NOTING ACC BASEBALL

The Super Four

Four ACC teams have advanced to the final 16 of the 2019 NCAA Baseball Championship and will continue play in the Super Regionals this weekend ... Duke, Florida State and North Carolina all swept through their respective NCAA Regionals with three consecutive wins ... Louisville battled back from a Saturday loss with three straight wins on its home field to punch the ACC's fourth Super Regional ticket.

Return Engagements

FSU, making its 57th overall trip to the postseason, holds the longest active streak with 42 straight appearances in the NCAA tournament ... North Carolina is appearing in the tournament for the 32nd time overall ... This year marks the 13th NCAA Baseball Championship appearance for Louisville and the eighth for Duke ... All four of the ACC's Super Regional teams also earned NCAA tournament bids in 2018, and both Duke and North Carolina are in the Super Regional round for the second consecutive year.

One More Time

Florida State is making its 40th consecutive NCAA appearance under legendary head coach Mike Martin, who has announced his retirement following the conclusion of this season ... Martin, the winningest NCAA coach in any sport with 2,026 career victories, has led FSU to 16 appearances in the College World Series ... Florida State will play in its 17th Super Regional, the most in the 21-year history of the current NCAA format.

Right at Home

This year will mark ACC champion North Carolina's ninth NCAA Super Regional appearance and second consecutive ... The Tar Heels have advanced to the College World Series each of the last seven times that they reached the Super Regionals ... UNC is 40-7 at home in NCAA tournament play under veteran head coach Mike Fox.

Another Devil of a Run

Duke, under the direction of head coach Chris Pollard, will be making the second Super Regional appearance in program history and the second in as many years. The Blue Devils reached the Super Regional last season for the first time since the NCAA's current tournament format was introduced in 1999.

In the Cards

Louisville reached the NCAA Super Regional for the eighth time in 13 NCAA Championship appearances and seeks its fifth College World Series berth ... The Cardinals presented head coach Dan McDonnell with a milestone victory while advancing through the regional round, as last Sunday night's 11-2 win over Illinois State marked the 600th of his career. McDonnell now owns a 601-238 record in 13 seasons at the Louisville helm.

Tar Heels Claim 2019 ACC Baseball Title

DURHAM, N.C. – North Carolina captured its seventh ACC Baseball Championship trophy with a 10-2 win over Georgia Tech in the title game on May 26. The Tar Heel offense came to life, blasting four home runs on the day and amassing 12 hits while four Tar Heel pitchers held the Yellow Jackets to four hits and just one earned run.

Senior Michael Busch was named the tournament MVP for the Tar Heels, who capped a 4-0 tournament run with their victory over the Yellow Jackets in a battle of ranked teams and eventual NCAA Regional hosts.

North Carolina is now 7-5 in ACC Baseball Championship title games, including a 3-1 mark under current head coach Mike Fox (winning in 2007, 2013 and this year; losing in 2017). UNC owns 11 ACC baseball titles overall, winning four times during years in which the regular-season winner as crowned the champion (1960, 1964, 1966 and 1969).

Three of UNC's ACC Baseball Championship titles have come in the city of Durham (1984, 2013 and 2019).

ACC BASEBALL BY THE NUMBERS

2 – Duke has earned a spot in the NCAA Super Regionals for the second time in school history and for the second consecutive season under head coach Chris Pollard.

3 – Three ACC teams rank in the top five nationally for most all-time tournament appearances: No. 2 Florida State (57), No. 3 Miami (46), and No. 5 Clemson (44).

4 – The ACC's four semifinalists for the Brooks Wallace Award presented to the nation's top shortstop – Louisville's Tyler Fitzgerald, Wake Forest's Patrick Frick, Georgia Tech's Luke Waddell and NC State's Will Wilson – leads all conferences.

4 – Four active ACC coaches – Florida State's Mike Martin, North Carolina's Mike Fox, Georgia Tech's Danny Hall and NC State's Elliott Avent – have surpassed 1,000 wins for their careers.

5 – No. 7 Louisville is a national seed for the fifth time in program history (No. 7 in 2010, No. 3 in 2015, No. 2 in 2016 and No. 7 in 2017) ... The Cardinals join Florida as the only two programs to be national seeds four times since 2015.

6 – The ACC has placed at least six teams in the NCAA Tournament field each of the last 16 seasons.

8 – The ACC's eight teams in the 2019 NCAA Baseball Championship field were the second-most of any conference ... This marks the fourth time since 2010 that the ACC has placed at least eight teams in NCAA tournament.

10 – This marks the 10th consecutive season that the ACC has boasted two or more top-eight national seeds.

11 – North Carolina entered NCAA play as the ACC champion for the 11th time, including seven titles via tournament format since 1982.

13 – At least one ACC team has reached the College World Series in Omaha each of the past 13 years, and multiple ACC teams have reached the CWS eight times during that span.

17 – Florida State has reached the Super Regionals 17 times in 21 seasons under the current NCAA baseball tournament format.

18 – Number of times a team playing in the ACC Baseball Championship title game has gone on to play in the College World Series.

18 – ACC champion North Carolina is making its 18th NCAA appearance in 21 seasons under head coach Mike Fox.

24 – The ACC has placed a total of 24 teams in the College World Series in the past 13 years, an average of just under two per season.

28 – This marks the 28th consecutive season that the ACC has had at least one player taken in the first round of the MLB Draft (NC State's Will Wilson -15th overall; Clemson's Logan Davidson - 29th; North Carolina's Michael Bush 31st).

30 – Duke has hit the 30-win mark each of the past six seasons while earning three NCAA bids in the last four seasons.

40 – North Carolina has won 40 of 47 NCAA tournament home games under 21st-year head coach Mike Fox.

42 – Florida State's 42nd consecutive selection to the NCAA Baseball Championship field continued the longest active streak in the nation.

82 – Number of NCAA Tournament bids earned by ACC teams over the past 11 seasons.

94 – Combined number of College World Series appearances by the ACC's 14 baseball programs.

248 – The ACC closed the regular season with a 248-97 (.719) record against non-conference opposition.

600 – Louisville's win over Illinois State in NCAA Regional play June 2 marked head coach Dan McDonnell's 600th in 13 seasons at the school.

979 – Current ACC teams own a total of 979 wins in NCAA Tournament play while posting a winning percentage of .575.

2,026 – Number of wins for Florida State's Mike Martin, who will retire at the end of this season as the NCAA's all-time winningest coach in any sport.

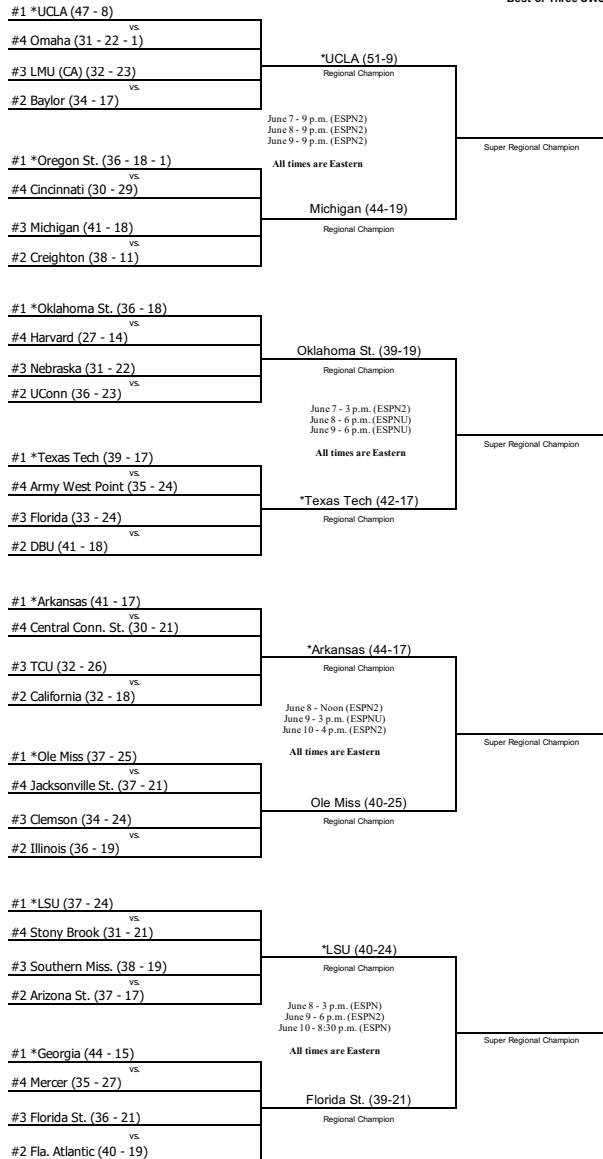
