SEMINOLES FACE LSU IN SEMIFINALS OF ADVOCARE CLASSIC

No. 13/14 Florida State, which defeated UAB in the quarterfinals of the AdvoCare Invitational, 81-63, on Thursday night, plays No. 19/21 LSU at the HP Field House in Lake Buena Vista, Fla., on Friday, Nov. 23, 2018 at 4:30 p.m. The winner of Thursday's semifinal match-up will earn a spot in the championship game of the event on Sunday. Florida State earned its fourth consecutive double digit win of the season with its +18-point win over UAB, marking the second consecutive season the Seminoles have won each of its first four games of the season by at least 10 points. The Seminoles opened the 2017-18 season with five consecutive double-digit victories. In LSU, the Seminoles will face their second SEC opponent of the season after dispatching Florida, 81-60, on Nov. 6 in Tallahassee in the season opener for both teams.

FLORIDA STATE VS. LSU – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State will play LSU in the semifinals 2018 AdvoCare Invitational at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex. The game between the Seminoles and the Tigers is the second of two games against teams from the state of Louisiana for Florida State this season as they won at Tulane, 80-69, on Nov. 11. Florida State has an all-time record of 2-3 against LSU with its most recent game against the Tigers coming as a 67-50 loss on Dec. 30, 2004 in the Sugar Bowl Classic. The Seminoles' most recent victory over the Tigers came on Dec. 16, 1967 – a 130-100 win in the consolation game of the Milwaukee Classic in Milwaukee, Wisc. In that 1967 game, "Pistol" Pete Maravich scored 42 points for LSU and Dave Cowens added 24 for Florida State. Will Wade is in his second season as the head coach at LSU. He has coached against Florida State once as a head coach (at VCU; a 76-71 Seminole win on Dec. 6, 2015 in Atlanta). Wade was an assistant on the 2011 VCU team that defeated the Seminoles in the NCAA Tournament. He is familiar with the Seminoles as he was a student manager (2002-05), graduate assistant (2005-06) and director of basketball operations at Clemson under Oliver Purnell. Bill Armstrong, a Tiger assistant in his first season, was an assistant coach at Birmingham Southern when the Seminoles defeated the Panthers by a 56-47 mark on Dec. 15 2004 in Tallahassee. Nelson Hernandez, the Tigers' Director of Basketball Operations is also familiar with Florida State as the video coordinator at Clemson during the 2014-15 season. The Seminoles were 2-1 against the Tigers with a win in the ACC Tournament during his one season with the Tigers.

CURRENT SEMINOLES AGAINST THE SEC

The players on Florida State's roster are 6-0 against teams from the Southeastern Conference with five wins against Florida (2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19) and one against Mississippi State (2015-16). Senior Phil Cofer is the first player in school history to be a member of five teams that defeated Florida (he has never lost to the Gators during his career, 5-0) while senior Terance Mann is the only basketball player in school history to play in four victories over the Seminoles' in-state rivals. Seniors Christ Koumadje and PJ Savoy have played in three victories over Florida.

TWO SEMINOLES REACH THE CENTURY MARK IN WIN OVER UAB

A pair of Seminoles – Christ Koumadje (career blocked shots) and PJ Savoy (career 3-point shots made) -- both reach the statistical milestone of the century mark in Florida State's victory over UAB on Thursday night. Koumadje enters Friday's game against LSU tied for 15th in school history with 100 career blocked shots and Savoy enters the game against the Tigers ranked 22nd in school history with 100 career 3-point shots made.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat LSU and improve its record to 5-0 for the second consecutive season and third time since the start of the 2013-14 season. Florida State has started six seasons with at least five consecutive wins under 17th-year head coach Leonard Hamilton;

...Defeat LSU and improve its record to 5-0 in this event. The Seminoles won the championship of the previously named Old Spice Classic with a 3-0 record in 2009;

...Defeat LSU and defeat a nationally ranked team for the 45th time under 17th-year head coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles averaged nearly three wins over ranked teams per season in the first 16 years of the Hamilton-era in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State is 53-21 (.716 winning percentage) and has defeated 13 nationally ranked teams since the beginning of the 2016-17 season. The Seminoles will face their first ranked opponent of the 2018-19 season when they tip-off against No. 19/21 LSU on Friday in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational. Nearly one-quarter (13 of 53, .245 percent) of the Seminoles' victories in the last three seasons have come against nationally ranked opponents.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Led by junior Trent Forrest and his team-leading and career-high .941 free throw shooting percentage through the first four games of the season, Florida State enters Friday's game against LSU shooting .763 as a team from the free throw line. The Seminoles are shooting exceptionally well in their first two games of the AdvoCare Invitational with a .839 team mark from the line in its two wins over Canisius and UAB. Florida State shot a combined percentage of .689 (40 of 58) in its first two victories of the season against Florida (.706 percent) and at Tulane (.667).

FORREST FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Junior Trent Forrest entered the 2018-19 season as a .690 career free throw shooter. He enters Friday's game against LSU ranked fourth in the ACC with a career-high .941 shooting mark from the free throw line. He has made 16 of 17 free throws this season and five consecutive since the second half of the Seminole' victory over Tulane in New Orleans (Nov. 11).

MANN PERFECT FROM THE FIELD; LEADS SEMINOLES TO WIN OVER UAB

Senior Terance Mann was a perfect five-of-five from the field and scored 17 points in Florida State's 81-63 win over UAB on Thursday. It marked the second time this season and ninth time in the last two years that the guard has led the Seminoles in scoring. In making all five of his shots from the field against the Blazers, he raised his shooting percentage in the season to .583 percent and his career field goal shooting percentage to .574 percent – the 11th best career field goal shooting mark in school history.

NOTING TERANCE MANN

Senior Terance Mann enters Friday's game against LSU as the Seminoles' leader in minutes played (117 / 29.3 MPG), points scored (59 / 14.8 ppg) and 3-point field goal shooting percentage (4 of 5 / .800). The most amazing statistic on his line is that he has been whistled for only two fouls (one against Florida and one against UAB).

MANN GROWS CLOSER TO 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Senior Terance Mann enters Friday's game with 959 career points and needs only 41 points to become just the 47th player in school history with 1,000 career points.

MANN FROM THE BONUSPHERE

Senior Terance Mann is has made at least one 3-point shot in each of Florida State's first four games of the season and is shooting .800 from the 3-point line through the first four games of the season. He entered the 2018-19 season shooting .272 from the 3-point line during the first three seasons of his career.

KOUMADJE NEARLY NOTCHES FIRST CAREER DOUBLE-DOUBLE

With 12 points and a career-high tying nine rebounds, senior Christ Koumadje nearly recorded his first career double-double in Florida State's victory over UAB. His nine rebounds marked the second consecutive game he pulled down nine rebounds (also against Canisius) and the third time in his career he earned nine rebounds in a single game. Koumadje enters Friday's game against LSU averaging a career-high and team-leading 6.9 rebounds per game.

KABENGELE IN DOUBLE FIGURES IN THREE STRAIGHT GAMES

Redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele has scored in double figures in each of the Seminoles' last three games and is averaging 13.3 points per game in the Seminoles' victories at Tulane (12 points), at home against Canisius (18 points) and on the road against UAB (10 points).

VASSELL CONTINUES TO SHINE AS A TRUE FRESHMAN

Among the Seminoles' biggest surprises through the first four games of the season has been the play of freshman Devin Vassell. The guard scored 10 points in Florida State's win over Canisius and added nine more in the Seminoles' win over UAB. Vassell enters Friday's game against LSU averaging 7.3 points scored per game and shooting .500 from the field. He was a perfect two of two from the 3-point line in the Seminoles' win over UAB.

FLORIDA STATE VS. LSU – THE LAST GAME

Tack Minor scored a career-high 23 points and dished out nine assists to help LSU beat Florida State 67-50 in the Sugar Bowl Classic on Dec. 30, 2004. The Seminoles shot 41 percent from the field and were outrebounded by LSU 42-30. Florida State had 16 turnovers. Florida State was led by Jason Rich with 10 points. Against the Seminoles, LSU was effective defensively, especially in the second half when they held Florida State to 9-of-26 from the field. Both teams were cold to start the second half. The first basket of the half came almost three minutes in when Von Wafer scored to cut LSU's lead to 35-29. Five minutes into the half the Tigers led 41-33. Florida State pulled to within five – 47-42 – on a basket by Rich with 7:52 left. The Tigers used a 10-2 run to go up 58-44.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST LSU

Florida State's 130 points scored in its 130-100 win over the Tigers on Dec. 16, 1967 is the fourth highest total number of points scored in a single game and the most points scored by a Seminole team on a neutral court in school history.

FSU Forward Terance Mann Credits Mother For Turning Him Into Strong Leader, Floor Coach

When Florida State forward Terance Mann roamed his mother's college basketball practices, he had one simple job he took to be extreme.

Mann's duty growing up was to just be a ball boy and give basketballs to the players when requested, but he took his work to another level.

"He would protect that ball rack like it was his life, and the girls literally had to come up to him and ask me nicely for a basketball before he would give it to them," said Daynia La-Force, Mann's mother who has spent 22 years as a Division I women's basketball coach.

"He felt like those were his prized possessions and he would not give them up. He thought the ball boy was supposed to protect the basketballs."

Mann added with a smile, "Yeah, I guarded that ball rack with everything. I remember those days. They were fun."

As coach Leonard Hamilton and the Florida State men's basketball team prepares for Tuesday's season opener at home against George Washington University, the Seminoles will rely heavily Mann to lead by example and from experience this season.

Behind Magic rookie forward Jonathan Isaac, Hornets rookie guard Dwayne Bacon, Knicks G-League guard Xavier Rathan-Mayes, fifth-year center Michael Ojo and Mann last season, the Seminoles (26-9) went undefeated at home, finished second in the ACC and were a win short of tying the school record for victories in a season.

While their first trip back to the NCAA Tournament in five years was spoiled by a second-round exit to Xavier at Amway Center, the Seminoles hope Mann can be a pillar on a team that will be without a clear-cut NBA prospect and depending on a cast of developing players to compete in the vaunted ACC.

FSU will need Mann to shoot more from the outside, but his gritty multi-faceted play combined with his firsthand knowledge from his mother's practices make him an ideal candidate to lead the Seminoles.

"He was pretty much born on a court, and raised on a court," La-Force said. "He's learned everything from being on a basketball court, everything about life."

After playing at Georgetown, La-Force climbed up the women's coaching ranks up and down the East Coast at Long Island University, St. John's, New Haven and Northeastern. She is now entering her fourth season at the University of Rhode Island. Mann, 21, and his younger brother Martin, 19, have been fixtures on the practice courts, learning along the way.

During quiet moments together, La-Force would ask Mann which players were wearing certain jerseys so he could learn his numbers.

As practice was underway, Mann and his brother were on the sidelines imitating the players' actions. When La-Force blew her whistle to coach up a player, Mann listened to the yelling intently until it was time for him to also resume practicing.

When it was time to head back home after road games, Mann and his brother would ask if they could go sit in the back of the bus with the girls on the team.

As they got older, they would travel with La-Force on her recruiting trips to scout for new players — something Mann surprisingly loved. More than the traveling to new places and going out to dinner, Mann enjoyed sitting in basketball gyms for high school and AAU games like a coach himself.

“Believe it or not, I like going recruiting with her,” Mann said. “Since I was younger, I would give my mom little tidbits of players I would see.”

If La-Force’s team suffered a loss on a certain day, Terance and his brother knew to keep their distance. Mann said he would often check in with his mother after the games, hear her “coaching spiel” about the unfortunate outcome and then head back to his room to play video games to let her finish stewing.

“If I lost a game, he may not have had dinner or help with his homework,” La-Force said with a laugh. “They knew to give me at least an hour after a loss to cool off.”

As Mann has gone through prep school and is now entering his third season at FSU, he and La-Force have to stay connected from afar.

Before every FSU game, La-Force loves to send Mann a special text letting him know it is game day. While they might speak briefly before tipoff, they like to save their 20-minute debriefing for after the games.

“He always listens, wants to talk, sometimes giving me his side of the story. Then I have to say, ‘No, no, no, this is what I saw,’” La-Force said.

Mann admits there may be times when he’s not ready for his mother’s honesty. But it’s more than appreciated.

“I wouldn’t say it’s like a coach and player relationship. I feel like she’s my mentor,” Mann said of his mother. “She’s my mom of course. But I feel like she’s always trying to give me life lessons like a mentor.

“Whatever happens, I’ll go to her and ask her for advice and she’ll have the right answer. Sometimes it’s not the answer that I want, but it’s always right.”

Luckily for Mann and his mother, La-Force’s schedule lined up perfectly, allowing her to visit FSU for the team’s two exhibitions. She will also be in the stands for the season opener after her first two games of the season, but she won’t be able to see Mann in person again until the ACC or NCAA tournaments later in the year.

“It just worked out that way — it’s God giving me an opportunity to watch him grow, watch him play,” La-Force said.

She said her proudest moments as Mann’s mother are when she hears how respected and valued he is as a leader in FSU’s program.

Mann hopes to make her even more proud this season, with high hopes for the Seminoles and himself this season. “I have to step it up this year, definitely, on both sides of the ball,” Mann said. “I’m trying to not only get defensive player of the year, but I’m definitely trying to get on the ACC All-Defensive Team. That’s one of my big goals.

“I definitely have to step it up.”

Exhibition 2 – Florida State 99, Valdosta State 77

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Florida State defeated Valdosta State, 99-77, in its second and final exhibition game to open the 2018-19 season. Redshirt freshman RaiQuan Gray scored the first seven points of the game for the Seminoles on a pair of smooth driving lay-ins and a three-point bomb from the wing. Game 4 -- Florida State 81, UAB 63

LAKE BUENA VISTA, Fla. -- Bolstered by a 5-for-5 night from the field and a 6-of-7 effort at the free-throw line, guard Terance Mann scored a game-high 17 points to lead Florida State past UAB, 81-63, to earn a spot in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational. The Seminoles relied upon their signature stingy defense to blow past the Blazers, holding UAB to 19 of 58 from the field (33 percent) and 2-14 (14 percent) from the 3-point line. Both marks were a season-bests for the Seminoles, and their two 3-point shots allowed were the least by an FSU team since Fordham made just one on Nov. 17, 2018. After a slow start that saw scoreless basketball for the first 2:30, FSU senior PJ Savoy found his stride, connecting on back-to-back 3-point baskets to earn the game's first points. With the game tied 8-8 five minutes into the first half, senior Christ Koumadje catapulted an 11-1 run that held UAB without a field goal for 6:18. Off an inbound lob, Koumadje threw down a heavy dunk that put the Noles up 14-11. A few possessions later, he had yet another slam that extended the lead to five. Koumadje used his size and strength to dominate the paint all night. He finished with 12 points, a career-high tying nine rebounds and three blocks. His three blocks put him at 100 blocks for his career. Florida State ran through the first half off of a balanced scoring attack that saw nine different Seminoles score at least one basket. Fresh off a 10-point showing against Canisius, freshman Devin Vassell hit a corner 3-point shot to put FSU up 27-15 at the 7:01 mark.
