**NO. 11/12 FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO NORTH FLORIDA ON WEDNESDAY AT 7:00 P.M.**

No. 11/12 Florida State, which has won four consecutive games, plays host to North Florida at the Donald L. Tucker Center on Wednesday, December 19, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. The Seminoles defeated Southeast Missouri, 85-68, on Monday to raise their record to 9-1 – the third consecutive season they have won nine of their first 10 games. Florida State enters Wednesday's game against North Florida ranked No. 11 by the Associated Press and No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches poll – the third consecutive week it has been ranked No. 11 or higher in the AP poll and the third straight week the Seminoles have been ranked No. 12 or higher in the coaches poll. Following Wednesday's game against the Ospreys, the Seminoles will travel to Sunrise, Fla., to play Saint Louis in the Metro by T-Mobile Orange Bowl Classic at the BB&T Center. Florida State's game against the Billekins marks their seventh consecutive appearance in the event.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. NORTH FLORIDA – A SERIES HISTORY**

Florida State plays host to North Florida on Dec. 19, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. One of only four games scheduled against teams from the state of Florida during the regular season series, the Seminoles are renewing a series that began in 2010 with three games (all Florida State wins) having been played in the series. All three games played by the Seminoles under head coach Leonard Hamilton have been played in Tallahassee at the Tucker Center. North Florida head coach Matt Driscoll has coached the Ospreys in each of the first three games of the series and knows the Seminoles and Hamilton well. Driscoll spent six seasons as an assistant to Larry Shyatt at Clemson (1998-2003) – a time period when the Seminoles were 9-7 against the Tigers, including four wins in the ACC Tournament. Bobby Keenan, the associate head coach at North Florida, served on Seminole playing and coaching legend Hugh Durham's coaching staff at Jacksonville for five years (2000-05). Bruce Evans, also an assistant coach on the UNF staff, was the Director of Player Development at Georgia Tech (2012-16) when the Seminoles earned a 3-1 mark against the Yellow Jackets. Evans coached at North Florida from 2010-12 including in the first two games (both Florida State wins) of the series between the Seminoles and the Ospreys.

**SEMINOLES OFF TO BEST START SINCE ... LAST YEAR**

At 9-1, Florida State is off to its best 10-game start since the beginning of the 2017-18 season (last year) when the Seminoles also won nine of their first 10 games. Each time the Seminoles have begun a season with a 9-1 or 10-0 record (2003-04), they have been 10-1 after their first 11 games of the season. After starting the 2017-18 season at 9-1, the Seminoles improved to 10-1 with a win over Charleston Southern and then to 11-1 with a victory over Southern Miss.

**FLORIDA STATE'S WINNING STREAKS TO OPEN THE 2018-19 SEASON**

Florida State won its first five games of the 2018-19 season and enters its game against North Florida with a four game winning streak. The Seminoles are 22-3 (.880 winning percentage) in non-conference games – including 3-1 in the 2018 NCAA Tournament in the last two seasons.

**LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...**

...Defeat North Florida and win its 31<sup>st</sup> consecutive non-conference home game. The Seminoles are 38-1 (.974 winning percentage) at home on non-ACC games since the beginning of the 2014-15 season;  
 ...Defeat North Florida and win its fourth consecutive game against North Florida. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against the Ospreys with a 3-0 series lead;  
 ...Defeat North Florida and raise its record at home to 37-2 (.949 winning percentage) since the start of the 2015-16 season.

**SEMINOLES IN THE POLLS**

Florida State has defeated two teams (No. 19/21 LSU and No. 18/19 Purdue) which were nationally ranked in the polls at the time of the games.

**FLORIDA STATE BY THE NUMBERS AGAINST SOUTHEAST MISSOURI...**

...Florida State outrebounded Southeast Missouri by a 46-28 margin (+18 rebounds). The Seminoles' 46 rebounds ranked as their highest total of the season as does their +18 rebounding margin against the Redhawks;

...Florida State tied its season-high with five blocked shots – including four by senior Christ Koumadje. The Seminoles have blocked five shots in both of their last two games (five against UConn and five against Southeast Missouri) and have blocked five shots three times this season (also against UAB in the quarterfinals of the AdvoCare Invitational);

...Florida State defeated Southeast Missouri by an 85-68 score – a +17-point margin of victory. The Seminoles have earned six of their nine wins this season by double figures and enter Wednesday's game against North Florida with a +12.1 margin of victory for the season;

...Florida State shot 50 percent from the field (31 of 62). It marked the second time this season the Seminoles have shot 50 percent from the field (also in its win over Canisius).

**COFER TO FACE NORTH FLORIDA FOR SECOND TIME IN CAREER**

Redshirt senior Phil Cofer, who made his season debut against Southeast Missouri on Monday night, will play in his second game of the season on Wednesday against North Florida. His appearance against the Ospreys marks the second appearance of his career against North Florida. He totaled a then career-high 14 points and eight rebounds in Florida State's 93-77 victory over the Ospreys on December 17, 2014 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The game was the 10<sup>th</sup> of Cofer's Seminole career and the second time he scored in double figures during his freshman season. He totaled 14 against Northeastern in the second game of his career. Cofer scored in double figures six times and averaged 6.9 points during his freshman season (2014-15).

**FORREST SCORES CAREER-HIGH 23 IN WIN OVER SOUTHEAST MISSOURI**

Junior Trent Forrest played one of the most complete games of his 79-game career as he totaled a career-high 23 points, pulled down eight rebounds, was credited with four assists and three steals. He scored 13 of his 23 in the first half with 11 of his 13 points coming in the final 9:44 after the Redhawks had taken an 11-point lead (21-10 with 10:14 left to play in the first half). He scored 11 of the Seminoles' final 26 points of the half and helped his team forge a 34-34 tie at the intermission. Forrest totaled 10 points, four rebounds, three assists and two steals in the second half as FSU pulled away for the victory.

**TRENT FORREST BY THE NUMBERS...**

...He scored his career-high of 23 points in Florida State's victory over Southeast Missouri on Monday night. He enters Wednesday's game against North Florida averaging a career-high 11.1 points per game, shooting a career-high .500 from the field, a career-high .841 from the free throw line, shooting 15.1 percentage points above his career free throw shooting percentage entering the 2018-19 season, and having scored in double figures in 13 of his last 20 games dating to a 16-point performance in Florida State's victory over Clemson on Feb. 14, 2018.

**NOTING TRENT FORREST AGAINST SOUTHEAST MISSOURI**

Junior Trent Forrest led the Seminoles in scoring (23 points), rebounding (eight rebounds), assists (four assists) and steals (three steals) in their victory over Southeast Missouri on Monday night. He became the first Seminole to lead the team in all four categories since Devon Booker led Florida State in scoring (15 points), rebounds (five rebounds), assists (four assist) and steals (two steals) in an 88-66 victory over Boston College in the ACC Tournament in Washing, D.C. on March 8, 2016.

**DAVID NICHOLS IN HIS LAST TWO GAMES...**

...Has scored 29 points and is averaging 14.5 points per game. He scored 16 points in Florida State's victory over UConn (Dec. 8) and 13 in the Seminoles' win over Southeast Missouri (Dec. 17) to mark the first two times he has scored in double figures in his Florida State career;

...He is shooting .667 from the field (10 of 15) and has made five field goals in each of his last two games against UConn and Southeast Missouri State;

...He is shooting .750 from the 3-point line (six of eight) and has made three shots from the bonusphere in both of the Seminoles' wins over UConn and Southeast Missouri State.

**KOUMADJE MOVING UP THE SEMINOLES' CAREER BLOCKED SHOTS LIST**

Senior Christ Koumadje has blocked four shots in both of the Seminoles' last two games and enters Wednesday's game against North Florida ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in school history with 110 career blocks. He needs only eight blocked shots to move into Florida State's all-time top 10 in the big man category. Koumadje has eight blocked shots in the last two games and is averaging a career-high 1.6 blocked shots per game as a senior.

**KOUMADJE PERFECT FROM THE FIELD AGAINST SOUTHEAST MISSOURI**

Senior Christ Koumadje was a perfect six of six from the field against Southeast Missouri and enters Wednesday's game against North Florida shooting .596 from the field. He is one of the Seminoles' all-time leading field goal percentage shooters (.614 percent, 167 of 272) and is ranked third in school history in career field goal shooting percentage. Koumadje has made six consecutive field goals as Wednesday's game begins.

**DEVIN VASSELL NOT PLAYING LIKE A FRESHMAN**

Freshman Devin Vassell scored his career-high of 16 points and pulled down four rebounds in the Seminoles; 85-68 win over Southeast Missouri on Monday night. He entered the game having scored 29 points in his first seven games of his career. With four rebounds against the Redhawks, he nearly matched his total of eight rebounds in his first seven appearances as a Seminole.

**MFIONDU KABENGELE IN HIS LAST THREE GAMES...**

...Has scored 34 points and is averaging 11.3 points per game, has pulled down 16 rebounds and is averaging 5.3 rebounds per game and is shooting .545 from the field (12 of 22).

**FLORIDA STATE VS. NORTH FLORIDA – THE LAST GAME**

Montay Brandon had a career-high 24 points and Kiel Turpin added a career-high 19 points as Florida State routed North Florida 93-77 on December 17, 2014 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. They were helped by a pair of freshmen who had strong nights. Phil Cofer had 14 points and eight rebounds and Xavier Rathon-Mayes had 11 points and nine assists while FSU shot 34 of 58 (58.6 percent) from the floor. Brandon was tough to stop, driving into the lane and made 8 of 11 shots from the floor. He had eight assists and also made 7 of 8 free-throw attempts for his best night in three college seasons. Dallas Moore scored 23 points on 9 of 17 shooting, and Chris Davenport added 20 points on 5 of 8 shooting for North Florida (6-5). Davenport also made 10 of 13 free-throw attempts. The Ospreys shot 24 of 56 (42.9 percent) from the floor. North Florida struggled from beyond the 3-point arc, making just 5 of 24 (20.8 percent) of its shots. The Seminoles outbounded the Ospreys 38-27. Turpin made 8 of 9 shots against the North Florida defense.

## Florida State's Mann Joins 1,000 Point Club

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Terance Mann prides himself on doing a little bit of everything for the Florida State men's basketball team.

A look at the Seminoles' stat book shows Mann at the top in both points (12.1) and rebounds per game (7.4), and among the team leaders in shooting percentage, free-throw percentage and assists. He's also chipped in a handful of blocks and steals, and maybe an uncountable number of opponents' plays disrupted by his defensive intensity.

And it's Mann's commitment to versatility that makes his latest milestone just a little bit sweeter.

Mann scored 20 points during Florida State's 79-71 victory over Connecticut last week. Along the way, he permanently etched his name into FSU basketball history by becoming just the 47<sup>th</sup> Seminole to score 1,000 points in his career.

The senior guard now sits 1,009 career points, good for 46<sup>th</sup> on FSU's all-time list and within range of the top 25. (A spot that Mann's friend and former teammate, Xavier Rathan-Mayes, holds with 1,236 points.)

"It's definitely cool to be a part of that group," Mann said. "Just to see everything come together, I'm so thankful. God really blessed me with this opportunity."

Mann is the third Seminole of his era to reach the 1,000-point mark, joining Rathan-Mayes, Dwayne Bacon (1,139, 32<sup>nd</sup>) and Devon Bookert (1,120, 34<sup>th</sup>).

Bacon is currently in his second year with the NBA's Charlotte Hornets, while Rathan-Mayes and Bookert have each play professional basketball overseas.

While Mann isn't the first of his peers to reach 1,000 points, he might be the first to have done it his way.

Bacon was no surprise, a former McDonald's All-American who was pegged for NBA stardom before he ever set foot on campus. Rathan-Mayes was one of FSU's most sought-after prospects of the last decade, and captivated the college hoops world when he scored 30 points in four minutes, 38 seconds during a game at Miami.

And Bookert was a sharp-shooting 3-point specialist, whose .419 percentage from the perimeter ranks fifth in school history.

Mann, though, arrived at Florida State as a relatively under-the-radar recruit, the son of a basketball coach who as a middle schooler met FSU assistant Charlton Young and kept Young's Seminoles in mind when it came time to play college basketball.

"I grew up dreaming about this," Mann said.

In recent years, FSU coach Leonard Hamilton has preached that the Seminoles strength lies in the quality of their overall depth, and that if 11 players all buy into playing as hard and as selflessly as they can, they'll find success. Mann has perhaps been the greatest embodiment of that philosophy.

On some nights, like his most recent outing against UConn, Mann might stuff the basket and lead the Seminoles in scoring.

On others, like FSU's game against Troy a few nights before, he might have a quiet night on the offensive end, but still manage to contribute on defense and on the glass.

No matter the game, the end result has been largely the same – with Mann leading the way, the Seminoles have amassed an 8-1 record and a No. 10 national ranking.

“It really just goes back to the type of guy Terance is,” junior guard Trent Forrest said. “He focuses on things other than scoring. And when you look up he has 15 and 10, and you're like ‘Where did that come from?’”

Mann is proud of the feat – he'd like to one day have the game ball from his 1,000<sup>th</sup> point on display – but, in the midst of his senior season, he also has his sights set on a much bigger prize.

The Seminoles last season embarked on a stunning NCAA tournament run that ended just a few points short of their first Final Four since 1972.

Come March, FSU's newest member of the 1,000-point club plans to take that next step to the Final Four. And he has no intention of stopping there, either.

“We have one goal in mind,” Mann said, “and that's to get to the Final Four and win the national championship.”

Do that, and Mann will be remembered for far more than just scoring 1,000 points.

## **Anthony Polite Takes Different Path To Same Destination As His Father**

Despite the garnet and gold in his gene pool, Anthony Polite didn't grow up around Florida State.

In fact, the Florida State legacy spent the first 15 years of his life on a different continent.

Polite was born in Lugano, Switzerland while his father Michael was playing basketball abroad.

That didn't stop him from following in his father's footsteps and ending up at FSU as well.

"It has been a part of his life from when he was a very small kid," Michael Polite told the *Tallahassee Democrat*.

"I'd bring my bag home with the ball in there. Him, as a child, rolling it around the house, his mom allowing him to play with the ball and him becoming familiar with that round ball and having a love for it kind of snowballs."

Michael played at FSU from 1987 through 1991. He finished his career with 1,066 points and was on teams that made the NCAA Tournament in three of his four seasons with the Seminoles.

"He has the benefit of a father who really knew something about basketball. That speaks for itself," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said.

After his time in Tallahassee, he went onto have a 10-year career in Europe. It was during this time that Michael's wife Maddalena gave birth to Anthony.

Even after Michael's time as a professional player ended, the Polites stayed in Switzerland.

Polite bounced back and forth between basketball and soccer before locking in on wanting to seriously play basketball when he was 12.

"He's been a student of the game," Michael said.

"He knows the history of where I started, from my high school and then obviously playing college ball and then seeing me play professionally, wanting to follow in his dad's footsteps."

A few years and a move to a different area in Switzerland later, Anthony decided he wanted to play high school basketball in the United States.

He moved to Boca Raton and enrolled at St. Andrew's School as a freshman at 15 while his mother stayed back in Switzerland, where she remains to this day.

"His mom has really been supportive of him liking the game and him actually wanting to follow in his dad's footsteps," Michael said.

Added Anthony, "I always looked up to my dad and my mom. They always wanted the best for me. My dream was always to come play college basketball.

"Once I came over here and I moved to the states, (FSU) was definitely one of my top choices."

After a prolific playing career which saw him named the 2017 Palm Beach Player of the Year as a senior, Polite chose FSU over Miami and Memphis, among others.

While his connection to FSU seemed clear on paper, Michael is adamant that his career had little impact on his son's decision to pursue basketball and to do so at FSU.

"I never really pushed him in the direction that he has to do what his dad did. He just had a love for the game and was a student of the game," Michael said.

"Growing up in Switzerland, his mom being supportive of him being a basketball player, he just followed some of the better players, better leagues and the competition in terms of college basketball as well. He decided to come here and play college basketball here and he learned the game from this perspective being here in the U.S. and just studied the collegiate game as well.

"He took a visit to Florida State and fell in love with the program in terms of how coach Hamilton runs his program, the guys showing a lot of love towards him as a player and he made his decision. It was nothing that I forced on him. It was something that he studied and decided to come play for Florida State."

While Anthony played his entire high school career in the U.S., Hamilton sees aspects of his game that developed from his time playing abroad.

"He brings that European system where I think they spend a lot of time with youngsters earlier in life fundamentally. He seems to be pretty sound when he dribbles left, dribbles right, he has good shooting form," Hamilton said.

Michael added, "Growing up in Europe, he has that European style, he has that style of play. Then, obviously, coming over to the U.S., playing high school ball, playing on the AAU circuit, he's done a tremendous job of transitioning his game from learning how to play the game and the fundamentals over in Europe and then picking up the style of play here."

After battling tendinitis in both of his knees last year while redshirting, Polite has earned his first significant playing time this season.

Averaging 14.3 minutes, Polite is seeing the most playing time out of the Seminoles' four true or redshirt freshmen.

"I'm not surprised. I've seen Anthony put in a lot of work in his first two years," FSU point guard Trent Forrest said.

"I knew he was going to be a pretty good player defensively and he was always able to shoot the ball. I feel like he's just gaining his confidence."

His intensity and ability to operate the Junkyard Dog defense Hamilton wants to see is one of the main things to which this can be attributed.

"I like him being in a stance, I like the pressure he's putting on the ball," Hamilton said.

"I envision him as some point being a good defender, a guy who can pick up the point guard for us and a guy also who can knock down jump shots."

Added Anthony, "I know I'm a good defender so that's what I do. If my shot's not falling, I have to find something else that I can produce in and that's defense, steals, rebounds, finding someone else."

All of this has Hamilton excited about the legacy Anthony may leave behind in his own right at FSU.

"The fact that he has the potential he's developed, he has the energy and the quickness and speed and the strength to defend. I think he's obviously a pretty good shooter, pretty good dribbler," Hamilton said.

"I do think that you can see the future is very bright for him and for us."

## Game 4 -- Florida State 81, UAB 63

LAKE BUENA VISTA, Fla. -- Bolstered by a 5-for-5 night from the field and a 6-of-7 effort at the free-throw line, guard Terance Mann scored a game-high 17 points to lead Florida State past UAB, 81-63, to earn a spot in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational. The Seminoles relied upon their signature stingy defense to blow past the Blazers, holding UAB to 19 of 58 from the field (33 percent) and 2-14 (14 percent) from the 3-point line. Both marks were a season-bests for the Seminoles, and their two 3-point shots allowed were the least by an FSU team since Fordham made just one on Nov. 17, 2018. After a slow start that saw scoreless basketball for the first 2:30, FSU senior P.J. Savoy found his stride, connecting on back-to-back 3-point baskets to earn the game's first points. With the game tied 8-8 five minutes into the first half, senior Christ Koumadje catapulted an 11-1 run that held UAB without a field goal for 6:18. Off an inbound lob, Koumadje threw down a heavy dunk that put the Noles up 14-11. A few possessions later, he had yet another slam that extended the lead to five. Koumadje used his size and strength to dominate the paint all night. He finished with 12 points, a career-high tying nine rebounds and three blocks. His three blocks put him at 100 blocks for his career. Florida State ran through the first half off of a balanced scoring attack that saw nine different Seminoles score at least one basket. Fresh off a 10-point showing against Canisius, freshman Devin Vassell hit a corner 3-point shot to put FSU up 27-15 at the 7:01 mark.

### Game 10 -- Florida State 85, Southeast Missouri 68

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Forrest scored a career-high 23 points and freshman Devin Vassell added 16 points as No. 11 Florida State overcame a sluggish first half and beat Southeast Missouri 85-68. Florida State secured its 30th straight non-conference home win. Nebraska is the last non-conference team to defeat the Seminoles, 70-65 on Dec. 1, 2014. Ledarius Brewer scored 16 points and Skyler Hogan added 14 points, knocking down four 3-pointers, for Southeast Missouri. Christ Koumadje added seven rebounds as Florida State outrebounded the undersized Redhawks 46-28. The Seminoles shot 50 percent (31 for 62).
