NATIONALLY RANKED SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO MIAMI ON WEDNESDAY IN TALLAHASSEE

Florida State, which moved back into the national rankings this week following a two-week absence, plays host to Miami at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on Wednesday, January 27, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. The Seminoles and the Hurricanes meet for the first of two times this season as they are scheduled to play on February 24 in Coral Gables. Florida State enters its game against Miami having won four straight games with victories over NC State, North Carolina, Louisville and Clemson and four of its last five games dating to its 72-59 win over Gardner-Webb on December 21. The Seminoles are 8-1 at home this season and have won 21 consecutive ACC home games dating back to a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Following Wednesday's game against Miami, the Seminoles travel to play at Georgia Tech on January 30 at McCamish Pavilion in Atlanta before a scheduled road game at Boston College on February 2.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 21 STRAIGHT ACC HOME GAMES

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Miami having won 21 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' ACC winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Their most recent ACC victory at home came as an 80-61 win over Clemson on Saturday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles 21-game ACC home-game winning streak is tied for the third longest streak in ACC history.

SEMINOLES' BARNES NAMED A TOP-10 CANDIDATE FOR THE COUSY AWARD

Florida State freshman Scottie Barnes, the Seminoles' leader in assists and steals, has been named as one of the Top 10 candidates for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. Barnes is one of three freshmen from around the nation and one of only two players from the ACC selected as one of the top candidates for the award named for former Boston College and Holy Cross guard Bob Cousy. Barnes enters Wednesday's game against Miami at the Donald L. Tucker Center as Florida States' leader in assists (40 / 4.0 apg) and steals (14 / 1.4 spg) while ranking second in scoring (10.6 ppg) and fourth in rebounding (40 / 4.0 rpg). He ranks fifth in the ACC in assist:turnover ratio (2.1:1) and seventh in the ACC in assists.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and win its sixth consecutive game against the Hurricanes. A win would match the Seminoles' longest winning streak against Miami since winning six straight from February 18, 2009 through February 11, 2012. Florida State has earned two winning streaks of six games (December 6, 1968-January 6, 1971 and February 18, 2009-February 11, 2012) against Miami in the history of the series which began on December 19, 1950;

...Defeat Miami and win its fifth consecutive ACC game. A win would mark the Seminole's fourth ACC winning streak of at least five games in the last three seasons.

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Miami looking to improve to 6-1 in ACC play for the second consecutive season. The Seminoles improved to 7-1 in ACC play before losing their second conference game during the 2019-20 season.

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Wednesday's game against Miami as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 367 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

HAMILTON ON BALLOT FOR NAISMITH HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2021

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, who has won nearly 600 games and who is the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, was named as an eligible candidate for the Naismith Hall of Fame Class of 2021. Hamilton highlights the list of four first time coaching candidates including Ken Anderson (Wisconsin-Eau Claire), Lou Henson (Hardin-Simmons, New Mexico State, Illinois) and Paul Westhead (NBA and college). Hamilton has been named as the National Coach of the Year four times and by four different national governing bodies. He was named the Clarence "Big House" Gaines National Coach of the Year in 2018, the Basketball Times Coach of the Year in 2009, the BCA National Coach of the Year in 2000 and the UPI National Coach of the Year in 1995. Hamilton has also been named the ACC Coach of the Year three times (2009, 2012 and 2020) and the Big East Coach of the Year twice (1995 and 1999).

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON NEARLY 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 74-4 (.949 winning percentage) in its last 78 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Miami having won .949 percent of their games (74-4) and .930 percent of their ACC games (40-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles are 8-1 at home this season, were 16-0 at home last season (including 10-0 in ACC play), were 15-1 at home (including 8-1 in the ACC) during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in the 2016-17 season.

FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 64-15 (.810 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 9-2 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won nearly 87 percent of their games with a record of 26-4 (.867 winning percentage).

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 34-10 (.773 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and are 5-1 this season.

FLORIDA STATE OFFENSIVELY IN THE LAST FOUR GAMES

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Miami as the hottest team in the league with four consecutive victories over three teams with a combined 10 ACC wins (Louisville, 4; North Carolina, 4; NC State, 2). During that span of three wins, the Seminoles have moved to within one game of the conference lead, they have shot .536 percent from the field, .527 from the 3-point line and .917 from the free throw line while averaging 88.3 points scored per game.

FLORIDA STATE GOES ON THE DEFENSIVE

Florida State's defense limited Clemson to 61 points and a .304 field goal shooting percentage in its 80-61 win over the Tigers on Saturday in Tallahassee. It marked the fewest points the Seminoles have allowed in an ACC game this season (tied for the fewest, 61, also against Georgia Tech, on December 15) the lowest field goal percentage the Seminoles have allowed this season and the fewest number of field goals Florida State has surrendered this season. Florida State has held five of its opponents to below 40 percent shooting from the field and held two opponents (North Florida and Gardner-Webb) under 60 points scored. In two ACC games against Clemson, the Seminoles held the Tigers to a combined .336 field goal shooting percentage (40-119).

SEMINOLES AMONG ACC'S DEFENSIVE LEADERS

Florida State, which limited Clemson to a .304 shooting percentage in its 80-61 victory over the Tigers on Saturday, enter Wednesday's game against Miami ranked third in the ACC with a .400 defensive field goal mark in holding five of its first 11 opponents below 40 percent shooting from the field, the Seminoles are one of only three ACC teams who are holding their opponents to a combined defensive field goal percentage mark of 40 percent or lower this season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

M.J. Walker and Patrick Williams each scored 14 points as No. 8 Florida State beat Miami 99-81 on February 8, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee for a two-game season series sweep between the Seminoles and the Hurricanes. Devin Vassell had 13 points and Wyatt Wilkes scored 11, knocking down three 3-pointers, for the Seminoles. Florida State connected on 13 of 26 3-point attempts. Isaiah Wong had a career-high 23 points on 8 of 12 shooting for Miami. Sam Waardenburg added 15 points, Harlond Beverly had 14 and DJ Vasiljevic scored 12 on 5-of-13 shooting. Anthony Polite had eight rebounds for Florida State, which outrebounded Miami 46-24. The Seminoles also made 16 of 17 free-throw attempts. Five players scored in double figures and the Seminoles' bench outscored Miami's reserves 54-11. Thirteen players scored for the Seminoles, including walk-ons Travis Light and Harrison Prieto.

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.500 Freshman Scottie Barnes is shooting .500 from the 3-point line (three of six) in the last two games.

.571 Junior Sardaar Calhoun is shooting .571 from the 3-point line (eight of 14) in the last three games. He made his career-high of four 3-point shots in scoring his career-high of 15 points in Florida State's 80-6 victory over Clemson on Saturday in Tallahassee.

.833 Senior Nathanael Jack is shooting .833 from 2-point range (five of six) and a career-high .391 from the 3-point line (14 of 29) entering Wednesday's game against Miami.

.947 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray has made 18 of his last 19 free throw attempts (.947 percent) and is shooting a career-high .800 percent from the line through the first 11 games of the season.

1 Sophomore Balsa Koprivica totaled 13 points and a career-high 10 rebounds against Clemson to earn his first career double double.

1 Senior M.J. Walker is shooting a career-high .920 percent from the free throw line this season and is the only player in the ACC who is shooting above 90 percent from the free throw line.

6 Redshirt junior Wyatt Wilkes has blocked six shots this season including two in Florida State's victories over North Florida and Clemson on Saturday in Tallahassee. He blocked a total of five shots in his first three seasons and 49 games as a Seminole.

6 Redshirt junior Malik Osborne has made six consecutive free throws and is shooting a career-high .923 percent from the free throw line through the first 11 games of the season.

6 Senior Tanor Ngom has six blocked shots in Florida State's last four games including his career-high of three in Florida State's 105-73 victory over NC State on January 13.

8 Florida State has eight players in its rotation (RaiQuan Gray, Balsa Koprivica, Anthony Polite, Scottie Barnes, M.J. Walker, Wyatt Wilkes, Malik Osborne and RayQuan Evans) who all have experience as starters.

9 Florida State is undefeated, 9-0, when it outscores its opponent.

10 Senior RayQuan Evans has made 10 consecutive free throws and is shooting a career-high .938 from the free throw line for the season entering Wednesday's game against Miami. He is a perfect 10 of 10 from the free throw line in Florida State's six ACC games.

10 Florida State has won 10 consecutive overtime games entering Wednesday's game against Miami.

Scottie Barnes – I chose to wear No. 4 at Florida State because of the many great players before me who played at Florida State and wore No. 4, including most recently Dwayne Bacon and Patrick Williams. Both players were great Seminoles and both were drafted into the NBA.

RayQuan Evans – There is no particular reason why I wear No. 0 at Florida State. I wore the same number at Northern Idaho and I really like the way it looks. It's a very unique number and I feel that I'm a unique player.

RaiQuan Gray – I chose to wear No. 1 at Florida State because I wanted to wear a number that was completely different from any number that I have ever worn before. I wore double digit numbers throughout my career. I wore No. 41 in high school.

Nathanael Jack – I chose to wear No. 11 at Florida State because my younger brother Joshua wears that number as a football player at St. Mary's University in Nova Scotia, Canada. He has been a huge influence on my life and has defied many odds to get where he is in his career. I sincerely admire him for all of the challenges he has been able to overcome.

Balsa Koprivica – I wear No. 5 because I have worn the number throughout my high school and AAU career. I feel like it's been a good number, so I asked for it when I committed to Florida State and was lucky to get it.

Tanor Ngom -- I try to model my game after AD (Anthony Davis) and all the bigs in the league that can do more than just dunk. Giannis is who I eventually want to play like and his number is 34; I also wear the No. 34 because of Shaquille O'Neal in his Laker days – who along with Anthony Davis – are two of the most dominant players ever to play this game.

Anthony Polite – I wear No. 2 at Florida State because I am the second member of my family to play at Florida State. My dad, Michael, wore No. 45 during his career as a Seminole. (1988, 1989, 1991).

M.J. Walker -- I wear No. 23 because LeBron James has been my favorite player for as long as I can remember. I was about four years old when he began playing in the NBA and I have patterned my game after him. I wore No. 23 throughout high school and during AAU ball.

Wyatt Wilkes -- When I signed to play at Florida State and the coaches asked me which number I wanted to wear, I told them I care about wins and not about uniform numbers. There is no significance to the No. 31 that I wear during my Florida State career. I wore No. 21 in high school.

"After the pump fake, I saw a lot of space to the basket, but there were only three seconds on the shot clock," Osborne said. "I kept telling myself, 'Get to the rim, get to the rim.' I made sure I went up with authority."

Authority? His new nickname should be The General.

Osborne, a junior, nearly ripped the rim off the backboard with a one-handed tomahawk jam that helped the No. 25 Seminoles to a 78-65 ACC road win.

Osborne soared over the block attempt of a Louisville defender for additional style points. He finished with 12 points. The dunk, however, stole the show, landing at No. 3 on the "SportsCenter" top plays.

"When I dunked it, I looked over at the bench and everyone was screaming," Osborne said. "Then I started screaming. It was almost an out-of-body experience."

"After the game, people started saying the dunk had to have made the 'SportsCenter' Top 10."

They were right.

"The next morning, I'm watching 'SportsCenter' and I had to turn in homework for a class," Osborne said. "So I'm trying to do that and watch TV. They get to No. 3 and I hear my name."

"I called my dad and said, 'We're No. 3, we're No. 3.' I've been watching 'SportsCenter' since I was a kid. You always dream of being on the Top 10 plays. It was a fun and exciting moment."

Not soon after, Osborne's phone started to blow up. This is when social media can be worth all of the headaches.

"People were hitting me up on all sorts of platforms," he said. "Twitter, Instagram. People were remembering me from Rich South. It was crazy how it played out."

How Osborne arrived at Florida State is somewhat crazy. He spent his freshman season at Rice, averaging 9.0 points and 6.5 rebounds while playing in 31 games.

He looked to be a big part of program's future.

Osborne, however, decided to transfer.

“I was honored to be a part of the Rice family and thankful they took a chance on me,” he said. “But I believed I could play in a bigger platform and with guys who had the abilities to play in the NBA. I wanted to play against people who are going where I want to be.”

It was a risky decision, but Osborne didn’t want to look back at his life and wonder “what if?”

As it turns out, it was a wise decision.

He sat out one season due to NCAA transfer rules. Last season, he averaged 6.0 points and 4.9 rebounds for the Seminoles.

His contributions, though, extend beyond the numbers.

“Malik is strong, quick, fast and can run and jump,” Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton said. “He’s a really good athlete who can shoot the jump shot.

“He has an unselfish spirit, a competitive spirit and he’s an outstanding teammate. He has a willingness to do whatever you need him to do.”

No different from when he was staring at Rich South.

But Osborne’s greatest impact might be off the court.

He was asked before this school year to join FSU president John Thrasher’s task force on anti-racism, equality and inclusion.

The group, which consists of students, faculty and alumni, shares thoughts on how to make the campus more inclusive and comfortable.

It’s a big honor. One that Osborne takes tremendous pride in.

“When I was sitting in the president’s office and asked to be a part of this, that was another out-of-body experience,” Osborne said. “Being a voice for changes to the diverse student body at a top 25 university in the country is an honor. “It’s a process, but there’s going to be action taken. It’s been an interesting experience. I’m trying to be the best student-athlete I can be.”

Thrasher said Osborne’s contributions will be impacted for years.

“It’s been a pleasure to get to know Malik over the past couple of years,” Thrasher said. “While those who follow college basketball know he’s an accomplished athlete, he’s also an amazing young man.

“I’m so proud of his commitment to tackle issues of racial inequity and injustice. His service on Florida State’s task force will help ensure a more diverse and inclusive campus for future generations.”

That’s what I call leaving your mark.

Former Billings Skyview Standout RayQuan Evans Thriving On Big Stage At Florida State

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — RayQuan Evans didn't receive much notice before making his first start in the ACC.

"I found out I was going to be starting a couple minutes before the game," Evans told MTN Sports. "It didn't change my mindset. I just had to play my role, move the ball, score when I need to, bring energy, be that glue guy, so that's what I tried to do, just play my role and tried not to change anything."

Maybe the short notice was for the best. The former Billings Skyview High School basketball standout had his best NCAA Division I game, scoring 24 points — on 9-of-11 shooting, no less — to help his Florida State squad roll to a 105-73 win over North Carolina State on Wednesday.

It might have been Evans' first start for the Seminoles since joining the program in 2019, but it was a long time in the making. He said he used last season "like a learning year," and that experience is paying dividends this year. Evans has played in all eight of Florida State's games and is averaging 7.4 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game. He's doing it efficiently, too, shooting 47.4% from the floor, 45.5% from 3-point range and 91.7% from the free throw line.

"It's been a great journey. Last year I got the opportunity to learn from a bunch of veterans here. Trent Forrest, he's a great point guard, I got to watch him every day, compete with him and be able just to learn," Evans said. "... This year I've been able to apply everything I've learned, just embrace my role and do what I have to do for this team. It's been a great journey, it's been a challenging journey, but it's led me to become the player that I am today."

The player today is living out the dream of the player from years prior.

Evans was a high school star in Montana, bursting onto the scene as a sophomore at Skyview in 2015. As a junior, he helped the Falcons win their second consecutive Class AA state basketball championship. As a senior, he was one of the best players in the state, averaging 18.2 points, 6.3 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.1 steals per game and helping the Falcons to a third-place finish at the state tournament.

Evans originally committed to play college basketball at Rocky Mountain College, but he was a non-academic qualifier, which ultimately led him to North Idaho College, one of the premier junior college basketball programs in the Pacific Northwest. He had a stellar two-year career at NIC and became a big-time recruit on the transfer market. The likes of Georgetown, Washington State and Gonzaga showed their interest, but Evans was all-in on Florida State and the ACC.

Now in Tallahassee, Evans has shown he belongs — Wednesday's breakout game being the final point of affirmation. "It felt good. I felt like I showed my teammates and the ACC what I'm capable of as a player, but more importantly we got the win, and that's what I was more excited about," said Evans, a 6-foot-4 senior point guard. "One of our teammates came off the bench, had 18 points, Nate Jack, so I was really just proud of our team and the way we performed. I was just happy for everyone else."

Florida State is 6-2 this season after last year's remarkable 26-5 season where they won the ACC regular-season championship. The Seminoles never got to finish out their postseason, though, as the coronavirus pandemic shut down the ACC and NCAA tournaments.

Since then, the pandemic has continued to take its toll on sports across the country, but college basketball teams are persevering through the season. FSU has had three games postponed, with Wednesday's matchup with NC State marking their return to action and first game of 2021. The Seminoles are slated to host North Carolina at 10 a.m. (MT) Saturday.

“It’s been kind of difficult,” Evans said of playing during the pandemic. “You’re so used to your home environment and on-the-road environments with just loud noises and crowds, and now you’re going into environments with no fans at all and all you can hear is each other. It’s quite an adjustment, but as long as you just lock in mentally, I feel like you kind of avoid all that, you kind of don’t really pay attention to it, and I feel like that’s what our team has been doing pretty well, just getting locked into the game and focusing on each other. Whether there’s fans or not, we’re just going to continue to play how we’ve been playing.”

And all of those games are still broadcast to a national audience, usually on ESPN or the ACC Network.

“At first, it was a different feeling just knowing that this game might be on ESPN, because that’s what you dream of as a kid, just playing on TV,” Evans said, before adding that that no longer registers.

In fact, having his games available on national broadcasts has become a big benefit of playing at Florida State. Evans’ family back in Montana can watch and cheer from afar, and he receives plenty of support from the Treasure State. Social media buzzes whenever he’s in action — especially when he has a big game like he did against NC State — though he’s not likely to see it.

“I’ve felt the support ... through high school to now,” Evans said. “My mom’s always calling me, talking about people are supporting you at home, and you really don’t realize until you hear it from other people, because I’m not really on social media much so I don’t see it. But I hear it all the time, and it’s just a good feeling to know that there’s support back home.”

The pride works both ways, too. Evans receives the support from back home, but he’s embraced the opportunity to showcase his Native American heritage on some of college basketball’s biggest stages.

“All of my family back home in Montana are Native Americans. To be able to show people that I’m proud of where I come from, where my heritage is, and to see that this program really takes pride in that as well — like, we have jerseys dedicated to that — it’s a great feeling,” he said. “I’m very prideful when I wear those jerseys and just wear my Native American culture on my sleeve, so it’s a great feeling to be able to represent my home that way.”

It was the program's fifth-best percentage, spanning all contests, behind a 72.7% shooting performance against Minnesota in the 1979-80 season. Florida State trailed 9-8 before scoring 31 of the next 37 points to take control. Ten different Seminoles scored during the stretch — led by Nathanael Jack's five points. The Seminoles made 20 of 28 field goals (71.4 percent) in the opening 20 minutes, going 7 of 10 from 3-point range. Jack missed just one of his eight field goals and finished with 18 points for Florida State (6-2, 2-1), which also made all 11 of its free throws. The Seminoles have won 19 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Thomas Allen scored 16 points with four 3-pointers for N.C. State (6-4, 2-3). Devon Daniels added 14 points and Jericole Hellems had 12 points and six rebounds.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Balsa Koprivica had 13 points and 10 rebounds for his first career double-double and Florida State pulled away early and routed No. 20 Clemson 80-61. Sardaar Calhoun added a season-best 13 points for Florida State. Calhoun, a junior college transfer, made 4 of 5 3-pointers. John Newman III scored 12 points for Clemson. Florida State used a 15-2 run early in the first half to take a commanding 24-9 lead with 9:16 until halftime. In the first half, Clemson had more turnovers (seven) than made shots (4 of 24). The Tigers were 14 of 16 from the free-throw line, helping to keep them in the game early before the Seminoles poured it on in the second half. Florida State led by 38 with 11:20 left in the game.
