### NO. 18/20 SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT LOUISVILLE IN A BATTLE OF NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

Florida State, which has won five consecutive and 11 of its last 12 games, travels to No. 7/8 Louisville to face the Cardinals on Saturday, January 4, 2020 at the KFC YUM! Center. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Louisville positioned in the national rankings for the fifth consecutive week at No. 18 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 20 in the Coaches Poll. Florida State has been included in five of the nine polls this season and has been ranked in the AP Poll in 22 of the last 27 weeks since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State has won two consecutive regular season games against Louisville – during the 2018-19 season at home (February 9, 2019, 80-75 in overtime) and during the 2017-18 season on the road (February 3, 2018, 80-76). Following Saturday's game at Louisville, the Seminoles will play at Wake Forest on Wednesday, January 8, 2020 at 7:30 p.m.

### FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 41-10 overall (.804 winning percentage) and 15-6 in ACC play (.714 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season.

### FLORIDA STATE ENTERS NEW CALENDAR YEAR WITH 12-2 RECORD

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Louisville (it's first game in 2020) with a 12-2 record and a .857 winning percentage). It marks fourth consecutive season the Seminoles have two or fewer losses heading into the new year. The Seminoles were 14-1 heading into January 2017; 11-2 heading into January of 2018 and 13-1 after a January 1 victory over Winthrop in January of 2019.

### HAMILTON WITH 71 WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game against No. 7/8 Louisville looking for his 72<sup>nd</sup> career win over a nationally ranked team. He earned two wins over ranked teams at Oklahoma State, 17 at Miami and 52 at Florida State. He has earned four wins over No. 1 ranked teams: against No. 1 Oklahoma (February 4, 1989 while at Oklahoma State); against No. 1 Duke (March 1, 2006 while at Florida State); against No. 1 North Carolina (March 4, 2009 while at Florida State) and against No. 1 Duke (January 12, 2011 while at Florida State). More than 13 percent of Hamilton's total of 544 wins have come against nationally ranked teams (71 of 544, .1305 percent).

### FLORIDA STATE WITH EIGHT VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State enters its game against No. 6/6 Louisville with two victories over nationally ranked teams this season and six wins over nationally ranked opponents during the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season and have defeated a school-record 52 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton.

### HAMILTON MOVES CLOSER TO SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 346 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18<sup>th</sup>-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game against Louisville on Saturday as the seventh all-time winningest coach in ACC history. He needs only three wins to move into sixth place in ACC history (passing Maryland's Lefty Driesell) and only four wins to become just the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games.

#### HAMILTON ONLY FOUR WINS FROM TOP FIVE ACC RANKING

With 157 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton needs only four ACC wins to become the fifth all-time winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019 and Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 157 ACC wins during his career, and needs only four conference wins to move sole possession of fifth place in ACC history with 161 all-time ACC wins.

#### DURING FLORIDA STATE'S CURRENT FIVE GAME WINNING STREAK...

...The Seminoles are shooting .797 from the free throw line (55 of 69) and are averaging 11 free throws made per game;  
 ...The Seminoles have earned 50 steals and are averaging 10.0 steals per game. Sophomore Devin Vassell and redshirt sophomore RaiQuan Gray have earned nine steals each during the Seminoles' five game winning streak;  
 ...The Seminoles have blocked 38 shots and are averaging 7.6 blocked shots per game. Sophomore Devin Vassell leads the Seminoles with 10 blocked shots during the streak;  
 ...The Seminoles have forced 96 turnovers – an average of 19.2 turnovers per game by their opponents. In ACC play, the Seminoles forced Clemson into 18 turnovers and Georgia Tech into 20 turnovers;  
 ...The Seminoles have outscored their five opponents by 71 points – an average of 14.2 points per game. The Seminoles have won two ACC games by 19 points (72-53 against Clemson) and 12 points (70-58 against Georgia Tech).

#### SEMINOLES LEAD THE ACC IN FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Florida State, which has made 29 of its last 32 free throw attempts in its last three games (.906 percent) enters Saturday's game at Louisville as the ACC leaders from the free throws line with a .763 team shooting percentage.

#### SEMINOLES PERFECT FREE THROW SHOOTING NIGHT MOVES THEM ATOP ACC FOR TEAM FREE THROW PERCENTAGE

With its perfect performance from the free throw line (17-17, 1.000 percent) in its victory over North Alabama on December 28 in Tallahassee, Florida State moved back into the No. 1 position for team free throw shooting in the ACC statistics with a .763 team percentage. The Seminoles' perfect 17 of 17 free throw performance marked the most free throws made (17) in finishing with a perfect shooting percentage from the line in school history. It marked the fifth time in school history the Seminoles were perfect from the free throw line on at least 10 attempts in a single game.

#### FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN STEALS

Florida State enters its game against Louisville on Saturday as the ACC leaders in steals with a 9.7 steals per game average. The Seminoles have earned double figure steals in eight of their 14 games with its season high of 16 steals coming in their victory over Purdue (63-60 in overtime) in the championship game of the Emerald Coast Classic. The Seminoles earned 11 steals in Tuesday's victory over Georgia Tech and are averaging 7.0 steals per game (21 total steals) in their first three ACC games of the season.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. LOUISVILLE -- THE LAST GAME**

Mfiondu Kabengele scored 22 points and Terance Mann added 20 as No. 22 Florida State erased a 10-point second-half deficit to force overtime, where the Seminoles made 11 of 12 free-throw attempts to knock off No. 16 Louisville 80-75 on February 9, 2019 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Kabengele and Mann were critical as Florida State came back. Mann, a senior leader, connected on 4 of 6 shots from the floor and 9 of 11 free-throw attempts. Kabengele shot 7 of 12 from the floor and pulled down seven rebounds. Christen Cunningham scored 20 points, including 13 in the first half, for Louisville. Ryan McMahon made three 3-pointers in a span of 90 seconds in the second half as the Cardinals pulled ahead 52-42 but the Seminoles gradually chipped away at the deficit, tying the game on Trent Forrest's layup with 34 seconds left. The Cardinals' Jordan Nwora missed a 3-pointer with six seconds left in regulation. Florida State's Phil Cofer pulled down the rebound, ran down the court but missed a desperation 25-footer at the buzzer. Louisville's Dwayne Sutton also scored 14 points, knocking down four 3-pointers. The Cardinals committed 23 turnovers.

**FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME**

With its overtime victory over Purdue in the championship game of the 2019 Emerald Coast Classic, the Seminoles have now won eight consecutive overtime games. **Trent Forrest** – “My full name is Landon Trent Forrest. I was named after the actor Michael Landon because my family really enjoyed him as an actor. Trent is not a family name – it was the chosen middle name for me by my parents and one that I preferred as a child. My oldest brother is named Lester Tremaine Forest (LTF) and my parents wanted to keep the same initials for me.”

**Balsa Koprivica** – “My name comes from the ancient Serbian King Balšić and his family. The Balšićs were a noble family that ruled from 1362 to 1421, during and after the fall of the Serbian Empire. Balsa also means strong and well built.”

**Malik Osborne** – “My full name is Malik James Osborne. Malik comes from a close friend of my father and James from my father.”

**M.J Walker** – “My full name is James Michael Walker, Jr. I am named after my father who is James Michael Walker, Sr.”

## Florida State Depth Developing As Seminoles Prepare To Enter ACC Play

As the lone four-year senior on this year's Florida State men's basketball team, Trent Forrest knows what it takes to win at the highest level.

He's been a part of a level of success in his time with the Seminoles unlike any in recent program history. He also knew the challenge that the Seminoles faced this season having six new players on the roster as they set out to replace six major pieces off last year's team.

There was a time before the season when Forrest was unsure if the new Seminoles would be up to the task that lies ahead against a tough ACC schedule.

"Throughout summer, me and some of the coaches, I would meet with them and I would just be like, 'I don't know if these guys are going to be ready,'" Forrest said.

With No. 20 FSU (11-2, 1-1 in ACC) set to begin a stretch of 18 straight conference games with a home stint against Georgia Tech (6-6, 1-1) Tuesday at noon, it's safe to say that the beginning stretch of FSU's season has changed Forrest's mind.

"They've definitely exceeded my expectations and done more," Forrest said.

"I couldn't be more happy for those guys."

FSU has been led by consistent performances from a number of veterans this season as Forrest, sophomore Devin Vassell and junior M.J. Walker are all averaging more than 10 points.

But the Seminoles' youth movement has also come up big for them this season, growing into the season despite FSU's brutal non-conference schedule.

For proof, look no further than FSU's two talented true freshmen and the impact they've made.

Freshman forward Patrick Williams is averaging 9.2 points -- fourth-most on the team by a wide margin -- while shooting over 50% from the field and 39% from three this season.

Freshman center Balsa Koprivica has had more of an up-and-down season to date as he's struggled with fouls and in certain games. He's still making the most of his minutes, though, averaging 6.2 points and 2.6 rebounds in 12.7 minutes per game.

"What we've tried to do is allow them to mature and improve at a normal rate without the pressure," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said.

"They're capable of impacting the game, there's no doubt about that, and we want their maturation to be at the rate that's comfortable for them with us encouraging them and pushing them, putting them out there in these type of situations.

"I must say I'm expecting them to be factors in our season. I think they've shown that they're capable, but we want them to continue to keep getting better and I think you saw signs (Saturday) that they are improving and they're comfortable. They're showing a level of maturity and they're becoming more consistent."

Saturday's non-conference finale against North Alabama was a testament to the strides both have made. Koprivica scored 13 points while making five of his six shots from the floor while Williams added 12 points, three rebounds, three assists and made both of his three-point attempts.

"Since the summer, they bought into what we are about," redshirt sophomore forward Malik Osborne said.

"We emphasized as returners and vets that this program is predicated on 18 strong and so sometimes, it will be your night and sometimes it won't be your night...We're a brotherhood and, off the court, we're as close as can be so we keep each other motivated, we talk about these things and keep our spirits high."

While Osborne was around the team last year while forced to sit out a season after transferring from Rice, this is his first season playing for the Seminoles. He enters the GT matchup coming off a game where he led FSU with a season-high 14 points in 18 minutes of action.

Add in back-up point guard RayQuan Evans continuing to improve as he gets caught up after he missed seven weeks over the summer and fall with a torn hamstring and you see how the Seminoles' depth is showing itself at the ideal moment.

"We are making progress in those areas that have been missing," Hamilton said.

"That's part of the growth. Trying to integrate six new players into your rotation and now you're getting ready to go into a conference schedule that you're going to have to be ready to play every day."

It may come as a surprise given all the Seminoles lost off last year's team, but the KenPom rating system look at FSU favorably entering the bulk of ACC play.

KenPom predicts FSU to finish ACC play at 12-8 and in fourth in the conference standings. If that happens, it would give the Seminoles a double-bye in the ACC Tournament for the second straight season.

If it's going to happen, it will be in large part behind continued progress from FSU's newcomers.

"We all know that we go deep into the bench so you never know at what time you're going to be asked to come into the game and make an impact," Forrest said.

"We're just as confident in those guys as we are in the starters. It doesn't matter who it is. I feel like if we can have that balance like we did (Saturday) with those guys coming in and bringing their energy and that spark off the bench, it's going to be hard to stop us."

## **Crow Tribal Member Making His Mark As A Seminole**

Crow tribal member Rayquan Evans, member of the Greasy Mouth clan, and son of Lavern Old Elk and Israel Evans, is making his mark on the Florida State University basketball program.

He is a 2017 graduate of Skyview High School, in Billings Montana. Evans is a state AA champion his sophomore and junior years and a third place trophy winner earned all-state honors, as named by USA Today. He earned Class AA All State first team and eastern class AA all-conference first team honors as a senior.

From there he graduated from North Idaho College in 2019 with an associate's degree social science and he recognized as the Northwest Athletic Conference Male Basketball Athlete of the Year in 2019

He was also named to the All-East Region Defensive Team and as the East Region MVP in 2019 He led the Cardinals to a two-year combined record of 56-10 and they finished with a combined 27-5 overall record in NWAC play, including a perfect 16-0 record during the 2018-19 season.

Evans averaged 18.2 points, 7.4 rebounds and 4.9 assists in leading North Idaho to its second consecutive Northwest Athletic Conference Championship. He shot .552 percent from the field and .781 percent from the free throw line in his second season and scored in double figures in each of his games as a sophomore with his season-high of 32 points, six assists and two steals coming in NIC's victory over Walla Walla in the NWAC Tournament championship game as a senior.

Evans helped lead North Idaho to the 2019 NWAC Championship, where he averaged 23.3 points in three tournament games including a double-double of 18 points and 15 rebounds in the Cardinals' semifinal round victory over Everett Community College.

Evans lived in Billings as a youth, but then his family moved to Minneapolis. He came back to the state for high school, a sport he hopes to continue after college, he said.

"My biggest challenge was trying to keep head focused on main goal," Evans said of his time in school at North Idaho College. "Junior college changed my life, because I learned a lot about myself and how I have to stay focused to get where I want to go."

He did say being alone at first was the toughest thing he had to overcome.

"It's ok to leave (home). I've had to leave my family a lot of times, and it was hard, and still is, but I know they'll always be there and I have their support," he said.

Evans is continuing his social science track at FSU and is weighing options about what type of career he is aiming for, he said.

"I do want to continue to play after college," he said.

Evans, who spent most of his childhood in the city, said it does feel weird being back in a city, but the Florida humidity is what is really surprising.

"Otherwise, it's just another big city," he said.

Evans has traveled a lot for the sport he loves and encourages kids from small towns to do the same.



“Don’t be scared to leave, being on your own can be scary, but being away, for me, is one of the best things that could happen to me. It helps you appreciate the support and home more,” he said.

Evans spends a lot of his time in practice, class or working out for the team so organization is important to him. He suggests learning a routine and sticking with it manage time.

“I’m really looking forward to getting RayQuan into our rotation. He simply needs playing time to gain his confidence back after missing valuable time when he was injured,” said FSU Seminoles Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. “He’s a very smart player who thinks the game well and has a high basketball IQ. He’s a very instinctive player who is a valuable member of our team; he’s a player who will contribute to the success of our team this year.”

Evans, said he bring a positive attitude to the team and is pretty good at playing his role, and bringing his energy to the environment during a game.

“This is something I’ve dreamed about my whole life, he said. “Always work hard and put everything you have into something you love, don’t be afraid of losing people along the way. If you put your heart into something and not worry about what people say or think, the sky’s the limit”.

## Florida State Basketball Guard Devin Vassell Becoming A More All-Around Player

Florida State guard Devin Vassell has ice in his veins.

As a freshman, the moment was never too big for him and he never backed down even during the Seminoles' run to the Sweet 16.

After playing the sharp-shooter role on last year's team, he wants to become an all-around player in his second year.

"Just play as hard as I can on defense and not really worry about offense," Vassell told the *Democrat*.

"Just try and get all the little things like the deflections, the steals, and rebounds and just all the little things to help our team win."

Despite being a freshman, Vassell was the top shooter on FSU's roster a season ago.

He knocked down 41.9% of the threes he took. No other player shot over 39% from beyond the arc last season.

Vassell connected on 26 of the 62 three-point shots he took, and all 26 were assisted. His ability to catch and shoot immediately is a valuable weapon for the FSU offense.

"It's a lot of hours I just did with coach C.Y. (Charlton Young) and coach (Stan) Jones and just with the whole coaching staff," Vassell said.

"I'll just say that credit to them to, you know, get me to where I am and I just keep working every day."

FSU needs Vassell to step up this season after losing half of last year's roster to graduation and the NBA.

With six newcomers, Vassell is one of the more experienced players on the roster, at least from a playing at FSU standpoint.

But he's not only stepped up his play on the court. He's become one of the leaders of the locker room despite being one of the youngest players on the roster.

"We expect him to continue the improvement that he showed us from the beginning of the season last year until now," FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said.

"The difference that I expect to see from Devin is his maturity, his confidence. He is a lot more vocal. He's becoming a guy who is the voice in the background who's consistently vocal enough to help guys remember exactly what he's supposed to do. He's been outspoken, as much as any sophomore that I've seen."

The system that FSU runs requires the players to be in top shape due to the effort that they have to play with when they're on the court.

The Seminoles rotate players constantly and players are supposed to give everything they have for around a four-minute stretch before coming off for the next wave of players.

The pace of the game and the effort that FSU requires was one of the things that were the hardest to adjust to last season, according to Vassell.

He's put in a lot of work this off-season to make sure he's ready for it as a sophomore.  
"I probably gained about 10-15 pounds over the summer," Vassell said.

"I've just been really working on my defense to be able to guard one through four and just be able to switch it and be the match-up problem on offense and on defense."
