NO. 19 SEMINOLES FACE USF IN METRO BY T-MOBILE ORANGE BOWL CLASSIC

Florida State, which has won two consecutive and nine of its last 10 games, travels to play USF in the Metro by T-Mobile Orange Bowl Classic on Saturday, December 21, 2019 at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla. The Seminoles will face USF for the first time since December 20, 2014 in a game also played in the Orange Bowl Classic. Florida State's game against the Bulls marks the eighth consecutive season it will play in the Orange Bowl Classic. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against the Bulls with two consecutive victories including a 98-81 win over North Florida on Tuesday night in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 38-10 (.792 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season entering Saturday's game against USF. The Seminoles won a school-record 29 games with a 29-8 record (.784 winning percentage) and an NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance in 2019 and are 9-2 (.818 winning percentage) in the first 11 games of the 2019-20 season.

SEMINOLES TO HONOR NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE AGAINST USF

The Florida State men's basketball team will wear turquoise Nike N7 uniforms against USF in Saturday's game to raise awareness for bringing sport to Native American and Aboriginal youth. It marks the 14th time (and second time this season) the Seminoles will wear the special uniforms. The Seminoles wore the special uniforms in their 80-65 win over Saint Francis in Tallahassee on November 23, 2019. This season (2019-20) marks the seventh consecutive season the Seminoles will wear the turquoise uniforms. Florida State makes a distinct departure from its traditional school colors to don turquoise Nike N7 uniforms to stand for the importance of bringing sport and physical activity to Native American and Aboriginal youth. "The Seminole Tribe of Florida approached us about this program, and we are honored and excited to wear these unique uniforms," said head coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles first wore the turquoise uniforms in their 89-61 win over UT-Martin in Tallahassee on November 17, 2013.

HAMILTON MOVES CLOSER TO SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 343 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game against Clemson on Sunday as the seventh all-time winningest coach in ACC history. He needs only six wins to move into sixth place in ACC history (passing Maryland's Lefty Driesell) and only seven wins to become just the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games.

FLORIDA STATE NATIONALLY IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

The Seminoles are one of seven teams in the nation (Florida State, Duke, Gonzaga, Kentucky, Michigan, Purdue and Texas Tech) who have advanced at least as far as the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in both of the last two seasons. The Seminoles advanced to the Elite Eight in 2018 and to the Sweet 16 in 2019.

SEMINOLES BUILDING A WINNING CLUTURE UNDER LEONARD HAMILTON

With nine wins in their first 11 games of the 2019-20 season and 16 wins in their final 19 games of the 2018-19 season, the Seminoles have won 25 of their last 30 games (.833 winning percentage) since defeating Clemson, 77-68, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on January 22, 2019. Florida State has defeated four nationally ranked teams during that incredible stretch of victories with their losses coming at then No. 8 North Carolina, then No. 5 Duke in the Championship game of the 2019 ACC Tournament, then No. 4 Gonzaga in the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament, at Pitt in the 2019-20 season opener and at Indiana on December 3, 2018 in the ACC /Big Ten Challenge.

FLORIDA STATE ON NEUTRAL COURTS IN THE LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against USF with a 16-5 record (.762 winning percentage) in game played on a neutral site court in the last three seasons. Included in those 16 wins is one win in the Orange Bowl Classic (against Saint Louis on 2018), three wins during the 2018 NCAA Tournament (against Missouri and Xavier in Nashville and Gonzaga in Los Angeles) and two wins during the 2019 NCAA Tournament (against Vermont and Murray State in Hartford, Conn.)

FLORIDA STATE VS. USF – CONNECTIONS

Florida State makes its eighth consecutive appearance in the Orange Bowl Classic (and 11th overall appearance) as it plays USF on December 21, 2019 at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla. The Seminoles lead the all-time series against the Bulls by a 21-12 margin with the last game between the two teams coming as the first since a 75-62 win on December 20, 2014 in the Orange Bowl Classic. South Florida is coached by Brian Gregory – who is in his third season as the Bulls' head coach. He was the head coach at Georgia Tech from 2012-2016 – a five-year period when the Seminoles earned a 4-1 record against the Yellow Jackets. Gregory also coached against Florida State in the inaugural ACC / Big Ten Challenge while an assistant coach at Northwestern. The Seminoles defeated the Wildcats, 60-46, in that game to capture the first Commissioners Cup for the ACC. Tom Herrion, a special assistant coach at USF, has coached against Florida State at three of his nine coaching stops: Virginia (1999-02, 5-2 against Florida State), Pittsburgh (2008-10, 0-1 against Florida State) and Georgia Tech (2015-16, 1-1 against Florida State). Bulls' Assistant Coach Scott Wagers is 0-1 in his coaching career against Florida State. He coached for Jacksonville against Florida State on November 17, 2015 – a 98-79 Seminole win at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Billy Hubly, the director of player development for the Bulls, spent three seasons at Georgia Tech (2014-16) – a span of three years when the Seminoles were 2-1 against the Yellow Jackets.

FLORIDA STATE'S HISTORY IN THE ORANGE BOWL CLASSIC

No. 21 Florida State owns an 8-2 record in 10 previous Orange Bowl Classic appearances and enters the 2019 Classic having won eight of their last nine games with victories over Nebraska (2005), Western Kentucky (2008), Tulsa (2012), UMass (2013), USF (2014), Florida Atlantic (2016), Manhattan (2017) and Saint Louis (2019).

FLORIDA STATE VS. USF -- THE LAST GAME

Florida State blocked a school record-tying 15 blocked shots, and beat South Florida 75-62 in the Orange Bowl Classic on December 20, 2014 at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla. Jarquez Smith blocked a career-high six shots and scored eight consecutive points during a pivotal stretch. Devon Bookert had a career-high 22 points on 12 shots for Florida State and was voted the game's Most Valuable Player. Smith added 16 points, and Kiel Turpin had 13, both in reserve roles. Smith played 24 minutes and Turpin 20. Corey Allen Jr. scored a career-high 31 points to lead the Bulls. He shot 12 for 21, while his teammates went 12 for 43 (28 percent). Chris Perry, a 6-8 forward averaging 13.3 points per game, had five shots blocked. He went 1 for 13 and scored three points. The Bulls made 47 percent of their shots that were not blocked by the Seminoles. Florida State shot 59 percent in the second half and 49 percent for the game.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.500 Freshman Patrick Williams is shooting .500 (three of six) from the 3-point line and averaging 10 points scored per game in the last two games.

.818 Freshman Balsa Koprivica enters Saturday's game against USF shooting a worldly .818 from the field. He has made each of his last four attempts from the field and 11 of his last 13 field goal attempts (.846 percent) in the last five games.

1 Florida State's Trent Forrest is the only player in the ACC to rank in the top 10 of the current ACC career statistics for career steals (first, 181), assists (second, 310), rebounds (fifth, 464) and points scored (seventh, 905).

1 Redshirt sophomore Malik Osborne leads the Seminoles in rebounds with 60 and a 5.5 rebounds per game average. He has earned five or more rebounds in seven of the Seminoles' first 11 games of the season.

2 Florida State has defeated both nationally ranked teams it has played so far this season – No. 6 Florida (63-51, November 10 at Gainesville, Fla.) and No. 17 Tennessee (60-57, November 29 at Niceville, Fla.)

2 Two Seminoles – Devin Vassell and Trent Forrest -- have started each of the first 11 games of the season for Florida State.

3 Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has named three captains for the 2019-20 season – Trent Forrest, M.J. Walker and Harrison Prieto.

3 Dominik Olejniczak is just the third Graduate transfer to play at Florida State. He joins guards Jeff Peterson (2012) and David Nichols (2019). Both Peterson and Nichols helped lead their teams to the NCAA Tournament during their only seasons in Tallahassee.

4 Florida State enters the 2019-20 season looking to play in its school-record tying fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament.

4 Florida State is the fourth winningest program in the ACC since the start of the 2005-06 season ranking behind only Duke, North Carolina and Virginia in the composite ACC standings over the last 15 years.

6 Junior M.J. Walker enters Saturday's game against USF having made six consecutive free throws and shooting .815 from the free throw line for the season.

6 Florida State enters Saturday's game having won six consecutive games against teams from the state of Florida.

7 Junior RayQuan Evens has made seven consecutive free throws entering Saturday's game against USF. He has made each of his free throw attempts since the second half of the Seminoles' victory over Chattanooga on November 20.

SEMINOLES SHOOT WELL FROM THE FIELD IN VICTORY OVER NORTH FLORIDA

Florida State, which is ranked fourth in the ACC with a team field goal shooting percentage of .468, shot .569 from the field in its win over North Florida on Tuesday night in Tallahassee. It marked the third time this season the Seminoles had shot better than .520 from the field in a single game. The Seminoles' top three field goal shooting days have produced their top three scoring games with 113 points coming in their win over Chicago State (113-56, November 25), 98 coming in their win over North Florida (98-81, December 17) and 89 points coming against Chattanooga (89-53, November 20). When the Seminoles shoot over 50 percent from the field this season, they average 100 points scored per game (300 total points in three games).

Led by redshirt sophomore RaiQuan Gray's career-high five assists in Florida State's victory over North Florida on Tuesday night in Tallahassee, the Seminoles earned 20 assists on 41 baskets – an assist to basket ratio of nearly 50 percent (.488 percent). It marked the third time this season the Seminoles had earned 20 assists in a game. Not coincidentally, the three times the Seminoles totaled 20 or more assists in a game, they also shot their highest shooting percentages and scored their three highest point totals of the season.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC DEFENSIVE STATISTICS

Head Coach Leonard Hamilton refers to his defense as a Junkyard Dog type of defense. Florida State is ranked in the top five in the ACC in four of the most important defensive categories calculated by the ACC. The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC ranked in the conference's top five for steals (second), scoring defense (fourth), field goal percentage defense (fifth) and blocked shots (fifth). Hamilton has long considered the field goal percentage defense category as his most favorite of any statistic recognized nationally. His teams (twice at Florida State in 2010 and 2011 and once at Miami) have led the nation in the defensive field goal percentage statistic during his coaching career.

FLORIDA STATE FOURTH IN THE ACC IN SCORING OFFENSE

Florida State enters Saturday's game against USF averaging 76.5 points scored per game and have scored 80 points or more in four of its first 11 games. The Seminoles are ranked fourth in the ACC in scoring offense and are one of only five teams in the ACC that averages more 76 or more points scored per game. Florida State scored its season-high of 113 points in its 113-56 victory over Chicago in the second round of the Emerald Coast Classic in Tallahassee on November 25.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

Florida State made six 3-point shots in its victory over North Florida on Tuesday night and enters Saturday's game against USF averaging 7.1 3-point field goals made per game. The Seminoles made their season-high of 15 3-point field goals in their win over Clemson (15-32, December 8) and have reached in double figures in 3-point shots three times this season.

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY FROM LONG RANGE

...The Seminoles are shooting .412 from the 3-point line in the last two games (21 of 51);

FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME

With its overtime victory over Purdue in the championship game of the 2019 Emerald Coast Classic, the Seminoles have now won eight consecutive overtime games. During the stretch of eight consecutive overtime wins, the Seminoles have defeated seven ACC opponents, one of the SEC (LSU), one from the Big Ten (Purdue) and three ranked opponents (No. 24 LSU, No. 15 Virginia Tech and No. 16 Virginia Tech). The Seminoles have outscored their last eight overtime opponents by a 110-66 margin including its 5-2 margin over Purdue on November 30. Florida State scored all five of their overtime points from the free throw line in its win over the Boilermakers.

He also started the first three games of the 2019-20 season (at Pitt, at Florida and against Western Carolina) and the last three games of the 2018-19 season – all in the NCAA Tournament (in wins over Vermont, Murray State and against Gonzaga);

Forrest is one of four point guards from the Atlantic Coast Conference on the list of 20 which will be narrowed down to five players in March as finalists for the award. The award will be presented to the top point guard on April 10, 2020 at the College Basketball Awards Show in Los Angeles.

What's In a Seminoles' Name**

RayQuan Evans – “My full name is RayQuan Ethan Evans. My dad took the name of one of the singers, Raekwon, from the 1990's band Wu Tang Clan, and put his own spin on the spelling for my first name. Ethan, from the Bible, came from my mom. The name Ethan means strong, firm and long-lived.”

RaiQuan Gray – “My full name is RaiQuan Kelvan Gray. I wasn't named after anyone specifically. My name means wisdom and power. All the children in my family have an R to begin their names – my sister, Raven and my brother, Rasheed. My middle name is similar to my dad's middle name which is Kelvin.”

Anthony Polite – “My full name is Anthony Michael Lewis Polite. Anthony comes from Saint Antonio (also known as Anthony of Lisbon) whose birthday was June 13, 1231. My grandmother was also born on June 13 and my mother really loved the name Anthony. My middle name, Michael, is from my dad and Lewis is after my mother's grandfather – my great-grandfather.”

Trent Forrest – “My full name is Landon Trent Forrest. I was named after the actor Michael Landon because my family really enjoyed him as an actor. Trent is not a family name – it was the chosen middle name for me by my parents and one that I preferred as a child. My oldest brother is named Lester Tremaine Forest (LTF) and my parents wanted to keep the same initials for me.”

Balsa Koprivica – “My name comes from the ancient Serbian King Balšić and his family. The Balšićs were a noble family that ruled from 1362 to 1421, during and after the fall of the Serbian Empire. Balsa also means strong and well built.”

Malik Osborne – “My full name is Malik James Osborne. Malik comes from a close friend of my father and James from my father.”

M.J Walker – “My full name is James Michael Walker, Jr. I am named after my father who is James Michael Walker, Sr.”

Devin Vassell – “My full name is Devin Anthony Vassell. I got my first name from my grandmother. My parents were going to name me Anthony, but my grandmother preferred Devin, so that's what my family went with.”

Harrison Prieto – “My full name is Harrison Hansbrough Prieto. I'm named after my great-grandfather, Peter Harrison Hansbrough, but my mom liked the named Harrison more than she did Peter, so she chose to name me Harrison.”

Devin Vassell was the only other Seminole scoring in double figures with 13 points. That included the final two free throws in overtime after getting fouled when he grabbed a missed Purdue shot. Matt Haarms led the Boilermakers with 16 points followed by Jahaad Proctor with 12 and Eric Hunter Jr. with 10. It was a back-and-forth game with 10 lead changes and 11 ties. Florida State never led by more than four points while the Boilermakers briefly went ahead by seven early in the second half after trailing 27-24 at the intermission.

FSU Basketball Star Trent Forrest Set To Graduate After 3 ½ Years

Trent Forrest has scored 905 points in his Florida State career. He has pulled down 464 rebounds, dished out 370 assists, collected 181 steals and been a part of 86 wins, three NCAA Tournaments, two Sweet 16s and one Elite Eight.

And yet the number his family might be most proud of is 3.5.

That's the number of years it's taken the Chipley, Fla., native to earn his bachelor's degree in sports management from Florida State.

The Seminoles' senior guard will walk across the Tucker Center stage and accept his diploma on Friday night. It's the same building where he has produced so many memorable moments since arriving in Tallahassee in 2016.

The beautiful passes and breathtaking drives to the basket. The suffocating defense and dominating victories.

Yet this moment might go down as the most special of them all for his parents, Barbara Lee and Lester Forrest.

"(They're) very proud," Trent Forrest said. "Sometimes more proud of that than anything I do on the court. Because they stress to me that that's one thing that somebody will never be able to take from you is your education. So for my family, they're very proud of me graduating and all the academic awards I've received."

Forrest, who has been on the All-ACC Academic Honor roll each of the last three years, was able to graduate ahead of schedule at FSU because he took college-level courses during his time at Chipley High School, where he graduated with a 4.3 GPA.

Now, after graduating with a degree in sports management, he will enroll in the Florida State master's program in the same field, saying he wants to one day be a coach or NBA general manager.

When Forrest arrived in Tallahassee, he had no way of knowing how his career would pan out. He was hoping, of course, to play in a few NCAA Tournaments. He was likely hoping to maybe even leave school early to pursue his NBA dreams.

Forrest, after all, did score over 3,000 points in high school and was considered one of the best point guards in the nation. So it wasn't outrageous for him to hope -- or even expect -- to leave college before his eligibility was up. Instead, he's a senior leader trying to earn a fourth straight NCAA Tournament berth before pursuing his professional career.

But he always knew that no matter what happened on the hardwood, he'd be getting his degree from Florida State University. This has been the plan all along. And it was one of the main reasons he signed with Leonard Hamilton and the Seminoles in the first place.

"That's kind of what won my parents over," Forrest said. "His graduation rate is ridiculously high. It definitely won them over. It was definitely a no-brainer for them. Even if I didn't stay all four years, they knew I'd get my degree." Well, he's stayed all four years.

He just didn't need them all to graduate.

So when the Seminoles take the court again on Tuesday night, he won't be Florida State senior guard Trent Forrest anymore.

He'll be Florida State graduate Trent Forrest.

'I Got To Wear My Kicks': RaiQuan Gray And The Seminoles Size Up Their Shoe Collections

Florida State redshirt sophomore forward RaiQuan Gray believes he's the biggest sneakerhead on the team. The 6-foot-8, 260-pounder carries himself with the same confidence while stating that's a fact as he does when he's pushing the ball up the court or launching a 3-pointer.

That's no small claim for a basketball roster that includes 17 players. Most of them have plenty of basketball and casual shoes at their disposal between their time with the team and their own personal accumulation of kicks over the years.

In Gray's mind, junior forward M.J. Walker is a close second. He's versatile. He has classics like Nike's Air Force 1s and Retro Air Jordans, but also has more modern brands and models.

Freshman forward Patrick Williams is a rising newcomer. Like Walker, he boasts a strong collection of Jordans, but he doesn't have enough experience yet.

Redshirt sophomore guard Anthony Polite, who's from Lugano, Switzerland, is more into European designer shoes. His favorite designer is Giuseppe Zanotti, who's Italian. He agreed that Gray has a strong sneaker game, but disagreed with the ranking.

"He might be one of the top guys... With me," Polite said while standing near the door in the press conference room at the Civic Center after his team's 79-74 win over Western Carolina. "I'd put me at No. 1; him at No. 2."

Senior guard Trent Forrest has been in Tallahassee longer than anyone else on the squad. Unsurprisingly, he has a ton of shoes, but Gray said he doesn't really wear them very often. Forrest rejected that point and clarified that while he mostly wears comfortable shoes because he's often just chilling when he's not playing basketball, he has some heat in his closet. Not only that, but he emphatically declined to put Gray at No. 1.

"No chance, not even close," Forrest said. "I would put myself, definitely."

Forrest said his closet has "flavors," which is code for versatile. If he's feeling casual, he'll just throw on some Vans. If he's walking around campus, you might catch him in some Jordan 11s (his favorite is a tie between the "Cool Grey" and "Concord" colorways). If he's going out, he might put on some an Off-White collaboration.

When Forrest stepped off the team bus to play in the home opener against Western Carolina on Nov. 15, he was wearing some Adidas Yeezys. To Forrest, that diversity is what sets him apart.

"He got a lot of variety, too, though," Forrest says of Gray. "He got a lot of (Jordan) 1s and different ones, too. I'm first, but he's definitely second, though, for sure."

The reason why Gray thinks his collection takes first place is that it has the best mix of quality, versatility and exclusivity. He's not just some hoarder who collects the shoes to post pictures on social media and brag about them to his friends but never actually wears them, either. He's emphatic in that he's all in on the culture.

"Nah, I wear mine," Gray says while sitting courtside following a public Florida State scrimmage in October. "I wear my kicks. I can't do that. I got to wear my kicks."

"I got to."

Gray was relatively late to the sneaker game. He didn't really start getting into shoes until his senior year of high school. Before then, he mostly wore running and training shoes or whatever kicks came with the time he spent playing on the Under Armour basketball circuit.

Sure, he got some Jordan Melos that he liked back in middle school, but his collection was admittedly pretty weak. When his sister bought him a few more pairs of J's while he was a senior in high school approaching graduation, however, he got hooked.

Gray estimates that he owns 20-25 pairs of Jordans alone. On top of that, he has several shoes from several other brands and around 25 pairs of basketball shoes.

"I got like 22 at home for sure... Nah, like 23-24 at home for sure," Gray says. "Then basketball, I would say here (at the Civic Center) I got like five and then in our practice facility probably like 15-16."

Without a doubt, Jordan is Gray's favorite brand. He enjoys the Jordan 1s, 4s and 11s. His favorite colorway is either the Jordan 11 "Bred" or Jordan 11 "Concord," but the 1s are his top silhouette.

"Any 1," Gray says. "Any Jordan 1, I'll wear. If the color looks good to me, I'll wear it. I like 1s. I can have a whole closet of 1s and I'll be fine. So, the 1s, any color."

Gray will often opt for something more comfortable when going to class or if he's just relaxing. Besides his Jordans, he goes to the Nike Air Monarchs the most.

"It depends," Gray says. "If it's a chill day, I'll probably throw on some trainers. I got the Air Monarchs, I like those. Those feel good. Then any 'J,' I'll just throw 'em on. I just put 'em on and go to class. That's about it."

The most treasured basketball shoe that Gray owns is the LeBron 16 "I'm King." The feel is ideal for someone of his size, which isn't surprising given they're designed for the 6-foot-8, 250-pound LeBron James, and he likes the black and gold colorway. His favorite casual shoe is the Jordan 1 "Turbo Green."

Gray stores his shoes at home along the bottom of his closet. The shoes that he only pulls out for special occasions are kept in their boxes and stacked on top of each other in two rows. The day-to-day shoes are kept in a large bin. His stockpiles at the Civic Center and Basketball Training Center weren't nearly as organized, so Florida State assistant Stan Jones made him give some of the shoes away.

"I just gave like seven pairs away," Gray says. "Coach Jones made me give 'em away. I had too many shoes in my locker at the top and he was like, 'I cleaned it out.'"

Gray couldn't rely on his sister to buy his shoes forever. The first pair of shoes that he bought with his own money were the Jordan 1 "Top 3" during his senior year of high school.

Eventually, Gray sold them, but he wound up buying them for a second time.

"Ohh," Gray says as he leans back in his chair and rests his hands on the top of his head when asked about the most expensive pair of shoes he's ever purchased. "The most money? Probably like \$400. I had two pair of Top 3 1s. The ones in high school were \$350, but I ended up selling 'em and I wanted 'em back, so I bought 'em for like \$400." Were they really worth the extra \$50?

"Yeah," Gray says. "I wanted 'em back."

Even Forrest — who's probably the player with the best argument to contend with Gray — hasn't gone past \$250. He spent that on a pair of Jordan 12 "Flu Game" shoes off of Flight Club, which is an authenticated store that resells sneakers.

Part of the price gap is shoe size. Forrest wears a 14, while Gray wears a size 16. That sounds subtle, but it makes a huge difference when it comes to finding rare shoes at a reasonable price on the resale market.

“It is (tough on him),” Forrest says. “But, I don’t know, somehow he be getting them.”

Finding the shoes alone in his size exceedingly difficult. Getting them at a reasonable price is almost impossible. He almost has to get a pair he wants as soon as they come out if he wants to avoid breaking the bank.

“Yeah, yeah, yeah,” Gray says, his disappointment with his conundrum apparent. “It’s a lot. It’s hard to find the exclusive shoes. I’ll just hit somebody up and they’ll try to hold a pair for me.”

Gray typically buys a new pair of shoes every month. At least every other month. Some Jordans can be found for around \$100, but the nicer pairs that Gray enjoys often exceed \$200, \$300 or even \$400 in retail price.

“Oh, I’m definitely trying to get the UNDEFEATED x Nike Kobe 4 Protros, the “Black Mamba” ones that just came out,” Gray says. “I want to play in those this year. Then Jordans, some “Shattered Backboards” (1s) or, I don’t know what they’re called, the orange and green (SoleFly Art Basel Sail) 1s. Either one of those.”

Gray is superstitious about his shoes when it comes to basketball. If he plays well in a pair of shoes one game, he’ll keep wearing it. As soon as he plays bad, though, he’ll switch it out for another.

Last season, he said his best shoe was a pair of the Nike Kobe “A.D.” He customized them using the Nike I.D. service. They were all gray with gold chrome on the heel and the Nike check on the side. He wore them for the first time in the Seminoles’ 80-75 overtime win over Louisville on Feb 9. He played in them for the rest of the season.

To make sure he’s prepared if something feels off, Gray brings at least three shoes with him to every game.

“I’ll shoot in a pair for home games and then switch before (the game),” Gray says. “Last year, I played in a shoe, then before that in the shootaround, I wore a shoe and then I shot before the game in a shoe. It depends on how I’m feeling in them, really.”

The equipment managers always pack shoes whenever FSU goes on the road, but Gray also brings a backpack that has two more pairs of shoes in it.

“Because I don’t want to wear the team shoe to the gym and then getting back on the plane, I do that,” Gray explains. “Then they bring a shoe bag for our team and I’ll steal somebody’s spot and just bring like three pair of basketball shoes. It depends on how I’m feeling.”

Even during the scrimmage, Gray couldn’t be caught lacking when it came to his sneaker game. He wore a pair of the Nike KD 11 “Still KD”. They’re black and gray with a light blue, translucent outsole. His spot as the biggest sneakerhead on the team is solid — for now — but it’s still close enough to spark debates within the team.

“Me and M.J.,” Gray says when asked of the primary competitors. “Actually, Pat, too. He tries to count my shoes and stuff like that. I feel like they’re trying to say that I got the most shoes on the team, but I don’t believe it. I think those two people are definitely up there with me.”

For now, no one on the team quite matches Gray. Well, almost. There’s a student manager for the team who has so many shoes that he has to split them between his apartment in Tallahassee and his home in Georgia. Gray mentions him in passing, initially, but he realizes that even *he* can’t compete as he describes the collection.

“That’s who you should be talking to,” Gray jokes as he walks away and heads in the direction of the locker room.

Gray has some catching up to do.
