**CLEMSON OVERVIEW**

- Clemson, who has a 7-2 road record, defeated Furman 2-0 at home on Wednesday night.
- The Tigers are averaging 6.8 runs per game and hitting .268 with a .374 on-base percentage and 57 steals.

- The pitching staff has a 3.23 ERA, .227 opponents' batting average and 2.93 strikeout-to-walk ratio and Clemson is fielding .969.

**FLORIDA STATE OVERVIEW**

- Florida State is led by head coach Mike Martin, who is in his 40th and final season.
- The Seminoles lost at home 3-1 to Florida on Tuesday. They are hitting .247 and have a 4.74 ERA and .969 fielding percentage.
- Robby Martin is hitting .324, Drew Mendoza has eight homers and 23 RBIs and J.C. Flowers has a team-high six saves.

**QUICK HITS**

- The Tigers have answered each of their last 15 losses with a win in their next game dating to back-to-back losses on April 13,14, 2018.
- Clemson is 21-0 when scoring five or more runs and 4-8 when scoring less than five runs.
- Clemson is outscoring its opponents 33-3 in the fifth inning. It is its highest-scoring inning and its opponents' lowest-scoring inning.

**ATTENDANCE**

- Clemson is averaging 4,813 fans per home date (19), eighth-highest figure in the nation and first in the ACC (through games of April 10).
- Entering 2019, Clemson had a top-20 national figure in average attendance 25 straight seasons and a top-15 figure 17 years in a row.

- Clemson is ranked as high as No. 13 by Collegiate Baseball in the polls this week.
- Clemson has been ranked in the top 25 by at least one poll for 54 straight weeks dating to 2016.

## ACC STANDINGS

- Clemson is in second place behind NC State (12-3) in the ACC Atlantic Division standings with an 11-4 league mark.
- Overall in the ACC standings, Clemson is in second place.

## POWER & SPEED SURGE

- In 2018, Clemson hit 98 homers, tied for third in the nation, but many of those players who contributed to that total departed.
- Clemson has hit 40 homers in 33 games in 2019, good for 1.2 per game. The Tigers were second in the nation in that category in 2018 (1.6).
- Clemson hit a homer in 13 consecutive games, the last two games of 2018 and the first 11 games of 2019.
- The 13-game streak tied a Tiger record. From March 21 to April 12, 1966 and March 31 to April 17, 1996 Clemson also had a 13-game streak.
- Twelve Tigers have accounted for the 40 homers. Logan Davidson has a team-high nine homers and Bryce Teodosio is second with eight homers.
- Clemson has also showed a penchant for stealing bases in 2019. The Tigers have 57 steals, an average of 1.7 per game.
- Ten Tigers have accounted for the 53 steals. Sam Hall leads the team with 21 steals and Logan Davidson is second with 11 steals.

## FAMILY CONNECTIONS

- Clemson has several players who have family ties to current and former professional athletes as well as former Tigers.
- Grayson Byrd's father, Paul Byrd, was a righthander at Louisiana State and played 14 seasons (1995-02, 04-09) in the major leagues.
- Logan Davidson's father, Mark Davidson, played at Clemson in 1982 and played six seasons (1986-91) in the majors with the Twins and Astros.
- Chad Fairey's uncle, Burke Fairey, played baseball at Clemson (1985-88) and his grandfather, Jim Fairey, played six MLB seasons (1968-73).
- Adam Hackenberg's brother, Christian Hackenberg, was a quarterback at Penn State from 2013-15.
- Ryne Huggins' father, Mike Huggins, played three seasons (1986, 87, 89) at Clemson and had a 4-3 record and four saves in 41 relief outings.
- Bo Majkowski's father, Don Majkowski, played football at Virginia, then played 10 years (1987-96) in the NFL, totaling 12,700 passing yards.
- James Parker's father, Tim Parker, was a pitcher at Clemson in 1987, 88, 90 and was a third-round draft pick by the Chicago Cubs.
- Carson Spiers' cousin, Will Spiers, was a sophomore starting punter on Clemson's 2018 national championship team.
- Carson Spiers' father, Michael Spiers, hit .301 with 16 homers, 110 RBIs and 32 steals in 184 games over four seasons (1988-91) at Clemson.
- Carson Spiers' uncle, Bill Spiers, played three seasons (1985-87) at Clemson and played 13 seasons (1989-01) in the major leagues.
- Carson Spiers' grandfather, Bud Spiers, hit .254 with seven homers and 44 RBIs in three seasons (1956-58) at Clemson.

## ASKEW ANSWERING THE CALL

- When Clemson was in need of help in the weekend rotation in early March, freshman lefthander Keyshawn Askew stepped up.
- He was a midweek starter in the first few weeks, then he made his weekend starting debut against No. 3 North Carolina on March 10.

- He is 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA, .250 opponents' batting average and 27 strikeouts in 34.2 innings pitched over eight appearances (seven starts).

## BYRD PROVIDING SENIOR LEADERSHIP

- Senior Grayson Byrd has been a steadying influence as a leader and due to his ability to play both corner infield spots and in the outfield.
- He has started 20 games at third base and 10 games at first base, and he has also started the last three games in left field.
- He is hitting .294 with four homers, two triples, nine doubles, 28 RBIs, 27 runs and a .388 on-base percentage in 33 games in 2019.
- He is hitting .345 with two homers, a triple, five doubles, 14 RBIs, 14 runs and a .435 on-base percentage in 15 ACC regular-season games.
- He was named ACC Player-of-the-Week on April 1 for his performances in four road games between March 26-31.
- He was 9-for-15 (.600) with two doubles, two triples, a homer, seven RBIs, 10 runs and a .714 on-base percentage in the four games.
- In his three seasons as a Tiger, he is hitting .274 with 14 homers, 74 RBIs, 72 runs and eight steals in 138 games (126 starts).
- He is the son of former MLB pitcher Paul Byrd.

## CLARK CARVING UP THE COMPETITION

- Sophomore lefthander Mat Clark was a reliever as a freshman in 2018 and during the first few weeks of the 2019 season.
- He has since moved into the weekend rotation as the Saturday starter.
- He has utilized his control and change of speed to be effective on the mound.
- He is 7-0 with a 1.98 ERA, .187 opponents' batting average and 31 strikeouts in 41.0 innings pitched over eight appearances (five starts).
- He has allowed just eight walks.
- He is 5-0 with a 1.97 ERA, .187 opponents' batting average and 18 strikeouts in 32.0 innings pitched in five ACC regular-season starts.
- He made his second career start against No. 3 North Carolina in the second game of a doubleheader on March 9 and earned the win.
- He pitched 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball with seven strikeouts against no walks to earn the win against Notre Dame on March 16.
- He allowed just one run on four hits in 7.1 innings pitched to earn the win against No. 8 Louisville on April 6.
- In his career, he is 11-0 with a 1.88 ERA and .198 opponents' batting average in 62.1 innings pitched over 27 appearances (six starts).
- He has 54 strikeouts against only 12 walks in his career, good for a 4.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

## DAVIDSON DOING IT ALL

- Junior shortstop Logan Davidson has shown the ability to impact the game in a variety of ways.
- He was one of 40 players named to the Golden Spikes Award Midseason Watch List in April.
- He was voted as a co-captain (alongside Carson Spiers) by his teammates prior to the 2019 season.
- He is hitting .302 with eight doubles, a triple, nine homers, 32 RBIs, 28 runs, a .419 on-base percentage and 11 steals in 33 games.
- He is 9-for-17 (.529) with two homers, four doubles, five walks and a .680 on-base percentage after the seventh inning.
- He has committed only six errors in 161 chances at shortstop, good for a .963 fielding percentage.

# NOTES

- He had a 14-game hitting streak in March and is riding a current 30-game on-base streak.
- He hit a walkoff two-run homer on a 2-2 pitch with two outs in Clemson's 5-4 win over No. 3 North Carolina to complete a sweep on March 10.
- In his career, he is hitting .292 with 35 doubles, a triple, 36 homers, 119 RBIs, a .403 on-base percentage and 31 steals in 159 games.
- He has hit 18 career homers as a lefthanded batter and 18 career homers as a righthanded batter.
- He has started every Clemson game of his career at shortstop and has a .948 career fielding percentage.
- His father, Mark, a former Tiger and MLB player, was a student assistant coach on the 2018 team.

## HALL STARTING THINGS OFF

- Sophomore infielder and outfielder Sam Hall has been in the leadoff spot in 2019, and he has also started at five different positions.
- He is hitting .297 with 11 doubles, three homers, 20 RBIs, 36 runs, a .421 on-base percentage and 21 steals in 33 games in 2019.
- He has made 13 starts in left field, 10 at second base, seven at third base, two in right field and one in center field in 2019.
- He is the only Tiger to start every game in the same lineup spot (1).
- He received the Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP of the South Carolina series from March 1-3.
- He was 5-for-10 with a homer, double, three RBIs, four runs, a .571 on-base percentage and three steals in the series against the Gamecocks.
- In Clemson's sweep of No. 3 North Carolina from March 9,10, he started one game apiece in left field, center field and right field.
- In his career, he is hitting .276 with 15 doubles, five homers, 27 RBIs, 54 runs and 29 steals in 58 games (54 starts).

## HAWKINS PATCHING THE TIGERS

- Freshman infielder Bryar Hawkins has emerged as an everyday player at first base and designated hitter.
- He is hitting .304 with five doubles, three homers, 15 RBIs, 21 runs and a .402 on-base percentage in 27 games (24 starts).
- He is hitting .345 with two homers, four doubles, eight RBIs, 17 runs and a .433 on-base percentage in 15 ACC regular-season games.
- He hit a three-run homer in his first career plate appearance against Virginia Military in the second game of a doubleheader on Feb. 23.
- He had five straight two-hit games from March 24-31.

## JONES STANDING TALL

- Sophomore righthander Holt Jones is one of the tallest Tigers in history at 6'8".
- The native of Santa Monica, Calif. pitched sparingly as a freshman in 2018, but he has become one of the team's top relievers in 2019.
- He is 2-0 with three saves, a 1.44 ERA, .145 opponents' batting average and 28 strikeouts in 25.0 innings pitched over 13 relief outings.
- He is holding opponents to 4-for-42 (.095) with runners on base, 2-for-31 (.065) with RISP and 1-for-28 (.036) with two outs.
- He has allowed just five of his 15 inherited baserunners to score in 2019.
- He pitched 4.0 scoreless innings of one-hit ball with three strikeouts to record the save against South Carolina on March 2.
- In two relief appearances against No. 8 Louisville on April 5,7, he pitched 5.0 hitless and scoreless innings with five strikeouts.

- In his career, he is 4-0 with three saves, a 2.61 ERA and 46 strikeouts in 41.1 innings pitched over 21 appearances (three starts).
- He has allowed just 28 hits in his career, good for a .192 opponents' batting average.

## MAJKOWSKI KNOWS GETTING ON BASE

- Sophomore outfielder has burst onto the scene to not only become an everyday starter in the outfield, but one of the team's hottest hitters.
- He has also made many highlight-reel catches in right field to save runs.
- He is hitting .308 with five doubles, a triple, 11 RBIs, 13 runs and four steals in 28 games (18 starts) in 2019.
- He has a .458 on-base percentage thanks to nine walks and nine hit-by-pitches in just 65 at-bats.
- In ACC regular-season games, he is hitting .375 with five doubles, a triple, eight RBIs, 10 runs, a .528 on-base percentage and a steal.
- In his career, he is hitting .303 with five doubles, a triple, 11 RBIs, a .452 on-base percentage and four steals in 30 games (18 starts).
- His father, Don, played football at Virginia, then played 10 years (1987-96) in the NFL with 12,700 passing yards and 66 passing touchdowns.

## SHARPE SHINING AS FRESHMAN

- Freshman utility player Davis Sharpe has made an immediate impact, both on the mound and at the plate.
- He is 5-1 with a 1.55 ERA, .184 opponents' batting average and 57 strikeouts against 15 walks in 46.1 innings pitched over eight starts.
- He is hitting .303 with three homers, four doubles, 15 RBIs, a .411 on-base percentage and two steals in 26 games (25 starts) on offense.
- He is 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA, .179 opponents' batting average and 34 strikeouts in 31.2 innings pitched over five ACC regular-season starts.
- He made his college debut a memorable one in a doubleheader against South Alabama on Feb. 16.
- In the first game, he started on the mound and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball with eight strikeouts to earn the win.
- In the second game of the doubleheader, he made his offensive debut and hit two homers with three RBIs as the designated hitter.
- He allowed one hit and no runs with 11 strikeouts in 6.0 innings pitched against VMI in the second game of a doubleheader on Feb. 23.
- He was named ACC Player-of-the-Week on Feb. 18 for his performances in the doubleheader against South Alabama on Feb. 16.
- He was named one of 12 national players-of-the-week by Collegiate Baseball on Feb. 25 for his performances in four games from Feb. 18-24.
- He allowed just three hits, no runs and two walks with six strikeouts in 7.0 innings pitched to earn the win at Boston College on March 22.
- He allowed four hits, one run and one walk with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings pitched to earn the win against No. 8 Louisville on April 5.
- He was named midseason national freshman-of-the-year by D1Baseball on April 4.

## SPIERS MOVES INTO CLOSER ROLE

- Junior righthander Carson Spiers was one of Clemson's best relievers in 2018 and has moved into the closer role in 2019.
- He was voted as a co-captain (alongside Logan Davidson) by his teammates prior to the 2019 season.
- He has a team-high nine saves in a team-high 15 relief appearances.

## HEAD COACH MONTE LEE

- He is 1-2 with a 2.18 ERA, a .231 opponents' batting average and 19 strikeouts against six walks in 20.2 innings pitched.
- He has allowed just four of his 17 inherited baserunners to score in 2019.
- In his career, he is 3-4 with 13 saves, a 2.15 ERA and 61 strikeouts against 25 walks in 67.0 innings pitched over 47 relief appearances.
- He has allowed just 44 hits in his career, good for a .184 opponents' batting average.
- His cousin, Will Spiers, was the starting punter on the Tigers' 2018 national championship football team.
- His father, Michael Spiers, hit .301 with 16 homers, 110 RBIs and 32 steals in 184 games as a Tiger from 1988-91.

- He is hitting .270 with eight homers, seven doubles, 27 RBIs, 24 runs, a .323 on-base percentage and seven steals in 33 games (32 starts).
- In his career, he is hitting .227 with 11 doubles, 12 homers, 36 RBIs, 36 runs and eight steals in 70 games (56 starts).

### WEATHERLY STRIKING OUT OF BULLPEN

- Sophomore Sam Weatherly has emerged as one of the team's top lefthanders out of the bullpen in 2019.
- He is 2-0 with a 2.63 ERA, .200 opponents' batting average and 24 strikeouts in 13.2 innings pitched over nine relief appearances.
- He has allowed just one extra-base hit (double).
- In his career, he is 2-0 with a 5.03 ERA and 41 strikeouts in 34.0 innings pitched over 17 appearances (five starts).
- He has allowed just 33 hits in his career, good for a .273 opponents' batting average, and five extra-base hits, including only one homer.

### WILKIE USING BAT & ARM

- Junior catcher Kyle Wilkie has helped keep opponent running games in check with his ability to throw out basestealers.
- He has thrown out 11 of 28 basestealers, and many of the successful steals have come with no throws due to great jumps.
- He was named to the Buster Posey Award Watch List during the season.
- He is hitting .275 with a homer, five doubles, 16 RBIs, 18 runs, a .369 on-base percentage and four steals in 30 games (28 starts) in 2019.
- He had a 10-game hitting streak from February to March after ending the 2018 season on a 29-game hitting streak.
- He had a 41-game on-base streak, which comprised the last 39 games of 2018 and the first two games of 2019.
- In his career, he is hitting .298 with 16 doubles, six homers, 61 RBIs, a .400 on-base percentage and six steals in 116 games (106 starts).

### FOUR TIGERS IN THE MAJORS IN 2019

- Former Tigers Steven Duggar, Dominic Leone, Brad Miller and Tony Sipp are on 2019 MLB rosters.
- Duggar is in his second year, Leone is in his sixth year, Miller is in his seventh year and Sipp is in his 11th year.
- Duggar was a two-time All-ACC player as a Tiger from 2013-15 and made his MLB debut with the San Francisco Giants on July 8, 2018.
- Leone, who had a 16-8 career record at Clemson, made his major league debut with the Seattle Mariners in 2014.
- Miller, the 2011 ACC Player-of-the-Year, hit .339 with 36 doubles, eight triples, 16 homers, 135 RBIs and 46 steals in 191 games as a Tiger.
- Sipp batted .280 and had a 2-2 pitching record for the Tigers in 2004.
- Every Tiger team from 1974 to 2015 has had at least one future major leaguer on its roster.
