ON EVANS: Earned his Bachelor's Degree in Social Science from Florida State University on April 23, 2021...is currently pursuing a second bachelor's degree in International Affairs...one of four players with experience as a starter for the Seminoles in the 2021-22 season...started 18 games as Florida State's point guard in leading the Seminoles to a second place finish in the ACC standings, the championship game of the ACC Tournament, the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament and the a No. 10 final national ranking in the ESPN Coaches Poll...returns for his fifth season of eligibility for the Seminoles in the 2021-22 season...has played four seasons of college basketball – two at North Idaho College and two at Florida State...decided to play in his fifth season after participating in Senior Day ceremonies with his teammates on March 3 against Boston College at the Donald L. Tucker Center...Florida State is 44-12 overall (.786 winning percentage) and 27-8 in ACC play (.771 winning percentage) in the last two seasons with Evans in the lineup...has played in 53 games in his first two seasons as a Seminoles and has 18 total starting assignments...played in 24 of Florida State's 25 games and started each of the final 18 games of the year during the 2020-21 season...came off the bench in each of his 29 appearances and made Florida State a better basketball team...played in double figure minutes in 12 of Florida State's final 15 games of the season as it solidified itself as the top team in the ACC by winning the regular season ACC championship for the first time in school history...he Seminoles finished with a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 mark in ACC play in his first season at Florida State...the Seminoles' 16 ACC wins ranks as a school record for regular season ACC wins...Florida State totaled an 18-7 overall mark and an 11-4 slate in league play during his second season...has played on two top-two ACC teams in his first two seasons – the Seminoles earned a first place league finish in 2019-20 and a second place finish during the 2020-21 season...a very smart, instinctive and cerebral basketball player according to head coach Leonard Hamilton...as a lead guard he has the ability to put people in the right places – to direct traffic – with a terrific sense of knowing where teammates are on the court...has an innate ability to understand spacing and where his teammates need to be on the court at all times...a big guard who also understands Florida State's defensive principles and has a burning desire to play defense...a tremendous athlete...has worked hard on his shot – both long range and mid-range – during his career...the second player from North Idaho to play basketball for Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton as he followed in the footsteps of Braian Angola who is now playing professionally in Europe...averaged in double figure scoring in both of his seasons at North Idaho as he led the Cardinals to a pair of conference championships...was selected as the MVP of the conference tournament in both seasons as a Cardinal...in his two seasons at the school, he led North Idaho to a 56-10 record (.848 winning percentage)...scored at least 20 points 10 times as a sophomore and in 18 games as a freshman...scored at least 40 points twice and at least 30 points five times as a freshman...his career high of 47 points came against Everett Community College with 42 points coming against Treasure Valley Community College as a freshman...signed with North Idaho College following his stellar high school career after first committing to Rocky Mountain College...earned two awards at the Seminoles' 2020 Honors Banquet: The First Year Academic Achievement Award and the Unsung Hero Award.

AS A SENIOR (2021): Averaged a career-high 5.1 points (eighth on the team), a career-high 2.0 rebounds (seventh) and a career-high tying 1.4 assists as Florida State's starting point guard over the course of the final 18 games of the season... established career-highs for games started (18), minutes played (461), minutes played per game (19.2), field goals made (37), field goals attempted (101), 3-point field goals made (nine), 3-point field goals attempted (25), free throws made (39), free throws attempted (46), free throw shooting percentage (.848), total points (122), points scored per game (5.1), offensive rebounds (13), defensive rebounds (35), total rebounds (48), rebounds per game (2.0), blocked shots (six) and steals (11) in his second season as a Seminole...played in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in his career as he led Florida State to the Sweet 16 of the 2021 NCAA Tournament...helped lead Florida State to a second place finish in the ACC standings, to the championship game of the 2021 ACC Tournament and to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament...totaled a 2-1 record in the NCAA Tournament and a 1-1 record in his first career ACC Tournament as Florida State's starting point guard...Florida State was 13-5 with Evans as the starter at the point guard position with wins coming against nine different ACC teams during the regular season, North Carolina during the ACC Tournament as well as UNC Greensboro and Colorado in the NCAA Tournament...with 44 wins during the first two seasons at Florida State (44-12), the Seminoles are the winningest team in the ACC in the last two seasons with Evans in the lineup...Virginia is second in the last two seasons with 41 wins and a 41-12 record...with Evans at the helm of Florida State's offense during the 2020-21 season, Florida State ranked first in scoring offense (77.2 ppg), first in scoring margin (+8.0 ppg), first in 3-point field goal percentage (.376), third in field goal percentage (.474) and third in free throws made (351)...helped the Seminoles defeat four nationally ranked teams -- No. 25 Florida (Dec. 12), No. 20 Clemson (Jan. 23), No. 7 Virginia (Feb. 15) and No. 22 Colorado (March 22)...each of the teams the Seminoles defeated played in the 2021 NCAA Tournament...scored his career-high of 24 points in Florida State's 105-73 win over NC State in Tallahassee...his 24 points were tied for the most points by a Seminoles player with RaiQuan Gray's 24 points against Wake Forest (Jan. 13)...double figure scoring in a career-high four games with all four coming against ACC competition (24 against NC State, 12 at Pittsburgh, 11 at Louisville and 10 at home against North Carolina)...all four of his double figure scoring games led to Florida State victories...totaled eight points and four rebounds in Florida State's 72-59 win over Gardner-Webb at the Donald L. Tucker Center (Dec. 21)...scored nine points to go along with two rebounds in Florida State's game at Clemson (Dec. 29)...as a first-time starter, he totaled a career-high 24 points and a career-high six rebounds in Florida State's 105-73 win over NC State at the Donald L. Tucker Center...in double figures with 10 points, four assists and three

steals in Florida State's victory over North Carolina at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee (Jan. 16)...in double figures for the third consecutive games with 11 points, three rebounds and one steal in Florida State's victory over Louisville at the KFC Yum! Center (Jan. 18)...scored five points to go along with five rebounds and three assists against Georgia Tech in Atlanta (Jan. 30)...totaled 12 points on a career-high 10 made free throws in Florida State's 79-72 win at Pittsburgh at the Peterson Events Center (Feb. 20)...totaled six points, two rebounds, two assists and two blocked shots as a starter on Senior Night in Florida State's 93-64 win over Boston College at the Donald L. Tucker Center (March 3)...totaled two points and one blocked shot as a starter in Florida State's 71-53 win over Colorado in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at the Indiana Farmers Coliseum in Indianapolis...the victory sent the Seminoles to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season (March 22).

AS A JUNIOR (2020): Averaged 3.2 points (12th on the team), 1.2 rebounds (10th) and 1.4 assists (tied for fourth) as he played in 29 of Florida State's 31 games...continued to improve throughout his first season as a Seminole and was playing his best basketball deep into February and March...helped the Seminoles finish with a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 record in ACC play...averaged nearly 12 minutes played per game in leading the Seminoles to the first Regular Season ACC Championship in school history...the Seminoles' 16 wins in ACC play established a school record for ACC regular season wins in the first season of 20 conference games...Florida State finished the season ranked No. 4 nationally – the highest final ranking in school history...the Seminoles moved into the nation's top-10 in the national rankings on January 13 (Week 11) and stayed in the top 10 for the remainder of the season...made his Florida State debut with three minutes played in the Seminoles' 79-74 win over Western Carolina (Nov. 15)...totaled four points, four steals and two assists in Florida State's victory over Chattanooga in the first round of the Emerald Coast Classic in Tallahassee...first extended playing time for the Seminoles with 14 minutes played in the Florida State's victory over the Mocs (Nov. 20)...scored six points, pulled down five rebounds earned one assist, one blocked shot and one steal in Florida State's victory over Saint Francis (Nov. 23)...totaled six points, two assists and one steal in Florida State's victory over Chicago State in the second round of the Emerald Coast Classic in Tallahassee (Nov. 25)...totaled four points – including the first made 3-point shot of his Seminole career – along with two rebounds and two assists in Florida State's victory over USF in the Orange Bowl Classic (Dec. 21)...totaled seven points, two rebounds and one assist in Florida State's victory over North Alabama in Tallahassee (Dec. 28)...totaled seven points, one rebound, one assist and one blocked shot in Florida State's victory over Louisville on the road in ACC play (Jan. 4)...totaled seven points and one rebound in 12 minutes of playing time in Florida State's victory over North Carolina in Tallahassee (Feb. 3)...a season-high eight points, a season-high four rebounds and three assists in Florida State's 99-81 victory over Miami in Tallahassee (Feb. 8)...totaled six points, four assists and two rebounds in Florida State's victory over Syracuse in Tallahassee (Feb. 15)...totaled three points, a career-high six assists and a season-high tying four rebounds in Florida State's victory over Boston College...the Seminoles' win over the Eagles gave Florida State the first regular season ACC Championship in school history with a 16-4 record in the first 20 game season in conference history (March 7).

AT NORTH IDAHO: Graduated from North Idaho College in 2019 with an Associate's Degree in Graphic Design...recognized as the Northwest Athletic Conference Male Basketball Athlete of the Year in 2019...named to the All-East Region Defensive Team and as the East Region MVP in 2019...led the Cardinals to a two-year combined record of 56-10; they finished with a combined 27-5 overall record in NWAC play including a perfect 16-0 record during the 2018-19 season...averaged 18.2 points, 7.4 rebounds and 4.9 assists in leading North Idaho to its second consecutive Northwest Athletic Conference championship... shot .552 percent from the field and .781 percent from the free throw line in his second season...scored in double figures in each of his games as a sophomore with his season-high of 32 points, six assists and two steals coming in NIC's victory over Walla Walla in the NWAC Tournament championship game as a senior...in leading North Idaho to the 2019 NWAC Championship, Evans averaged 23.3 points in three tournament games including a double-double of 18 points and 15 rebounds in the Cardinals' semifinal round victory over Everett Community College...averaged 10 points, 8.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists as a freshman at North Idaho...totaled 28 points to lead North Idaho to a 90-83 victory over Peninsula and claim its first ever NWAC Title...in winning the NWAC title in 2018, the Cardinals defeated a pair of No. 1 seeds to win the championship...among the league leaders in steals.

AT BILLINGS SKYVIEW HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Billings Skyview High School in 2017...earned All-State honors as named by *USA Today*...earned Class AA All-State First Team and Eastern Class AA All-Conference First Team honors as a senior...averaged 18.2 points, 6.3 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game as he led the Falcons to a third place finish in the state championship tournament...totaled 38 points in the consolation final to secure Skyview's third place finish...averaged 14.2 points, 5.7 rebounds and 3.8 assists as a junior...played in the Montana-Wyoming All-Star game following the conclusion of his senior season...scored 10 points to lead Montana to the 93-78 victory in the first game of the All Star weekend...totaled 12 points in the second game which was also won by Montana.

PERSONAL: Born September 16, 1998...RayQuan is the son of LaVern OldElk and Israel Evans...a member of the Crow Tribe and Greasy Mouth clan... spent a portion of his childhood on the Crow Indian Reservation near Hardin, about an hour east of Billings...his dad played basketball at the University of Montana...played two seasons as a forward at Montana (1993 and 1994)...his father averaged 9.1 points, 4.2 rebounds, 0.9 steals and 0.3 blocks during his career...has three brothers – Tray, Tye and Cam....originally from (and born in) Georgetown, S.C...moved back to Montana to begin his freshman year of high school...selected Florida State over Utah State, Washington State, Gonzaga, Georgia, Oregon and Utah...initially committed to Utah State before signing his National Letter of Intent to attend Florida State in April of 2019...earned his first bachelor's degree in Social Science and is currently pursuing a second bachelor's degree in International Affairs – both from Florida State.
