### SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO PITT ON ACC SUNDAY NIGHT HOOPS NATIONAL BROADCAST

Florida State, which has four wins against nationally ranked teams this season, plays host to Pitt on Sunday, Feb. 18, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles enter Sunday's nationally televised game against the Panthers fresh from their fourth victory of the season over a nationally ranked team after an 81-79 overtime victory over Clemson on Wednesday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles have now defeated four ranked teams this season -- No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4; 83-66), No. 10 North Carolina (Jan. 3; 81-80), No. 24 Miami (Jan. 27, 104-93 in overtime) and Clemson (Feb. 14, 81-79 in overtime) and have 11 wins over ranked teams in the last two seasons. Florida State defeated a school-record tying seven ranked teams during the 2016-17 season. The Seminoles' game against Pitt on Sunday is their first (and only) game against the Panthers during the regular season. With its game against Pitt, the Seminoles will have played 13 of their 14 ACC opponents at least once this season. Following Sunday's game against Pitt, the Seminoles will travel to play at NC State on Sunday, Feb. 25, 2018. The Wolfpack are the only ACC team Florida State has yet to face this season.

### HAMILTON REACHES 500 WIN PLATEAU

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton won his 500<sup>th</sup> career game on Wednesday as the Seminoles defeated No. 11 Clemson, 81-79 in overtime, in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' 16th year head coach became just the fifth current ACC coach with 500 victories. He is already the winningest coach in Florida State history and is the first coach at Florida State to win 300 games with the Seminoles.

### BACON AND ISAAC BACK FOR FLORIDA STATE'S GAME AGAINST PITT

Dwayne Bacon and Jonathan Isaac, two of the most electrifying players in school history, will be in attendance and recognized during Florida State's game against Pitt. The pair who led the Seminoles to a 12-6 record and a second place finish in the ACC and to the NCAA Tournament in 2017, are both currently playing in the NBA -- Isaac with the Orlando Magic and Bacon with the Charlotte Hornets.

### FLORIDA STATE'S WINS

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Pitt having won five of its last eight ACC games with three of those wins coming in either overtime (104-93 over Miami and 81-79 over Clemson) or double overtime (101-90 over Syracuse). The Seminoles have won a single-season school-record three ACC games in overtime this season. Florida State leads the ACC with six wins of five points or less or in overtime and have not lost an overtime game this season. The Seminoles' school record for overtime wins in a single season is four during the 1992-93 season.

### COFER LEADS FLORIDA STATE WITH 17 IN SEMINOLES' WIN OVER CLEMSON

Senior Phil Cofer scored a team-high 17 points (all in the second half) as Florida State rallied back from an 18-point deficit to defeat Clemson, 81-79 in overtime, on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. Cofer totaled his 17 points on eight of nine shooting from the field (.889 percent) and one made 3-point shot as Florida State outscored the Tigers by a 41-29 mark in the second half to force the overtime period. It marks the career-high 17<sup>th</sup> time the senior has scored in double figures this season.

### CLOSING OUT THE CLEMSON WIN

Florida State outscored Clemson by a 52-35 margin and shot .590 percent from the field (23 of 39) in the final 23:51 of its 81-79 win over Clemson. The Seminoles tied the game for the first time with 6:59 left in the second half and took their first lead of the game with 1:06 remaining to be played in overtime.

### LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Pitt and earn its eighth ACC victory of the season. It would mark the school-record 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive season the Seminoles will have won at least eight ACC games;  
...Defeat Pitt and gain its 19<sup>th</sup> win of the season. It would mark the third consecutive season and ninth season in the last 11 years the Seminoles will have won at least 19 games in a season;  
...Defeat Pitt and gain a home victory over the Panthers for the second time in the last three games.

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 276 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 18-8 (2017-18).

**NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S VICTORY OVER CLEMSON**

Florida State rallied from an 18-point deficit to defeat No. 11 Clemson on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. The Seminoles were down by 18 with 18:07 left to play in the second half and started the comeback with a 15-4 win that began at the 15:41 mark and spanned 5:24. At the conclusion of that the run, the Seminoles had pulled to within 55-53 with 10:17 remaining to be played. After a Clemson basket gave the Tigers a 57-53 lead, sophomore Trent Forrest began a second half ending 17-13 run in the final 9:11 with a lay-up to bring Florida State back to within 57-55. Forrest later tied the game at 70-70 on a layup with eight second remaining in regulation. Forrest was huge again as he put the Seminoles ahead (for the first time in the game) at the 1:06 mark of the overtime period with another lay-up. His lay-up began a game-ending and winning 8-5 run that gave the Seminoles the 81-79 win.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON IN THE SECOND HALF AND OVERTIME PERIODS**

Florida State forced Clemson into 15 second half turnovers and outscored the Tigers by a 21-3 margin on points off of turnovers in the second half and overtime periods of their win on Wednesday. The Seminoles outscored Clemson by a 28-22 points in the paint margin and by a 12-0 margin on fast break points in the second half and overtime periods. The Seminoles totaled seven steals in the second half and shot .594 from the field (19-32) in outscoring Tigers by a 41-29 margin after trailing for only the fourth time all season at the half of an ACC game.

**SEMINOLES FORCE CLEMSON IN TO 21 TURNOVERS**

Florida State forced Clemson in 21 turnovers and earned 29 total points off turnovers (two in the overtime period) in its 81-79 overtime win over the Tigers on Wednesday. The Tigers entered the games averaging 12.1 turnovers per game. The Seminoles forced Clemson in to 12 turnovers in the second half of their win.

**SEMINOLES EARN NINE STEALS AGAINST CLEMSON**

Led by two steals each by Braian Angola, Terance Mann and Mfiondu Kabengele, the Seminoles earned nine steals in their win over Clemson. It marked the eighth time this season Florida State has earned nine or more steals in a game with its ACC season-high of 11 steals coming against Miami (Jan. 7).

**SEMINOLES BACK ON THE OFFENSIVE AGAINST CLEMSON**

Florida State scored 81 points and shot .525 from the field in its victory over Clemson. It marked the eighth time in 14 ACC games the Seminoles have scored at least 80 points and places the Seminoles third in the ACC in scoring with an 82.8 points per game scoring average. Florida State enters Sunday's game against Pitt as one of only five teams in the ACC, scoring an average of 80 points or more scored per game. The Seminoles totaled 41 second half points – the fourth time in ACC play they have scored 40 or more points in the second half of a game.

**SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO GO TO THE BOARDS**

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Pitt with a +4.0 rebound margin and are ranked third in the ACC with a 39.0 rebounds per game average. The Seminoles have outrebounded 10 of their last 12 opponents and have not been outrebounded since Jan. 24 by Georgia Tech– a span of seven games. Despite being outrebounded by the Yellow Jackets, the Seminoles defeated their rivals from Atlanta by an 88-77 margin. The Seminoles' win over Georgia Tech is one of two ACC games the Seminoles have won by double digits (+11 vs. Syracuse and Georgia Tech).

**SEMINOLES FROM THE 3-POINT LINE**

Florida State made five 3-point shots in its victory over Clemson and enter Sunday's game against Pitt ranked sixth in the ACC with an 8.4 3-point shots made per game average. The Seminoles have made at least five 3-pinit shots in each of their 26 games this season.

**FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME**

Florida State is undefeated, 3-0, in its three overtime games this season. The Seminoles have defeated Syracuse (Jan. 13; 101-90), No. 24 Miami (Jan. 27; 104-93 in double overtime) and No. 11 Clemson (Feb. 14; 81-79). The Seminoles are shooting .571 (20 of 28) from the field and averaging 11.8 points in four overtime periods. Florida State tied its school record with 20 points and scored on all 12 of its possessions in overtime in its 103-94 victory over Miami.

**FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME – NOTE II**

Florida State has won a near school-record three consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles have won three or more consecutive overtime times four times in school history.

Sheldon Jeter scored a career-high 29 points and Young had 11 as Pittsburgh upset No. 17 Florida State 80-66 on Feb. 16, 2017 at the Pederson Events Center. Jeter also had eight rebounds. Four of his 12 field goals were 3-pointers as the 6-foot-8 forward showed his range against bigger Florida State defenders. Pitt led by as many as 15 points in the second half, but a 10-0 Florida State run cut the lead to two with 6:19 to play. The Panthers responded by outscoring the Seminoles 16-4 the rest of the way. Xavier Rathan-Mayes had 12 points for Florida State. Florida State dominated inside, outscoring Pitt 38-26 in the paint. Freshman forward Jonathan Isaac had 11 points and six rebounds.

Senior Phil Cofer, who led the Seminoles with 17 points in its overtime victory over No. 11 Clemson, has led the Seminoles in scoring in four of the last six games (21 vs. Miami, 23 at Wake Forest, 16 at Louisville and 17 vs. Clemson). Junior Terance Mann, who led the Seminoles in rebounds against Clemson, has led Florida State in rebounds in both of the last two games (eight vs. Notre dame and Clemson).

The biggest 3-point shot made of his career may have come with 1:56 remaining in overtime against Clemson on Wednesday night to bring the Seminoles to within 74-73. He hit the two biggest free throws of his Florida State career with 0:05 seconds remaining in overtime of Wednesday's victory over Clemson to give the Seminoles an insurmountable 81-78 lead.

## M.J. Walker – The SkyWalker

There's the CEO of Chick Fil-A, there's 2 Chainz, and then there's MJ Walker.

It's not easy to find Jonesboro, Georgia on a map. Only 5,000 people live in the town, and many of those born there end up staying. The people that make it out do not take it lightly. M.J. Walker knows that.

"It was tough. There were a lot of distractions ... all kinds of trouble. Everybody is trying to get their own and make it," Walker says, re-living much of it in his mind. "I just tried to stay focused. Basketball helped me."

Playing basketball is Walker's earliest memory. A stellar high school career, count it. An invitation to the McDonald's All-American game, check. Five-stars as a recruit coming out of high school, no doubt. So, when did his favorite moment of playing basketball happen?

At nine years old...in a church league.

"There were two minutes left," Walker's eyes suddenly light up. "I got the ball, pounded it, got fouled and scored. I never show emotion in a game. That was the first time I ever screamed after I scored. After that, I knew I had that dog in me."

The ring of an elevator seems to come out of nowhere in a silent hallway of the FSU basketball practice facility. A basketball hits the hardwood in the distance every now and then.

Despite daily dosages of practice, film watching and class, Walker takes pride in arriving punctually. He drops everything in his arms just to shake hands. The walls of the facility are filled with photographs of standout freshman — from Beasley to Bacon to Isaac. Walker notices them every day, envisioning himself popping out of those same picture frames.

"That's one of the reasons why I came here. It was a good opportunity for me to take over what the [freshmen] used to do for the program," Walker says with a look of determination. "With what I can do, I felt like I would fit well in the program."

Shooting 42 percent from the field and 40 percent from beyond the arc is certainly a good start. Already one of FSU's strongest shooters, Walker's ability to create his own shot adds yet another dimension to a Florida State offense that's ranked third in the ACC in scoring.

"M.J. is giving us everything he has," head coach Leonard Hamilton says about the true freshman. "He's coachable. He's a great teammate, and he's got a good relationship with players and coaches.

With scholarship offers from UCLA, Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech lined up out of high school, the 6-5 guard chose the Garnet & Gold. Tough choice, right?

Not for M.J. Walker.

"Family. That's the most important thing," Walker says without hesitation. "The loyalty as well. Florida State's coaches had been recruiting me since ninth grade. They cared about my life."

Caring is the first step in every walk of life, from the biggest cities to the smallest towns. For a small town in Georgia, Jonesboro has notable natives. 2 Chainz, Chick-Fil-A's CEO and several professional athletes are just a few to have made it out of Clayton County. Walker lights up at the thought of being on that list.

MONTEGO BAY, Jamaica -- Redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele scored 15 points and pulled down nine rebounds and junior Terance Mann scored 14 points and pulled down five rebounds to lead Florida State to a 67-43 victory over Fordham at the Montego Bay Convention Centre in the Jamaica Classic. Kabengele and Mann were the only two Seminoles in double figure scoring as the Seminoles utilized a suffocating defense that limited the Rams to 12 made field goals and a .231 field goal shooting percentage while blocking nine shots and recording 12 steals. Florida State's height advantage and ball-hawking defense was on display from the opening tip as they scored took their first double digit lead

at 19-9 with 7:43 remaining in the first half. The Seminoles increased their lead to 20 at the 16:01 mark of the second half (40-20) and led by as many as 28 (50-22) with just over 10 minutes remaining. Game 3 -- Florida State 90, Colorado State 73

MONTEGO BAY, Jamaica -- Jamaica -- Freshman M.J. Walker scored 22 points and junior Terance Mann added 20 to lead Florida State to a 90-73 victory over Colorado State in the Championship Game of the Inaugural Jamaica Classic at the Montego Bay Convention Centre. Walker made five 3-point shots and was a perfect three-of-three from the free throw line as Florida State ran its record to a perfect 3-0 on the season. The Seminoles outscored the Rams by a 42-23 margin in the final 15:11 of the game to gain the win. Colorado State, which trailed by a 47-36 margin at the half, but outscored the Seminoles by a 14-1 score to open the second half. The early blitz by Colorado State gave them a 50-48 lead with 15:11 remaining in the game. Florida State righted itself and outscored the Rams by an 8-4 margin over the next 3:30 to take a 56-50 lead. Senior Brian Angola scored two baskets, Mann one and Walker one as the Seminoles took the lead for good. The Seminoles extended their lead to 70-61 with 7:49 left and were comfortably ahead by an 80-67 margin with 3:32 left in the game. Walker, playing in only his third career game, scored 14 points in the first half on four made 3-point shots and a free throw. He began his hot shooting game at the 13:29 mark to put the Seminoles up 15-13. He extended the Seminoles lead three more times in the first half including 30-21 on two long range shots within 1:38 of each other.

## **M.J. – The Skywalker**

There's the CEO of Chick Fil-A, there's 2 Chainz, and then there's MJ Walker.

It's not easy to find Jonesboro, Georgia on a map. Only 5,000 people live in the town, and many of those born there end up staying. The people that make it out do not take it lightly. MJ Walker knows that.

"It was tough. There were a lot of distractions ... all kinds of trouble. Everybody is trying to get their own and make it," Walker says, re-living much of it in his mind. "I just tried to stay focused. Basketball helped me."

Playing basketball is Walker's earliest memory. A stellar high school career, count it. An invitation to the McDonald's All-American game, check. Five-stars as a recruit coming out of high school, no doubt. So, when did his favorite moment of playing basketball happen?

At nine years old...in a church league.

"There were two minutes left," Walker's eyes suddenly light up. "I got the ball, pounded it, got fouled and scored. I never show emotion in a game. That was the first time I ever screamed after I scored. After that, I knew I had that dog in me."

The ring of an elevator seems to come out of nowhere in a silent hallway of the FSU basketball practice facility. A basketball hits the hardwood in the distance every now and then.

Despite daily dosages of practice, film watching and class, Walker takes pride in arriving punctually. He drops everything in his arms just to shake hands. The walls of the facility are filled with photographs of standout freshman — from Beasley to Bacon to Isaac. Walker notices them every day, envisioning himself popping out of those same picture frames.

"That's one of the reasons why I came here. It was a good opportunity for me to take over what the [freshmen] used to do for the program," Walker says with a look of determination. "With what I can do, I felt like I would fit well in the program."

Shooting 42 percent from the field and 40 percent from beyond the arc is certainly a good start. Already one of FSU's strongest shooters, Walker's ability to create his own shot adds yet another dimension to a Florida State offense that's ranked third in the ACC in scoring.

"MJ is giving us everything he has," head coach Leonard Hamilton says about the true freshman. "He's coachable. He's a great teammate and he's got a good relationship with players and coaches."

With scholarship offers from UCLA, Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech lined up out of high school, the 6-5 guard chose the Garnet & Gold. Tough choice, right?

Not for MJ Walker.

"Family. That's the most important thing," Walker says without hesitation. "The loyalty as well. Florida State's coaches had been recruiting me since ninth grade. They cared about my life."

Caring is the first step in every walk of life, from the biggest cities to the smallest towns. For a small town in Georgia, Jonesboro has notable natives. 2 Chainz, Chick-Fil-A's CEO and several professional athletes are just a few to have made it out of Clayton County. Walker lights up at the thought of being on that list.

"It would mean a lot," Walker takes a breath before looking out onto the court. "A lot of good guys made it out of that area. Those are guys that I looked up to. It gave me hope that I could make it out."

Memories fly out of Walker's mind in a vacuum. Jonesboro is still very much with him, probably resting on a shoulder like the "chip" so often described by those who make it out. Time passes, practice is about to start, and so it's back down the elevator. Drake's "God's Plan" is blaring in a nearby film room on the first floor.

To Walker, landing at Florida State is part of the plan — a plan so vivid that he must see it every time he closes his eyes. Trusting the process is something that he and his father have always lived by, but the first part of the process is remembering where you come from. To Walker, that means never being far removed from what he started as.
