SEMINOLES CONTINUE HOMETAND AS SAINT FRANCIS (PA) COMES TO TALLAHASSEE

Florida State, which has won 51 of its last 54 games at the Donald L. Tucker Center, plays host to Saint Francis (Pa.) in its third of four consecutive home games, on Saturday, November 23, 2019 at 2:00 p.m. The Seminoles' game against the Red Flash is the first ever meeting between the two schools in the sport of men's basketball. Florida State enters Saturday's game having won three consecutive games with wins at Florida, and at home against Western Carolina and Chattanooga. Following Saturday's game against Saint Francis, the Seminoles play host to Chicago State at 7:00 on Monday in the second round of the Emerald Coast Classic at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

FLORIDA STATE VS. SAINT FRANCIS – CONNECTIONS

Florida State faces the Saint Francis (Pa.) Red Flash for the first time in program history on November 23, 2019 at the Donald L Tucker Center. The Red Flash are members of the Northeast Conference – tonight's game is the Seminoles' first against a current member of the NEC since they defeated Wagner on December, 18, 2003 in Tallahassee by a 76-67 margin. The Red Flash are coached by Rob Krimmel who has been at Saint Francis as a player, assistant coach and head coach for the last 18 seasons but has never coached against Florida State. Andrew Helton, the Associate Head Coach for the Red Flash, worked with Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton at the University of Miami (1999-00). The Seminoles' game against Saint Francis (Pa.) is their first game against a non-conference opponent from the State of Pennsylvania since facing Villanova in the Championship game of the 2018 AdvoCare Invitational at Lake Buena Vista, Fla (Disney World).

SEMINOLES TO HONOR NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE AGAINST SAINT FRANCIS

The Florida State men's basketball team will wear turquoise Nike N7 uniforms against Saint Francis in Saturday's game to raise awareness for bringing sport to Native American and Aboriginal youth. It marks the 13th time (and first time this season) the Seminoles will wear the special uniforms. The Seminoles wore the special uniforms in their 73-72 win over No. 18/19 Purdue in Tallahassee on November 28, 2018 in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge. This season (2019-20) marks the seventh consecutive season the Seminoles will wear the turquoise uniforms. Florida State makes a distinct departure from its traditional school colors to don turquoise Nike N7 uniforms to stand for the importance of bringing sport and physical activity to Native American and Aboriginal youth. "The Seminole Tribe of Florida approached us about this program, and we are honored and excited to wear these unique uniforms," said head coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles first wore the turquoise uniforms in their 89-61 win over UT-Martin in Tallahassee on November 17, 2013.

A QUICK REVIEW OF THE 2018-29 SEASON

Florida State enjoyed one of the greatest seasons in school history in 2018-19 as it played in its third consecutive NCAA Tournament, advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the school-record tying second consecutive season, finished the season ranked 10th nationally, advanced to the championship game of the ACC Tournament, finished fourth in the ACC standings and defeated six nationally ranked teams. Florida State won a program record 29 games and earned a school-record 13 ACC wins, finishing fourth in the best conference for college basketball in the country. The Seminoles defeated Virginia, who won the National Championship, in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament to reach the championship game of the ACC Tournament for the third time in school history.

FLORIDA STATE NATIONALLY IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

The Seminoles are one of seven teams in the nation (Florida State, Duke, Gonzaga, Kentucky, Michigan, Purdue and Texas Tech) who have advanced at least as far as the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in both of the last two seasons. The Seminoles advanced to the Elite Eight in 2018 and to the Sweet 16 in 2019.

HAMILTON MOVES CLOSER TO SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 337 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game against Saint Francis on Saturday as the seventh all-time winningest coach in ACC history. He needs only 12 wins to move into sixth place in ACC history (passing Maryland's Lefty Driesell) and only 13 wins to become just the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games.

SEMINOLES UTILIZE 15 PLAYERS IN VICTORY OVER CHATTANOOGA

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff utilized 15 players in Florida State's 89-53 win over Chattanooga on Wednesday night. A total of 12 players scored at least one point and nine earned at least 12 minutes of playing time.

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO LEAD ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Florida State, which has shot better than 80 percent from the free throw line in two of its first four games of the season, enters Saturday's game against Saint Francis as the ACC leader with a team free throw shooting percentage of .783. The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC that is shooting better than 75 percent from the free throw line. A trio of Seminoles – freshman Patrick Williams (first, 1.000 percent), junior M.J. Walker (tied for eighth, .824 percent) and senior Trent Forrest (tied for 10th, .813 percent) are all ranked in the ACC's top-15 making Florida State and Pitt the only two teams with three players ranked in the ACC's top 15 for team free throw shooting.

SEMINOLES SHARE THE BASKETBALL IN VICTORY OVER CHATTANOOGA

Led by senior Trent Forrest's season-high tying seven assists, the Seminoles totaled a season-high 20 assists in their victory over Chattanooga on Wednesday. It marked the fifth time in the last two seasons the Seminoles have earned at least 20 assists in a single game with 25 assists coming on 30 baskets in the Seminoles' 80-62 win at Syracuse on February 5, 2019. The Seminoles also totaled 21 assists (on 36 baskets) in their 90-62 win over Murray State in the second round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. Florida State is 5-0 and averages 85.0 points per game when it has totaled 20 or more assists in the last two seasons and five games.

NEWCOMER EVANS LEADS THE STEALS BRIGADE AGAINST CHATTANOOGA

Junior RayQuan Evans, who totaled a game-high four steals in Florida State's victory over Chattanooga, helped the Seminoles reach double digits in steals with 10 against the Mocs. The Seminoles' 10 steals helped to earn a 16-6 advantage in fast break points, and ultimately to its 36-point victory (89-53) over Chattanooga. It marked the eighth time in the last two seasons that Florida State had earned at least 10 steals in a game with 11 coming in their 2019 NCAA Tournament victory over Murray State and 13 coming in their New Year's Day victory over Winthrop on January 1, 2019.

SEMINOLES LIMITING OPPONENTS' SHOOTING MARK TO .364 PERCENT

In what has long been Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's most favorite statistic, Florida State enters Saturday's game against Saint Francis limiting its opponents to a .364 field goal shooting mark from the field. The Seminoles have held three of their first four opponents below 40 percent shooting and held then No. 6 Florida to a .280 shooting mark on their home floor. Florida State limited the Gators to six first half field goals (FSU lead 25-21 at the intermission) and limited its in-state rival to eight second half baskets (FSU outscored the Gators by a 38-30 second half margin).

2 Two Seminoles – Devin Vassell and Trent Forrest have started each of the first four games of the season for Florida State.

3 Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has named three captains for the 2019-20 season – Trent Forrest, M.J. Walker and Harrison Prieto.

3 Florida State is undefeated, 3-0, when it outscores its opponent.

3 Led by redshirt sophomore Malik Osborne's five blocked shots, the Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Saint Francis tied for second in the ACC with a 5.5 blocked shots per game average.

4 Florida State has entered the 2019-20 season looking to play in its school-record tying fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament.

6 Florida State has outscored its opponent in six of the first eight halves of the season.

7 Florida State has won a school-record seven consecutive overtime games entering the 2019-20 season. The Seminoles won three of three overtime games during the 2017-18 season and four of four overtime games during the 2018-19 season. Florida State's overtime winning streak began with a double overtime victory over Syracuse, 101-90, on January 13, 2018.

7 Seven Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Saint Francis playing an average of 21.5 minutes per game or more through the first four games of the season.

9 Nine players on the Seminoles' 2019-20 roster have taken a redshirt season during their collegiate careers – RaiQuan Gray, Ty Hands, Travis Light, Justin Lindner, Will Miles, Dominik Olejniczak, Anthony Polite, Harrison Prieto and Wyatt Wilkes.

17 Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have 17 wins as an unranked team over a nationally ranked team since the start of the 2002-03 season – the most wins by a coach of an unranked team over nationally ranked teams in college basketball history.

20 Florida State will play 20 regular season ACC games for the first time in school and ACC history during the 2019-20 season.

20 Since defeating Clemson on January 22, 2019 in Tallahassee, the Seminoles have won 19 of their last 23 games (.826 winning percentage) with 11 of those victories coming at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

81 Senior Trent Forrest has been a part of 81 Seminole victories during his career – including a school-record 29 wins during the 2018-19 season.

VASELL ESTABLISHES CAREER HIGHS IN POINTS AND REBOUNDS IN WIN OVER CHATTANOOGA

Sophomore Devin Vassell scored his career-high of 17 points and pulled down his career-high of eight rebounds in Florida State's victory over Chattanooga. With his 17 points, he became the Seminoles' individual scoring leader with his 13.5 points per game scoring average. With his eight rebounds, he moved into second place on the team with his 5.3 rebounds per game average. His 17-point scoring performance marked the fourth consecutive game he has scored in double figures this season (14 at Pitt, 13 at Florida, 10 vs. Western Carolina and 17 vs. Chattanooga) – Vassell is the only Seminole to score in double figures in each game this season. After scoring in double figures five times as a freshman, he has nearly matched that total this season and has scored in double figures in nine career games.

Florida State freshman Patrick Williams 'Scratching The Surface' Of His Potential

Florida State's Patrick Williams isn't a typical freshman.

The 6-foot-8, 225-pound forward from Charlotte, N.C. comes to Tallahassee with enormous expectations.

Williams was ranked as a five-star prospect out of West Charlotte High by the 247Sports composite rankings in the 2019 class, and he's already been projected as a first round pick in a 2020 mock draft by ESPN.

"He has all the tools to be a very, very special player at Florida State," FSU associate head coach Stan Jones told the *Democrat*.

"He's just scratching the surface of what he's going to become. I think he's the youngest freshman we've ever had come in. He's from a great family and he's got he's got great character. I'll be shocked if he doesn't just continue to grow and grow and do some spectacular things during the course of the season."

There's usually an adjustment period for highly-ranked prospects as they transition from high school to the college level.

Being able to take plays off on the defensive end, getting the ball every time down the court, and being the vocal point for the team is something many talented high school players get used to.

When they get to the college level, those things go away for most players and it can be a tough adjustment.

But FSU's coaches and players all agree that's not the case with Williams. He's got a team-first mentality and doesn't expect anything to be given to him.

"He is very similar in humility as Jonathan Isaac was, in the fact that he doesn't think he's good enough yet, which is a great characteristic," Jones said.

"When you have that healthy fear of where you are and what you want to become, I think that escalates your growth and development. He's never come in with any premonitions of where he should be playing or how much he should be playing. He just wants to become a better player like Jonathan was.

"He lets you coach him. He responds to coaching. He accepts instructions at an extremely at a high level and can give it back to you."

Isaac wasn't the only comparison that Jones made for Williams. He also said that he's a lot like former FSU forward Chris Singleton, who was also a first-round pick by the Washington Wizards.

He compared him to Singleton because of his ability on the defensive end of the court, though he also said Williams is further along offensively than Singleton was when he arrived at FSU.

"I've put him in a category with a couple pretty good Florida State players in Chris Singleton and Jonathan Isaac and he meets all the criteria that both those guys have done while they were here," Jones said.

FSU fans got their first introduction to Williams during the Seminoles' 95-66 exhibition win over Barry University.

It took him a little time to find his rhythm, but after he threw down his first dunk of the game, he settled in nicely.

Williams finished the game with 12 points, nine rebounds, and a block in just under 18 minutes of play. All five of his baskets came on dunks and he knocked down both of his free throw attempts.

"We expect a lot from him," redshirt sophomore forward RaiQuan Gray said.

"He's a great athlete. He has a high basketball IQ. He fits right into our system. He can run, jump, and shoot. We treat him like one of the vets so he's earned a lot of respect."

His athleticism was on full display as he flew through the air on his dunks as well as his effort rebounding and blocking shots.

Williams effort on the defensive end was something else that stood out about his game, but it didn't surprise his teammates.

If a player doesn't give the same effort on the defensive end of the court as he does on the offensive end, then that player isn't going to see the court much under FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton.

Williams has worked hard to be a good defender for the Seminoles and his efforts haven't gone unnoticed.

"He does good and with his athleticism, he can you guard one through five if he had to and one through four easily," senior point guard Trent Forrest said.

"He can block shots one through five and clean up the glass like probably one of the best on the team. I'll say he's probably one of our best shot blockers that we have, even with our seven footers. So just his athleticism and his ability to kind of get around the court with quick burst like he does is going to help us a lot."

Williams does have things that he needs to work on, including being more self-assertive when he has the ball. That's something he's been working on during fall practice and he's already made progress in that regard.

FSU knows that Williams is going to make some freshman mistakes this season. That comes with the territory no matter how talented a player is.

But there's a lot of confidence that when Williams does make a mistake, he won't make it twice.

"We've always kind of prided ourselves on having those kind of guys that can cover a lot of ground quickly and can cover a lot of space up high that other people can't get to and he certainly fits the mold in all those categories," Jones said.

"He'll just grow in confidence offensively once he starts figuring his spots out a little bit more and realizing where he is okay making mistakes and where he's going to learn from his mistakes and not make that one again."
