ON COFER: Earned his Bachelor's Degree in Sociology as he graduated from Florida State University on May 4, 2019...one of the most athletically gifted players in Florida State history who was a member of three NCAA Tournament teams and played in six career NCAA Tournament games...finished his five-year career at Florida State ranked eighth in school history with 133 games played, 23rd in school history with 83 games started and tied for 17th in school history with a .366 career 3-point field goal percentage...finished his career just 23 points shy of 1,000 for his career and among the top 50 all-time scorers in school history...granted a medical hardship waiver by the NCAA on May 25, 2018 giving him a fifth season to play for the Seminoles as a redshirt senior during the 2018-19 season...Florida State applied for the medical hardship waiver after Cofer played in only 11 games and 132 minutes as a sophomore during the 2015-16 season because of injuries...missed much of his second season as a Seminole after undergoing ankle surgery on January 4, 2016 – a procedure that kept him out of the lineup for the remainder of the season...missed the first nine games of the 2018-19 season as he continued rehab on his foot and ankle...helped Florida State to three NCAA Tournament appearances – the Elite Eight in 2018, the Sweet 16 in 2019 and the round of 32 in 2017...played in six NCAA Tournament games as a Seminole...averaged 10.5 points per game in Florida State's incredible run to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament with victories over No. 8 seed Missouri (March 16, 2018; 67-54); No. 1 seed Xavier (March 18, 2018; 75-70) and No. 4 seed Gonzaga (March 22, 2018; 75-60)...it was Florida State's first trip to the Elite Eight since 1993...marked the first time in school history the Seminoles defeated three teams seeded higher than them in the NCAA Tournament...totaled nine points and four rebounds in Florida State's victory over Missouri...scored 10 points and pulled down three rebounds in the Seminoles' win over Xavier...scored seven points and blocked one shot as Florida State defeated Gonzaga...totaled a double-double of 16 points and 12 rebounds against Michigan (March 24, 2018; 54-58) as the Seminoles fell to the Big Ten Champions only one game short of the second Final Four appearance in school history...his career-high of six 3-point shots made at Duke (Dec. 30, 2017) are tied for the 16th best single game effort in school history...Florida State was successful against nationally ranked teams during Cofer's career with 22 wins over teams ranked in the nation's top-25...helped the Seminoles defeat a school-record tying seven nationally ranked teams as a junior and gain wins over six nationally ranked teams as a senior and as a redshirt senior...two of the wins over nationally ranked teams came against No. 3 Xavier (March 18, 2018; 75-70) and No. 8 Gonzaga (March 22, 2018; 75-60) in the 2018 NCAA Tournament...his play during the 2016-17 season helped Florida State earn a 26-9 record, finish in second place in the ACC standings and earn a school-record tying No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament...the Seminoles won a near-school record 26 games and tied the school record with 12 ACC wins during the regular season...Florida State won a school-record 29 overall games and a school-record 13 ACC games during his redshirt senior season...was a highlight reel during his career who has exhibited an incredible array of high-flying dunks, blocked shots and rebounds that made the nation stand up and take notice of the ultra-talented forward...one of the most popular players inside of the Seminoles' locker room throughout his career and will always be known as a player who brought laughter and positivity to the entire team...earned the No. 1 Play of the Day on ESPN with his monstrous, seen and heard around the college basketball world dunk over ACC Player of the Year and 2015 No. 3 overall NBA Draft Choice Jahlil Okafor of Duke on February 9, 2015 as the Seminoles played host to the No. 5 ranked Blue Devils in Tallahassee... Said ESPN's Shane Battier: "This might be a SportsCenter Top 10 – Phil Cofer sending it in with authority over the big fella. This was a fantastic baseline attack by Cofer. One way to attack a shot blocker is to go right through his chest and that's what he (Cofer) did right there. Very impressive, athletic play by Phil Cofer."...a four-star recruit and the No. 56 overall high school basketball prospect in the nation in 2014 according to ESPN...the No. 8 overall ranked prospect in the talent-laden state of Georgia by the Phenom Hoop Report as a high school senior...the No. 6 ranked prospect in the class of 2014 by Georgia Hoops...a talented member of the Atlanta-based Team Georgia Elite coached by Al Outlaw... named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll in 2017 for the first time in his career...the Seminoles were named as an Academic Team of Excellence by the NABC for finishing with a cumulative team GPA of 3.222 for the 2016-17 season...presented with the Doc Fauls Award at the 2019 Golden Nole Banquet...the award was established in 1999 and recognizes the senior Seminole Athlete that has overcome the most adversity to participate in athletics for Florida State University...presented with the Mr. Hustle Award by the Florida State coaching staff at the Seminoles' 2015 season-ending honors banquet...presented with the Sixth Man Award as a member of the Boom Squad at the 2017 Florida State Honors Banquet...a big winner at the Seminoles' 2018 Basketball Honors Banquet as he was presented with the award as the Seminoles' top 3-point field goal percentage shooter, the Dave Cowens Chairman of the Boards Award and the Bob Sura Offensive Player of the Year Award...presented with the Tip of the Spear award from the Seminoles' coaching staff at

the teams annual Honors Banquet in 2019...the Tip of the Spear Award is presented annually to the member of the men's basketball team who exemplifies the unconquered spirit and who gives unselfishly of himself throughout the season.

AS A REDSHIRT SENIOR (2019): Averaged 7.4 points (fifth on the team) and 3.5 rebounds (fifth) while making 29 3-point field goals (fifth) and playing in 22 games and averaging 26.1 minutes played per game (fourth)...was granted a fifth season of eligibility by the NCAA on May 25, 2019 and made the most of his return...played in 22 of Florida State's 37 games as his foot healed from off-season surgery...started 19 of the 22 games he appeared in as a redshirt senior and averaged 7.5 points scored per game...helped Florida State finish the 2018-19 season with a 29-8 overall record and a 13-5 record in ACC play...the Seminoles' 29 wins set a new school record for wins in a season while their 13 wins set a school record for conference wins in a season...the Seminoles finished in fourth place in the ACC standings with their record setting total of conference wins...was at his best in the ACC Tournament as he helped the Seminoles advance to the Championship Game for the third time in school history...averaged 8.0 points and 2.7 rebounds as Florida State defeated Virginia Tech in overtime (March 14, 2019, 65-63) and No. 2 and National Champion Virginia (March 15, 2019, 79-69) before falling to Duke in the championship game (March 16, 73-63)...scored in double figures in six games as a redshirt senior including his season high of 21 points in Florida State's game against Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center...Florida State defeated six ranked teams in his redshirt senior season: No. 19 LSU (November 23, 2018, 79-76 in overtime), No. 19 Purdue (November 28, 2018, 73-72), No. 16 Louisville (February 9, 2019, 80-75 in overtime), No. 15 Virginia Tech (March 5, 2019, 73-64 in overtime) and No. 16 Virginia Tech (March 14, 2019, 65-63 in overtime in the ACC Tournament)...first game after missing first nine of the season with a broken right foot came in Florida State's 85-68 win over Southeast Missouri in Tallahassee...totaled five minutes of playing time in the first half of the Seminoles' ninth win of the season (Dec. 17)...totaled seven points in 17 minutes of playing time in Florida State's 81-59 win over Saint Louis in the Orange Bowl Classic (Dec. 22)...a starter with 14 points, three assists and two rebounds in Florida State's 87-76 win over Winthrop in Tallahassee (Jan. 1)...scored nine points and added four rebounds in Florida State's ACC opener at Virginia (Jan. 5)...totaled seven points, six rebounds and two assists in 29 minutes played in Florida State's victory over Miami (Jan. 9)...season-high 21 points and seven rebounds in 34 minutes of playing time in the Seminoles' game in Tallahassee against No. 1 Duke (Jan. 12)...scored 11 points to go along with three rebounds, three assists and one steal in Florida State's victory over Syracuse in the Carrier Dome (Feb. 5)...totaled 13 points (on three of six shooting from 3-point range), five rebounds, three assists, one blocked shot and one steal in Florida State's victory over Wake Forest in Tallahassee (Feb. 13)...totaled eight points (on two of three made 3-point field goals) and seven rebounds in Florida State's victory over Georgia Tech in Atlanta (Feb. 16)...scored eight points and added five rebounds in Florida State's 78-73 win over NC State in Tallahassee (March 2)...totaled 11 points and three rebounds in 36 minutes on Senior Night in Florida State's 73-64 victory over Virginia Tech in Tallahassee (March 5)...totaled nine points and four rebounds in Florida State's regular-season ending 65-57 win over Wake Forest in Winston-Salem (March 9)...nine points - including a 3-point shot with 1:15 remaining in overtime — in Florida State's 65-63 overtime victory over Virginia Tech in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament...it was Cofer's shot that tied the game at 63-63 and the Seminoles' won the game and advanced to the ACC Tournament semifinals on Terance Mann's basket with 1.8 seconds remaining to win the game (March 14)...scored 11 points and added two rebounds in Florida State's 69-59 victory over No. 2 Virginia in the semifinals of the 2019 ACC Tournament at the Spectrum Center in Charlotte...scored nine of his points against the Cavaliers on three made 3-point shots (March 15).

AS A SENIOR (2018): Averaged a career-high 12.8 points (first on the team), a career high 5.1 rebounds (second) and a career-high 29.3 minutes played (first) as a starter in each of the Seminoles' 35 games as he led Florida State to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament...led the Seminoles in games played (35), games started (35), minutes played (1,026), minutes played per games (29.3), field goals attempted (346), defensive rebounds (122), points scored (449) and points scored per game (12.8)...the Seminoles' leading scorer in the NCAA Tournament with a 10.5 points per game scoring average and named to the West Regional All-Tournament Team in leading Florida State to the Elite Eight with wins over No. 8 seed Missouri (March 16, 2018; 67-54), No. 1 seed Xavier (March 18, 2018; 75-70) and No. 4 seed Gonzaga (March 22, 2018; 75-60)...it was Florida State's first trip to the Elite Eight since 1993...averaged 10.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and shot .846 from the free throw line (11 of 13) as Florida State tied its school record with three wins in the NCAA Tournament...named to the NCAA Tournament West Regional All-Region Team as he helped lead the Seminoles to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the third time in school history...helped lead Florida State to six wins over nationally ranked teams as a senior — at No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4, 2017, 83-66), against No. 11 North Carolina (Jan. 3, 2018, 81-80), against No. 24 Miami (Jan. 27, 2018, 103-94 in overtime), No. 11 Clemson (Feb. 14, 2018, 81-79 in overtime), No. 3 Xavier (March 18, 2018, 75-70) and No. 8 Gonzaga (March 22, 2018, 75-60)...totaled a single-season career-high 449 points as a senior...he scored 449 points (12.8 ppg) as a senior as compared to 365 points in the first three seasons and 76 games of his career (4.8 ppg)...Cofer realized the third most improved scoring increase from his junior season (2.9 ppg) to his senior season (12.8 ppg) — an increase of +9.9 points per game — third most among all of the players in the ACC...scored in double-figures in a career-high 22 games — more than twice as many double-figures scoring games that he earned in the first three seasons of his career (10)...scored in double figures in a career-high 11 different ACC games...led, or was tied for the lead in scoring amongst his teammates in a team-high nine different games including six ACC games (28 at Duke, 21 vs. Miami, 23 at Wake Forest, 16 at Louisville, 17 vs. Clemson and 21 at Clemson) and in the Seminoles' Elite Eight game in the NCAA Tournament (16 points)...ranked second among his teammates with six games of 20 points or more scoring (21 vs. Kennesaw State, 22 vs. Oklahoma State, 28 at Duke, 21 vs. Miami, 23 at Wake Forest and 21 at Clemson)...second on the team with 178 rebounds and a single-season career-high 5.1 rebounds per game average...tied his career-high with 12 rebounds in Florida State's 83-66 win at No. 5 Florida (Dec. 4)...also pulled down 12 rebounds in Florida State's game against Michigan in the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament at the Staples Center in Los Angeles...with his 12-rebound performance against UMass in the Naismith Hall of Fame Classic (Nov. 23, 2014), he has pulled down 12 rebounds in three different career games...totaled 10 rebounds in Florida State's 80-76 win at Louisville (Feb. 3)...totaled five or more rebounds in 15 different games as a senior...third amongst his teammates with a single-season career-high 48 3-point field goals made...he made four times as many 3-point field goals as a senior than he did in his first three seasons as a Seminole (48-12)...made at least one 3-point shot in 26 of the Seminoles' 35 games and made multiple 3-point shots in nine of the Seminoles' 35 games as he illustrated how hard he has worked on his shot during his career...made four or more 3-point shots in four different games — his career-high of six at Duke (Dec. 31, career-high 28 points), five vs. Oklahoma State in the Orange Bowl Classic (Dec. 16, 22 points) and four at Rutgers in the ACC Big Ten Challenge (Nov. 28, 19 points) and at Clemson (Feb. 28, 21 points)...made 29 3-point shots in 18 ACC games including six at Duke, five at Clemson and two each in the Seminoles' wins over Syracuse (Jan. 13, 16 points), Miami (Jan. 27, 21 points), at Wake Forest (Jan. 31, 23 points) and against Virginia (Feb. 7, nine points)...made three long range shots against Louisville in the second round of the ACC Tournament at the Barclays Center (March 7, 12 points)...made one 3-point shot in three of the Seminoles' four NCAA Tournament games (against Missouri, nine points; against Xavier, 10 points and against Michigan, 16 points)...totaled two double-doubles (10 points and 12 rebounds in Florida State's win over Florida and 16 points and 12 rebounds in the Seminoles' Elite Eight game in the NCAA Tournament against Michigan) to bring his career total to three...his first career double-double came at Pitt (21 points and 11 rebounds) on Jan. 14, 2015...scored 19 points and added four rebounds in a career-high tying 37 minutes in Florida State's victory over Rutgers in the ACC Big Ten Challenge...made four of five shots from the 3-point line in the Seminoles' win over the Scarlet Knights (Nov. 28)...scored 21 points and pulled down eight rebounds in Florida State's victory over Miami in Tallahassee (Jan. 27)...was his second consecutive game with at least 21 points as he totaled 23 points and four rebounds in Florida State's game at Wake Forest (Jan. 31).

AS A JUNIOR (2017): Averaged 2.9 points and 1.9 rebounds as he played in 32 of the Seminoles' 35 games including both games in the ACC Tournament and both in the NCAA Tournament...a starter in Florida State's victory over George Washington in the BB&T Classic at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C. and against Notre Dame in the second round of the ACC Tournament at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn...earned playing time in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in his career with appearances against both Florida Gulf Coast and Xavier...scored his season-high of 13 points in 20 minutes of play in Florida State's victory over Iona at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Nov. 15)...pulled down a season-high tying six rebounds in the Seminoles' victory over the Gaels as the Seminoles improved to 2-0 on the season...totaled his season-high of 13 points and pulled down six rebounds in Florida State's victory over the Gaels...scored seven points on a perfect three of three shooting from the field in the first half to lead Florida State to a robust 47-32 halftime lead on their way to a 99-78 win in upping their record to 2-0...finished the game as he made a season high of six field goals on eight attempts...was five of six from the free throw line in scoring nine points in the Seminoles' 83-67 win over Manhattan at the Orange Bowl Classic at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla (Dec. 17)...was a perfect two of two from the field and a perfect four of four from the free throw line in scoring eight points and leading the Seminoles to a 46-41 halftime lead over the Jaspers...scored four consecutive points for the Seminoles in a 50 second span (on a tip-in at the 15:34 mark and a layup at the 14:44 mark) to break a tie and give Florida State a 15-11 advantage...two of two free throws at the 5:18 mark of the first half broke a tie and gave the Seminoles a 34-32 advantage...the Seminoles led for the remainder of the game and took a 20-point second half advantage in winning their sixth consecutive Orange Bowl Classic victory...his five of six made free throws were both season highs...his five made free throws were only one off of his career-high of six that came at Pitt on Jan, 14, 2016...scored his ACC season-high of eight points in Florida State's 95-71 win over NC State...made his career-high of two 3-point shots in the Seminoles' win over the Wolfpack...totaled six points in ACC play in win over Clemson (Feb. 5) and against Virginia Tech (March 8) in the ACC Tournament at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn...scored five points – three in the second half on a 3-point shot – in Florida State's momentum building win over No. 11 Virginia in Charlottesville (Dec. 31)...his second half 3-point shot at the 13:07 mark proved to be one of the biggest shots of the season...his 3-pointer pulled Florida State to within one point at 39-38 after the Seminoles trailed by as many as five early in the second half. began a 25-19 game-ending run that helped Florida State go from a 39-35 deficit with 13:34 remaining to a 60-58 win on a buzzer-beating, game-winning shot by future NBA draft choice Dwayne Bacon with under five seconds remaining to be played in the game...productive with a 1.8 points per game and 2.0 rebounds per game averages in one of the most important six-game stretch in the history of the Seminole basketball program...the Seminoles earned a 5-1 record against six consecutive ranked teams (No. 11 Virginia, No. 23 Virginia Tech, No. 7 Duke, No. 11 North Carolina, No. 15 Notre Dame and No. 12 Louisville) – a streak that vaulted the Seminoles into the nation's No. 6 ranking...totaled 11 points and 12 rebounds during the stretch including two points and four rebounds in Florida State's 83-80 win over Notre Dame at the Donald L. Tucker Center (Jan, 15)...also scored five points in the Seminoles over Virginia in Charlottesville...averaged 11.2 minutes played per game in the season-defining six-game series...the Seminoles' 5-1 record in this six games marked the most success an ACC team has ever had in a string of six consecutive games against nationally ranked teams...his season-high of six rebounds (including a season-high four offensive rebounds) came in Florida State's 99-78 win over Iona and in the Seminoles' ACC game at Pitt (Feb. 18)...also totaled five rebounds in Florida State's victory over Samford (Dec. 19)...closed his junior season well on the boards with nine rebounds in his last three games including three in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament (March 8)...totaled seven steals with one each coming in seven different games...five of his seven steals came against ACC competition with one coming against Notre Dame in the ACC Tournament...played his season-high of 23 minutes in Florida State's game at Pitt and played in double figure minutes in 24 of his 32 appearances...20 minutes or more in four different games – Iona (20), Temple (22), Samford (22) and at Pitt (23).

AS A FRESHMAN (2015): Averaged 6.9 points (fourth on the team), 4.5 rebounds (second) and 0.6 blocked shots (fourth) while starting 24 of 33 games – the final 24 games of his first season as a Seminole...ranked sixth on the team with a .456 shooting percentage and sixth on the team with a .632 free throw

shooting percentage...among the ACC freshmen leaders in scoring (14th) and rebounding (eighth) and was one of only 12 freshmen in the ACC to rank in the top-15 in both scoring and rebounding...also finished 11th in the ACC among freshmen in blocked shots and 15th in field goal shooting percentage...inserted into the Seminoles' starting line-up on December 17 against North Florida and played exceedingly well and won the starting job at the power forward spot and held onto the starting job for the remainder of the season...started the Seminoles' final 17 ACC games of the season...the only ACC game he did not start was in December at Notre Dame...started each of the Seminoles' ACC games during the months of January, February and March...his 149 rebounds rank as the seventh highest total by a Seminole freshman...first career double-double came on the road at Pittsburgh (21 points and 11 rebounds) in his third career ACC road game...the 21 points ranks as his overall career and ACC-high while his 11 rebounds against the Panthers (Jan. 14) ranks as his ACC career-high and his second highest single game rebounding total...pulled down his career-high of 12 rebounds in his fourth career game against UMass in the final round of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic (Nov. 23)...his career-high 21-point scoring game was the first time in his career that he has led the Seminoles in scoring...also led the Seminoles in rebounding with his career-high of 12 rebounds against UMass...was one of five Seminoles who scored at least 20 points in a game during the 2014-15 season...scored in double figures six times as a freshman including victories over Wake Forest (Jan. 28, 19 points), Boston College (Feb. 18, 13 points) and against Clemson in his first career ACC Tournament game (March 11, 10 points)... a very consistent scorer who finished fourth on the team in scoring with a 6.9 points per game scoring average despite scoring in double figures only six times...double figures came against ACC opponents four times including three during the regular season and once in the ACC Tournament (10 points against Clemson)...ranked second on the team as he led the team in rebounding eight times including in his first career game against Manhattan (six rebounds on Nov. 15)...also led the Seminoles in rebounding against UMass, North Florida (Dec. 17, eight), Stetson (Dec. 22, eight), at Pittsburgh, against Wake Forest (eight), against Boston College (nine) and against Clemson in the ACC Tournament (March 11, seven)...Florida State was 6-2 during his freshman season when he led the team in rebounding...his 12 rebounds against UMass in the final round of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic were the most by any Seminole in a single game during the 2014-15 season...finished fourth among his Seminole teammates in blocked shots with 20...one of only 10 freshmen in the ACC during the 2014-15 season with 20 or more blocked shots...multiple blocked shots in four different games with two each against Northeastern (Nov. 18), UCF (Dec. 6), Wake Forest and at Virginia Tech (Feb. 7)...career-high three steals against NC State (Jan. 17) rank as his career and ACC high...**(vs. Boston College):** Scored 13 points and pulled down nine rebounds in Florida State's only game of the season against Boston College...the Seminoles rallied for a 69-60 victory over the Eagles at the Donald L.
