RANKED TEAMS MEET AS PURDUE COMES TO TALLAHASSEE FOR ACC / BIG TEN CHALLENGE

Florida State, which played for the championship of the AdvoCare Invitational, plays host to No. 18/19 Purdue in the 20th Annual ACC / Big Ten Challenge on Wednesday, November 28, 2018 at 9:15 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. It marks the second meeting of the two teams in the Challenge and the third time the Seminoles have played the Boilermakers in the sport of basketball. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game with a 5-1 record after winning their first five games of the season for the second consecutive season. Florida State's game against Purdue is the first game of a two-game home stand for the Seminoles who play host to Troy in its next game on Monday, December 3, 2018 at 8:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. PURDUE – A SERIES HISTORY

Florida State plays host to Purdue in the 20th Annual ACC - Big Ten Challenge on November 28, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles and the Boilermakers have met once previously in the challenge, with the Seminoles taking a 97-57 win on Dec. 29, 2005 in Tallahassee. Florida State is 2-0 against Purdue in the all-time series between the two teams with wins during the 1974-75 and 2005-06 seasons. Florida State's 69-66 win over the Boilermakers on Dec. 26, 1974 came in the first round of the Holiday Classic in Louisville, Ky. Matt Painter, the head coach of the Boilermakers since the start of the 2005-06 season, has faced the Seminoles once – with Florida State defeating his first Purdue team in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge. Greg Gary, who is in his seventh season as an assistant coach at Purdue, played three years of collegiate basketball at Tulane (1990, 1991, 1992) – and faced the Seminoles as members of the Metro Conference four times during his career. Florida State was 3-1 against the Green Wave with Gary as their starting point guard. Elliott Bloom, Purdue's Director of Basketball Administration and Operations, was the sports information director for the Duke men's basketball team in the ACC during the 2000-01 season.

FLORIDA STATE LOOKS TO CONTINUE ITS WINNING WAYS AT HOME

Florida State enters Wednesday's night's game against Purdue as the winningest team in the nation on its home court since the start of the 2015-16 season. With 33 wins in its last 35 games played in the Donald L. Tucker Center during the 2016-17 (a perfect 18-0 record), 2017-18 season (13-2 record) and 2018-19 (2-0 record), Florida State is the winningest team on its home court in the nation in the last two seasons. The Seminoles have a .943 winning percentage at home in the last three seasons and have a better winning percentage than Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium (.938), North Carolina in the Dean Smith Center (.903), Kentucky in Rupp Arena (.886), Michigan State in the Breslin Center (.882) and Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse (.853).

...Defeat Purdue and win its third consecutive ACC / Big Ten Challenge game. The Seminoles defeated Minnesota in Tallahassee during the 2016-17 Challenge and won at Rutgers in Piscataway, N.J. during the 2017-18 Challenge;

...Defeat Purdue and raise its home record in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge to 7-3. The Seminoles won their first five home games in the history of the Challenge which included a home victory over Purdue on Nov. 29, 2005.

...Defeat Purdue and win its 28th consecutive non-conference home game at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Since the start of the 2013-14 season, the Seminoles are 35-1 in non-conference home games;

MANN CLOSING IN ON 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Senior guard Terance Mann enters Wednesday's game against Purdue with 977 career points – he needs only 23 to become the 47th member of Florida State's 1,000 career point club. He is Florida State's leading scorer with a 12.0 points per game scoring average – the second consecutive season he has averaged at 12.0 points scored per game. Mann was Florida State's second leading scorer with a career-high 12.6 points per game scoring average during the 2017-18 season.

SEMINOLES' MANN NAMED TO ADVOCARE INVITATIONAL ALL TOURNAMENT TEAM

Florida State's Terance Mann, who averaged 11.8 points, 5.8 rebounds and 2.5 assists in four games, was named to the AdvoCare Invitational All-Tournament team along with Dhamir Cosby-Roundtree (MVP) and Eric Paschall of Villanova, Cameron McGriff of Oklahoma State and Grant Riller of the College of Charleston. It's the third career All-Tournament mention for Mann who was also named to the 2018 NCAA Tournament All-West Regional Tournament team and the 2017 Jamaica Classic All-Tournament Team. Mann was an All-ACC Honorable Mention selection in 2018.

SEMINOLES TO HONOR NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE AGAINST PURDUE

The Florida State men's basketball team will wear turquoise Nike N7 uniforms against Purdue on Wednesday in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge to raise awareness for bringing sport to Native American and Aboriginal youth. It marks the 11th time (and first of two times this season) the Seminoles will wear the special uniforms. It also marks the sixth consecutive season the Seminoles will wear the turquoise uniforms. Florida State makes a distinct departure from its traditional school colors to don turquoise Nike N7 uniforms to stand for the importance of bringing sport and physical activity to Native American and Aboriginal youth. "The Seminole Tribe of Florida approached us about this program, and we are honored and excited to wear these unique uniforms," said head coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles first wore the turquoise uniforms in their 89-61 win over UT-Martin in Tallahassee on November 17, 2013.

FLORIDA STATE VS. PURDUE – THE LAST GAME

Alexander Johnson led four Florida State players in double figures with 14 points in the Seminoles' 97-57 win over Purdue in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on November 29, 2005 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Al Thornton and Isaiah Swann each contributed 12 points, and Jason Rich added 11 as the Seminoles defeated the Boilermakers in just the second-ever meeting between the teams. Twelve different players scored for the Seminoles, who got 41 points from the bench, and led by as many as 43 points. Harried by Florida State's pressure man-to-man defense, rebuilding Purdue shot just 39 percent from the floor and 24 percent (4-of-17) from 3-point range. Korey Spates led turnover-prone Purdue with 13 points, while Nate Minnoy added 11 points. Purdue committed 28 turnovers that led to 41 Florida State points. Florida State broke out to an early lead, using a 28-8 run from the start to build a 58-23 lead at the half. The Seminoles shot 64.7 percent in the first half and 60.3 percent for the game, while hitting 12-of-22 shots (54.5 percent) on 3-pointers.

Trent Forrest: A Man of Impact

When Trent Forrest was growing up, his parents instilled in him one very important message: Lead, never follow.

In his first season as a full-time starter as a junior and a respected leader throughout the entire Florida State men's basketball program, it is safe to say that Forrest got the message.

In the Seminoles' run to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament last season, Forrest led the team in assists and steals. He averaged 7.9 points, 4.9 rebounds, 4.1 assists and 1.6 steals as a sophomore, appearing in 34 games as the Seminoles finished the season with a 23-12 record. He was eighth in the ACC in steals and 10th in assists -- one of five players in the conference to rank in the top 10 in both categories.

Forrest was at his best during the NCAA Tournament, when he averaged 9.5 points, 5.3 rebounds, 4.8 assists and 2.5 steals in the Seminoles' four contests. He posted double figures in two of those games, scoring 10 points against Missouri and 14 against No. 1 seeded Xavier.

What's most impressive about Forrest, however, is not what he can do on the court, but the manner in which he carries himself off of it. Simply put, he aims to be a man of impact both on the basketball court and in the community.

"I want to be one of the leaders in community service and in athletics in general," said Forrest. "In all of athletics at Florida State, I want our team to be one of the one that invests the most time in the community."

In his first two seasons as a Seminole, Forrest has certainly solidified himself as a leader in athletics. He was named to the 2017 and 2018 All-ACC Academic Basketball Team, as well as the 2017 and 2018 ACC Academic Honor Roll.

In addition to his role on the men's basketball team, he currently serves as a member of the Student Athlete Advisory Council and is an active member of REAL Men (Reliable Educated Approachable Leaders) and LYFE (Leaders Yearning for Excellence).

Being a presence within the community is not a responsibility that Forrest takes lightly.

When asked about his service experiences, especially those that involve mentoring children within the Tallahassee community, his eyes light up and his smile widens.

"It means a lot, because outside of basketball kids look up to us," said Forrest. "They want to be like us, so just setting a good example for them is one of my biggest things to do to set the stage for the next generation. You see them smile. Sometimes you can go to schools and there's kids that are having bad days and they'll end up seeing us and they'll have a good day. That's what it's all about and that's the reason to do things like that."

Forrest's efforts have not gone unnoticed.

In 2018, he was honored with the LYFE Mr. Inspirational Award, further solidifying himself as a leader within Florida State Athletics.

"Trent Forrest is an outstanding student-athlete who seeks to achieve at the highest levels on the basketball court and in the classroom," said Derrick Coles, director of student-athlete development and community service. "It is quickly evident that Trent really wants to be a champion in the community through his tireless work as a mentor to many students in the local elementary and middle schools."

Forrest's service efforts are not simply limited to mentorship. Recently, he has focused his efforts on helping those within the Tallahassee community, and the Florida Panhandle, in the wake of Hurricane Michael.

Growing up in Chipley, Fla., a small town less than 100 miles northwest of Florida State, Forrest has seen the devastating effects of the storm both in his hometown and in Tallahassee, his home away from home.

Since the hurricane, he and his teammates have engaged in efforts to assist their neighboring communities. Less than two weeks ago, the team traveled to Blountstown, Fla., to provide affected families with boxes of food and toiletries. In addition, just days after the storm, the Seminoles helped load trucks with 40,000 cases of water and 28,000 cases of food to send down to the neighboring coast. Forrest was at the forefront of it all.

In the wake of all the devastation, Forrest hopes that he and his teammates can offer the community both within Tallahassee and throughout the Florida Panhandle the distraction it needs.

"I feel like we can provide a lot to the community this year," said Forrest "A lot of people are without and those same people are people that support Florida State. I feel like they're looking for us to get their mind off of the hurricane.

"I know my mom, she called me and said, 'I can't wait for you all to play so I can stop thinking about the storm and trying to get the house back together.

"I feel like that's how it is for everybody in the Panhandle area, it just gives them something to get their mind off of that for a few hours."

Forrest has been surrounded by leaders his entire life. His mom a pastor and his dad his basketball coach, Forrest's development into a leader was inevitable. What separates him from others is his ability to lead in all facets of his life, whether it be on the basketball court, in the classroom, or in the community.

"Trent has a way of seeing things that need to be addressed and he addresses it," said Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton. "He's from a special family, he has tremendous morals and he's been taught the right way. He has tremendous character and he's one of those guys that don't along very often."

LAKE BUENA VISTA, Fla. -- Bolstered by a 5-for-5 night from the field and a 6-of-7 effort at the free-throw line, guard Terance Mann scored a game-high 17 points to lead Florida State past UAB, 81-63, to earn a spot in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational. The Seminoles relied upon their signature sting defense to blow past the Blazers, holding UAB to 19 of 58 from the field (33 percent) and 2-14 (14 percent) from the 3-point line. Both marks were a season-bests for the Seminoles, and their two 3-point shots allowed were the least by an FSU team since Fordham made just one on Nov. 17, 2018. His three blocks put him at 100 blocks for his career. Florida State ran through the first half off of a balanced scoring attack that saw nine different Seminoles score at least one basket. Fresh off a 10-point showing against Canisius, freshman Devin Vassell hit a corner 3-point shot to put FSU up 27-15 at the 7:01 mark.

Reid, slowed recently by an ankle injury, scored 12 points in 41 minutes. M.J. Walker had 13 of his game-high 21 points during the first half as Florida State took a 30-29 lead at the break.
