NO. 22 FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO NO. 16 LOUISVILLE IN TOP 25 MATCHUP AT TUCKER CENTER

No. 22/24 Florida State, which has won four consecutive ACC games plays host to No. 16/17 Louisville on Saturday, February 9, 2019 at 4:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles have earned four consecutive ACC wins over Clemson (January 22, 77-68), at Miami (January 27, 78-66), Georgia Tech (February 2, 59-49) and at Syracuse (February 5, 80-62) in improving to 17-5 and 5-4 at the mid-point of their ACC schedule. Since defeating Purdue in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge (November 28, 73-72) the Seminoles have won 12 of their last 16 games. Florida State's game against Louisville is its third game this season played at home that matches two ranked teams – The Seminoles defeated then No. 18/19 ranked Purdue and fell to then No. 1/2 Duke in one of the best games of the season across the nation (January 12, 80-78). Following Saturday's game against Louisville, the Seminoles will play host to Wake Forest (February 13, 7:00 p.m) in the first of two meetings between the two teams during the 2018-19 regular season.

FLORIDA STATE IS VERY SUCCESSFUL AT HOME

No. 22 Florida State, which has won 41 of its last 44 games (.932 winning percentage) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season, will look to up its 2018-19 home record to 11-1 when it plays host to Louisville on Saturday. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against the Cardinals having won .932 percent of their games (41-3) and nearly 88 percent of their ACC games (21-3) at home since the end of the 2015-16 season.

WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS AT HOME

Florida State has won 10 of its last 12 games in the Donald L. Tucker Center against ranked opponents including victories over No. 19 Purdue (November 28, 2018, 73-72, in the ACC / Big 10 Challenge) this season and No. 12 North Carolina (Jan. 3, 2018, 81-80) and No. 15 Miami (Jan. 7, 2018, 103-94 in overtime) during the 2017-18 season. Florida State was undefeated, 6-0, at home against ranked teams in finishing undefeated (18-0) at home during the 2016-17 season.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Louisville and win its fifth consecutive ACC game. It would mark the first time since the Seminoles' ACC Championship season of 2011-12 that they have defeated five consecutive ACC opponents. Florida State won a school record seven consecutive ACC games with wins at Virginia Tech (January 10, 63-59), against North Carolina (January 14, 90-57), against Maryland (January 17, 84-70), at Duke (January 21, 76-73), at Wake Forest (January 25, 75-52), against Georgia Tech (February 1, 68-54) and against Virginia (February 4, 58-55) and won the ACC Tournament championship at the end of that season;
 ...Defeat Louisville and gain a win over a ranked team for the third time this season. The Seminoles defeated then No. 19/21 LSU in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Classic (November 23, 79-76 in overtime) and then No. 18/19 Purdue (November 28, 73-72) in earning their way to 17 overall victories;
 ...Defeat Louisville and gain their second consecutive regular season victory over the Cardinals. The Seminoles defeated Louisville at Louisville at the KFC YUM! Center (February 3, 2018; 80-76) last season;
 ...Defeat Louisville and gain a win over Cardinal Head Coach Chris Mack for the second straight year. The Seminoles defeated his Xavier team by a 75-70 score to advance to the Sweet 16 of the 2018 NCAA Tournament.

SEMINOLES AND HAMILTON AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against No. 16/17 Louisville with 46 wins over ranked teams during the 17-year tenure of Leonard Hamilton at Florida State. Included in those 46 wins over ranked teams are seven wins over nationally ranked Duke teams including a win over the No. 6 ranked Blue Devils (March 10, 2012, 62-59) in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament at Philips Arena in Atlanta. The Seminoles defeated No. 4 North Carolina one day later to win the first ACC Championship in school history.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S VICTORY OVER SYRACUSE...

...Florida State won at Syracuse by an 80-62 margin on Tuesday night. The win for the Seminoles was their first in the Carrier Dome over the Orange since March 12, 1997 in the postseason NIT;

...Florida State was credited with a season-high 25 assists on 30 baskets – a total that is tied for the fourth highest assist total in an ACC game in school history. The Seminoles were credited with 26 assists in a 107-79 win over NC State on January 15, 1995. Seminole legend Bob Sura recorded a triple-double of 19 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists in the Seminoles' win over the Wolfpack in that game;

...Florida State shot .500 percent from the 3-point line (11-22) including .615 percent (eight of 13) in the first half;

...Junior guard Trent Forrester recorded his ACC career-high of 10 assists – tied for the sixth highest assists total in an ACC game in school history. The Seminoles' school record of 13 assists came in Florida State's 75-56 win over Georgia Tech at Alexander Memorial Coliseum in Atlanta on January 9, 1999;

...Redshirt sophomore forward Mfiondu Kabengele was a perfect four of four (1.00 percent) from the 3-point line in scoring 18 points against the Orange. He became just the eighth player in Florida State's ACC history to be perfect from the 3-point line in four or more attempts.

FLORIDA STATE'S SHOOTING THE BALL FROM ALL OVER THE COURT DURING FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Louisville having won four consecutive games – all ACC games – with two wins coming at home and two on the road. One of the keys to the Seminoles' success is their hot shooting from all three zones on the court – the Seminoles are shooting .481 from the field (they shot .560 in their win over Miami and .545 in their win over Syracuse), .423 from the 3-point line (they shot .660 from the bonusphere in their win at Miami) and are shooting .766 from the free throw line (they shot .810 from the line against Clemson).

THREE DOUBLE DIGIT WINS DURING FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK

Florida State earned an 18-point win (80-62) at Syracuse on Tuesday night marking its third consecutive double-digit victory during its current four-game ACC winning streak. The Seminoles have earned double digit wins over Miami (78-66, +12), Georgia Tech (59-49, +10) and Syracuse (80-62, +18) and have a +13.3-point margin of victory in their last three games.

FLORIDA STATE'S RECENT LEADS

Florida State has led each of its last four games (all against ACC opponents) by at least 11 points during its current four-game winning streak. The Seminoles led Clemson by 11 points (77-66, 0:52 left second half), led Miami by 21 points (68-47, 7:44 left second half), led Georgia Tech by 12 points (39-27, 17:44 left in second half) and led Syracuse by 22 points (36-14, 5:58 left first half).

FLORIDA STATE ON FIRE FROM 3-POINT LINE

Led by Mfiondu Kabengele's perfect four-of-four performance from the 3-point line, Florida State made 11 3-point shots and shot .500 from the 3-point line in its at Syracuse. It marked the third time in the last four games the Seminoles had made 10 or more shots from the bonusphere. The Seminoles are shooting .463 from the 3-point line during their current four-game winning streak.

FLORIDA STATE SHOOTING 77 PERCENT FROM THE FREE THROW LINE IN LAST SEVEN GAMES

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Louisville ranked fifth in the ACC with a team free throw shooting percentage of .643. The Seminoles have been at their best in their last seven games and are shooting a combined .770 from the line since an 83 percent free throw shooting percentage against Duke on January 12 in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE VS. LOUISVILLE -- THE LAST GAME

Quentin Snider scored 19 points, Ray Spalding had 18 and Louisville knocked off Florida State 82-74 in an Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament game on March 7, 2018 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y. Deng Adel added 15 points and eight rebounds for the ninth-seeded Cardinals. Trent Forrest and PJ Savoy each had 14 points off the bench to pace No. 8 seed Florida State. A furious rally by the Seminoles whittled the margin to eight with 3:26 to play, but Louisville regrouped and hung on behind Snider. The senior point guard had six assists and five rebounds without committing a turnover in 35 minutes. Reserve forward Dwayne Sutton added 10 points, six rebounds and three blocks for Louisville

NICHOLS PLAYING HIS SECOND CAREER GAME AGAINST LOUISVILLE

FSU Center Mfiondu Kabengele Brings Passion To Court, Sense Of Purpose Off It

NBA players have made suits fashionable and it's rarely a mistake for young man to don a jacket and tie for what essentially is a big interview.

Florida State assistant basketball coach Dennis Gates knew, however, suiting up isn't always the right call and first impressions are indelible.

"What was going through my mind was this would be the first time in the history of college athletics that a kid wore a three-piece suit, shirt and tie on their official visit," Gates said. "I had to stop it from happening."

Mfiondu Kabengele loved basketball, a passion his family shared. After all, his uncle, Dikembe Mutombo, was an 18-year NBA veteran and Hall of Famer.

Before FSU took an interest in Kabengele, Binghamton University was the only school to offer him a basketball scholarship. As a result, Kabengele's official visit to Tallahassee took on great significance and his dad wanted him to make the best impression.

The dapper suit was an appeal, one additional way of impressing an Atlantic Coast Conference basketball program.

The plan, however, was vetoed.

"Mfiondu appreciates it to this day," Gates said of his intervention.

The young man did not need the haberdasher's touch to impress FSU. But the ensemble made an impact that still resonates with Gates.

"It spoke volumes to, you know what, this kid is going to be somebody," Gates said. "That's where I think his discipline comes from. That's where I think his grit, his toughness has come from and it's a direct correlation to his parents."

Kabengele changed into a more comfortable ensemble — jeans and a button-up collared shirt — for the visit that would change the trajectory of his life.

First Meeting

Gates, Kabengele's primary recruiter at FSU, first saw Kabengele play at the Kennedy-King's Willie Little Gymnasium in the south side of Chicago. Kabengele, then a mere 6-foot-6 forward, played for Bosco Institute, a preparatory school in Indiana.

When he first graduated high school in his native Canada, Kabengele spurned Binghamton's initial offer and landed at Bosco to hone his skills. The move offered him a platform to engage the likes of FSU. By Gates' third visit, Kabengele had grown to 6-foot-10.

Even so, Kabengele was surprised by the interest he generated.

"When I first offered him a scholarship, he did not believe anything I was saying," Gates said. "His mouth dropped, he had no clue."

Once FSU made Kabengele an offer, Wisconsin, Georgetown (Mutombo's alma mater), Kansas State, Georgia and Boston College entered the recruiting conversation.

Gates made a statement for FSU at the very beginning. He was the first member of a Power 5 conference who believed in Kabengele's potential.

"It's not a sense that he did not believe in himself, he didn't know who else believed in him," Gates said. "One of the reasons we ended up signing him was because we were the first high-major school to offer him a scholarship and his mom and his dad remembered that."

A Sense Of Purpose

Once the NBA drafted Mutombo in 1991, he sent for his entire family to move from the Democratic Republic of Congo, which was plagued by volatile political injustice. Mfiondu's parents, Tshilongo and Tshimanga Kabengele, left their homeland to pursue an education in Canada. Mfiondu was born soon after in 1997.

Though their upheaval was not directly linked to the country's politics, Mfiondu has taken the injustices of The Congo to heart.

"There's a lot of corruption and I'd love to go over there and make a change," said Mfiondu, who is majoring in international affairs at FSU.

This passion for a land 7,000 miles from Tallahassee distinguishes Mfiondu from most other athletes. And it impressed Gates.

"The conversations that I had with the kid is what made me say this kid can play at Florida State," Gates said. "It had nothing to do with basketball. It had something and everything to do with the kid's ability to have comfortable conversations with adults and have a worldly understanding of the things around him."

Development Plan

Kabengele's FSU career began with a redshirt.

The Green Team, FSU's scout team, was Kabengele's first challenge. Facing soon-to-be professional basketball players Jonathan Isaac, Dwayne Bacon and Michael Ojo daily challenged Kabengele physically and intellectually.

"He was able to hold his own against those guys no matter the differences or what the advantages were," Gates said. "You knew right then you had a guy that could use his intelligence to his advantage. ... It makes him as versatile of a post guy there is in the country."

Kabengele has transformed exponentially since his redshirt season in 2017. He has emerged as FSU's sixth man this season.

During FSU's matchup against LSU in the AdvoCare Invitational on Nov. 23, the game was tied 76-76 in overtime with 11 seconds remaining.

"Coach Gates told me to get to the open corner," Kabengele said of the ensuing FSU possession. "They trapped Trent [Forrest] and Trent saw me and I just set my feet. When it came off my wrist, it felt good."

The ball hit the rim, intensifying the suspense and dropped through the net.

Kabengele's 3-point shot sealed the 79-76 victory over LSU and sent the Seminoles to the AdvoCare championship, where they faced defending national champion Villanova. FSU fell 66-60 but gained much from the tournament.

One month later, Kabengele notched a career high in points (24) during FSU's 95-81 win over North Florida.

"[Number] 25 is a beast," UNF coach Matt Driscoll said of Kabengele. "He's from the old school. I told him after the game, if you stay this way, you're going to make as much as you ever want to make."

Gates also sees a bright future for Kabengele, but he expects it to include success beyond basketball.

“He’s a Renaissance man. He’s a young man with an old soul, but he’s very educated,” Gates said. “He has basketball — [but] one thing will never define him.”

Mfiondu Kabengele Went From Under-Recruited To A Star For Florida State

An hour and fifteen minutes away from Syracuse, down Interstate 81, stands the only school that offered Mfiondu Kabengele a basketball scholarship out of high school: Binghamton.

He was eager to play basketball and accept his first collegiate offer, knowing no Power five schools would contact him. But with guidance from his coach at Corpus Christi High School in Canada, Kabengele bypassed Binghamton's offer. Instead, he elected to attend the Bosco Institute in Indiana in hopes of playing for a better school.

Three years after taking a chance on himself, Kabengele's decision has paid dividends for No. 22 Florida State (16-5, 4-4 Atlantic Coast). After helping lead FSU to an Elite Eight appearance in 2018, the 6-foot-10 redshirt sophomore has become the Seminoles leading scorer (13 points per game) despite averaging under 20 minutes per contest.

With a 26-point outing against Boston College and a 24-point performance against then-No. 1 Duke, Kabengele has gained attention from professional scouts as he continues his third season with the program.

"He has worked on his body, his shooting and rebounding abilities, his ability to block shots, his knowledge of reading defenses to help on our team on offense," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said. "I think he has just scratched the surface of his potential."

Kabengele is the nephew of former NBA player and Hall of Famer Dikembe Mutombo, who is 7-foot-2. While some of his skills came naturally from his physique, it took a three-inch growth spurt to get recognized.

Slowly, the now 6-foot-10 forward gained attention from mid-major schools like St. Bonaventure. Soon, Florida State became the first Power five school to give him an offer. ESPN ranked him as a three-star prospect, and other schools soon followed suit.

But Florida State was the first Power five school to give him a chance. So he chose to play for the Seminoles. When he arrived, the freshman didn't expect to be a redshirt. But after some convincing, he "took it with open arms."

"I knew, when they recruited me, they were the first school to trust me," Kabengele said, "so I must go with their word because they have trust in me, and I have trust in them."

Last year, he was given a chance to play and thrived as a reliable sixth man.

In the postseason, he averaged 8.3 points in the middle, and lead the team with 5.8 rebounds and two blocks per game. He recorded his second career double-double in a 67-54 first round win over eighth-seeded Missouri and posted nine points and six rebounds over No. 1 seed Xavier to get to the Sweet Sixteen.

"He was a big part of (the Tournament run) because he came in and made sure there was no different energy, made sure that we were all on our Ps and Qs," FSU teammate PJ Savoy said. "He's kind of like the floor general cause he sees everything because he's in the back."

Kabengele came into his redshirt sophomore year playing even better. In the offseason, he focused on conditioning, citing how taxing setting ball screens, guarding the post and constantly crashing the rim is on his body. He also worked to improve his outside shot. With more playing time, his field goal percentage has increased nearly two percentage points this season. He's also shooting 33.3 percent from three and is close to eclipsing his 3-point season total from last year (10).

In a game against then-No. 1 Duke on Jan. 12, Kabengele posted 24 points and 10 rebounds, catching the eyes of NBA scouts catching the eyes of NBA scouts in attendance.

He tries not to focus on his NBA stock, instead honing in on his current role: to grab rebounds. When Kabengele attacks the glass, he feels the rest of his game will follow. He doesn't worry about proving he belongs, saying that kind of "baggage" would only detract from the game.'

"He's worked so hard for everything he has," Savoy said. "You can't let that go unnoticed."
