NATIONALLY RANKED SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO MIAMI

No. 13/13 Florida State, which has won 38 of its last 40 games at home, plays host to Miami on Wednesday, January 9, 2019 at 9:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles enter Wednesday’s game against the Hurricanes having won 95 percent of their overall games (38-2) and 89 percent of their ACC games (16-2) at home since the beginning of the 2016-17 season. Included in that record is a 2-1 record over Wednesday night’s opponent – The Miami Hurricanes. Florida State is a perfect 7-0 at home this season with victories over Florida (80-61, November 6, 2018) and No. 19 Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge (73-72, November 28, 2018) included in its victory total in its home arena this season. The Seminoles’ game against the Hurricanes marks their ACC home opener and the second of 18 consecutive ACC games to close out the regular season before travelling to play in the ACC Tournament March 12-16 at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte, N.C. Florida State has won two consecutive ACC home openers with victories over Wake Forest (88-72, December 28, 2016) to open its 2016-17 home conference schedule and a win over then No. 11 ranked North Carolina (81-80, January 3, 2018) to open its 2017-18 ACC season. Florida State, which is playing its 28th season of ACC basketball, was a perfect 9-0 at home in conference play during the 2016-17 season. Following Wednesday’s game against Miami, the Seminoles play host to No. 1/1 Duke on Saturday, January 12 at 2 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE AND COACHING FOR LITERACY

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and Associate Head Coach Stan Jones are on the forefront of one of college basketball’s great initiatives as the Seminoles have partnered with Coaching for Literacy (CFL) to host their fifth annual Fight for Literacy Game against Miami on January 9. Coaching for Literacy’s Fight for Literacy Games empowers coaches, teams, and fans to make a more literate America by participating in awareness efforts, volunteer work and fundraising activities. According to the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), 59 percent of fourth-graders in Florida are not proficient in reading. The Seminoles are doing their part to change that unfortunate statistic. To promote the Fight for Literacy, members of the Seminole coaching staff will wear Coaching for Literacy’s Green Ties for Literacy awareness apparel. FLORIDA STATE’S NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters Wednesday’s game against Miami ranked No. 13 in the Associated Press poll and No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches poll. It marks the ninth consecutive week the Seminoles have been ranked within the nation’s top 15 after beginning the season ranked No.15 in the Coaches poll and No. 17 in the AP to begin the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles’ current nine-week stay in both of the nation’s most recognized polls is the second longest streak being a nationally ranked team after being ranked for the final 14 weeks in 2016-17.

FLORIDA STATE’S WINS

Florida State has earned nine of 12 wins (including each of its last four) by double-digit points and enters Wednesday’s game against Miami with a +11.1 margin of victory for the season.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and win its third consecutive ACC home opener. The Seminoles defeated Wake Forest to open its 2016-17 home ACC season and topped No. 11 North Carolina to win its 2017-18 conference home opener;
 ...Defeat Miami and gain its third consecutive home victory over Miami. The Seminoles defeated the Hurricanes on Feb. 1, 2017 (66-57) and on January 27, 2018 (103-94 in overtime) in the last two games played between the two teams in Tallahassee;

...Defeat Miami and win its 30th home game in its all-time series against Miami – a series that dates back to the 1950-51 season. The Seminoles are 29-8 in Tallahassee against Miami;

...Defeat Miami and win its fifth consecutive game played against a team from the state of Florida and its sixth consecutive game played in the state of Florida. The Seminoles are 10-1 in games played this season and have won 13 of its last 14 games played in the Sunshine State in the last two seasons.

HAMILTON MOVING UP THE ACC COACHING VICTORY CHARTS

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton enters Florida State's game against Miami as the eighth all-time winningest coach in ACC history with 317 overall wins. He needs only 10 wins to become the seventh all-time winningest coach in ACC history – surpassing Virginia legend Terry Holland who totaled 326 wins during his career with the Cavaliers.

HAMILTON ALSO EIGHTH IN CAREER ACC CONFERENCE GAME WINS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton is ranked eighth in ACC history with 136 career ACC wins (regular season and ACC Tournament games). He needs four ACC wins to become the league's seventh winningest coach for ACC wins surpassing Maryland Hall of Famer Lefty Driesell who won 139 ACC games during his career in College Park. Hamilton is one of only nine coaches in ACC history in the top-10 for both overall victories as an ACC coach and ACC wins as a conference coach.

FLORIDA STATE'S WINNING STREAKS

Florida State has earned winning streaks of five games (Nov. 6 through Nov 23) and seven games (Nov. 28 through January 1) in amassing their 12-2 record. Both winning streaks were stopped by No. 1 seeds in the 2018 NCAA Tournament – the five-game winning streak by defending national champion Villanova (66-60 in the championship game of the AdvoCare Invitational) and by the No. 1 overall seed in the 2018 NCAA Tournament Virginia (65-52 in the ACC opener for both teams on January 5 in Charlottesville).

AT THE HALF

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Miami with a 12-0 record when leading or tied at the half (the Seminoles were tied with Southeast Missouri at halftime).

FLORIDA STATE FROM LONG RANGE

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Miami shooting nearly 40 percent from the 3-point line in the last three games. The Seminoles have begun to move up in the ACC standings and are averaging 8.0 3-point field goals made per game in their last three games. Led by senior PJ Savoy's 22 3-point field goals made and senior Phil Cofer's .462 mark from the bonusphere, the Seminoles are shooting .336 from the 3-point line.

FLORIDA STATE RANKS SECOND IN ACC IN STEALS

Florida State has earned 69 steals in its last seven games and is averaging nearly 10 steals per game since earning nine steals in its victory over Troy on December 3 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles have earned at least nine steals in six of their last seven games with 13 steals coming in their victory over Winthrop on January 1 in Tallahassee. Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Miami ranked second in the ACC in both total steals (122) and steals per game (8.7).

FLORIDA STATE HAS NAERLY DOUBLED ITS BLOCKED SHOTS TOTAL IN THE LAST SEVEN GAMES

Florida State has blocked 33 shots in its last seven games with eight blocked shots coming in its victory over Winthrop on January 1 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles have blocked nearly two shots more in their last seven games as compared to their first seven games of the season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

Florida State defeated Miami 103-94 in overtime despite the Hurricanes making a school-record 17 3-pointers on January 27, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State was able to withstand the onslaught by shooting 60 percent from the field and having six players score 13 points or more. Phil Cofer led the way with 21 points while Braian Angola added 18 and CJ Walker 17. They also had a 38-30 edge in points in the paint and dominated at the line making 26 more trips and outscoring the Hurricanes 28-9. Florida State led for most of regulation and was up by as many as 10 points midway through the first half. Miami was finally able to tie it at 83 on a Dewan Hernandez dunk with 1:03 remaining in regulation. The Seminoles regained control by scoring the first seven points in overtime. The Hurricanes missed their first three shots and had a turnover while Florida State had a Koumadje dunk, Walker layup and Terance Mann 3-point play.

By The Numbers**

.909 Sophomore M.J. Walker has made 10 of his last 11 free throws dating back to the second half of Florida State's 73-72 victory over Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge on November 28 in Tallahassee.

5 Senior PJ Savoy earned a career-high of five steals in Florida State's game at Virginia on Saturday. He earned a total of seven steals in the first two seasons and 28 ACC games of his Florida State career.

2 Senior David Nichols earned two steals against Virginia in the first ACC game of his career on Saturday. It marked the fifth time this season he has earned his Florida State career-high of two steals.

6 Senior Christ Koumadje has earned at least one blocked shot in six consecutive games. He enters Wednesday's game against Miami only one game shy of tying his personal record for consecutive games with at least one blocked shot – seven – which he has accomplished on two occasions during his career.

11 PJ Savoy's five steals against Virginia are tied for the 11th best single-game steals effort in an ACC game in Florida State history.

11 Junior Trent Forrest has earned at least one steal in 11 of Florida State's 14 games. He enters Wednesday's game against Miami averaging a career-high 2.2 spg.

12 Florida State is undefeated, 12-0, when it outscores its opponent.

12 Redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele has blocked 12 shots in his last seven games (1.7 bpg) after recording only one blocked shot in the first seven games of the season.

13 Senior PJ Savoy enters Wednesday's game against Miami with 13 steals (0.9 spg). He earned a total of 16 steals in the first two seasons and 55 games of his career (0.3 spg).

13 Senior Anthony Polite has made 13 consecutive free throws entering Florida State's game against Miami on Wednesday. He has not missed a shot from the free throw line since the second half of the Seminoles' season-opening win over Florida on November 6 in Tallahassee.

41 Led by junior Trent Forrest's 31 steals, the Seminoles have 41 steals MORE than their opponent (122-81) and have totaled more steals than their opponent in 10 of their first 14 games of the 2017-18 season.

1,238 Senior David Nichols has scored 1,238 career points in 95 career games (13.0 points per game). He scored 1,132 points in 81 career games in three seasons at the University of Albany before transferring to Florida State as a graduate student.

KABENGELE – THE ACC'S TOP SIXTH MAN

Redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele is Florida State's leader in double figure scoring games with nine and is Florida State's second-leading scorer with an 11.4 points per game scoring average. He ranks seventh on the team in minutes played (18.1), has not played more than 23 minutes in any single game and has yet to start a single game this season.

KABENGELE ON THE BLOCKS

Redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele is second among his teammates with 13 blocked shots (0.9 bpg), has seven blocked shots in the last three games (2.3 bpg) and has 42 blocked shots in 48 career games for a 0.9 blocked shots average for his career.

Redshirt sophomore Mfiondu Kabengele has always been a prolific scorer and he enters Wednesday's game against Miami averaging a career-high 11.4 points in the Seminoles' first 14 games of the season. It's not just that he scores a great deal of points – he has scored 404 points in his first 48 career games – it's how often he scores his points. Kabengele averages more than 0.5 points per minutes played during his career. Leonard Hamilton's Emphasis On Academics Leads To FSU's impressive Graduate Rate

In a college basketball world that concerns itself with the next level and advancing ahead with the opportunity to play professionally, academics can often be pushed to the side.

The addition of the one-and-done rule in 2005 -- which required all draft-eligible players to be 19 and one year removed from high school -- unintentionally furthered the notion among these players that school is secondary to basketball.

All of this makes the hit rate with which Florida State men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton has seen his players graduate across his tenure in Tallahassee all the more impressive.

Since Hamilton took the FSU job ahead of the 2002-03 season, 61 of the 63 players (96.8 percent) that have enrolled and played for the Seminoles for at least four seasons left with their degrees.

The only two that didn't, former FSU players Al Thornton (2003-2007) and Solomon Alabi (2007-2010), have both reached out to FSU about finishing their degrees with online coursework as their playing careers wind down.

While this may seem impressive to many, Hamilton just views it as an expectation of someone in his position.

"It's part of our responsibility to take young men when they're teenagers and usher them into young adulthood," Hamilton told the *Tallahassee Democrat*.

"When you're a teenager, 17 or 18 years old, sometimes you're not in a position to make worldly decisions even though you might think that you are. I think that what we have always done is just set certain boundaries and certain expectations, try to hold everybody accountable to the things that we believe are important in the overall development of a young man, not as a basketball player but as an individual.

"What we've always tried to do is just treat everything like we would treat it if it was our own children. That's the way we look at it and so everything that we do totally in our program -- not only in academics but in everything that we do -- we try to treat it as such."

This is a belief that traces back to Hamilton's time as an assistant coach at Kentucky, where he won a national championship in 1978.

"That was part of my responsibility as a young assistant coach at the University of Kentucky for 12 years to make sure that I stay on top of the kids' academically," Hamilton said.

"I was at an institution that really placed a lot of emphasis on making sure that the kids not only played well, but they graduated."

With all the success the No. 10 Seminoles (8-1) have found early this season -- making the program's earliest appearance in the Top 10 since 1992 -- Hamilton sees the bigger picture when reflecting on his success at FSU.

"We truly believe that when you look around in my office and you see all those NCAA rings and watches and memorabilia, trophies, coach of the year awards, if that's where you place all the emphasis -- the fact that we have won a certain number of basketball games -- then I think we're very shallow in the big picture," Hamilton said.

"The most important thing we do is take young men and try to be a part during this period of life when you're taking them from teenagers to young adults. That is by far the most important thing we do as coaches.

"Now, there's no question that we need to win. That's part of the process, that's part of the job. But if we win and fail in the development of young people, in helping them grow in developing the tools that are going to give them a chance to be successful in life, we have failed."

A significant subset of this group of graduates are people who became the first in their direct family to attend or graduate from college.

Hamilton is quite aware of the fact that athletic scholarships could be the only means of some of his players earning college degrees and doesn't take that responsibility lightly.

"A lot of them will be the first people who have gone to college in their families. This is important because they many times change the whole culture of their family by them having academic success that compliments what most people want in athletic success," Hamilton said.

"Our rewards come five, six, seven, eight years after a kid has left us and what are they doing with their lives and their families and their careers. That's when our great report comes in.

"I'm hoping that as a staff when we hang our whistles up and we look ourselves in the mirror, that we will be able to say that we have done everything possible to help the young people that have been a part of our journey to have a place in our society that's meaningful and that they're not only proud of the fact that they represented the school, Florida State, but that we had the kind of relationships that they feel helped them become who they are in the next part of their lives."

FSU Center Mfiondu Kabengele Brings Passion To Court, Sense Of Purpose Off It

NBA players have made suits fashionable and it's rarely a mistake for young man to don a jacket and tie for what essentially is a big interview.

Florida State assistant basketball coach Dennis Gates knew, however, suiting up isn't always the right call and first impressions are indelible.

"What was going through my mind was this would be the first time in the history of college athletics that a kid wore a three-piece suit, shirt and tie on their official visit," Gates said. "I had to stop it from happening."

Mfiondu Kabengele loved basketball, a passion his family shared. After all, his uncle, Dikembe Mutombo, was an 18-year NBA veteran and Hall of Famer.

Before FSU took an interest in Kabengele, Binghamton University was the only school to offer him a basketball scholarship. As a result, Kabengele's official visit to Tallahassee took on great significance and his dad wanted him to make the best impression.

The dapper suit was an appeal, one additional way of impressing an Atlantic Coast Conference basketball program.

The plan, however, was vetoed.

"Mfiondu appreciates it to this day," Gates said of his intervention.

The young man did not need the haberdasher's touch to impress FSU. But the ensemble made an impact that still resonates with Gates.

"It spoke volumes to, you know what, this kid is going to be somebody," Gates said. "That's where I think his discipline comes from. That's where I think his grit, his toughness has come from and it's a direct correlation to his parents."

Kabengele changed into a more comfortable ensemble — jeans and a button-up collared shirt — for the visit that would change the trajectory of his life.

First Meeting

Gates, Kabengele's primary recruiter at FSU, first saw Kabengele play at the Kennedy-King's Willie Little Gymnasium in the south side of Chicago. Kabengele, then a mere 6-foot-6 forward, played for Bosco Institute, a preparatory school in Indiana.

When he first graduated high school in his native Canada, Kabengele spurned Binghamton's initial offer and landed at Bosco to hone his skills. The move offered him a platform to engage the likes of FSU. By Gates' third visit, Kabengele had grown to 6-foot-10.

Even so, Kabengele was surprised by the interest he generated.

"When I first offered him a scholarship, he did not believe anything I was saying," Gates said. "His mouth dropped, he had no clue."

Once FSU made Kabengele an offer, Wisconsin, Georgetown (Mutombo's alma mater), Kansas State, Georgia and Boston College entered the recruiting conversation.

Gates made a statement for FSU at the very beginning. He was the first member of a Power 5 conference who believed in Kabengele's potential.

"It's not a sense that he did not believe in himself, he didn't know who else believed in him," Gates said. "One of the reasons we ended up signing him was because we were the first high-major school to offer him a scholarship and his mom and his dad remembered that."

A Sense Of Purpose

Once the NBA drafted Mutombo in 1991, he sent for his entire family to move from the Democratic Republic of Congo, which was plagued by volatile political injustice. Mfiondu's parents, Tshilongo and Tshimanga Kabengele, left their homeland to pursue an education in Canada. Mfiondu was born soon after in 1997.

Though their upheaval was not directly linked to the country's politics, Mfiondu has taken the injustices of The Congo to heart.

"There's a lot of corruption and I'd love to go over there and make a change," said Mfiondu, who is majoring in international affairs at FSU.

This passion for a land 7,000 miles from Tallahassee distinguishes Mfiondu from most other athletes. And it impressed Gates.

"The conversations that I had with the kid is what made me say this kid can play at Florida State," Gates said. "It had nothing to do with basketball. It had something and everything to do with the kid's ability to have comfortable conversations with adults and have a worldly understanding of the things around him."

Development Plan

Kabengele's FSU career began with a redshirt.

The Green Team, FSU's scout team, was Kabengele's first challenge. Facing soon-to-be professional basketball players Jonathan Isaac, Dwayne Bacon and Michael Ojo daily challenged Kabengele physically and intellectually.

"He was able to hold his own against those guys no matter the differences or what the advantages were," Gates said. "You knew right then you had a guy that could use his intelligence to his advantage. ... It makes him as versatile of a post guy there is in the country."

Kabengele has transformed exponentially since his redshirt season in 2017. He has emerged as FSU's sixth man this season.

During FSU's matchup against LSU in the AdvoCare Invitational on Nov. 23, the game was tied 76-76 in overtime with 11 seconds remaining.

"Coach Gates told me to get to the open corner," Kabengele said of the ensuing FSU possession. "They trapped Trent [Forrest] and Trent saw me and I just set my feet. When it came off my wrist, it felt good."

The ball hit the rim, intensifying the suspense and dropped through the net.

Kabengele's 3-point shot sealed the 79-76 victory over LSU and sent the Seminoles to the AdvoCare championship, where they faced defending national champion Villanova. FSU fell 66-60 but gained much from the tournament.

One month later, Kabengele notched a career high in points (24) during FSU's 95-81 win over North Florida.

"[Number] 25 is a beast," UNF coach Matt Driscoll said of Kabengele. "He's from the old school. I told him after the game, if you stay this way, you're going to make as much as you ever want to make."

Gates also sees a bright future for Kabengele, but he expects it to include success beyond basketball.

“He’s a Renaissance man. He’s a young man with an old soul, but he’s very educated,” Gates said. “He has basketball — [but] one thing will never define him.”
