### SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO NO. 2 VIRGINIA CAVALIERS IN TALLAHASSEE

Florida State, which has won five of its last seven games, including a victory over Louisville on the road this past Saturday, plays host to No. 2 Virginia on Wednesday, Feb. 7, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. As the No. 2 ranked team in both major polls, Virginia is the highest ranked team to play the Seminoles in the Tucker Center since Florida State played host to, and defeated, No. 1 Duke on Jan. 12, 2011. The Seminoles enter Wednesday’s game against Virginia looking to win its fourth game of the season against a ranked team with victories over then No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4, 83-66), then No. 11 North Carolina (Jan. 3, 81-80) and then No. 24 Miami (Jan. 27, 104-93 in overtime). The Seminoles have 11 wins over nationally ranked teams in the last two seasons (school-record tying seven during the 2016-17 season and four during the 2017-18 season). Following Wednesday’s game against Virginia, the Seminoles travel to play at Notre Dame on Saturday at 4:00. That game will be televised nationally on ESPN2

### HAMILTON GOES FOR 500<sup>TH</sup> CAREER VICTORY AGAINST VIRGINIA

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton is pursuing his 500<sup>th</sup> career victory and his 300<sup>th</sup> at Florida State as the Seminoles play host to Virginia on Wednesday. The NCAA recognizes Hamilton with 499 career wins - 299 at Florida State - following the vacation of 22 victories from the 2008-09 season. In terms of games won on the court, Hamilton has an overall record of 521-412 spanning 30 collegiate seasons and is 321-202 in his 16 seasons leading the Seminoles. Averaging 20 wins a season, he is Florida State’s all-time leader in victories.

### SEMINOLES FACE ANOTHER RANKED OPPONENT IN VIRGINIA

With three wins against nationally ranked teams already this season (No. 5 Florida, Dec. 4, 83-66, No. 11 North Carolina, Jan. 3, 81-80 and No. 24 Miami, Jan. 27, 104-93 in overtime), Florida State faces its sixth ranked opponent of the season as it welcomes Virginia to the Donald L. Tucker Center. Florida State has 10 wins over nationally ranked teams in their last 47 games dating to its 83-78 victory over then No. 21 Florida on Dec. 11, 2016. During that stretch of games, the Seminoles are 33-14 (.702 winning percentage) overall and 18-11 (.621 winning percentage) in ACC regular season games. Florida State is scheduled to play two more games against teams ranked nation’s top 25 (both against Clemson). The Seminoles have been nationally ranked for five weeks during the 2017-18 season.

### FLORIDA STATE’S RECENT SUCCESS

Florida State has won five of its last seven ACC games and enters Wednesday’s game against Virginia with a 6-5 record in ACC play. The Seminoles were 1-3 in ACC play entering its home game against Syracuse on Jan. 13 (a 101-90 victory) and enter their game against Virginia with a 6-5 mark in conference play. Florida State won three straight games (at Va. Tech and at home against Ga. Tech and Miami) to move above .500 in ACC play with a 5-4 record.

### SUPERMANN ADDS TO HIS SEASON WITH GAME-WINNING BLOCK AGAINST LOUISVILLE

All-ACC candidate Terance Mann blocked a runner by Louisville’s VJ King with six seconds remaining in Florida State’s 80-76 win over Louisville at the KFC YUM! Center on Saturday. Mann blocked King’s attempt to tie the game at 78-78 with his fifth blocked shot of the season. The junior scored six second half points in the win over the Cardinals (he scored 11 points in the win) and enters Wednesday’s game against Virginia ranked 13<sup>th</sup> in the ACC in scoring with a career-high 15.5 points per game scoring average.

### SUPERMANN VS. RANKED TEAMS

All-ACC candidate Terance Mann averages 18.7 points and is shooting .583 from the field in Florida State’s three wins against ranked teams (No. 5 Florida, No. 11 North Carolina and No. 24 Miami) this season. Mann scored 25 points in the Seminoles’ 83-66 win over the Gators in Gainesville.

### LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Virginia and gain its third consecutive win over Virginia. The Seminoles defeated then No. 13 Virginia (Jan. 17, 2016, 69-62 in Tallahassee) and then No. 11 Virginia (Dec. 31, 2016, 60-58 in Charlottesville) in the last two meetings between the two teams;

...Defeat Virginia and gain a win over its fourth nationally ranked team of the season. The Seminoles have wins over then No. 5 Florida, No. 11 North Carolina and then No. 24 Miami on their resume;

...Defeat Virginia and gain a win over a to- five nationally ranked team for the first time since beating then No. 4 North Carolina (March 11, 2012, 85-82) for the for ACC Tournament championship at Philips Arena in Atlanta;

...Defeat Virginia and gain a win over a top-two nationally ranked team for the first time since defeating then No. 1 Duke (Jan. 12, 2011, 66-61) at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

**FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 12 YEARS**

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 12 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played as a member of the ACC with 276 wins. The Seminoles average 21.2 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15), 20-14 (2015-16), 26-9 (2016-17) and 17-6 (2017-18).

**FLORIDA STATE AT HOME**

Florida State is 10-1 at home in the Donald L. Tucker Center this season with four ACC wins (No. 11 North Carolina, Syracuse, Georgia Tech and Miami) and six non-conference wins (George Washington, Kennesaw State, the Citadel, Loyola (Md.), Charleston Southern and Southern Miss). The Seminoles have won 31 of their last 32 home games since defeating Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. Florida State enters Wednesday's home game against Virginia having won 16 of their last 17 home ACC games.

**SEMINOLES AND HAMILTON AGAINST RANKED VIRGINIA TEAMS**

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against No. 2/2 Virginia with 41 wins over ranked teams during the 16-year tenure of Leonard Hamilton at Florida State. Included in those 41 wins over ranked teams are four wins over nationally ranked Virginia teams (No. 16 Virginia, Feb. 4, 2012, 58-55; No. 24 Virginia, March 1, 2012, 63-60; No. 13 Virginia, Jan. 17, 2016, 69-62 and No. 11 Virginia, Dec. 31, 2016; 60-58). The Seminoles have six wins over nationally ranked Duke teams during Hamilton's tenure at Florida State.

**SEMINOLES RANKED SECOND IN ACC IN SCORING**

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Virginia ranked second in the ACC in scoring (84.7 ppg) and is second in the ACC in conference games only scoring (84.3 ppg). The Seminoles are averaging even more points (87.1 ppg) since scoring 101 points in their 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse in Tallahassee. Florida State has scored 100 points twice (103 in its win over Miami and 101 in its win over Syracuse) and has scored at least 90 points twice more in ACC play (93 at Duke and 91 in a road win at Virginia Tech).

**FLORIDA STATE RANKED THIRD IN ACC IN REBOUNDING**

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Virginia ranked third in the ACC in rebounding with a 39.8 rebounds per game average. The Seminoles have outrebounded eight of their last nine opponents since beating Miami by +12 on Jan. 7 in Coral Gables. **FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA – THE LAST GAME**

Dwayne Bacon hit the game-winning 3-pointer with 2 seconds left as the Seminoles handed the 12th-ranked Cavaliers just their second loss in their last 37 ACC home games, 60-58, at the John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville on Dec. 16, 2016. Bacon's game-winner, giving him 26 of his career-high 29 points after halftime, was a step-back jumper with Virginia defender Isaiah Wilkins in his face. Bacon scored the last seven points during a 9-0 run for the Seminoles that turned a 51-49 deficit into a 56-51 lead, and then was the obvious choice to try and answer after Kyle Guy got free in the right corner, giving Virginia a 58-57 lead. Guy scored 14 points and three others had 10 for Virginia. Xavier Rathan-Mayes added 10 points for the Seminoles. The Seminoles won their 10th straight as they began a stretch of six consecutive games against teams in the Top 25, or likely to be there. Virginia's London Perrantes tried a half-court heave at the buzzer, and it was on line, but came up well short.

**FLORIDA STATE APPROACHING 3-POINT MILESTONE**

Florida State is ranked third in the ACC as they make an average of 8.6 3-point field goals made per game. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Virginia with 197 made 3-point field goals made this season and need to make three to reach the 200 mark for the 2017-18 season and for the third consecutive season.

**FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY**

Florida State has a 21-11 record in ACC play in its last 32 games (.656 winning percentage). The Seminoles won their final three regular season ACC games in 2015-16, were 12-6 in 2016-17 and are 6-5 in 2017-18.

**.750** Sophomore Trent Forrest is shooting .750 from the free throw line (nine of 12) in the last three games. He made four free throws (all in the second half) of the Seminoles' victory over Louisville on Saturday. It marked the second time in the last three games that six players scored in double figures. With Cofer leading the way against Miami on Jan. 27, six Seminoles also scored in double figures (Cofer, 21; Braian Angola, 18; CJ Walker, 17; Terance Mann, 14; Christ Koumadje, 13 and M.J. Walker, 13).

**COFER TO HIT THE CENTURY MARK AGAINST VIRGINIA**

Senior Phil Cofer will be in his 100<sup>th</sup> career game against Virginia on Wednesday. He should also tie his career high with his 24<sup>th</sup> start of the 2017-18 season; he also started 24 games as a freshman in the 2014-15 season.

## Exhibition 1 -- Florida State 116, Central Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Behind a hot night from beyond arc, Florida State rolled to a 116-68 win over Central Missouri in its first exhibition of the season. Terance Mann scored 12 points and added six rebounds, but the story of the night was the Seminoles' ability from deep, knocking down 13 shots from behind the 3-point line. Junior PJ Savoy, the team's top marksman from a year ago made four on the night, on the way to 19 points in the contest. Seven different Seminoles hit a three on the night, a stark contrast from a season ago when the team ranked near the bottom of the ACC in three-point shooting and percentage. The depth on the roster, especially of those with shooting capabilities provides FSU with more versatility on the offensive end than it had last year. The game also provided a first glimpse of some new faces for the Seminoles, including the debut of highly recruited M.J.Walker. The true freshman dropped 17 points in his first game dawning the Garnet and Gold. Flashes of the athleticism that made him a five-star recruit appeared against the Mules, while the Jonesboro, Ga., native also showed some ability from the 3-point line.

## Game 1 -- Florida State 87, George Washington 67

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Terance Mann scored 17 points and pulled down eight rebounds, and the Seminoles had five players score in double-figures on its way to an 87-67, season-opening victory over George Washington. Christ Koumadje, the 7-foot-4 center, added a career-high 14 points, seven rebounds and five blocks, and senior Phil Cofer scored 15 for Florida State. The Seminoles shot better than 62 percent in the first 20 minutes, and they went into the break with 50 points despite not attempting a single free throw. Florida State finished with advantages in rebounding (37-31), points in the paint (52-20) and fast-break points (14-2). The Seminoles forced the Colonials into 19 turnovers. Heralded freshman M.J. Walker made a fine first impression with 12 points on 4 of 5 shooting, including a 3-for-4 mark from 3-point range. Redshirt freshman Mfondu Kabengele scored 10 in his debut and 7-foot freshman center Ike Obiagu made the most of his time on the floor with three blocks in just seven minutes.
