 3-point field goal percentage.

**10** Junior PJ Savoy is ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in school history with his career-3-point field goal shooting percentage of .384. He is one of 12 players in school history to shoot 38 percent or better from the 3-point line.

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FIELD IN THE SECOND HALF RECENTLY**

Florida State, which has earned two come-from-behind victories (against Clemson and Pitt) in the last two weeks, is playing its best basketball after halftime since rallying from an 18-point deficit to defeat Clemson (Feb. 14) in the first meeting between the two teams. Florida State is shooting .609 and outscoring its three opponents by 25 total points in the second halves of its last three games.

He scored 17 points (all in the second half) of Florida State's victory over Clemson on (Feb. 14) in the first meeting between the two teams this season;

Walker's momentum building shot began a 7-0 spurt which gave Florida State a 77-74 lead and helped Florida State close the win on an 11-5 run in the final 1:56.

**Sophomores Stepping Up For Florida State  
During Stretch Run

Florida State's 2016 basketball recruiting class is showing that it shouldn't be defined by just one person.

Jonathan Isaac garnered most of the attention last season before deciding to leave college after one year for the NBA, where he was the sixth overall selection by Orlando. With Isaac's departure, sophomore guards CJ Walker and Trent Forrest along with redshirt freshman Mfondu Kabengele are making solid contributions for the 18-8 Seminoles.

"I can see the growth," coach Leonard Hamilton said. "They are more invested; they talk more and are more confident."

The class was rated fourth nationally by 247 Sports, but Isaac garnered the lion's share of attention as he was considered one of the top recruits in program history. He averaged 12.0 points and 7.8 rebounds while Walker and Forrest, who were rated as four-star recruits, had limited roles off the bench.

Walker, who can play either guard spot, has started every game this season after coming off the bench last year. The 6-foot-1 Indianapolis native is averaging 9.4 points per game but has scored in double figures in three of the last six games. He is also shooting 68 percent from the field (15 of 22) over the past four games.

Walker has seen his minutes more than double to 25.7 per game this year. With the Seminoles preparing to enter the stretch drive of the regular season, Walker said the important thing at this stage is trying to make sure he is better prepared mentally.

"Coming in as a freshman you want to do everything but when it gets to the last quarter of the season you need to watch more film and be more focused instead of relying on being just physical," he said.

Forrest, who grew up nearby in Chipley, Florida, has come off the bench and run the floor as the point guard. He has been content to create opportunities for teammates for most of the season but scored a career-high 16 points in Wednesday's overtime win over No. 11 Clemson. The 6-5 Forrest scored eight of the Seminoles' last 13 points, including the game-winning basket.

"I feel real good where my game is. I've been playing off my teammates," said Forrest, who is averaging 6.4 points. "I have to continue to be aggressive."

Kabengele was a guard until the end of his junior year in high school, when he grew three inches to 6-7. After redshirting last season, the Burlington, Ontario, native — who is the nephew of former NBA standout Dikembe Mutombo — is acclimating to the college game, averaging 8.2 points.

"I feel like I'm king of getting the pace of the game," Kabengele said. "The way the referees are going to officiate and what I can do and what I can't do. I'm just waiting for my spots to be aggressive by being more observant on the court."

Isaac, who has had an injury-plagued rookie season for the Magic, is on campus this weekend as most of the NBA is off for the All-Star Game. Isaac, who is averaging 5.3 points and 3.7 rebounds, still keeps in regular contact with his former teammates and has been pleased with seeing them take the next step.

"It's amazing to see them progress and come into their own," Isaac said. "To watch them playing great is fun to see."

**OBIAGU AGAINST NC STATE**

In his first stretch of extended playing time since the beginning of the Seminoles' ACC season, freshman Ike Obiagu turned in quite a performance against NC State on Sunday night. He totaled six blocked shots, one steal and one rebound in 13 minutes of play against the Wolfpack. Obiagu's 13 minutes played were his most minutes in a single game since also playing 13 as a starter against Duke (Dec. 30) in the ACC opener for both teams.

**NOTING OBAIGU'S BLOCKED SHOTS...**

...His six blocked shots against NC State marked the second time this season that he had blocked at least five shots in a game — he totaled five in the Seminoles' victory over Rutgers in the ACC/Big ten Challenge (Nov. 28). He has blocked multiple shots in 15 of his 27 games as a freshman;

...His 51 blocked shots are the third most by a freshman in a single season in school history and is the 11<sup>th</sup> highest single-season total in school history. He is one of only 11 players in school history with 50 or more blocks in a season.

**KOUMADJE IN TOP 20 IN SCHOOL HISTORY FOR BLOCKED SHOTS**

Junior Christ Koumadje enters Wednesday's game against Clemson ranked 17<sup>th</sup> in school history with 87 career blocked shots. Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116, Central Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. Junior PJ Savoy, the team's top marksman from a year ago made four on the night, on the way to 19 points in the contest. Seven different Seminoles hit a three on the night, a stark contrast from a season ago when the team ranked near the bottom of the ACC in three-point shooting and percentage. The depth on the roster, especially of those with shooting capabilities provides FSU with more versatility on the offensive end than it had last year. The game also provided a first glimpse of some new faces for the Seminoles, including the debut of highly recruited M.J.Walker. The true freshman dropped 17 points in his first game dawning the Garnet and Gold. Flashes of the athleticism that made him a five-star recruit appeared against the Mules, while the Jonesboro, Ga., native also showed some ability from the 3-point line.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennesaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. **Game 27 -- Florida State 88, Pitt 75**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- PJ Savoy led Florida State with 18 points and M.J. Walker added 16 as the Seminoles pulled away in the second half for an 88-75 victory visiting Pittsburgh. All five of Savoy's field goals were 3-pointers as he led the Seminoles in scoring for the second time this season. The 6-foot-4 junior missed seven games but is averaging 12.3 points and is 10 of 21 on 3-pointers in three games since returning from a knee injury. The Panthers led 39-38 at halftime after hitting 10 of 17 from 3-point range in the first half but Florida State took the lead with a 9-2 run to start the second half. Pitt, which was 2 of 6 on 3-pointers in the second half, was still within three (74-71) with 3:29 remaining but FSU took control with a 7-1 run. The Seminoles, who were 26 of 47 from the field, took 18 more trips to foul line and had a 36-24 advantage in points in the paint. They also had a 17-3 edge in second-chance points. Jared Wilson-Frame and Shamiler Stevenson led Pittsburgh with 17 points each and Parker Stewart added 16.
