NO. 16 FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT GEORGIA TECH RIDING 5-GAME ACC WINNING STREAK

No. 16/16 Florida State, which has won each of its last five ACC games by an average of 18.6 points, travels to play at Georgia Tech on Saturday, January 30, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. at McCamish Pavilion in Atlanta. The game is the second of the season between the Seminoles and the Yellow Jackets following a 74-61 Florida State win in Tallahassee on December 15, 2020. Florida State arrives in Atlanta having won five consecutive ACC games with victories over NC State (January 13, 105-73), North Carolina (January 16, 82-75), at Louisville (January 18, 78-65), Clemson (January 23, 80-61) and Miami (January 27, 81-59). The Seminoles are 5-0 since the calendar turned to 2021 and will look to close out an undefeated month of January for the first time since the 1988-89 season when they won each of their eight games in the first month of the year. Following Saturday's game at Georgia Tech, the Seminoles will travel to play at Boston College on Tuesday, February 2, 2021 at 9:00 p.m. in the first of two regular season meetings between the teams.

SEMINOLES TO PLAY AT PITTSBURGH ON FEBRUARY 6 IN RESCHEDULED GAME

The Atlantic Coast Conference announced that the postponed Florida State at Pittsburgh men's basketball game, originally scheduled for January 9, has been rescheduled and will be played on Saturday, February 6 at 2 p.m. and be carried on RSN.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Georgia Tech ranked No. 16 in this week's Associated Press poll and No. 16 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. The Seminoles were ranked No. 15 in both of the major polls during the week of December 14, 2020.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 65-15 (.813 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 10-2 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won more than 87 percent of their games with a record of 27-4 (.871 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 35-10 (.778 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and are 6-1 this season.

BARNES A MIDSEASON CANDIDATE FOR THE LUTE OLSON AWARD

Freshman Scottie Barnes, Florida State's leader in assists and its second leading scorer, has been announced as one of 35 midseason candidates for the Lute Olson Award as presented by collegeinsider.com. He is one of five players from the ACC (Barnes; Justin Champagnie, Pittsburgh; Sam Hauser, Virginia; Matthew Hurt, Duke, Carlík Jones, Louisville) and one of only four freshman from across the nation (Barnes; Cade Cunningham, Oklahoma State; Evan Mobley, USC; Jalen Suggs, Gonzaga) in the Olson Award Midseason List. Barnes is also a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards as the National Player of the Year and the Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard.

WALKER ONLY 46 POINTS FROM 1,000 FOR HIS CAREER

Senior M.J. Walker, who has scored in double figures in 10 of Florida State's first 12 games, enters Saturday's game against Georgia Tech with 954 career points and needs only 46 to become the 47th member of the Seminoles' 1,000 career point club. Walker has scored 19 of his 954 career points against Georgia Tech in four career games against the Yellow Jackets.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Georgia Tech and win its sixth consecutive ACC game. The Seminoles most recently won six consecutive ACC games from December 31, 2019 (70-58 over Georgia Tech) through January 25, 2020 (85-84 over Notre Dame) with wins over the Yellow Jackets, Louisville, Wake Forest, Virginia, Miami and the Fighting Irish;
...Defeat Georgia Tech and win its sixth consecutive game against Georgia Tech – and its third straight in games played between the Seminoles and the Yellow Jackets in Atlanta;
...Defeat Georgia Tech and improve its ACC record to 7-1 for the second consecutive season;
...Defeat Georgia Tech and up its ACC road record to 2-1 this season. The Seminoles won at Louisville (January 18, 78-65) and are 7-5 in ACC road games in the last two seasons.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game at Georgia Tech as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 370 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

HAMILTON ON BALLOT FOR NAISMITH HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2021

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, who has won nearly 600 games and who is the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, was named as an eligible candidate for the Naismith Hall of Fame Class of 2021. Hamilton highlights the list of four first time coaching candidates including Ken Anderson (Wisconsin-Eau Claire), Lou Henson (Hardin-Simmons, New Mexico State, Illinois) and Paul Westhead (NBA and college). Hamilton has been named as the National Coach of the Year four times and by four different national governing bodies. He was named the Clarence "Big House" Gaines National Coach of the Year in 2018, the Basketball Times Coach of the Year in 2009, the BCA National Coach of the Year in 2000 and the UPI National Coach of the Year in 1995. Hamilton has also been named the ACC Coach of the Year three times (2009, 2012 and 2020) and the Big East Coach of the Year twice (1995 and 1999).

FLORIDA STATE OFFENSIVELY IN THE LAST FIVE GAMES

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Georgia Tech as the hottest team in the league with five consecutive victories over five teams with a combined 20 ACC wins (North Carolina, 6, Louisville, 5; Clemson, 4, NC State, 3, and Miami, 2). During that span of five wins, the Seminoles have moved to within one game of the conference lead, they have shot .528 from the field, .465 from the 3-point line and .855 from the free throw line while averaging 85.2 points scored per game.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Georgia Tech ranked first in the ACC in scoring offense (79.3 points scored per game) and second in the league statistics in scoring margin (+11.6 points per game). The Seminoles have increased their scoring output (426 points / 85.2 points per game) as well as their margin of victory (+18.6 ppg) during their five game winning streak. In ACC play, the Seminoles have four players averaging in double figure scoring (M.J. Walker, 12.6 ppg; RayQuan Evans, 11.2 ppg; Scottie Barnes, 11.0 ppg, RaiQuan Evans, 10.0 ppg).

 ...Nine players who are averaging at least 13.3 minutes played per game with senior M.J. Walker averaging a team and career-high 29.6 minutes played per game;
 ...Six players shooting 80 percent from the free throw line or better. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Georgia Tech ranked fifth in the ACC with a .745 team free throw shooting mark;

SEMINOLES BUILDING UP THEIR REBOUNDING RESUME

Florida State outrebounded Miami by a 45-23 margin in its 81-59 win over the Hurricanes on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. It marked the fourth time in the last five ACC games (all wins) that the Seminoles held a rebounding advantage over their opponent and have a +5.6 rebounding margin for the season – a margin which ranks third in the ACC. In the last five games, the Seminoles have outrebounded North Carolina (who currently ranks first in the ACC in rebounding margin, +11.3) and Louisville (who currently ranks fourth in the ACC in rebounding margin, +5.3).

FLORIDA STATE VS. GEORGIA TECH – THE LAST GAME

Freshman guard Scottie Barnes scored 14 of his 16 points after halftime and the 15th-ranked Seminoles pulled away midway through the second half to beat Georgia Tech 74-61 on December 15, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. M.J. Walker scored 14 points and Balsa Koprivica added 10 points and eight rebounds. The Seminoles won for the 27th straight time in Tallahassee, including all four games to open the 2020-21 season. Michael Devoe had 21 points, while Jordan Usher and Moses Wright added 12 apiece for Georgia Tech. The Yellow Jackets used a 15-0 run to get back into the game in the second half, but the Seminoles never relinquished their lead. The Yellow Jackets went 22 of 51 (43%) from the floor but just 5 of 20 (25%) on 3s. The Seminoles shot 27 of 51 (53%) from the floor and 8 for 17 (47%) from 3-point range. Florida State has won 15 of the last 17 meetings in the series.

.824 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray is shooting .824 from the free throw line (14 of 17) during the Seminoles' current five game winning streak. He is shooting a career-high .759 from the line through the Seminoles' first 12 games of the season.

.857 Sophomore Balsa Koprivica was a perfect three of three from the free throw line in Florida State's victory over Miami on Wednesday night in Tallahassee. He is shooting .857 from the line (six of seven) in the last two games.

1 Senior M.J. Walker leads the ACC in free throw shooting percentage with a career-high .920 mark – he is the only qualifying player in the conference (minimum 2.5 FTM/Game) who is shooting better than 90 percent from the field.

3 Three Seminoles – M.J. Walker, Balsa Koprivica and RaiQuan Gary – are the only Seminoles who have started in each of Florida State's first 12 games of the 2020-21 season.

6 Junior Sardaar Calhoun has made at least one 3-point shot in six consecutive games and is shooting .529 from the bonusphere (nine of 17) in those six games.

7 Junior Sardaar Calhoun is a perfect seven of seven from the free throw line in the first 12 games of his Seminole career.

9 Sophomore Balsa Koprivica has as many assists in the first 12 games of the 2020-21 season (nine) as he did in 27 games as a freshman during the 2019-20 season.

10 Florida State is undefeated, 10-0, when it outscores its opponent.

11 Freshman Scottie Barnes, who totaled a career-high seven assists in Florida State's victory over Clemson, has totaled 11 assists in the last two games (5.5 apg).

75 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray has 76 career steals in 77 career games.

Walker is the only player in the ACC and one of only 16 players in the nation who is shooting 92 percent or better from the free throw line.

"The Seminoles flew under the radar early but they have looked excellent in the month of January. Two double-digit wins this week against teams that should finish in the top half of the conference made it clear that FSU is on track to contend for another ACC title. The Noles jumped on Louisville early on Monday, leading by as many as 24 in the first half before cruising to a 13-point win. Saturday, The Noles torched a good Clemson defense for 80 points to knock off the Tigers, 80-61, in a game that wasn't nearly as close as that scoreline indicates. What makes Leonard Hamilton's club special is its balance. FSU put five players in double figures in the win over Louisville and four against Clemson, with just one player (RaiQuan Gray) who scored at least 10 in both games. The team's leading scorer for the season, senior M.J. Walker, scored just two points against Louisville and a quiet 10 against Clemson. Meanwhile, highly touted freshman Scottie Barnes has been more than happy settling into a high-level glue guy role in what will likely be his lone season in Tallahassee, consistently picking his spots and making good decisions in a hybrid guard/forward role.

New-Look RaiQuan Gray Reaping Rewards Of Offseason Work For FSU Basketball

It didn't take long this season for Florida State basketball forward RaiQuan Gray to show the strides he had made.

In the opening minutes of the Seminoles' second game of the season Dec. 9 vs. Indiana, Gray possessed the ball outside the arc in the corner. In one swift move, he accelerated past his defender, drove into the lane, rose airborne and slammed the ball into the basket.

It was a resounding play and one the redshirt junior admits he probably wouldn't have been able to make last year before he transformed his body this past offseason.

"That's a play right there I don't think I would have made last year," Gray told the *Democrat*.

"Obviously, I think I'm athletic, I think I'm more athletic than people think I am. But last year compared to me dunking the ball, I would say last year's Boston College game to the Indiana game and a few other games this year, you can kind of see the difference of balance and the quickness of my step a little bit."

That's just one of a number of plays this season made by Gray that have shown how his commitment to himself has paid off on the court.

Currently listed at 6-foot-8, 260 pounds, Gray is still very close to what he weighed over his first few years at FSU. But it doesn't take much time looking at him to see how drastically different his body looks this year.

After FSU had its 2019-20 season unceremoniously ended by the coronavirus pandemic, Gray took it upon himself to transform his body during quarantine.

"Just watching what I eat. Obviously, I'm a bigger dude, I have to watch what I eat, what time I eat, have to do extra cardio other than smaller people," Gray said.

"I stayed in the weight room with (FSU basketball strength and conditioning coach Mike) Bradley this offseason and I was just really locked in and focused on being in better shape this year.

"Because of a new team coming in, I didn't know what my role was gonna be, but I wanted to be prepared for anything thrown at me. I think I'm in better shape and I feel good out there moving around."

If you see Gray around FSU's basketball training center nowadays, he's normally carrying a jug of water as a reminder to stay extremely hydrated, a tip he picked up from former Seminole Trent Forrest.

Gray's journey at FSU has been a gradual one. A three-star recruit from Fort Lauderdale Dillard, Gray redshirted in his first year at FSU in 2017-18.

He's seen his playing time and production gradually increase in the years since. He went from 12.3 minutes and 3.9 points per game as a redshirt freshman in 2018-19 to 19.5 minutes and 6.0 points per game last season.

The timing of Gray's transformation was quite optimal as the departures of Patrick Williams, Devin Vassell and Forrest off last year's team forced him to take a larger role both on the court and as a leader.

So far this season, he's averaging 9.4 points and 5.5 rebounds per game, fifth and second-most on the FSU roster, respectively. He's also averaging 24.5 minutes per game, third-most among all Seminoles.

"He's becoming more comfortable with his role. Early on, that's a big adjustment to being a player that's playing on the team and kind of in a different role with Patrick and Trent and Devin over the last couple of years. Now, he's more a leadership role, he's experienced," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said.

"Whether we are successful or not, a lot has to do with how well he played. I think he's maturing into that, understanding his strengths and his weaknesses. He's going to the basket more, he's being patient with the shot selection. He gives us leadership on the floor, he gives us unique ball-handling and decision-making for his size, which is challenging."

While five-star freshman Scottie Barnes is a non-traditional primary ball-handler at 6-foot-9, Gray is an even more unusual primary ball-handler by traditional metrics. And yet, Gray has served as an occasional primary ball-handler for the Seminoles during the last four games with Barnes limited due to injury.

This dates back to when he was a late bloomer as a young high-school basketball player.

"Coach Ham, he recruited me and he always believed I could play one through five..." Gray said.

"I was always a short kid growing up so I didn't really grow into my height, my size until 10th grade. Before that, I was just a guard, honestly, dribbling the ball. Even in high school, I started at the point guard spot so it wasn't anything new to me. I'm comfortable playing anywhere on the court."

With Barnes limited of late, Gray has risen to the occasion in a big way for the Seminoles. He scored a career-high 19 points in FSU's win over North Carolina Jan. 16. Two days later at Louisville, he added 17 more points.

He played just 11 minutes in FSU's last game vs. Clemson due to foul trouble, but still managed to score 11 points. His streak of three consecutive games in double-figures is more than the two times he scored 10-plus points in FSU's first eight games this season.

These strides Gray has made have put him on the radar of NBA teams more than ever before. His mix of defensive ability, potential as a three-level scorer, solid passing skills for his size and the additional athleticism he has shown could one day make him another player in an ever-growing group of former Seminoles in the NBA. If he gets there, he knows much of it will be due to his commitment to self-improvement that began this past offseason.

"(FSU assistant coach Stan) Jones always touches on, 'If you want to be a star in this league, you've got to have that star condition. If you want to be a role player, you've got to have role player condition.' It's a different level of conditioning to the type of role that you have on your team," Gray said.

"I just wanted to be prepared for any role that I may fit in. I think that my body and my conditioning have come a long way. I'm still improving every day, taking it step by step, but it has definitely helped me a lot this season."

Former Billings Skyview Standout RayQuan Evans Thriving On Big Stage At Florida State

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — RayQuan Evans didn't receive much notice before making his first start in the ACC.

"I found out I was going to be starting a couple minutes before the game," Evans told MTN Sports. "It didn't change my mindset. I just had to play my role, move the ball, score when I need to, bring energy, be that glue guy, so that's what I tried to do, just play my role and tried not to change anything."

Maybe the short notice was for the best. The former Billings Skyview High School basketball standout had his best NCAA Division I game, scoring 24 points — on 9-of-11 shooting, no less — to help his Florida State squad roll to a 105-73 win over North Carolina State on Wednesday.

It might have been Evans' first start for the Seminoles since joining the program in 2019, but it was a long time in the making. He said he used last season "like a learning year," and that experience is paying dividends this year. Evans has played in all eight of Florida State's games and is averaging 7.4 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game. He's doing it efficiently, too, shooting 47.4% from the floor, 45.5% from 3-point range and 91.7% from the free throw line.

"It's been a great journey. Last year I got the opportunity to learn from a bunch of veterans here. Trent Forrest, he's a great point guard, I got to watch him every day, compete with him and be able just to learn," Evans said. "... This year I've been able to apply everything I've learned, just embrace my role and do what I have to do for this team. It's been a great journey, it's been a challenging journey, but it's led me to become the player that I am today."

The player today is living out the dream of the player from years prior.

Evans was a high school star in Montana, bursting onto the scene as a sophomore at Skyview in 2015. As a junior, he helped the Falcons win their second consecutive Class AA state basketball championship. As a senior, he was one of the best players in the state, averaging 18.2 points, 6.3 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game and helping the Falcons to a third-place finish at the state tournament.

Evans originally committed to play college basketball at Rocky Mountain College, but he was a non-academic qualifier, which ultimately led him to North Idaho College, one of the premier junior college basketball programs in the Pacific Northwest. He had a stellar two-year career at NIC and became a big-time recruit on the transfer market. The likes of Georgetown, Washington State and Gonzaga showed their interest, but Evans was all-in on Florida State and the ACC.

Now in Tallahassee, Evans has shown he belongs — Wednesday's breakout game being the final point of affirmation. "It felt good. I felt like I showed my teammates and the ACC what I'm capable of as a player, but more importantly we got the win, and that's what I was more excited about," said Evans, a 6-foot-4 senior point guard. "One of our teammates came off the bench, had 18 points, Nate Jack, so I was really just proud of our team and the way we performed. I was just happy for everyone else."

Florida State is 6-2 this season after last year's remarkable 26-5 season where they won the ACC regular-season championship. The Seminoles never got to finish out their postseason, though, as the coronavirus pandemic shut down the ACC and NCAA tournaments.

Since then, the pandemic has continued to take its toll on sports across the country, but college basketball teams are persevering through the season. FSU has had three games postponed, with Wednesday's matchup with NC State marking their return to action and first game of 2021. The Seminoles are slated to host North Carolina at 10 a.m. (MT) Saturday.

“It’s been kind of difficult,” Evans said of playing during the pandemic. “You’re so used to your home environment and on-the-road environments with just loud noises and crowds, and now you’re going into environments with no fans at all and all you can hear is each other. It’s quite an adjustment, but as long as you just lock in mentally, I feel like you kind of avoid all that, you kind of don’t really pay attention to it, and I feel like that’s what our team has been doing pretty well, just getting locked into the game and focusing on each other. Whether there’s fans or not, we’re just going to continue to play how we’ve been playing.”

And all of those games are still broadcast to a national audience, usually on ESPN or the ACC Network.

“At first, it was a different feeling just knowing that this game might be on ESPN, because that’s what you dream of as a kid, just playing on TV,” Evans said, before adding that that no longer registers.

In fact, having his games available on national broadcasts has become a big benefit of playing at Florida State. Evans’ family back in Montana can watch and cheer from afar, and he receives plenty of support from the Treasure State. Social media buzzes whenever he’s in action — especially when he has a big game like he did against NC State — though he’s not likely to see it.

“I’ve felt the support ... through high school to now,” Evans said. “My mom’s always calling me, talking about people are supporting you at home, and you really don’t realize until you hear it from other people, because I’m not really on social media much so I don’t see it. But I hear it all the time, and it’s just a good feeling to know that there’s support back home.”

The pride works both ways, too. Evans receives the support from back home, but he’s embraced the opportunity to showcase his Native American heritage on some of college basketball’s biggest stages.

“All of my family back home in Montana are Native Americans. To be able to show people that I’m proud of where I come from, where my heritage is, and to see that this program really takes pride in that as well — like, we have jerseys dedicated to that — it’s a great feeling,” he said. “I’m very prideful when I wear those jerseys and just wear my Native American culture on my sleeve, so it’s a great feeling to be able to represent my home that way.”

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Highly touted freshman Scottie Barnes scored 17 points and No. 20 Florida State extended its dominance against the Gators with an 83-71 victory that came after Florida suddenly lost its best player. The Seminoles led by as many as 18 in the second half. They ended up extending their winning streak against Florida to seven games, tying the longest by either team in the series. They also stretched their winning streak against nonconference opponents at home to 41 and won their 26th straight at home. Barnes, Anthony Polite and M.J. Walker made this one look easy most of the day. Barnes, the top-rated recruit of Hamilton's tenure in Tallahassee, had two thunderous dunks and was 7-of-10 shooting. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – RayQuan Evans scored a career-high 24 points, M.J. Walker added 19 and Florida State made 70.7 percent of its field goals in beating North Carolina State 105-73. Evans was 9 of 11 from the floor and Walker 6 of 7 as Florida State finished 41 of 58, including 12 of 18 from 3-point range, to set a program best for shooting percentage in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
