FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO LOUISVILLE FOR FIRST BIG MONDAY GAME OF THE YEAR

Florida State, which has won two straight and three of its last four games, travels to play at Louisville at the KFC YUM! Center on Monday, January 18, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. in the first Big Monday game of the year on ESPN. The Seminoles won two games last week with victories over NC State (January 13, 105-73) and North Carolina (January 16, 82-75) in which they averaged 93.5 points scored and shot .602 percent from the field (65 of 108). The Seminoles' game against Louisville on Monday is the only scheduled meeting between the two teams during the regular season and is Florida State's second road game of the season. The Seminoles played their first six games of the season at home before traveling to play at Clemson. After having three games postponed (Duke at home, January 2; at Syracuse, January 6; at Pittsburgh, January 9), the Seminoles played host to the Wolfpack and the Tar Heels and earned two victories to extend their ACC home winning streak to 20 games. Following Monday's game against Louisville, the Seminoles play host to Clemson (January 23) and Miami (January 27) before beginning a three-game road swing at Georgia Tech (January 30).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 32-10 (.762 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and are 3-1 this season.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 62-15 (.805 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 7-2 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won nearly 86 percent of their games with a record of 24-4 (.857 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN ITS TWO WINS OVER NC STATE AND NORTH CAROLINA...

...Shot a combined .602 from the field (65 of 108) and averaged 32.5 made field goals per game in defeating the Wolfpack and the Tar Heels. The Seminoles set a program record for ACC games as they shot .707 from the field (41 of 58) in their win over the Wolfpack;

...Shot a combined .588 from the 3-point line (20 of 34) and averaged 10.0 made 3-point field goals. The Seminoles shot .667 from the bonusphere (12 of 18) in their win over NC State;

...Shot a combined .974 percent from the free throw line (37 of 38) and have missed only one free throw in its two wins last week. The Seminoles were a perfect 11 of 11 from the free throw line against the Wolfpack and a near-perfect 26 of 27 from the line in their win over the Tar Heels. At one point, the Seminoles made 32 consecutive free throws during the two games.

FLORIDA STATE – THE NEWBLOODS

Florida State, which characterizes itself as one of the NewBloods of college basketball, will look to earn another win over one of the BlueBloods of college basketball when it plays at Louisville on Monday. The Seminoles have earned victories over North Carolina (3rd all-time winningest collegiate program), Indiana (10th winningest all-time collegiate program) and NC State (25th all-time winningest collegiate program) so far this season.

HAMILTON WITH 74 WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Monday's game against No. 16/18 Louisville looking for his 75th career win over a nationally ranked team. He earned two wins over ranked teams at Oklahoma State, 17 at Miami and 55 at Florida State. He has earned four wins over No. 1 ranked teams: against No. 1 Oklahoma (February 4, 1989 while at Oklahoma State); against No. 1 Duke (March 1, 2006 while at Florida State); against No. 1 North Carolina (March 4, 2009 while at Florida State) and against No. 1 Duke (January 12, 2011 while at Florida State). The Seminoles defeated Louisville twice last season when they were ranked No. 11 in the nation (January 4, 2020) and February 24, 2020).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Louisville and gain a win over a ranked team for the second time this season. The Seminoles defeated No. 25 Florida in Tallahassee on December 12 (83-71);

...Defeat Louisville and gain its fourth consecutive victory over Louisville. It would mark the longest winning streak by the Seminoles over the Cardinals during the history of the series which began on December 16, 1968.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Wednesday's game against NC State as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 367 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

HAMILTON ON BALLOT FOR NAISMITH HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2021

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, who has won nearly 600 games and who is the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, was named as an eligible candidate for the Naismith Hall of Fame Class of 2021. Hamilton highlights the list of four first time coaching candidates including Ken Anderson (Wisconsin-Eau Claire), Lou Henson (Hardin-Simmons, New Mexico State, Illinois) and Paul Westhead (NBA and college). Hamilton has been named as the National Coach of the Year four times and by four different national governing bodies. He was named the Clarence "Big House" Gaines National Coach of the Year in 2018, the Basketball Times Coach of the Year in 2009, the BCA National Coach of the Year in 2000 and the UPI National Coach of the Year in 1995. Hamilton has also been named the ACC Coach of the Year three times (2009, 2012 and 2020) and the Big East Coach of the Year twice (1995 and 1999).

FLORIDA STATE WITH NINE VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State enters its game against No. 16/18 Louisville with one victory over a nationally ranked team this season (No. 25 Florida, 83-71, December 12) and 11 wins over nationally ranked opponents since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season and have defeated a school-record 55 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE IN THE LAST THREE GAMES

Florida State has shot a combined .915 from the free throw line in its last three games and enters Monday's game against Louisville ranked sixth in the ACC team free throw shooting percentage. The Seminoles are one of only six teams in the ACC shooting above 74 percent from the line for the season.

FLORIDA STATE'S INCREASED FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has said through the 2020-21 season that his team is a good free throw shooting team. Hamilton's players have begun to prove the three-time ACC Coach of the Year to be correct. The Seminoles are shooting better than 91 percent from the free throw line in the last three games and enter Monday's game shooting a season-high .746 from the free throw line.

DOUBLE FIGURE STEALS FOR SEMINOLES IN WIN OVER NORTH CAROLINA

Florida State totaled 10 steals in its victory over North Carolina on Saturday and enter Monday's game against Louisville ranked sixth in the ACC with a 7.7 steals per game average. The Seminoles totaled a season-high 12 steals in its season opening victory over North Florida and have earned at least five steals in each of their first nine games of the season.

SEMINOLES OUTREBOUND NORTH CAROLINA IN VICTORY OVER TAR HEELS

Florida State accomplished a feat that few teams achieve against North Carolina in its victory over the Tar Heels by winning the rebounding battle. The Seminoles outrebounded the Tar Heels by a 30-29 margin and held North Carolina to 13 offensive rebounds. The Tar Heels lead the ACC with a +12.1 rebounding margin while also leading the ACC with a 16.4 offensive rebounds per game margin.

FLORIDA STATE LEADS THE ACC IN BLOCKED SHOTS

Florida State enters Monday's game against Louisville as the ACC leaders in blocked shots with 5.0 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles totaled six blocked shots in its win over North Carolina, blocked seven shots in their win over NC State on Wednesday in Tallahassee and have earned 19 blocked shots in their last three ACC games at Clemson (six), against NC State (seven) and in their most recent win over North Carolina (six). Florida State totaled a season-high eight blocked shots in its win over Gardner-Webb on December 21.

FLORIDA STATE'S MINUTES PLAYED CHART

Florida State enters Monday's game at Louisville with nine players averaging at least 11.3 minutes played per game. Senior M.J. Walker is averaging a career-high 31.0 minutes played per game while Anthony Polite (28.1 mpg), Scottie Barnes (24.7 mpg) and RaiQuan Gray (25.3 mpg) are all averaging more than 24 minutes played per game. Seminole head Coach Leonard Hamilton, who has utilized two starting lineup the first nine games of the season (Gray, Balsa Koprivica, Polite, Barnes and Walker) in the first seven games and (Gray, Koprivica, Polite, Walker and RayQuan Evans) in the last two games.

FLORIDA STATE VS. LOUISVILLE – THE LAST GAME

Trent Forrest scored 14 of his 16 points after halftime, and No. 6 Florida State rallied from a double-digit deficit to beat No. 11 Louisville 82-67 on December 24, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles moved past the Cardinals into first place in the ACC with the win. Patrick Williams' thunderous dunk put an exclamation point to a 15-0 run that put the Seminoles ahead for good. Florida State outscored Louisville 50-27 in the second half and extended its home winning streak to 22 games. Devin Vassell and M.J. Walker each scored 12 points for FSU, which set a school record for ACC regular-season wins with three remaining in the 20-game schedule. Ryan McMahon scored 14 points and Jordan Nwora had 13 points and eight rebounds for Louisville, which went more than seven minutes without a field goal during one second-half stretch. The Cardinals played short-handed most of the night after junior center Malik Williams injured his left foot minutes into the game. He returned to the bench with a boot on the foot.

Former Billings Skyview Standout RayQuan Evans Thriving On Big Stage At Florida State

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — RayQuan Evans didn't receive much notice before making his first start in the ACC.

"I found out I was going to be starting a couple minutes before the game," Evans told MTN Sports. "It didn't change my mindset. I just had to play my role, move the ball, score when I need to, bring energy, be that glue guy, so that's what I tried to do, just play my role and tried not to change anything."

Maybe the short notice was for the best. The former Billings Skyview High School basketball standout had his best NCAA Division I game, scoring 24 points — on 9-of-11 shooting, no less — to help his Florida State squad roll to a 105-73 win over North Carolina State on Wednesday.

It might have been Evans' first start for the Seminoles since joining the program in 2019, but it was a long time in the making. He said he used last season "like a learning year," and that experience is paying dividends this year. Evans has played in all eight of Florida State's games and is averaging 7.4 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game. He's doing it efficiently, too, shooting 47.4% from the floor, 45.5% from 3-point range and 91.7% from the free throw line.

"It's been a great journey. Last year I got the opportunity to learn from a bunch of veterans here. Trent Forrest, he's a great point guard, I got to watch him every day, compete with him and be able just to learn," Evans said. "... This year I've been able to apply everything I've learned, just embrace my role and do what I have to do for this team. It's been a great journey, it's been a challenging journey, but it's led me to become the player that I am today."

The player today is living out the dream of the player from years prior.

Evans was a high school star in Montana, bursting onto the scene as a sophomore at Skyview in 2015. As a junior, he helped the Falcons win their second consecutive Class AA state basketball championship. As a senior, he was one of the best players in the state, averaging 18.2 points, 6.3 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game and helping the Falcons to a third-place finish at the state tournament.

Evans originally committed to play college basketball at Rocky Mountain College, but he was a non-academic qualifier, which ultimately led him to North Idaho College, one of the premier junior college basketball programs in the Pacific Northwest. He had a stellar two-year career at NIC and became a big-time recruit on the transfer market. The likes of Georgetown, Washington State and Gonzaga showed their interest, but Evans was all-in on Florida State and the ACC.

Now in Tallahassee, Evans has shown he belongs — Wednesday's breakout game being the final point of affirmation. "It felt good. I felt like I showed my teammates and the ACC what I'm capable of as a player, but more importantly we got the win, and that's what I was more excited about," said Evans, a 6-foot-4 senior point guard. "One of our teammates came off the bench, had 18 points, Nate Jack, so I was really just proud of our team and the way we performed. I was just happy for everyone else."

Florida State is 6-2 this season after last year's remarkable 26-5 season where they won the ACC regular-season championship. The Seminoles never got to finish out their postseason, though, as the coronavirus pandemic shut down the ACC and NCAA tournaments.

Since then, the pandemic has continued to take its toll on sports across the country, but college basketball teams are persevering through the season. FSU has had three games postponed, with Wednesday's matchup with NC State marking their return to action and first game of 2021. The Seminoles are slated to host North Carolina at 10 a.m. (MT) Saturday.

“It’s been kind of difficult,” Evans said of playing during the pandemic. “You’re so used to your home environment and on-the-road environments with just loud noises and crowds, and now you’re going into environments with no fans at all and all you can hear is each other. It’s quite an adjustment, but as long as you just lock in mentally, I feel like you kind of avoid all that, you kind of don’t really pay attention to it, and I feel like that’s what our team has been doing pretty well, just getting locked into the game and focusing on each other. Whether there’s fans or not, we’re just going to continue to play how we’ve been playing.”

And all of those games are still broadcast to a national audience, usually on ESPN or the ACC Network.

“At first, it was a different feeling just knowing that this game might be on ESPN, because that’s what you dream of as a kid, just playing on TV,” Evans said, before adding that that no longer registers.

In fact, having his games available on national broadcasts has become a big benefit of playing at Florida State. Evans’ family back in Montana can watch and cheer from afar, and he receives plenty of support from the Treasure State. Social media buzzes whenever he’s in action — especially when he has a big game like he did against NC State — though he’s not likely to see it.

“I’ve felt the support ... through high school to now,” Evans said. “My mom’s always calling me, talking about people are supporting you at home, and you really don’t realize until you hear it from other people, because I’m not really on social media much so I don’t see it. But I hear it all the time, and it’s just a good feeling to know that there’s support back home.”

The pride works both ways, too. Evans receives the support from back home, but he’s embraced the opportunity to showcase his Native American heritage on some of college basketball’s biggest stages.

“All of my family back home in Montana are Native Americans. To be able to show people that I’m proud of where I come from, where my heritage is, and to see that this program really takes pride in that as well — like, we have jerseys dedicated to that — it’s a great feeling,” he said. “I’m very prideful when I wear those jerseys and just wear my Native American culture on my sleeve, so it’s a great feeling to be able to represent my home that way.”

Game 8 -- Florida State 105, NC State 73

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- RayQuan Evans scored a career-high 24 points, M.J. Walker added 19 and Florida State made 70.7 percent of its field goals in beating North Carolina State 105-73. Evans was 9 of 11 from the floor and Walker 6 of 7 as Florida State finished 41 of 58, including 12 of 18 from 3-point range, to set a program best for shooting percentage in an Atlantic Coast Conference game. It was the program's fifth-best percentage, spanning all contests, behind a 72.7% shooting performance against Minnesota in the 1979-80 season. Florida State trailed 9-8 before scoring 31 of the next 37 points to take control. Ten different Seminoles scored during the stretch -- led by Nathanael Jack's five points. The Seminoles made 20 of 28 field goals (71.4 percent) in the opening 20 minutes, going 7 of 10 from 3-point range. Jack missed just one of his eight field goals and finished with 18 points for Florida State (6-2, 2-1), which also made all 11 of its free throws. The Seminoles have won 19 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Thomas Allen scored 16 points with four 3-pointers for N.C. State (6-4, 2-3). Devon Daniels added 14 points and Jericole Hellemis had 12 points and six rebounds.
