NO. 18/20 SEMINOLES GET BACK INTO CONFERENCE ACTION AS THEY PLAY HOST TO GEORGIA TECH

Florida State, which has won 10 of its last 11 games beginning with a 63-51 victory at No. 6 Florida on November 10, 2019, begins the heart of its 20-game ACC schedule as it plays host to Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' match-up with the Yellow Jackets is their third ACC game of the season after opening their conference schedule at Pittsburgh (61-63, November 6) and opening their home conference schedule with a victory over Clemson (72-53, December 8). Each of the 15 ACC teams are playing a 20-game conference schedule for the first time in league history with the Seminoles' 18 remaining regular season games all being a conference games. Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech having won four consecutive games with wins over Clemson (72-53), North Florida (98-81), USF (66-60) and North Alabama (88-71). Florida State has won 14 consecutive home games – including a victory over Georgia Tech on February 16, 2019 – a streak that dates to a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Included in those 14 consecutive wins at the Donald L. Tucker Center are eight consecutive ACC wins (seven to conclude the 2018-19 season and one over Clemson this season). Following Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech, the Seminoles will play their first of two consecutive ACC road games at Louisville on January 4.

FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC'S BEST IN LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech with a 40-10 overall record (.800 winning percentage since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished the 2018-19 season with a 29-8 record (a school-record for wins in a season) and are 11-2 this season (.846 winning percentage). The Seminoles are one of only three teams in the ACC with at least 40 wins and a winning percentage of 80 percent or better since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Additionally, Florida State has won 70 percent of its ACC games and has a 14-6 record in conference play. The Seminoles are one of only four teams with a conference games only winning percentage of 70 percent or better.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 56-3 (.949 winning percentage in its last 59 home games) since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles earned a 15-1 record home record at home during the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles enter Tuesday's game against Georgia tech having won .949 percent of their games (56-3) and .900 percent of their ACC games (27-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) during the 2016-17, 15-1 at home during the 2018-10 season and are 7-0 at home this season (2019-20).

HAMILTON MOVES CLOSER TO SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 345 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game against Georgia Tech on Tuesday as the seventh all-time winningest coach in ACC history. He needs only four wins to move into sixth place in ACC history (passing Maryland's Lefty Driesell) and only five wins to become just the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games.

HAMILTON ONLY FOUR WINS FROM TOP FIVE ACC RANKING

With 156 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton needs only five ACC wins to become the fifth all-time winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victory over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 156 ACC wins during his career, and needs only five conference wins to move sole possession of fifth place in ACC history with 161 all-time ACC wins.

FLORIDA STATE'S JUNKYARD DOG DEFENSE

Florida State enters Tuesday's game as one of the top 10 defensive teams in the nation and leads the ACC in turnovers forced (18.5 per game) and steals (9.6 steals per game) while ranking in the ACC's top six for blocked shots (third, 5.3 blocked shots per game), field goal percentage defense (sixth, .393), and scoring defense (63.4 points allowed per game). Florida State is the only team in the ACC to rank among the ACC's top six in the turnovers forced, steals per game, blocked shots per game, field goal percentage defense and scoring defense categories.

SEMINOLES PERFECT FREE THROW SHOOTING NIGHT MOVES THEM ATOP ACC FOR TEAM FREE THROW PERCENTAGE

With its perfect performance from the free throw line (17-17, 1.000 percent) in its victory over North Alabama on Saturday in Tallahassee, Florida State moved back into the No. 1 position for team free throw shooting in the ACC statistics with a .766 team percentage. The Seminoles' perfect 17 of 17 free throw performance marked the most free throws made (17) in finishing with a perfect shooting percentage from the line in school history. It marked the fifth time in school history the Seminoles were perfect from the free throw line on at least 10 attempts in a single game.

With double figures in steals in seven of its first 13 games of the season, Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech as the ACC leader in steals with a 9.6 steals per game average. The Seminoles have earned at least 13 steals in three different games (victories over Chicago State, Tennessee and USF) and earned nine steals in their win over North Alabama on Saturday. Florida State has 111 steals in its last 10 games for an 11.1 steals per game average since its November 20 victory over Chattanooga with double figure steals in seven of those 10 games.

FLORIDA STATE VS. GEORGIA TECH – THE LAST GAME

Christ Koumadje had 10 points and 12 rebounds as the Seminoles tied a school record with their seventh straight ACC win, 69-47, over Georgia Tech at Alexander Memorial Coliseum in Atlanta on February 16, 2019. Devin Vassell came off the bench to score a team-high 11 while playing for the Seminoles in his hometown. Seven Florida State players scored between seven and 11 points. Jose Alvarado broke out of a lengthy slump with 17 points, but the Yellow Jackets made just 8 of 36 shots from inside the 3-point arc. The 7-foot-4 Koumadje took just seven shots, making five. He was even more of a factor on the defensive end as he blocked three shots as Tech made just 6 of 28 in the paint. The teams were tied at 10 early before the Jackets fell into the first of multiple shooting freezes, and Florida State stretched the lead to 31-15 on a layup by Terance Mann with 4:27 left.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.556 Freshman Patrick Williams is shooting .556 from the 3-point line (five of nine) in the last four games. He made two 3-point shots each in Florida State's victories over Clemson and North Alabama.

.708 Freshman Balsa Koprivica was a perfect three of three from the free throw line in Florida State's victory over North Alabama and enters Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech shooting .708 from the free throw line in the first 13 games of his Seminole career.

.909 Junior RayQuan Evans is shooting .909 from the free throw line (10 of 11) in the last nine games. He has missed only one free throw attempt (against USF) since November 23 against Saint Francis.

2 Junior M.J. Walker needs only two made 3-point field goals to become just the 23rd player in Seminole history to make 100 or more career 3-point shots.

2 Two Seminoles – Devin Vassell and Trent Forrest -- have started each of the first 13 games of the season for Florida State.

SEMINOLES AMIONG ACC LEADERS IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech holding its first 13 opponents to a combined .393 field goal shooting percentage. The Seminoles are one of nine teams in the ACC holding its opponents below 40 percent shooting from the field. Florida State held No. 6 Florida to a .280 shooting percentage (14 of 50) in its 63-51 win in Gainesville. The Seminoles limited No. 6 Florida and No. 17 Tennessee to a combined .304 percent shooting from the field (28 of 92) in beating the Gators and Vols away from Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME

With its overtime victory over Purdue in the championship game of the 2019 Emerald Coast Classic, the Seminoles have now won eight consecutive overtime games. During the stretch of eight consecutive overtime wins, the Seminoles have defeated seven ACC opponents, one of the SEC (LSU), one from the Big Ten (Purdue) and three ranked opponents (No. 24 LSU, No. 15 Virginia Tech and No. 16 Virginia Tech). The Seminoles have outscored their last eight overtime opponents by a 110-66 margin including its 5-2 margin over Purdue on November 30. Florida State scored all five of their overtime points from the free throw line in its win over the Boilermakers.

Florida State Basketball Center Balsa Koprivica Showing Signs Of Progress

No. 19 Florida State has been one of the best college basketball programs in the country at developing big men over the last decade.

But the Seminoles (9-2, 1-1 ACC) have taken a bit of a step back this year, which is to be expected when two new centers are introduced to the program.

Ole Miss transfer Dominik Olejniczak and true freshman Balsa Koprivica are both still learning FSU's system in their first years with the program.

For a team that relies heavily on its big men, that has created some challenges.

"We've had a problem with our big guys," FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said.

"We have spots on the floor that we have to fulfill and transition. We don't have layups we got to get to what we call that checkpoints. And our guys are running to the wrong spot. Instead of running to the, what we call the halo at the front of the rim, they're running to the short corner. Or they run to the weak side, or they're stopping at the free throw line."

Both players have improved recently, but the progress that Koprivica has made has Hamilton excited for the rest of the season.

Koprivica, a native of Belgrade, Serbia, spent most of the first part of non-conference play on the bench because he was fouling at an extremely high rate. He even had as many fouls as minutes played at one point.

But Koprivica has shown flashes of his potential over the last six games, and FSU will need him to continue to do so against South Florida (6-4) in the Orange Bowl Classic Saturday at noon at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla.

"I told our staff that I'm seeing something develop there," Hamilton said.

"He's responding to coaching. We've been challenging him. We've been holding them accountable been pushing. And he's eager to learn he's a sponge."

Koprivica, 7-foot-1, 260 pounds, has played the eighth most minutes per game on FSU's roster, but he's sixth in points scored. He's averaging 6.2 points and 2.6 rebounds in 12.8 minutes per game. He's shooting 81.8% from the floor this season (27-33).

He had a career-high 15 points against North Florida Tuesday with three rebounds and a block.

The other seven players in front of him in minutes played are all averaging more than 20 minutes per game. As his time on the court improves, so will his grasping of the system that FSU runs. When that happens, FSU's coaches and players are excited for what his future holds.

"It's amazing," Olejniczak said.

"I mean, where he was when he got here as far as where he is right now it's like having a really, really big strides and he's got so much more potential and his ceiling is unbelievably high. So, I'm just looking forward to seeing where this season takes him."

Crow Tribal Member Making His Mark As A Seminole

Crow tribal member Rayquan Evans, member of the Greasy Mouth clan, and son of Lavern Old Elk and Israel Evans, is making his mark on the Florida State University basketball program.

He is a 2017 graduate of Skyview High School, in Billings Montana. Evans is a state AA champion his sophomore and junior years and a third place trophy winner earned all-state honors, as named by USA Today. He earned Class AA All State first team and eastern class AA all-conference first team honors as a senior.

From there he graduated from North Idaho College in 2019 with an associate's degree social science and he recognized as the Northwest Athletic Conference Male Basketball Athlete of the Year in 2019

He was also named to the All-East Region Defensive Team and as the East Region MVP in 2019 He led the Cardinals to a two-year combined record of 56-10 and they finished with a combined 27-5 overall record in NWAC play, including a perfect 16-0 record during the 2018-19 season.

Evans averaged 18.2 points, 7.4 rebounds and 4.9 assists in leading North Idaho to its second consecutive Northwest Athletic Conference Championship. He shot .552 percent from the field and .781 percent from the free throw line in his second season and scored in double figures in each of his games as a sophomore with his season-high of 32 points, six assists and two steals coming in NIC's victory over Walla Walla in the NWAC Tournament championship game as a senior.

Evans helped lead North Idaho to the 2019 NWAC Championship, where he averaged 23.3 points in three tournament games including a double-double of 18 points and 15 rebounds in the Cardinals' semifinal round victory over Everett Community College.

Evans lived in Billings as a youth, but then his family moved to Minneapolis. He came back to the state for high school, a sport he hopes to continue after college, he said.

"My biggest challenge was trying to keep head focused on main goal," Evans said of his time in school at North Idaho College. "Junior college changed my life, because I learned a lot about myself and how I have to stay focused to get where I want to go."

He did say being alone at first was the toughest thing he had to overcome.

"It's ok to leave (home). I've had to leave my family a lot of times, and it was hard, and still is, but I know they'll always be there and I have their support," he said.

Evans is continuing his social science track at FSU and is weighing options about what type of career he is aiming for, he said.

"I do want to continue to play after college," he said.

Evans, who spent most of his childhood in the city, said it does feel weird being back in a city, but the Florida humidity is what is really surprising.

"Otherwise, it's just another big city," he said.

Evans has traveled a lot for the sport he loves and encourages kids from small towns to do the same.

“Don’t be scared to leave, being on your own can be scary, but being away, for me, is one of the best things that could happen to me. It helps you appreciate the support and home more,” he said.

Evans spends a lot of his time in practice, class or working out for the team so organization is important to him. He suggests learning a routine and sticking with it manage time.

“I’m really looking forward to getting RayQuan into our rotation. He simply needs playing time to gain his confidence back after missing valuable time when he was injured,” said FSU Seminoles Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. “He’s a very smart player who thinks the game well and has a high basketball IQ. He’s a very instinctive player who is a valuable member of our team; he’s a player who will contribute to the success of our team this year.”

Evans, said he bring a positive attitude to the team and is pretty good at playing his role, and bringing his energy to the environment during a game.

“This is something I’ve dreamed about my whole life, he said. “Always work hard and put everything you have into something you love, don’t be afraid of losing people along the way. If you put your heart into something and not worry about what people say or think, the sky’s the limit”.
