NO. 5/6 RANKED SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO NOTRE DAME ON JANUARY 25 AT 8:00 P.M.

Florida State, which is ranked No. 5 in this week's Associated Press Poll and No. 6 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll, plays its first of two games against Notre Dame this season as it plays host to the Fighting Irish on Saturday, January 25, 2019 at 8:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles enter their game against the Fighting Irish having won an ACC-best nine consecutive and 15 of their last 16 games. Florida State has won each of its nine games since a 72-53 victory over Clemson on December 8 – a span of 49 days on game day against Notre Dame. The Seminoles, who made the first appearance of the season in the AP Poll on December 2, 2019 (week five of the regular season), are ranked No. 5 in the AP Poll. Their ranking of No. 5 is the highest in the AP Poll since being ranked No. 2 during the first and second weeks of the 1972-73 season Florida State has been ranked in the Top-10 of the AP poll in three of the last four seasons – No. 6 during the 2016-17 season, No. 9 during the 2018-19 season and now No. 5 during the 2019-20 season. Following Saturday's game against Notre Dame, the Seminoles travel to play at Virginia (January 28, 7:00 p.m.) and at Virginia Tech (February 1, 4:00 p.m.) before returning home to play host to North Carolina (February 3, 7:00 p.m.).

SEMINOLES' WINNING STREAKS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame having won nine consecutive games. The Seminoles won a school record 12 games during the 2016-17 season (November 25, 2016 through January 10, 2017). Florida State has earned winning streaks of 12 games (2016-17), at least 11 games (1969-70), and at least 10 games three times in school history (1954-55, 1971-72 and 2003-04).

SEMINOLES' FORREST ENTERS SATURDAY'S GAME AGAINST NOTRE DAME ON CUSP OF 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Florida State senior Trent Forrest enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame with 996 career points and needs only 4 points to become just the 48th player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points.

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and Associate Head Coach Stan Jones are on the forefront of one of college basketball's great initiatives as the Seminoles have partnered with Coaching for Literacy (CFL) to host their sixth annual Fight for Literacy Game against Notre Dame on January 25. Coaching for Literacy's Fight for Literacy Games empower coaches, teams, and fans to make a more literate America by participating in awareness efforts, volunteer work and fundraising activities. According to the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), 59 percent of fourth-graders in Florida are not proficient in reading. The Seminoles are doing their part to change that unfortunate statistic. To promote the Fight for Literacy, members of the Seminole coaching staff will wear Coaching for Literacy's Green Ties.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Notre Dame and win its 10th consecutive game. A 10th consecutive win would mark the Seminoles' longest winning streak since they won 12 consecutive games from Nov. 25, 2016 (72-61 win over Illinois) through January 10, 2017 (88-72 win over Duke);

...Defeat Notre Dame and win its seventh consecutive ACC game. A seventh consecutive ACC win would mark their longest streak since winning eight straight conference games from January 22, 2019 (77-68 win over Clemson) through February 19, 2019 (77-64 win over Clemson);

...Defeat Notre Dame and win its 19th consecutive home game – a streak that began on January 22, 2019 (77-68 win over Clemson);

...Defeat Notre Dame and win their fifth consecutive home game against Notre Dame. The Seminoles have never lost to the Fighting Irish in Tallahassee and hold a 4-0 record at home during the series.

HAMILTON THE SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 350 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game against Notre Dame as the sixth winningest coach in ACC history. He needs just FOUR wins to move into a tie for fifth place in ACC history (tying Georgia Tech's Bobby Cremins) and became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

HAMILTON ONLY ONE WIN FROM TOP FIVE ACC RANKING

With 161 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019, at Louisville on January 4, 2020, at Wake Forest on January 8, 2020, against Virginia on January 15, 2020 and at Miami on January 18, 2020, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 161 ACC wins during his career.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 58-3 (.951 winning percentage) in its last 61 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles earned a 15-1 record at home during the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Notre Dame having won .951 percent of their games (58-3) and .906 percent of their ACC games (29-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) during the 2016-17, 15-1 at home during the 2018-10 season and are 9-0 at home this season.

FLORIDA STATE IN SCND PLACE IN THE ACC STANDINGS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame in second place in the ACC standings at 6-1 – tying its best ACC record this deep into an ACC season in school history. The Seminoles were 7-1 in ACC play and in a tie for first place in the ACC standings to begin conference play in 2011-12. The Seminoles were 7-2 in ACC play and in a tie for 1st place in the ACC with North Carolina after a win over Virginia on Feb. 8, 1993. The Seminoles were tied with North Carolina for first place in the ACC standings in 1993 until falling to Duke on Feb. 24 and finished in second place in the conference.

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY IN THE ACC

Florida State is 18-2 in regular season ACC games (.900 winning percentage) since defeating Clemson (77-68) on January 22, 2019 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles won 12 of their final 13 regular season ACC games of the 2018-19 season and have won six of their first seven ACC games of the 2019-20 season. During that stretch of games, Florida State is 10-0 at home and 8-2 on the road in ACC play.

FLORIDA STATE ENTERS SATURDAY'S GAME WITH A 16-2 OVERALL RECORD

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame with a 16-2 record and an .889 winning percentage. The Seminoles have won nine consecutive and 15 of their last 16 games since a 63-51 win over No. 6 Florida on November 6, 2019.

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame looking to improve its record in ACC play to 7-1. It would tie the Seminoles' best start in ACC play since also beginning its ACC slate with a 7-1 record in 2012. The Seminoles finished their season with a 12-4 record in ACC play and earned the conference crown by winning the ACC Tournament championship.

FLORIDA STATE IN ONE POSSESSION GAMES

Florida State is 37-8 (.822 winning percentage) in one possession games decided by three points or less or in overtime since a 79-76 win over Duke on January 21, 2012. The Seminoles' victory over the Blue Devils at Cameron Indoor Stadium came courtesy of a Michael Snaer buzzer-beating 3-point shot and on their way to the 2012 ACC Tournament Championship. Florida State's overtime victory over Miami on Saturday was the Seminoles' ninth consecutive overtime win.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

Florida State is 45-10 overall (.818 winning percentage) and 18-6 in ACC play (.735 winning percentage) since the beginning of the 2018-19 season. Florida State won a school-record 29 games and finished with a 29-8 overall record (.784 winning percentage) in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. With its 6-1 record in the 2018 NCAA Tournament the Seminoles, are 48-11 (.814 winning percentage) since defeating Missouri on March 16, 2018.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE STATE OF FLORIDA

Florida State has won 22 consecutive games that have been played in the state of Florida – each game since a 77-68 win at home over Clemson on January 22, 2019.

FLORIDA STATE VS. NOTRE DAME – THE LAST GAME

Devin Vassell scored 13 points, sparking Florida State's second-half charge with a dunk and a 3-pointer on consecutive possessions, and the 18th-ranked Seminoles defeated Notre Dame, 68-61, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on February 25, 2019. Florida State trailed for most of the second half but took a 57-55 lead with 6:35 to go after Vassell dunked and made a 3-pointer on back-to-back possessions. Notre Dame was able to tie the game but never led after that. The Seminoles' bench has been critical nearly every night, with Florida State's reserves scoring 31 points against Notre Dame. Trent Forrest made 4 of 6 free-throw attempts in the final minute to help the Seminoles win the game and Christ Koumadje added 12 points. D.J. Harvey scored 18 points and Prentiss Hubb had 17 for Notre Dame. The Fighting Irish went scoreless for nearly five minutes late in the game and made just one of their final 10 field-goal attempts.

FLORIDA STATE SHOOTS .833 FROM FREE THROW LINE IN WIN OVER MIAMI; CONTINUES TO LEAD ACC FROM LINE

Florida State shot .833 percent from the free throw line in its overtime victory over Miami on January 18 – the fifth time this season it has shot better than 80 percent or better from the free throw line – and enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame shooting an ACC leading .763 team free throw percentage. The Seminoles were a perfect five of five from the line in the overtime period in outscoring the Hurricanes by a 14-10 margin in the extra session of five minutes.

FLORIDA STATE BY THE NUMBERS FROM THE FREE THROW LINE...

...Florida State leads the ACC with a .763 team free throw shooting percentage through its first 18 games of the season. The Seminoles are shooting nearly two percentage points higher from the free throw line this season (.763) as compared to the 2018-19 season (.744);

...Florida State has shot better than 80 percent in six different games – the Seminoles shot .867 from the line at Pittsburgh, .821 in their win over Western Carolina, .882 in their win over Saint Francis, .882 in their win over Chicago State, 1.000 in their win over North Alabama and .833 in their win at Miami;

...Florida State made its season-high of 27 free throws (27 of 31, .882 percent) in its win over Chicago State;

...Florida State was a perfect 17 of 17 from the free throw line in its school record tying performance in its victory over North Alabama;

...Florida State is shooting .780 percent from the free throw line (39 of 50) in its last three games with 18 made free throws coming in its win over Wake Forest and 15 made free throws coming in its victory over Miami.

FLORIDA STATE AVERAGING NEARLY 10 STEALS PER GAME TO LEAD THE ACC

Florida State, which has earned 35 steals in the last three games (11.7 spg) enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame as the ACC leaders in steals with 177 and a 9.8 steals per game average. The Seminoles are averaging 2.6 steals more per game this season than they did last season when they finished the season ranked third in the ACC in steals. With an 11.0 steals per game in 2006, Clemson was the last team to lead the ACC with a double digit steals average for an entire season. Maryland set the ACC record for steals in a game with a 12.7 steals per game average during the 1999 season.

Trent Forrest, a senior captain for the No. 5 ranked Florida State Men's Basketball team, has been named as one of four finalists for the 16th Annual Coach John Wooden Citizenship Cup, awarded annually to the most outstanding role models among student-athletes. He was named a finalist for the prestigious honor along with Claire Kloff of Denison University (soccer), Bria Matthews of Georgia Tech (track and field) and Ryan Culhane of the University of Dayton (football). Founded by Athletes for a Better World (ABW), a non-profit organization committed to changing the culture of American sports, the Wooden Cup is unique in that it is open to athletes in high school, collegiate, Olympic, and professional sports. The award will be presented at a ceremony in Atlanta in April.

FORREST ENTERS SATURDAY'S GAME AGAINST NOTRE DAME ONLY 4 POINTS FROM 1,000 FOR HIS CAREER

Senior Trent Forrest enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame with 996 career points and needs only 4 to become just the 48th player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points. He is averaging a career-high 11.8 points per game this season – the first time in his career that he has averaged in double figure scoring. He has scored in double figures 12 times in the first 18 games of the 2019-20 season. Forrest has increased his scoring total and scoring average in each of his last three seasons after averaging 4.9 points scored per game as a freshman.

EVANS GROWING COMFORTABLE IN FLORIDA STATE'S SYSTEM

Junior guard RayQuan Evans continues to show each and every game that he is becoming more and more comfortable in Florida State's offensive and defensive systems. He totaled a near career-high four assists in Florida State's overtime victory over Miami on January 18 and has hit one 3-point field goal in three of Florida State's last five ACC games. Evan's ACC career-high of seven points came on the road in Florida State's victory 78-65 over previously No. 1 ranked Louisville on January 4.

WILLIAMS UTILIZES HIS EXTRAORDINARY ATHLETIC ABILITY TO BLOCK SHOTS

Freshman Patrick Williams totaled his career-high of four blocked shots (two in the first half and two in the second half) in Florida State's overtime victory over Miami on January 18. He enters Saturday's game against Notre Dame tied for the team lead and tied for 10th in the ACC in blocked shots. RayQuan Evans – “There is no particular reason why I will wear No. 0 during my career at Florida State. I wore the same number at Northern Idaho and I really like the way it looks. It’s a very unique number and I feel that I’m a unique player.”

RaiQuan Gray – “I chose to wear No. 1 at Florida State because I wanted to wear a number that was completely different from any number that I have ever worn before. I have worn double digit numbers throughout my career. I wore No. 41 in high school.”

Anthony Polite – “I will wear No. 2 this season because I am the second member of my family to play at Florida State. My dad, Michael, wore No. 45 during his career as a Seminole (1988, 1989 and 1991)

Trent Forrest – “I wear No. 3 to honor two of my AAU teammates who have recently passed away. Rod Scott wore No. 3 and Herman Williams wore No. 13. So with the No. 3 in common in both of their numbers I decided to change to that number at Florida State when it became available. Rod passed away after he was involved in a car crash in 2016 and Herman collapsed while playing in a pick-up game at his church just before his freshman year began at University of Louisiana Monroe.”

Patrick Williams – “I wear number 4 because it represents my hometown of Charlotte (704). Many people who know the city, or are from Charlotte, refer to it as “the 4” so I wear the number 4 as my way of representing Charlotte and the people in the city. The city of Charlotte has supported my evolution as a person and a basketball player throughout my career.”

Dominik Olejniczak - “My favorite number is 13. I wore No. 13 when I played for Poland in the FIBA World Cup during the Summer of 2019 and while I was at Ole Miss. The No. 13 is retired at Florida State because the great Dave Cowens wore it during his Hall of Fame career at Florida State, so I wear No. 15 as a Seminole. My mother, Joanna Chelczyńska, who played professional basketball in Poland for the better part of two decades, wore No. 15 during her career.

M.J. Walker – “I wear No. 23 because LeBron James has been my favorite player for as long as I can remember. I was about four years old when he began playing in the NBA and I have patterned my game after him. I wore No. 23 throughout high school and during AAU ball.”

Devin Vassell - “I wear No. 24 because it is my favorite number and I’m also a big Kobe Bryant fan. I wore the number throughout my high school and my AAU career, and really grew to like that number. I was happy to be able to get No. 24 when I was being recruited by Coach Ham and the coaching staff.”

SEMINOLES’ VASSELL NAMED TO NAISMITH AWARD DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR MIDSEASON WATCH LIST

Sophomore Devin Vassell, a starting guard for the No. 5 ranked Florida State Men’s Basketball team, has been named to the 2020 Naismith Men’s Defensive Player of the Year Midseason Watch List. Vassell is one of only 15 collegiate basketball players selected from various conferences including the PAC-12, Big 12, Atlantic 10, SEC, BIG EAST, and Big Ten; and one of just three ACC players on the list. Vassell enters Saturday’s game against Notre Dame ranked eighth in the ACC in steals (1.7 spg) and 10th in blocked shots (1.2 bpg) and is one of only two players in the ACC who is ranked in the top 10 for both steals and blocked shots. Vassell has earned at least one steal in 14 consecutive games and totaled his career-high of four in Florida State’s victory over USF on December 21.

Vassell led the Seminoles to victories over both Virginia and Miami and shares the honor with Buddy Boeheim of Syracuse. It marks the first time Vassell has earned the weekly award from the ACC. Vassell scored his career-high of 23 points against Miami – besting his previous career-high of 18 in the Seminoles’ victory over Virginia earlier in the week and totaled the first double double of his career with 23 points and 11 rebounds in the Seminoles’ victory at Miami.

VASSELL – FLORIDA STATE’S CHIEF THIEF

Sophomore Devin Vassell is tied for eighth in the ACC with 30 steals (career-high 1.7 spg) and has earned at least one steal in 15 consecutive and 16 of the Seminoles’ first 18 games of the season.

MR. BIG SHOT – M.J. WALKER – IN HIS LAST FOUR GAMES...

...He is averaging 15.5 points scored per game (62 total points) and scored 19 points (all after halftime) in Florida State’s come-from-behind win at Miami on January 18. LOUISVILLE, Ky. -- M.J. Walker scored 23 points for Florida State as the 18th-ranked Seminoles beat No. 7 Louisville 78-65. The Seminoles endured a big game from Louisville's Jordan Nwora to pull the upset. The preseason All-American scored 32 points, matching a career high. But the Cardinals could not overcome a 55.2% shooting performance by the Seminoles in losing their second straight. Florida State made 11 of 23 3-pointers. Nwora had a hot hand early for Louisville, scoring 21 points in the first half. The junior shot 6 of 9 from the floor, but the Cardinals combined to make just 10 of 37. They went the last 5:04 without a field goal as the Seminoles took 39-32 lead into the break. Walker helped offset Nwora's early barrage. The junior came off the bench to score 15 points in the first half on 6-of-8 shooting, including 3 of 5 from 3-point range. Walker finished one point short of his career high. Trent Forrest added 20 points on 9-of-11 shooting, and Devin Vassell scored 14. Florida State led 52-42 with 13:43 remaining. Louisville cut that to 54-51 on Nwora's putback, but that was as close as the Cardinals would get.

Game 17 -- Florida State 83, Miami 79 (OT)

CORAL GABLES, Fla. – No. 9-ranked Florida State forced 24 turnovers, including three in a row in overtime, and rallied Saturday to earn their ninth consecutive victory by beating Miami 83-79. Sophomore Devin Vassell set a career high for the third consecutive game by leading Florida State with 23 points while adding 11 rebounds and five assists. His two free throws with six seconds left sealed the win. Walker played only 23 minutes because of foul trouble but scored 19 points, all in the second half, Malik Osborne's three-point play with 2:25 left in overtime put the Seminoles ahead to stay. The Seminoles won despite shooting 42 percent and committing 16 turnovers. They compensated by scoring 21 points off takeaways. Not that Florida State's characteristically strong defense wasn't stout from the start. The Hurricanes had to call a timeout when they were trapped on the game's first possession. They blew a dunk, threw up air balls and had 10 shots blocked. But Miami stayed in the game early with a strong defensive effort of its own. DJ Vasiljevic sank a 3-pointer and then scored on a breakaway to give the Hurricanes their biggest lead with 5:20 remaining, 65-56. The Seminoles have won nine consecutive overtime games, including two this season. Their last OT loss came against Iowa in December 2016.

Unselfishness, Toughness Help Vault FSU Into Associated Press Top-5 In Men's Basketball

Hugh Durham believes two qualities best exemplify the Florida State men's basketball team:

Unselfishness and toughness.

Durham, who led FSU to the 1972 NCAA Championship game and the team's last top-5 ranking during the 1972-73 season, says that's a difficult balance. He credits Seminoles coach Leonard Hamilton for the ability to get players - including those with their sights on the NBA - to commit to his system.

"Players accept their roles," Durham said Monday from his Jacksonville hometown.

"When you turn on the television, that's not what you see all the time. The perception might be this guy is not putting the team first. I think that's what is unusual about Florida State. Somehow, Leonard is able to get his players to buy in. I think that, along with the talent he recruits, he gets the talent buying into that concept."

FSU (16-2 overall, 6-1 ACC) continued its surge under Hamilton Monday, when it vaulted to No. 5 in The Associated Press men's college basketball poll.

It's the Seminoles' highest ranking since they were No. 2 in the opening weeks of the 1972-73 season under Durham. FSU was also ranked No. 6 in Monday's USA Today Coaches Poll.

The Seminoles haven't missed a beat from last season's Sweet 16 team that featured two NBA Draft picks.

Since its season-opening defeat at Pittsburgh, FSU has won 16 of 17 and is riding a nine-game win streak.

The Seminoles, who haven't lost since playing Indiana in the Big Ten-ACC Challenge the first week of December, are also in a first-place tie with Louisville in the ACC standings. Their next game is Saturday at home against Notre Dame (11-6, 2-4).

To say craziness abounds this season is an understatement.

Baylor, at No. 1 this week in the AP poll, is the seventh team on top this season. That matches the record set in 1983 for the most No. 1s in the history of the poll, which dates to the 1948-49 season.

"It's the first time when you can clearly say there are no favorites to win the NCAA Tournament," former FSU coach Pat Kennedy said Monday from his New Jersey home.

"It's not so much people getting beat, but how they are getting beat. This is one of Leonard's best overall teams I think since he has been there. They have tremendous experience. These kids are confident."

Seven top-25 teams in the Associated Press poll lost last Saturday, including three of the top-5. Six were steamrolled by double digits by unranked opponents.

FSU, meanwhile, jumped four spots in the poll after it beat reigning national champion Virginia at home and survived overtime at Miami, rallying from a nine-point deficit with five minutes remaining. The Seminoles won despite shooting 42 percent and committing 16 turnovers.

They may not always rely on style points, but it's difficult to argue with the results.

“When you watch them, they are tough, they are versatile, they are gritty – they get the job done,” former Seminole (1988-93) and Tallahassee resident Byron Wells said.

“To me, it seems like somebody different is stepping up every game. When you think about our teams compared to this one. ... we didn’t play defense like this one. The game was different when I played. It’s so much more physical now.”

Sophomore 6-foot-7 guard Devin Vassell has emerged as the Seminoles’ go-to player. He is averaging 17.2 points, 7.2 rebounds and 1.8 steals while shooting 39.1% from 3-point range in the past five games. He finished with 23 points, 11 rebounds, 5 assists, 2 blocks and 3 steals in the overtime victory over the Hurricanes.

Still, FSU has relied on the toughness and unselfishness Durham stressed.

Ten players are averaging double-digit minutes played. Three are averaging in double figures, led by Vassell at 13.2 points per game, followed by Trent Forrest (11.8) and M.J. Walker (11.6).

The Seminoles are outscoring opponents by 11.9 points per game (75.5 to 63.6) to rank third in the ACC behind Duke and Louisville. They are also 9-0 at home, 59-3 in their last 62 games.

NCAA Tournament bracket projections have pegged the Seminoles as high as a No. 2 seed. FSU has never won a national title in men’s basketball.

“Leonard’s team is one that always seems to find a way to win games,” said Kennedy, who led the Seminoles to the Elite Eight in 1992-93. “Look what’s already happened this season. Florida State is going to have a good shot at it (national title).”

Hamilton, in his 18th season at FSU, hasn’t shown any signs of slowing down at age 71. FSU Athletics Director David Coburn told the Democrat last week that the school is working toward a contract extension for the winningest head coach in in program history. Hamilton’s contract expires in April.

“Leonard looks like he’s 40,” Wells said and laughed.

“We are blessed to have him here. I am so proud of the type of kids he has in the program. They represent the university so well. He has done such an amazing job of putting his program together and keeping it going.”

Q&A: Vassell Loves Defense, Ready For Expanded Role

Florida State opens the 2019-20 season on Nov. 6 against Pittsburgh. But fans can get an early look at the Seminoles on Tuesday night when they play their first exhibition game against Barry University at 7 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

As a freshman last season, Vassell led the team in 3-point shooting (41.9 percent). He averaged 4.5 points per game but consistently brought energy and defense off the bench. Vassell may not start this season but could be a sixth man off the bench, a role that in past years has seen a player make significant contributions.

Vassell went one-on-one with the Osceola to discuss what he is working on going into year 2 and how he has made improvements.

What was your focus in the offseason?

Vassell: I was just trying to focus on getting a lot stronger to be able to guard one through four (point guard, shooting guard, small forward or power forward). Coach (Leonard) Hamilton, that's the type of defense he likes being able to use, just interchange with everybody. So just focusing on getting stronger and conditioning myself and just being able to be ready to play whenever my number's called.

So being able to guard one through four means add a little bit of weight but still be quick? How many pounds have you added?

Vassell: Over the offseason, I gained probably about 10, maybe 15 pounds. All good weight. I still can move and run and jump. I feel good. I just had a good work ethic this summer with trying to focus on getting bigger and working out three or four times a week.

How much of an adjustment was it college basketball and how comfortable are you now?

Vassell: I would definitely say that my freshman year went by superfast, but it was just a great opportunity for me to be able to go out there as a freshman and you know get big minutes, especially in big games, ACC games. I feel like that's going to be one thing that's helped us this year, we have a few key players that played in big games or we'll have experience for this upcoming year.

I'm sure you would like to start but how much do you enjoy being the spark plug guy on the bench and to have that opportunity to provide quality minutes off the bench?

Vassell: It really doesn't matter to me if I start or come off the bench. I'm just trying to help the team however I can. Whatever happens happens. I'm just ready to get out there and work and help my team however I can. Defensively, come out with energy just whatever I had to do.

Is there a little Terance Mann in how you play, the well-rounded and versatile traits?

Vassell: I've always looked up to Terance. I came in and he was the first person I talked to, as a senior, he always helped me out, with just the little things, offense and defense. Talking to him really about anything. He's a great player.

You have a good jump shot. How hard have you worked on your jumper?

Vassell: Ever since I was young, my dad put a ball in my hands. And you know, he just really taught me to spend countless hours of me in a gym just shooting with my dad or my trainer. Really just focusing on my shot. As soon as I came here, CY (assistant coach Charlton Young) helped me with my shot. I just want to say thanks to coach CY and coach Jones (assistant coach Stan Jones) for really helping me out with that too.

How has your dad helped you as a basketball player?

Vassell: My dad played basketball. He played in high school, won a few state championships and then in college went to Stony Brook. He was doing pretty good. We make jokes about each other all the time, saying who's better in college and stuff like that, but you know, it's all love at the end of the day.

How old were you when you beat him one-on-one in the driveway?

Vassell: I would say probably about 13. Got a little taller than him and I was able to beat him in one-on-one. He tried to have a smile on his face but I could tell he was a little upset.

A lot of first-year guys, whether they're transfers, freshman, junior college guys, it's going to be our first look at them in the exhibition. What have you seen from those guys?

Vassell: I would just say everybody that came in is bought in. They all came in work hard. You come into the gym, it's always somebody shooting. I'll just say that we've all come in and bought into our program. I'm ready to see how they play on Tuesday, too. And I'm just thrilled for this opportunity that we all have. And I'm just excited for the season coming up.

Best defender on the team is?

Vassell: Devin Vassell. I just I love playing defense. Whenever I see the best player on the floor, I want to guard that person, I want to step up to the challenge. My freshman year, just watching Trent (Forrest), he was one of the best defenders in the ACC. I was just watching him and learning from him asking a lot of questions about what his techniques are.

Who is the toughest guy to defend one on one?

Vassell: Trent Forrest. Definitely. Even with the bad toe you wouldn't be able to tell.

Who is the best shooter?

Vassell: M.J. Walker. M.J. has unbelievable confidence. Once that shot is gone, it's hard to stop him.

You are the captain. You have the first pick. Who do you take?

Vassell: Trent Forrest. Definitely. He is a floor general. He knows so much about the game. He just knows all the little things and just the stuff that will help you out.

Who's the best rebounder?

Vassell: Malik Osborne. He's just played with so much energy and he has a high motor. Whenever he sees a loose ball, he's always trying to go get it.
