#### SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT NOTRE DAME ON SATURDAY

Florida State, which has won four of its last seven games, travels to play its only game of the season against Notre Dame on Saturday, Feb. 10, 2018 at the Purcell Pavilion. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN2. The Seminoles game at Notre Dame marks their road game in their last four overall games. The Seminoles enter Saturday’s game at Notre Dame with six games remaining to be played in the regular season – three at home (Clemson, Pitt and Boston College) and three on the road (at Notre Dame, at NC State and at Clemson). Florida State has two ACC road wins on its resume (at Virginia Tech and at Louisville) and four overall road wins (at Rutgers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and at Florida when the Gators were ranked No. 5 nationally). After beginning their ACC season with a 1-3 record, the Seminoles have won five conference games with wins over Syracuse, at Virginia Tech, Georgia Tech, Miami and at Louisville. Following Saturday’s game at Notre Dame, the Seminoles will play host to Clemson on Wed., Feb 14, 2018 in the first of two meetings better the two teams.

#### HAMILTON GOES FOR 500<sup>TH</sup> CAREER VICTORY AGAINST NOTRE DAME

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton is pursuing his 500<sup>th</sup> career victory and his 300<sup>th</sup> at Florida State as the Seminoles travel to play at Notre Dame on Saturday. The NCAA recognizes Hamilton with 499 career wins - 299 at Florida State - following the vacation of 22 victories from the 2008-09 season. In terms of games won on the court, Hamilton has an overall record of 521-413 spanning 30 collegiate seasons and is 321-203 in his 16 seasons leading the Seminoles. Averaging 20 wins a season, he is Florida State’s all-time leader in victories.

#### ANGOLA ENTERS SATURDAY’S GAME AS SEMINOLES’ CAREER FREE THROW LEADER

Senior Braian Angola, who is shooting .900 from the free throw in 12 ACC games this season, enters Saturday’s game against Notre Dame as Florida State’s all-time leader with a .829 career free throw shooting percentage. He is shooting .958 percent from the free throw line (23 of 24) in the last five games.

#### SEMINOLES’ HAMILTON IN THE ACC’S TOP 10 FOR HOME AND ROAD WINS

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton, who ranks eight in ACC history for both overall wins (299) and ACC wins (133), enters Saturday’s game at Notre Dame as one of only seven coaches in ACC history ranked in the ACC’s top 10 for both home court and road victories. Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 79 home ACC wins (sixth in ACC history) and 43 true road ACC wins (ninth in ACC history).

#### HAMILTON NEARING ACC’S TOP 7 FOR OVERALL VICTORIES

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday’s game against Notre Dame ranked eighth in school history with 129 total ACC wins (regular season and ACC Tournament). He needs only six victories to move in to a tie for seventh place in ACC history with Lefty Driesell of Maryland.

#### FLORIDA STATE DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS HONORED AT NOTRE DAME ON SATURDAY

Stan Wilcox, the Director of Athletics at Florida State, will be honored Saturday at Notre Dame as the Irish celebrate their 1978 NCAA Final Four team. The team will be honored with a reception prior to the game and will be introduced at halftime of the game. Wilcox averaged 2.5 points and 2.9 rebounds as the Irish earned a 23-8 record during the 1977-78 season. Wilcox and the Irish defeated UCLA twice during the regular season and defeated Marquette when the Golden Eagles were ranked No. 1 that season. Notre Dame defeated Houston, Utah and DePaul to reach the Final Four before losing in the national semifinals to Duke. Wilcox is in his fifth year as Florida State’s Athletics Director.

#### LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Notre Dame and win its seventh ACC game of the season. It would mark the school-record 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive season the Seminoles would have won at least seven ACC games.

...Defeat Notre Dame and gain a win at Notre Dame for the first time. The Seminoles have played at Notre Dame only twice in school history (Dec. 13, 2014 and Feb. 11, 2017);

...Defeat Notre Dame and win its second consecutive ACC road game. The Seminoles won at Louisville (Feb. 3, 2018; 80-76) in their last ACC road game. The Seminoles have not won consecutive ACC road games since winning at Boston College (Jan. 26, 2016; 72-62) and at Wake Forest (Feb. 6, 2016; 91-71) during the 2015-16 season.

**FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS**

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 276 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 1776 (2017-18).

**LOOKING FOR ANOTHER FIRST AT NOTRE DAME**

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Notre Dame looking to gain its first win over Notre Dame at the Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center where the Seminoles have played only twice since the Fighting Irish joined the ACC. A win for the Seminoles would mark the second consecutive ACC road game the Seminoles had gained a victory in a gym they were previously winless in during school history. The Seminoles won for the first time at Louisville in the KFC Yum! Center last Saturday – giving Florida State its first victory over Louisville since the two were Metro Conference rivals in 1989.

**FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC LEADERS IN REBOUNDS**

Florida State, which has outrebounded each of its last four and nine of 12 ACC opponents this season, enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame ranked third in the ACC in rebounding (and fourth in the ACC in rebounds (39.4) and fourth in the ACC in rebound margin (+4.2). The Seminoles have outrebounded each of their last four opponents (Miami, Wake Forest, Louisville and Virginia) and have lost the rebounding battle to only Georgia Tech since outrebounding Miami in Coral Gables (Jan. 7). Florida State has been outrebounded in only three of 12 ACC games.

**SEMINOLES CUTTING DOWN ON TURNOVERS**

Florida State totaled its season low of seven turnovers (one in the final 25:32 of the game) in its overtime win over Miami (Jan. 27, 103-94) and have totaled single digit turnovers in two of its last four games. The Seminoles are averaging 2.3 fewer turnovers in their last 12 games (11.8) as compared to their first 12 games of the season (14.1). Florida State has played three games with single digit turnovers (Rutgers, Miami and Wake Forest)

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE**

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame ranked fifth in the ACC with an average of 8.5 3-point field goals made per game. The Seminoles have made 203 shots from distance this season – the third consecutive season the Seminoles have made at least 200 3-point field goals in a season. Florida State has made 200 or more 3-point field goals in 10 of 16 seasons under head coach Leonard Hamilton. With 203 3-point field goals made, the Seminoles are quickly approaching the top-five for 3-point shots made in a single season. The fifth all-time best single-season total is 220 by Florida State's 2015-16 team. Florida State' 19 3-point shots made in its 98-45 win over Southern Miss (Dec. 21) is the second most in a single game in school history and tied for the most in a single game in the ACC this season.

**SEMINOLES POINTS COMING AT A FAST PACE**

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame ranked third in the ACC in scoring with an 83.5 points per game scoring average. The Seminoles have scored 100 or more points three times this season (113 against the Citadel, 101 against Syracuse and 104 against Miami) and are undefeated in all three games. Florida State is averaging more than 10 points more per game in the last two season (2016-17 and 2017-18) than it did during the previous two seasons (2014-15 and 2015-16).

**SEMINOLES IN OVERTIME**

Florida State is 2-0 in overtime games this season with wins over Syracuse (Jan 13, 101-90 in double overtime) and over Miami (Jan. 24, 104-93). The Seminoles have not played three (or more) overtime games in a single season since playing five during the 2007-08 season and have not won three (or more) overtime games in a single season since winning four (against Temple, at Wake Forest, at Duke and against Western Kentucky in the NCAA Tournament) during the 1992-93 season. Florida State's last overtime win on the road came at Miami on March 3, 2008 (98-90). In winning its overtime game against Miami earlier this season, the Seminoles tied a school record as they scored 20 points and scored on all 12 of its possessions in the five-minute overtime period against the Hurricanes.

**FLORIDA STATE'S BENCH CONTINUES TO COME TO PLAY**

Florida State's bench bunch came to play against Virginia as it outscored the Cavaliers' reserves by a 23-8 margin. The Seminoles bench has outscored 10 of its 12 ACC (17 of 24 overall) and averages 28.1 points scored per game. Freshman M.J. Walker (8.4 points per game) is currently the Seminoles' leading scorer off of the bench.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. NOTRE DAME – THE LAST GAME**

Steve Vasturia and Bonzie Colson each scored 18 points and No. 22 Notre Dame knocked off No. 16 Florida State 77-73 to advance to the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament title game in the Barclays Center in Brooklyn on March 10, 2017. Dwayne Bacon led Florida State with 18 points. Notre Dame used a 23-8 run to end the first half that put the Irish up 42-26. Florida State whittled the lead down thanks to Braian Angola, who scored 14 of the Seminoles' 15 points in one stretch, including a 3-pointer that made it 63-55 with 8:23 left in the second half. Led by senior Phil Cofer's 16 points, the Seminoles finished their 80-76 win over Louisville (Feb. 3) with six players in double figure scoring (Cofer, 16; Braian Angola, 13; Christ Koumadje, 11; Terance Mann, 11; CJ Walker, 10 and Trent Forrest 10). It marked the second time in the last three games that six players scored in double figures. With Cofer leading the way against Miami on Jan. 27, six Seminoles also scored in double figures (Cofer, 21; Braian Angola, 18; CJ Walker, 17; Terance Mann, 14; Christ Koumadje, 13 and M.J. Walker, 13).

**FLORIDA STATE'S BLOCKED SHOTS**

Florida State has blocked at least one shot in each of its 24 games this season with a season-high 10 blocked shots coming in its win over the Citadel (Nov. 24).

He made his final free throw shot in the Seminoles' victory at Virginia Tech (Jan. 20), was a perfect six of six against Georgia Tech (Jan. 24), a perfect eight of eight against Miami (Jan. 27), four of five against Louisville (Feb. 3) and a perfect four of four against Virginia (Jan. 7).

**1.3** Sophomore Trent Forrest has 73 steals in 58 career games – an average of 1.3 steals per game for his career. He has earned multiple steals in eight different games this season with four coming in Florida State's win over Tulane (Dec. 10).
