SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO NC STATE FOR FIRST GAME OF SEASON AGAINST WOLFPACK

Florida State, which has won two consecutive and six of its last nine games since winning at Virginia Tech on Jan. 20, travels to play at NC State on Sunday, Feb. 25, 2018 at the PNC Arena in Raleigh, N.C. The Seminoles’ game against the Wolfpack is the first and only meeting between the two teams in the regular season and is the final team on their ACC schedule they have yet to face this season. Florida State enters Sunday’s game against NC State having won two consecutive games – against No. 11 Clemson (Feb. 14, 81-79 in overtime and Feb. 18, 88-75 over Pitt) – and after one week off from playing an ACC game. The Seminoles’ most recent game came against Pittsburgh last Sunday in Tallahassee. Florida State has won three consecutive games against NC State and are looking for its first four game winning streak in the series since winning five straight during the 1991-92 and 1992-93 seasons. The Seminoles won the first five games against the Wolfpack when they became members of the ACC for the 1991-92 season. Following Sunday’s game against NC State, the Seminoles will travel to play at Clemson (Wednesday, Feb. 28; 9:00 pm.) in their final road game of the regular season.

SEMINOLES RETURN TO THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters Sunday’s game against NC State ranked No. 25 in this weeks Associated Press poll. It marks the sixth week this season the Seminoles have been ranked in the AP poll. Florida State was ranked in five consecutive weeks in December and January -- Dec. 11, No. 19; Dec. 18, No. 24; Dec. 25, No. 24; Jan. 1, No. 24; and Jan. 8, No. 23). The Seminoles will play their sixth game as a nationally ranked team against NC State and are 2-3 when playing as a ranked team this season.

FLORIDA STATE WITH FOUR WINS OVER NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

Florida State has four wins over nationally ranked teams this season – 83-66 over No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4), 81-80 over No. 11 North Carolina (Jan. 3), 103-94 in overtime against No. 24 Miami (Jan. 27) and 81-79 in overtime over No. 11 Clemson (Feb. 14). The Seminoles have defeated 11 nationally ranked teams in the last two seasons.

FLORIDA STATE’S LEONARD HAMILTON IN THE ACC RECORD BOOK

Florida State’s Leonard Hamilton, who won his 500th career game against Clemson (81-79 in overtime) on Feb. 14, enters Sunday’s game against NC State ranked eighth in ACC history with 301 victories in 16 seasons at Florida State and eighth in ACC history with 135 career ACC victories (ACC regular season and Tournament). Hamilton is only 25 victories behind Virginia legend Terry Holland (326 wins) on the all-time ACC career victories list and is only four victories behind Maryland’s Lefty Driesell (139 wins) on the all-time ACC (regular season ACC Tournament) career victories list.

MANN STANDS AS ONE OF FOUR IN THE ACC

Florida State’s Terance Mann enters Sunday’s game at NC State as one of only four players in the ACC who is leading his team in both scoring and rebounding. Mann has scored a career-high 365 points and averages a career-high 14.0 points and has pulled down 151 rebounds and is averaging a career-high 5.8 rebounds per game.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 45-16 (.738 winning percentage) and have defeated 11 nationally ranked teams in the last two seasons. The Seminoles average 22.5 wins in the last two seasons including 26 during the 2016-17 season.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat NC State and win its 20th game of the season. It would mark the third consecutive season the Seminoles would have won at least 20 games. Most recently the Seminoles won 20 games in 2017 (26 wins), 2016 (20 wins, 2014 (24 wins), 2012 (25 wins), 2011 (23 wins), 2010 (22 wins) and 2009 (25 wins);

...Defeat NC State and win its ninth ACC game of the season. It would mark the second consecutive season the Seminoles has won at least nine conference games. The Seminoles were 12-6 in ACC play in 2016-17; ...Defeat NC State and win its fourth consecutive game against the Wolfpack. Florida State won five consecutive games against the Wolfpack during the 1991-92 and 1992-93 seasons – the first two years the Seminoles were in the ACC.

FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 276 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 19-8 (2017-18).

FLORIDA STATE'S RECORD

In winning six of its last nine games, the Seminoles have improved from 2-4 in the ACC (on January 15) to 8-7 in ACC play (on Feb. 18) following its victory over Pittsburgh on Feb. 18 in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE OFFENSIVELY IN ITS LAST TWO GAMES

Florida State is shooting a combined .527 and averaging 84.5 points scored per game in its last two victories over No. 11 Clemson (Feb. 14) and Pitt (Feb. 18). The Seminoles are shooting a combined 60 percent (36 of 60) and averaging 45.5 points in the second halves of both of their wins over the Tigers and the Panthers. In both games, the Seminoles trailed at halftime (41-29 to Clemson and 39-38 to Pitt) and outscored the Tigers (41-29, +12) and the Panthers (50-36, +14) by an average of 13 second half points. Florida State outscored the Tigers by an 11-9 margin in the overtime period to gain its fourth win over a ranked team this season.

FLORIDA STATE HAS LIMITED ITS TURNOVERS IN ITS LAST TWO VICTORIES

Florida State has averaged three second half turnovers and surrendered a total of three points off of turnovers in the second halves of its last two games – both wins over Clemson and Pitt. The Seminoles also limited their turnovers in overtime against Clemson with two Florida State turnovers leading to only one Clemson point as the Seminoles outscored the Tigers by an 11-9 margin in the extra time to win the game. The Seminoles' defense forced Clemson into 12 second half turnovers which they turned into 19 points in forcing overtime after trailing 18 points with 18:06 remaining in regulation. Florida State forced Pitt in to eight second half turnovers which resulted in 15 points off turnovers after halftime. The Seminoles forced three Clemson turnovers in overtime which resulted in two more points in their victory.

FLORIDA STATE'S DOUBLE FIGURE ACC WINS

Florida State has earned three double figure wins in ACC play (+11 vs. Syracuse, +11 vs. Georgia Tech and +13 vs. Pitt). The Seminoles' 13-point margin of victory over Pitt on Sunday in Tallahassee marked their 10th double figure scoring margin in a victory in ACC play in the last two seasons. Entering Sunday's game against NC State, the Seminoles have earned half (10) of their last 20 ACC victories by 10 points or more in the last two seasons.

FLORIDA STATE GETS TO THE LINE AGAINST PITT

Florida State made a season-high 29 free throws in its victory over Pitt on Sunday in Tallahassee – tied for the seventh highest free throw made total in an ACC game in school history. The Seminoles' 40 free throws attempted against the Panthers is tied for the third highest in ACC play in school history.

SEMINOLES RANKED THIRD IN ACC FOR FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE SHOOTING

Florida State is ranked third in the ACC with a .475 team field goal shooting percentage and are one of only three teams in the ACC shooting 47 percent or better from the field for the season. The Seminoles have shot better than 50 percent from the field in both of its last two games (.553 in its win over Pitt and .525 in its win over Clemson) and have shot 50 percent or better in five ACC games this season. The Seminoles are 5-0 in ACC play when shooting 50 percent of better from the field (victories over Virginia Tech, Georgia Tech, Miami, Clemson and Pitt).

SEMINOLES RANKED FOURTH IN ACC FOR REBOUNDING MARGIN

Florida State enters Sunday's game against NC State ranked fourth in the ACC with a +4.1 rebounds per game margin. The Seminoles have outrebounded six of their last seven opponents and has not been outrebounded since Jan. 24 by Georgia Tech. Florida State has outrebounded 12 of its 15 ACC opponents (except for Duke, North Carolina and Georgia Tech) and totaled 50 rebounds in consecutive games against Syracuse (Jan. 13) and at Boston College (Jan. 15).

SEMINOLES SCORING AVERAGE

Florida State enters Sunday's game against NC State ranked third in the ACC in scoring offense with an 83.0 points per game scoring average. The Seminoles' 83.0 points per game scoring average is the highest under head coach Leonard Hamilton and the highest since the 1992-93 season when Florida State averaged 86.3 points in advancing to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NC STATE – THE LAST GAME

Jonathan Isaac led 14th-ranked Florida State with 21 points as they defeated North Carolina State 95-71 on Feb. 6, 2017 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. North Carolina State's Dennis Smith Jr. matched a season-low with eight points and was held scoreless in the first half for the first time this season. Dwayne Bacon added 19 points and Michael Ojo had 11 for FSU, which won its 18 straight at home and, at one point, led by as many as 26 points in the second half. Bacon scored in double figures in the 34th straight games, which was the longest in program history since Alton Lee Gipson in 1984-85. Terry Henderson led the Wolfpack with 17 points while Maverick Rowan and Abdul-Malik Abu added 16 apiece.

Forrest Has Career Night At The Absolute Perfect Time

It was actually CJ Walker who suggested to the Florida State coaches that the final possession in regulation (against Clemson Feb. 14) should go to Trent Forrest.

So in the closing seconds, with the Seminoles down two, the ball found its way to the sophomore guard at the top of the key. He drove right and made a sensational runner in the paint to tie the game at 70.

He then scored six more points in overtime for the Seminoles in their dramatic - and very important - 81-79 victory over the No. 11 Tigers.

"Just attack the rim," Forrest said. "That's what Coach Ham was making the emphasis on us to us in the huddle. And I just did what he told me to."

It worked.

Forrest hit arguably the biggest shot of the season for the Seminoles to send the game to overtime, then hit two critical layups and two free throws in the final 90 seconds to lead the Seminoles to a crucial win over a team that was ranked No. 4 in the RPI.

Forrest finished with a career-high 16 points.

"I really was just playing off my teammates and taking whatever the defense gave me," Forrest said. "That's all it really was."

It was that first layup in overtime, the one where he drove right, spun back left in a flash and somehow ended up on the other side of the basket for a go-ahead layup that was the highlight of the night.

It was a remarkable move and it gave the Seminoles their first lead of the night.

"I knew (the defender) was probably going to try to cut me off," Forrest said. "I knew he was a strip defender, so I had to make a change of direction. Then after that I kind of just found the rim and that was it."

"... I wouldn't say I practice (that move). I just work on finishing around the rim, just knowing my angles on the glass, knowing where to put the ball."

It's not Forrest hasn't hit big buckets before. He was an elite scorer during his high school days in Pensacola. He routinely would score 40-plus points. And he had some nice moments during his freshman season as well.

But Wednesday night was by far the best offensive game of his college career.

"Trent is extremely intelligent," Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton said. "High basketball IQ. Extremely competitive. ... Trent scored 3,000 points in high school. So he's very capable. He's a pass-first guy. He's extremely unselfish. He does the best job of getting inside and finding his teammates. He's not (concerned) with the fact that he's not scoring a lot of points."

"He's a winner. He's trying to do everything he thinks is in the best interest for us to win. For a guy that scored 3,000 points in high school you'd think he want to shoot the ball. But he's such a team guy and he has such an unselfish guy. ... I still think his best basketball is ahead of him."

MANN IS FLORIDA STATE'S SCORING LEADER

Junior Terance Mann enters Sunday's game against NC State ranked as the Seminoles' leading scorer with a career-high 14.0 points per game scoring average. He has significantly increased his scoring average throughout his career and is averaging nearly nine points per game more as a junior (14.0) than he did as a freshman (5.2). Mann has scored in double figures a career-high 20 times with his career-high of 30 points coming in Florida State's victory over Georgia Tech.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Phil Cofer matched a career high with 21 points and fell just one rebound short of a double-double as Florida State raced past Kennesaw State, 98-79, in a Wednesday matinee. Cofer scored the game's first six points on the way to a 9-of-11 shooting effort, and his 28 minutes were the most since he logged 29 at NC State on Jan. 17, 2015. And he did it from all over the floor -- Cofer threw down a dunk and a handful of layups, was 2 for 2 from the free-throw line and even drained his only 3-point attempt. Braian Angola (17 points, seven rebounds), Terance Mann (13 points), C.J. Walker (12) and M.J. Game 25 -- Notre Dame 84, Florida State 69

NOTRE DAME, Ind. -- Matt Farrell scored a career-high 28 points to lead Notre Dame's potent three-guard attack in an 84-69 victory over Florida State. Rex Pfluger added a career-high 19 points and T.J. Gibbs matched him with 19 after a poor-shooting first half (2 of 12) as Mike Brey's Irish won their second straight. C.J. Walker had 16 points, Phil Cofer, 12 and PJ Savoy, 11 — all in the first half — for the Seminoles. Both teams struggled shooting early — Florida State went 5 1/2 minutes between field goals and Notre Dame nearly 5 minutes — before the Irish found their stroke from 3-point range hitting six of its first 12 on way to its biggest lead of the half, 32-22, with 3:42 before the half. The Irish then answered a 6-0 Seminole run and took a 40-34 halftime lead on the fourth 3-pointer by Farrell, who had 14 points. Florida State's height began to wear down the Irish on the boards in the second half. The Seminoles had a 16-9 edge and eventually caught the Irish 52-52 with 10:29 left on Walker's 3-pointer. But Gibbs made three free throws to give the Irish a 61-56 lead with 7:49 left. His driving bucket, combined with FSU's 3 1/2-minute scoring, gave the Irish a 70-58 lead with 3:57 remaining.

Game 26 -- Florida State 81, Clemson 79 (OT)

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Leonard Hamilton's 500th win as a college head coach will be one he is going to remember for a

long time. Hamilton's Florida State team trailed 11th-ranked Clemson by 18 early in the second half but rallied to send it into overtime before winning 81-79. Florida State tied the game twice in the second half but didn't take its first lead until 1:05 remaining in overtime when Trent Forrest made a layup to put them up 75-74. The 6-foot-5 sophomore guard, who came into the game averaging 6.0 points, scored a career-high 16 with eight coming in the final 5:08 of the game. After Clemson was called for a 5-second violation on the inbound, Forrest came up big with another driving layup to put Florida State up by three. Clemson scored four of the next six points to get within 79-78 but Forrest made both free throws with 5.3 seconds remaining to extend the margin to three. Reed was fouled with 3 seconds remaining. He made the first and missed the second. Clemson was unable to get off a last-second shot though to send it to another overtime. Phil Cofer, who scored all 17 of his points after halftime, said the key to the rally was being more aggressive driving into the paint along with turning up the defensive pressure. An Aamir Simms 3-pointer gave the Tigers a 49-31 lead with 18:06 remaining before Florida State was able to start battling back as it went on a 17-2 run. Clemson would score four straight to go up 55-48 but the Seminoles eventually fought back to tie it at 59 on Cofer's jumper with 6:59 remaining. The Tigers scored seven straight points and appeared to regain control. They were up 70-64 with 2:24 remaining, but missed their final four shots in regulation. Florida State made its last three shots to send it into overtime, including a driving off-balance layup by Forrest with eight seconds remaining. Marquise Reed scored 23 points while Gabe Devoe had 11 and David Skara had nine for Clemson.

Health, Hard Work, Right Mentality Help Cofer Make 'Unreal' Jump

TALLAHASSEE -- Phil Cofer became accustomed to watching everyone around him find success. The Florida State forward was a vocal cheerleader from the bench who quietly waited for his chance – when he would be healthy again and ready to show what he could offer.

Cofer went into his senior year focused on improving his weaknesses, refined his ball-handling and jump shot.

“All the hard work in the offseason,” Cofer said. “I went straight into the gym. I pretty much have been grinding and grinding.”

Cofer began an intense offseason in the days after FSU was eliminated from the NCAA Tournament in March. He was in the gym working on jumpers and post moves, 3-pointers and dribbling.

The texts to assistant coaches Charlton Young and Stan Jones were frequent, with Cofer wanting to know when either would be available for a late-night session in the gym.

“Everything he’s got going right now, he earned it,” Young said. “He has a pro’s type of mentality to the game. The jump he has made is unreal.”

The months of hard work have paid off. After battling through injuries as a sophomore and then averaging just 2.9 points a game as a junior, Cofer has become a go-to player for FSU (11-1), scoring in double figures in eight of FSU’s 12 games.

The senior forward is averaging 13.4 points per game and 5.5 rebounds per game through the non-conference schedule and has made contributions on the offensive and defensive end of the court for the Seminoles, who begin the ACC schedule on Saturday at No. 3 Duke (12-1) at 2 p.m.

“His commitment to becoming a better perimeter player has been huge for us,” Young said. “Now he’s another guy, a big at 6-8, that can dribble, pass and shoot and make a decision. Now he’s turned himself into a stretch 4.”

While Cofer was a starter as a freshman in 2014-15, his career detoured due to foot injuries the following year.

And Cofer was often viewed as a reserve that could provide defense and energy in quality minutes off the bench during his junior season.

But Cofer has been one of the most pleasant surprises of the 2017-18 season for FSU. He has made 13 three-pointers – already one more than he had in his first three seasons combined. He has also scored in double-figures in eight games this season after doing that just seven times in his prior 76 games.

“We have all known all along that he had the potential to be a high contributor,” FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said. “He’s been slowed by some injuries. He has tremendous character. He has good genes. You’re just seeing the maturity level of a guy growing, improving. Not only has he performed at a high level, he has given tremendous leadership.”

Cofer has led with his intensity on both ends of the floor. While he’s had nights where he didn’t score as many points, Cofer has made his mark as a rebounder, defender and leader.

And Cofer's accuracy from the floor (55 percent) and the free-throw line (75 percent) is also 10 points higher than his averages coming into the year. Coaches who have seen Cofer play a few times now are taken by surprise at the improvement in his game.

"He's a terrific long defender on film and in person," Charleston Southern coach Barclay Radebaugh said. "He's expanded his game so that he's efficient from the perimeter, both ways. I've seen his game grow in person. Because we've played Florida State play so many times, I've seen his game grow."

Cofer says his success this season hasn't surprised him. He's credited his teammates with supporting him along the way, encouraging him during the down times.

It's clear that Cofer doesn't like to discuss the injuries much. After one game in November, he said he "came a long way" and on Thursday he said that his focus is to "keep moving forward."

While he is playing to prove doubters wrong, his positive mind-set has helped him achieve a stunning start in what has been a career season. And the Seminoles have taken notice of the results from his hard work.

"Phil worked very hard over the summer and in the preseason, getting himself healthy, working on his game," guard Trent Forrest said. "Now it's just manifested for him."
