**FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO TROY ON MONDAY AT 8:00 P.M.**

Florida State, one of only five teams in the top 15 of the Associated Press poll which has defeated multiple nationally ranked teams in the first month of the season, plays host to Troy on Monday, December 3, 2018 at 8:00 p.m. The Seminoles are joined by only Kansas, Duke, Virginia and Michigan as the five teams in the nation who have defeated two ranked teams entering the month of December. The Seminoles have six wins entering their game against Troy – with victories registered of then No. 19/21 LSU in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational (November 23; 79-76 in overtime) and then No. 18/19 Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge (November 28, 73-72). Florida State's game against Troy is its second of two consecutive home games with two more home games coming after the university's semester exam period (December 17 against Southeast Missouri and December 19 against North Florida). Following Monday's game against Troy the Seminoles travel to play UConn in the Never Forget Tribute Classic on December 8 at the Prudential Center in Newark, N.J.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. TROY – A SERIES HISTORY**

Florida State will play host to Troy University on Dec. 3, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The series between the Seminoles and the Trojans began on Dec. 12, 1947 and was the second game in the history of the Florida State basketball program. The Seminoles won the first game played between the two teams – 57-37 in Tallahassee. Florida State enters its 2018 game against Troy with a seven-game winning streak in the series and has won every game in the series since a 68-64 win at Troy on Dec. 15, 1948. Troy is coached by Phil Cunningham who is in his sixth season as the Trojans' head coach. Cunningham has coached against Florida State once -- as an assistant coach at Mississippi State on March 20, 2007 – in an 86-71 win by the Bulldogs in the third round of the postseason NIT. Marcus Grant, an assistant coach on Cunningham's staff, was an assistant coach at Mississippi State from 2005-2012 – a time period when the Bulldogs were 1-0 against the Seminoles.

**FLORIDA STATE IS TOUGH TO BEAT AT HOME IN THE DONALD L TUCKER CENTER**

Florida State enters Monday night's game against Troy as the winningest team in the nation on its home court since the start of the 2015-16 season. With 34 wins in its last 36 games played in the Donald L. Tucker Center during the 2016-17 (a perfect 18-0 record), 2017-18 season (13-2 record) and 2018-19 (3-0 record), Florida State is the winningest team on its home court in the nation in the last two seasons. The Seminoles have a .944 winning percentage at home in the last three seasons.

**MANN ENTERS MONDAY'S GAME AGAINST TROY WITH 986 CAREER POINTS**

Florida State senior guard Terance Mann, a candidate for the 2019 Senior CLASS Award, enters Monday's game with 986 career points and needs only 14 points to become the 47<sup>th</sup> player in school history with 1,000 or more career points scored. He is Florida State's leading scorer with 86 points this season (team-leading 12.3 ppg) after scoring a total of 900 points in the first three seasons of his career.

**LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...**

...Defeat Troy and win its 29<sup>th</sup> consecutive non-conference home game. The Seminoles are 36-1 (.973 winning percentage) at home on non-ACC games since the beginning of the 2013-14 season;

...Defeat Troy and raise its record against teams from the Sun belt Conference to 51-8;

...Defeat Troy and win its eighth consecutive games against the Trojans in a series that dates back to the 1947-48 season – the first season of Florida State basketball. The Seminole played Troy (a 57-37 Florida State win) in the second game in the history of the program.

**SEMINOLES' WINS OVER RANKED LSU AND PURDUE TEAMS RAISE TOTAL TO 46 UNDER HAMILTON**

Florida State's victories over No. 19/21 LSU in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational (November 23) and over No. 18/19 Purdue in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (November 28) give the Seminoles multiple wins over nationally ranked teams for the fifth consecutive season. The Seminoles have 20 victories over nationally ranked teams since the beginning of the 2016-17 season and have defeated multiple nationally ranked teams in the month of November for the first time in school history. Florida State has defeated 46 nationally ranked opponents under 17<sup>th</sup> year head coach Leonard Hamilton.

**NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S COMEBACKS AGAINST LSU AND PURDUE**

Florida State rallied late to win both of its games against No. 19/21 LSU and No. 18/19 Purdue on its way to its 6-1 record and six wins in the month of November for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles trailed both the Tigers and the Boilermakers by at least eight points with under four minutes to play in regulation and rallied to win both games. The Seminoles outscored LSU by a 12-3 margin at the end of regulation and won the game, 79-69, on a game-winning, buzzer beating 3-point shot by redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele with 0.5 seconds remaining in overtime against LSU. The Seminoles then defeated Purdue, 73-72, on a short floater by junior Trent Forrest with 5.2 seconds remaining against Purdue.

**FLORIDA STATE SECOND IN THE ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE**

With two starters (Trent Forrest 2<sup>nd</sup>; Terance Mann, 8<sup>th</sup>) ranked among the ACC's top 10 individual free throw shooters, the Seminoles enter Monday's game as the No. 2 ranked free throw shooting team in the ACC with a .768 mark. In earning a 4-1 record and two wins over nationally ranked teams in their last five games, the Seminoles are shooting .809 from the line since November 19 against Canisius. In the last five games, the Seminoles are shooting a combined .837 from the free throw line in the first half and .794 from the line in the second half. The Seminoles shot .750 percent (three of four) in the overtime period in their 79-76 extra time win over LSU in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational.

**THE LAST TIME...**

...Florida State shot above 75 percent from the free throw line in a given year was during the 2007-08 season when it shots .773 from the line as a team. Isaiah Swann (.840), Uche Echefu (.814), Toney Douglas (.809) and Ralph Mims (.805) all shot above 80 percent from the free throw line for the Seminoles that season;

...Florida State led the ACC in free throw shooting percentage was during the 2007 (.758) and 2008 (.773) seasons. Those are the only two times the Seminoles have led the ACC from the free throw line since joining the ACC for the 1991-92 season;

**SEMINOLES BY COMMITTEE – THE BENCH BUNCH**

Florida State's bench outscored Purdue's bench to a 26-17 margin in the Seminoles 73-72 victory over Purdue in Tallahassee on Wednesday night in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge. It marked the fifth time in seven games (with one game tied off of the bench) that the Seminoles' bench has outscored its opponents' bench. Against Purdue, Florida State's bench scored 26 of its 73 points including six by David Nichols in the second half of its win. For the season, Florida State's bench has scored 186 of 547 total points (.340 percent) and outscored the Seminoles' starters against Canisius (51-42) and Villanova (33-27).

**FLORIDA STATE GOING TO THE GLASS**

Florida State has outrebounded six of its first seven opponents and enters Monday's game against Troy with a +6.7 rebounds per game margin. The Seminoles owned double figure margins in their wins over Canisius (+13) and LSU (+15). Florida State is averaging 35.4 rebounds per game and pulled down a season-high 43 in its victory over LSU in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational (Nov. 23).

**SEMINOLES HAVE ZERO SHOTS BLOCKED AGAINST PURDUE**

Florida State made 24 baskets and did not have a single shot blocked by Purdue in its win over the Boilermakers on Wednesday in Tallahassee. Purdue entered the game in the top half of the Big Ten standings with an average of 4.0 blocked shots per game.

**KABENGELE LEADS THE SEMINOLES IN DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING GAMES**

Redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele has scored in double figures in five of the last six games and leads the Seminoles with five double-figure scoring games in the first seven games of the 2018-19 season.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. TROY – THE LAST GAME**

Harry Davis led seven Seminoles in double figures as Florida State defeated Troy, 110-82, at Tully Gym on the FSU campus on Dec. 1, 1977. Davis totaled a double-double of 18 points and 14 rebounds in the Seminoles' victory. Also in double figures for Florida State were Murray Brown (16 points), Mickey Dillard (16 points, Eugene Harris (13 points), Kris Anderson (12 points), David Thompson (12 points) and Hank Mann (10 points). Both Davis and Brown (16 points and 11 rebounds) recorded double-doubles. Tony Jackson totaled nine points, eight rebounds and two steals in the victory. Terry Baker led Troy with 23 in 33 minutes of play. Also in double figures for Troy were Murphy Brown (15 points), Bryan Cruce (14 points) and Marvin Sales (13). Florida State shot 59 percent from the field and outrebounded Troy by a 72-49 margin. The Seminoles' 72 rebounds are tied for the fifth highest single game total in school history.

## Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

**.840** Senior Terance Mann enters Monday's game against Troy shooting .840 from the free throw line. He is shooting nearly 23 percentage points higher from the line this season (.840) than he did in his first three seasons as a Seminole (.613).

**1-2-3** Sophomore M.J. Walker is ranked first among his Seminole teammates with 14 3-point shots made, second on the team with nine steals and third on the team with 13 assists.

**1.9** Junior Trent Forrest, who had two steals in the final 16 seconds of Florida State's victory over Purdue, enters Monday's game against Troy averaging a career-high 1.9 steals per game.

**2** Senior Terance Mann earned a career-high tying two blocked shots – both in the first half – of Florida State's victory over Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge on Wednesday night in Tallahassee.

**3** Redshirt freshman RaiQuan Gray has scored at least seven points off of the bench in each of the last three games.

**4** Junior Trent Forrest has scored in double figures in four games and enters Monday's game against Troy averaging a career-high 9.9 points scored per game. He has scored in double figures in 11 of his last 17 games dating to Feb. 25, 2018 against Clemson.

**5** Senior PJ Savoy has made multiple 3-point shots in four of Florida State's first seven games of the season and enters Monday's game against Troy having made 103 career 3-point shots – the 22<sup>nd</sup> highest career total in school history.

**6** Florida State is undefeated, 6-0, when it outscores its opponent.

**6** Redshirt freshman RaiQuan Gray has made six consecutive free throws and is shooting .867 from the free throw line entering Monday's game against Troy.

**8** Senior Terance Mann has made eight consecutive free throws entering Monday's game against Troy. His streak began in the deciding overtime period during Florida State's 79-76 win over LSU. He made his final three free throw attempts in the final 59 seconds of the extra session to help the Seminoles to the win over the No. 19/21 Tigers of the SEC.

**13** Sophomore M.J. Walker scored a team-high 13 points in Florida State's victory over Purdue on Monday night. It marked the 13<sup>th</sup> time in his career (and fourth time this season) that he has scored in double figures.

**78** Redshirt freshman Mfiondu Kabengele has scored 78 points in 124 minutes played this season which equals 0.63 points per minute and equates to 25.2 points for 40 minutes played in the first seven games of the season.

### SEMINOLES BY COMMITTEE

Through the first seven games of the 2018-19 season, five different players have led (or been tied for the lead) in scoring for the Seminoles – Terance Mann (2, at Tulane, vs. UAB), Mfiondu Kabengele (2, Canisius, vs. Villanova), M.J. Walker (2, vs. LSU, Purdue), PJ Savoy (1, Florida) and Trent Forrest (1, vs. Villanova). The Seminoles enter Monday's game against Troy with a total of 11 Seminoles having scored at least 10 points through the first seven games of the season.

### RAIQUAN GRAY BY THE NUMBERS IN THE LAST THREE GAMES...

...He is averaging 7.3 points (22 total points) while shooting .538 from the field (seven of 13) and .875 from the free throw line (seven of eight). He made his first career 3-point shot in the first half of the Seminoles, 73-72 win over Purdue.

### FORREST AMONG THE ACC LEADERS IN STEALS

Junior Trent Forrest – who sealed Florida State's victory over Purdue with his third steal of the game as time expired – is tied for seventh in the ACC with 13 steals and a 1.9 steals per game average. He totaled two steals in the final 16 seconds of Florida State's come-from-behind win over the Boilermakers. Forrest's steal with 16 seconds remaining in the game was the precursor to his own game winning shot with 5.2 seconds remaining in the game – a basket which gave Florida State the 73-72 win. His three steals marked the third time this season he has earned at least three steals (3 at Tulane, 4 vs. LSU and 3 vs. Purdue) and was the 19<sup>th</sup> time in his career that he totaled at least three steals in a single game.

### KOUMADJE MOVES INTO SEMINOLES' ALL-TIME TOP-15 FOR BLOCKED SHOTS

Senior Christ Koumadje enters Monday's game ranked 14<sup>th</sup> in school history with 102 career blocked shots. He is one of 16 players in school history with 100 or more blocked shots and needs only 16 blocked shots to move into Florida State's all-time top 10 for blocked shots.

### M.J. WALKER LEADING FLORIDA STATE FROM THE BONUSPHERE

Sophomore M.J. Walker, enters Monday's game against Troy currently ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the ACC with his career-high .452 mark and tied for 17<sup>th</sup> in school history with his career mark of .367 from the bonusphere. He made two 3-point shots against Purdue, the fourth time this season (and 14<sup>th</sup> time in his 42 game career as a Seminole) that he has made multiple 3-point shots in a game.

### KABENGELE SCORING

Redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele enters Monday's game against Troy averaging a career-high 11.1 points scored her game. He scored the game-winning 3-point in the Seminoles' 79-76 win over LSU with 0.5 seconds remaining in overtime.

## **Leonard Hamilton – Dick Vitale Gala**

Leonard Hamilton, the winningest coach in Florida State basketball history, knows all too much of the pain caused by cancer.

“I’m not really sure there is anybody I know who has not been affected by this disease,” said Hamilton.

Making the fight against the dreaded disease even more personal, Hamilton’s family has been devastated by cancer.

“My grandmother died from cancer, my father, my mother and two of my brothers who I loved dearly have also been taken; so I have had a history of people in my family who have been affected by cancer.”

Hamilton’s father lost his life to cancer in 1999 at the age of 76. His mom fell victim to the disease in 2013 at the age of 95, as did his youngest brother, Barry, in 2010 at the age of 54 and his brother, Willie, in 2012 at the age of 57.

Because of how cancer has affected his life, Hamilton is especially motivated to use his position as a highly-respected college basketball coach to help raise funds for research to fight the disease.

Hamilton has made it part of his life’s mission to help raise the awareness through Florida State’s participation in fundraisers including the Coaches vs. Cancer program, the nationwide 3-point challenge and annual suits and sneakers awareness games. His efforts, in conjunction with the National Association of Basketball Coaches, have helped raise over \$100 million dollars for research funds for the American Cancer Society.

“We have to raise the consciousness,” said Hamilton. “We have to make people aware and work to raise the funds in order to expand the research capabilities to work continuously to defeat cancer. As coaches, we are doing everything we can to make people aware; we are working tirelessly to raise the consciousness of America to open up their pockets and give. We want to put an emphasis on the importance of raising money for research.”

Fortunately for Hamilton, he is part of an incredible network of college coaches who are just as committed to finding a cure for the disease as he is.

“We talk about it all of the time as coaches,” said Hamilton. “I know sooner than later we will find a cure and it’s going to make a difference in all of our lives. That’s why I’m doing everything I can to make people aware and raise the consciousness to find a cure for this disease.”

Hamilton desperately wants to be part of the solution.

“I have always been interested in trying to be involved as much as I possibly can to raise the consciousness while also helping raise funds to fight the disease.”

His desire to work hard to help find a cure is obviously personal.

“There is no doubt that my family has been affected by cancer,” said Hamilton. “We talk about it, care about others who have gone through it and try to be as encouraging as possible to those going through it. It’s life’s work and something we are committed to as a family.

“The time is now to find a solution. We can all play a part in finding the cure.”

## **Albany Beats Hartford Behind David Nichols' 40 Points**

Wednesday night, David Nichols did it for CJ.

The sophomore guard for the University at Albany basketball team scored a program-record-tying 40 points and vaulted the Great Danes to a pulverizing 100-71 win over Hartford in a quarterfinal game of the America East Conference Tournament at SEFCU Arena.

CJ is the nickname for Nichols' 24-year-old sister Cecilia Coleman, who died on Saturday after a long struggle with leukemia. The 6-foot Nichols briefly left the team and flew home to Chicago to be with his family during the trying time.

When he returned on Tuesday, there was no doubt he wanted to do something special for his sister.

And do something special he did.

Nichols' 40 points tied the all-time record for points, set by Gary Holway, who got his 40 against Utica on Feb. 2, 1957. The previous high for points in the UAlbany Division I era was 39 points, scored by Jamar Wilson at New Hampshire on Feb. 16, 2003.

"I think you could say that," Nichols said when asked if he was playing for his sister. "She was on my mind a lot. Playing for this team, which has been a big help in supporting me, I wanted to go out there and give it my all ... for this team and my family."

With the win, the Danes, the third seed in the tournament, improve to 20-12 (the third time in four years UAlbany has gotten to 20 wins) and advance to the semifinals. UAlbany will play second-seeded Stony Brook at 7:30 Monday night on Long Island. The Seawolves beat No. 7 Binghamton 70-60 on Wednesday.

The other semifinal will feature No. 1 Vermont, an 86-41 winner over No. 8 Maine, playing host to No. 4 New Hampshire, which edged No. 5 UMBC 74-65.

The story from the start of the UAlbany game was Nichols, and his family.

The 1,693 in attendance gave him a hearty welcome when he was introduced. And all of the Danes wore the initials "CC" on the backs of their warmups in honor of Cecilia Coleman, a gesture that touched Donald Nichols, David's father, who was watching back in Chicago.

"The tribute to Cecilia before (Wednesday's) game was nothing short of amazing," Donald Nichols said in a Twitter message. "The passion and determination exhibited by the team embodied the fighting spirit CJ showed throughout her life. The outpouring of support from the entire UAlbany family has provided needed comfort during this time."

David Nichols took it from there. He made four of his career-high eight 3-pointers before the game was five minutes old and the Danes had an already commanding 16-4 lead. Hartford, which had upset UAlbany in last year's playoffs as a seven seed, would make no such noise this time around.

"We know how talented a player David is," said sophomore Joe Cremo, who had his fourth double-double of the season with 14 points and 10 assists. "He deserved what he got (Wednesday). For him to go out and do that, especially for his sister, it means a lot to him. I thank him for putting up 40."

UAlbany scored a season-high 51 points in the first half (not counting the 53 the Danes had against Division III Oneonta) and led by 26. Nichols, who had 22 points at halftime, started the second half with another 3 and the rout continued. UAlbany led by as many as 37. The only drama left was whether or not he would get to 40 and he did that with 4:23 left and then was taken out of the game.

"David is a great kid and player," UAlbany coach Will Brown said. "He did a real good job of keeping his emotions in check. This might be as good a performance as I have seen (in my 16 years on the UAlbany bench). I thought he was outstanding."

"(Nichols) was playing with a great sense of purpose," said Hartford coach John Gallagher. "He just kept making shots."

Nichols made 14 of 22 shots and was 8-for-12 from 3-point range. As a team, the Danes made 13 of 25 shots from 3-point range, the most makes and attempts they have had from long range this season.

This was the first time the Danes have scored 100 points since they beat Maine 108-64 last season.

### Exhibition 2 -- Florida State 99, Valdosta State 77

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Florida State defeated Valdosta State, 99-77, in its second and final exhibition game to open the 2018-19 season. Redshirt freshman RaiQuan Gray scored the first seven points of the game for the Seminoles on a pair of smooth driving lay-ins and a three-point bomb from the wing. A quick 7-0 run gave FSU a 21-13 lead at the 12:06 mark after a short jumper from freshman Devin Vassell. Later in the half an 8-0 run, spurred by strong defense and attacking the basket, gave the Seminoles a 29-16 lead with 9:22 left. LAKE BUENA VISTA, Fla. -- Bolstered by a 5-for-5 night from the field and a 6-of-7 effort at the free-throw line, guard Terance Mann scored a game-high 17 points to lead Florida State past UAB, 81-63, to earn a spot in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational. The Seminoles relied upon their signature stingy defense to blow past the Blazers, holding UAB to 19 of 58 from the field (33 percent) and 2-14 (14 percent) from the 3-point line. Both marks were a season-bests for the Seminoles, and their two 3-point shots allowed were the least by an FSU team since Fordham made just one on Nov. 17, 2018. After a slow start that saw scoreless basketball for the first 2:30, FSU senior PJ Savoy found his stride, connecting on back-to-back 3-point baskets to earn the game's first points. With the game tied 8-8 five minutes into the first half, senior Christ Koumadje catapulted an 11-1 run that held UAB without a field goal for 6:18. Off an inbound lob, Koumadje threw down a heavy dunk that put the Noles up 14-11. A few possessions later, he had yet another slam that extended the lead to five. Koumadje used his size and strength to dominate the paint all night. He finished with 12 points, a career-high tying nine rebounds and three blocks. His three blocks put him at 100 blocks for his career. Florida State ran through the first half off of a balanced scoring attack that saw nine different Seminoles score at least one basket. Fresh off a 10-point showing against Canisius, freshman Devin Vassell hit a corner 3-point shot to put FSU up 27-15 at the 7:01 mark.

LAKE BUENA VISTA, Fla. -- Mfondu Kabengele hit a deep 3-point jumper with a half-second left in overtime, and No. 14 Florida State advanced to the AdvoCare Invitational championship game with a 79-76 win over No. 19 LSU. Tremont Waters made three free throws to pull LSU even at 76 with 11.5 seconds to go in overtime before Kabengele's shot bounced off the rim and into the basket. "It just dropped right in and I was in shock," said Kabengele. "I'm just happy it went

in." After trailing by nine, Florida State forced overtime when Trent Forrest tied it at 68-68 on a layup with 2.8 seconds left. Naz Reid's 3-pointer at the buzzer hit off the rim for LSU, who got 19 points from Skylar Mays. Reid hit a 3 and Emmitt Williams had a fast-break dunk as LSU went up 59-52 with 7 1/2 minutes left. Reid, slowed recently by an ankle injury, scored 12 points in 41 minutes. M.J. Walker had 13 of his game-high 21 points during the first half as Florida State took a 30-29 lead at the break.
