SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO CLEMSON AT TUCKER CENTER ON WEDNESDAY AT 7:00 P.M.

Florida State, which has won three consecutive games against Clemson, plays host to the Tigers on Wednesday, Feb. 14, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles defeated the Tigers at both sites of the home-and-home series last season and defeated the Tigers in the second of the two meetings between the teams two seasons ago on Jan. 20, 2016. Florida State’s game against the Tigers is the first of two meetings between the two teams this season and the first of two meetings in the next 14 days. The Seminoles travel to face the Tigers at Littlejohn Coliseum on Wednesday, Feb 28, 2018 to close out the regular season meeting between the teams. Florida State has won four of its last seven games with wins over Virginia Tech (Jan. 20), Georgia Tech (Jan 24), Miami (Jan, 27) and at Louisville (Feb. 3). Following their game against Clemson on Valentine’s Day, the Seminoles play host to Pitt in the only meeting of the regular season between Florida State and the Panthers on Sunday, Feb. 18 at the Tucker Center.

SEMINOLES’ HAMILTON GOES FOR WIN NO. 500 AGAINST CLEMSON

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton is pursuing his 500th career victory and his 300th at Florida State as the Seminoles plays host to Clemson on Wednesday. The NCAA recognizes Hamilton with 499 career wins - 299 at Florida State - following the vacation of 22 victories from the 2008-09 season. In terms of games won on the court, Hamilton has an overall record of 521-413 spanning 30 collegiate seasons and is 321-203 in his 16 seasons leading the Seminoles. Averaging 20 wins a season, he is Florida State’s all-time leader in victories.

SEMINOLES GO FOR WIN NO. 4 AGAINST A RANKED TEAM THIS SEASON

Florida State plays Clemson looking to gain its fourth win of the season over a nationally ranked team. The Seminoles count victories over No. 5 Florida (83-66, Dec 4), No. 10 North Carolina (81-80, Jan. 3) and No. 24 Miami (104-93 in overtime, Jan. 27) on the resume this season. The Seminoles have defeated 10 ranked teams (a school-record tying seven during the 2016-17 season and three during the 2017-18 season) in the last two years and 49 games. The Seminoles have gained victories over a nationally ranked team in 10 of their last 38 wins (.263 percent) since the start of the 2016-17 season. Florida State is 33-16 (.673 winning percentage) in the last two seasons.

ANGOLA AMONG FLORIDA STATE’S ALL-TIME LEADERS IN TWO CATEGORIES

Senior Braian Angola enters Wednesday’s game against Clemson ranked second in school history with his .818 career free throw shooting percentage and seventh in school history with his .397 3-point field goal shooting percentage. He is shooting a career-high .835 from the free throw line and .388 from the 3-point line this season.

SEMINOLES ON VALENTINE’S DAY

Florida State has an all-time record of 12-8 including six wins in its last 12 games on Valentine’s Day since it first played on Feb. 14 during the 1949-50 season. The Seminoles are 1-1 against Clemson on Valentine’s Day with its win coming during the 2013-04 season in Tallahassee.

...Defeat Clemson and gain its fourth consecutive victory over the Tigers. The Seminoles have earned two winning streaks of at least four games in the series between the two teams that dates back to the 1951-52 season;
 ...Defeat Clemson and gain its third consecutive home court victory over the Tigers for the fourth time in the history of the series. The Seminoles won at least three consecutive games against the Tigers three times (1993, 1994, 1995, 1996), (2009, 2010, 2011) and (2012, 2013, 2014);

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 276 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 17-8 (2017-18).

FLORIDA STATE BIG WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS AT HOME UNDER LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State has defeated 41 nationally ranked teams in the 16-year tenure of Leonard Hamilton. The winningest coach in Florida State history, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 14 wins over teams ranked in the top 15 of the Associated Press poll since the beginning of the 2002-03 season.

FLORIDA STATE WITH WINS OVER RANKED CLEMSON TEAMS

Florida State's most recent win over a nationally ranked Clemson team came on Feb. 28, 2009 when the Seminoles defeated the then No. 17 ranked Tigers, 73-66, at the Donald L Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State is 5-3 against a ranked Clemson team since first playing the Tigers when they were in the national top-25 on Jan. 17, 1996. The Seminoles are 3-2 against Clemson in games when the Tigers are nationally ranked and the game is played in Tallahassee.

SEMINOLES SHOOT WELL FROM 3-POINT LINE AGAINST NOTRE DAME

Florida State made nine 3-point field goals in its game at Notre Dame on Saturday and enters Wednesday's game against Clemson ranked fourth in the ACC in 3-point field goals made per game. The Seminoles have made at least five shots from distance in each of their 25 games this season and have made in double figures in 3-point shots three times (15 vs. Duke, 11 vs. North Carolina and 11 vs. Syracuse) and have made at least nine in three more games (nine against Virginia Tech, nine against Miami and nine against Notre Dame).

ONE OF FLORIDA STATE'S MANY STRENGTHS IS REBOUNDING

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Clemson ranked third in the ACC in rebounding with a 39.2 rebounds per game average and fourth in the ACC with a positive rebounding margin of +4.0 rebounds per game. The Seminoles have earned a positive rebounding margin in four of their last five games and have not lost the rebounding battle since Jan. 24 against Georgia Tech. Florida State has earned a double figure rebounding margin in four ACC games and in seven games this season. The Seminoles largest rebounding margin of the season came in its 83-66 win over No 5 Florida (+17) while its largest ACC rebounding margin came against Boston College (+14)

FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST GAME

Xavier Rathan-Mayes hit the go-ahead basket with 1:22 left and Florida State defeated Clemson, 76-74 on Feb. 25, 2017 at Littlejohn Coliseum. Jonathan Isaac of Florida State blocked Shelton Mitchell's drive with 11 seconds left after Rathan-Mayes' final hoop. After Trent Forrest made a free throw for the Seminoles, Marquise Reed came up short on a mid-range jumper with five seconds to go as the Seminoles held on to win their 23rd game in the regular season for the first time since 2008-09. Florida State kept pace in the Atlantic Coast Conference race, remaining two games behind league leader North Carolina entering the final week of the season. Florida State looked ready to stretch this one out after Forrest had a basket and two foul shots to put the Seminoles up 69-64 with 4:19 to go. But Jaron Blossomgame answered with a basket and Mitchell hit a 3-pointer to tie things once more. Blossomgame finished with a game-high 24 points. Isaac had 14 points and Dwayne Bacon added 12 for Florida State.

FLORIDA STATE GOING TO THE OFFENSIVE GLASS

Florida State totaled 11 offensive rebounds against Notre Dame on Saturday and has earned double figure offensive rebounds in 15 of its 25 games. The Seminoles totaled a season-high 23 offensive rebounds in its victory over Syracuse (Jan. 23) and have earned at least 20 offensive rebounds in four different games (at Florida, at Miami, Syracuse and at Boston College). The Seminoles have earned more second chance points than their opponent in three of their last five and eight of their 13 ACC games.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.533 Sophomore CJ Walker is shooting .533 from the 3-point line (eight of 15) in the last five games. He has made at least one shot from the bonusphere in each of those five games and made a career-high tying four from distance against Notre Dame.

.706 Sophomore CJ Walker is shooting .706 from the field (12 of 17) and averaging 11.0 points scored in the last three games. He totaled 10 points in Florida State's win over Louisville and scored a team-leading 16 points against Notre Dame.

.778 Sophomore Trent Forrest is shooting .778 from the free throw line (14 of 18) in the last five games. He made four free throws in Florida State's win over Louisville and against Notre Dame.

.778 Senior Phil Cofer is shooting .778 from the free throw line in the last five games (14 of 18). He made four free throws each against both Louisville and Notre Dame.

2 Sophomore Trent Forrest blocked a career-high two shots against Notre Dame on Saturday. He has seven blocked shots this season after blocking five shots in 35 games as a freshman.

2 Senior Phil Cofer and sophomore CJ Walker are the only two Seminoles to start all 25 games for the Seminoles this season. Eight different players have started at least one game for Florida State this season.

7 Junior Terance Mann is ranked seventh in school history with his career-field goal shooting percentage of .578. He is one of only 11 players in school history to shoot 57 percent or better from the field.

8 Ike Obiagu is ranked eighth in the ACC – and second among freshman – with 44 blocks and a 1.8 blocked shots per game average. He is one of only two freshmen in the ACC with 40 or more blocked shots (also Wendell Carter, Jr. of Duke)

10.9 Sophomore CJ Walker is averaging 10.9 points in the last eight games and has scored in double figures in five of the last eight games. He scored his ACC career-high of 19 points against Boston College (Jan. 15).

13 Senior Phil Cofer has made at least one 3-point field goals in 16 consecutive games and is shooting .392 from the bonusphere since making five 3-point shots against Oklahoma State (Dec. 16).

13 Junior PJ Savoy enters Wednesday's game against Clemson tied for 13th in school history with his .376 career 3-point field goal shooting percentage.

17 Florida State is undefeated, 17-0, when it outscores its opponent.

22 Senior Braian Angola has started 22 consecutive games. He has been in the Seminoles' starting five each game since the Seminoles' victory over Kennesaw State (Nov. 22).

ASSIST ME PLEASE

Florida State averages 15.7 assists on its 29.7 made field goals per game entering Wednesday's game against Clemson. The Seminoles have earned double figure assist in 24 of their 25 games with its ACC season-high of 23 assists on 33 baskets coming in its double overtime victory over Syracuse (Jan 13) and its overall season-high of 27 assists coming on 37 baskets in its win over Southern Miss (Dec. 21).

SEMINOLES HOLDING ONTO THE BASKETBALL

Florida State committed a season-low seven turnovers in its overtime victory over Miami (104-93, Jan, 27) in Tallahassee and enter Wednesday's game against Clemson averaging only 11.8 turnovers in 13 ACC games. The Seminoles' seven turnovers in their win over Miami included only one in the second half (on a shot clock violation) and only one in the final 32:25 of the win. Florida State turned the ball over only nine times in its win over Rutgers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (Nov. 28) and only nine times against Wake Forest (Jan. 31). This season marks the third consecutive year the Seminoles have a positive assist:turnover ratio.

Getting To Know Mfiondu Kabengele

The 2016 recruiting class was one of the best ever for the Florida State men's basketball team.

Three freshmen – Jonathan Isaac, Trent Forrest and CJ Walker – and two junior college transfers – Braian Angola and PJ Savoy - lived up to the billing, helping to continue the winning culture on the basketball court in Tallahassee. With a trip to the NCAA Tournament and a second-place finish in the ACC standings in 2017 under head coach Leonard Hamilton, it should come as no surprise that each newcomer played an integral role in helping Florida State make valuable strides as a program a season ago.

Kabengele is a 6-foot-10, 230-pound forward in his second season with the Seminoles after redshirting in 2016-17. He hails from Burlington, Ontario, and is the nephew of Basketball Hall-of-Famer Dikembe Mutombo.

After sitting out of AAU basketball during his sophomore year to train and develop, Mfiondu began to draw attention from established college basketball programs across the country. Six schools – Wisconsin, Georgetown, Kansas State, Georgia, Boston College and Florida State – all came calling,

Kabengele sought guidance from his uncle.

“When I went on my college visits, he told me questions to ask, rather than being star-struck with the coaches and how they treat you,” said Kabengele. “He was very strategic on how to approach the process. He told me to not only look at the name of the school, but at the people who were there and the other variables around it. He was really great about everything.”

Like his uncle, Kabengele possesses a fabulous shot-blocking wingspan paired with a smile and charisma that is almost as big as his stature.

As one of his roommates, guard Trent Forrest knows Kabengele as well as any member of the team.

“He is a great person to be around,” said Forrest. “He has a great sense of humor, and that translates in the locker room and helps the overall chemistry of the team.”

But on the court, Kabengele has his own unique game that he hopes to showcase this season. Expecting the 20-year-old to model his play after the most dominant athlete in his family would be a mistake.

“I love emulating Lamar Odom. I love Kevin Love. I love Draymond Green, especially because he's surrounded by stars and great players but still finds his niche and maximizes it,” said Kabengele.

Growing up a Lakers fan, Kabengele watched his favorite team make consecutive NBA Finals appearances in 2009 and 2010.

There's the CEO of Chick Fil-A, there's 2 Chainz, and then there's MJ Walker.

It's not easy to find Jonesboro, Georgia on a map. Only 5,000 people live in the town, and many of those born there end up staying. The people that make it out do not take it lightly. MJ Walker knows that.

"It was tough. There were a lot of distractions ... all kinds of trouble. Everybody is trying to get their own and make it," Walker says, re-living much of it in his mind. "I just tried to stay focused. Basketball helped me."

Playing basketball is Walker's earliest memory. A stellar high school career, count it. An invitation to the McDonald's All-American game, check. Five-stars as a recruit coming out of high school, no doubt. So, when did his favorite moment of playing basketball happen?

At nine years old...in a church league.

"There were two minutes left," Walker's eyes suddenly light up. "I got the ball, pounded it, got fouled and scored. I never show emotion in a game. That was the first time I ever screamed after I scored. After that, I knew I had that dog in me."

The ring of an elevator seems to come out of nowhere in a silent hallway of the FSU basketball practice facility. A basketball hits the hardwood in the distance every now and then.

Despite daily dosages of practice, film watching and class, Walker takes pride in arriving punctually. He drops everything in his arms just to shake hands. The walls of the facility are filled with photographs of standout freshman — from Beasley to Bacon to Isaac. Walker notices them every day, envisioning himself popping out of those same picture frames.

"That's one of the reasons why I came here. It was a good opportunity for me to take over what the [freshmen] used to do for the program," Walker says with a look of determination. "With what I can do, I felt like I would fit well in the program."

Shooting 42 percent from the field and 40 percent from beyond the arc is certainly a good start. Already one of FSU's strongest shooters, Walker's ability to create his own shot adds yet another dimension to a Florida State offense that's ranked third in the ACC in scoring.

"MJ is giving us everything he has," head coach Leonard Hamilton says about the true freshman. "He's coachable. He's a great teammate and he's got a good relationship with players and coaches."

With scholarship offers from UCLA, Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech lined up out of high school, the 6-5 guard chose the Garnet & Gold. Tough choice, right?

Not for MJ Walker.

"Family. That's the most important thing," Walker says without hesitation. "The loyalty as well. Florida State's coaches had been recruiting me since ninth grade. They cared about my life."

Caring is the first step in every walk of life, from the biggest cities to the smallest towns. For a small town in Georgia, Jonesboro has notable natives. 2 Chainz, Chick-Fil-A's CEO and several professional athletes are just a few to have made it out of Clayton County. Walker lights up at the thought of being on that list.

"It would mean a lot," Walker takes a breath before looking out onto the court. "A lot of good guys made it out of that area. Those are guys that I looked up to. It gave me hope that I could make it out."

Memories fly out of Walker's mind in a vacuum. Jonesboro is still very much with him, probably resting on a shoulder like the "chip" so often described by those who make it out. Time passes, practice is about to start, and so it's back down the elevator. Drake's "God's Plan" is blaring in a nearby film room on the first floor.

To Walker, landing at Florida State is part of the plan — a plan so vivid that he must see it every time he closes his eyes. Trusting the process is something that he and his father have always lived by, but the first part of the process is remembering where you come from. To Walker, that means never being far removed from what he started as.
