"Not many future lottery picks would buy into this, but Scottie Barnes has. Since returning a few weeks ago from an ankle injury, Leonard Hamilton has opted to bring Barnes off the bench as a reserve. It's paying off. The 6-9 freshman hit a game-tying layup at the end of regulation last Saturday against Wake Forest and then had seven points, six assists, and no turnovers in Monday night's 21-point victory over Virginia. Barnes is engaged on the sidelines when he's not in the game and is visibly excited when his other teammates have success. He's not complaining about his current situation — he's embracing it. Another thing to remember: Florida State has had two of its reserves in the past two years — Mfondu Kabengele and Patrick Williams — drafted in the first round of the NBA Draft."

NO. 9/11 RANKED SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT MIAMI

Florida State, which has won eight of its last nine game and which is currently in first place in the ACC, travels to play at Miami on Wednesday, February 24, 2021 at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla. The Seminoles and the Hurricanes are meeting for the second time this season. Florida State defeated Miami, 81-59, in Tallahassee on January 27, 2021. The Seminoles are in the midst of a three-game road swing which began in Pittsburgh (Won, 79-82), continues at Miami and comes to an end in Chapel Hill on Saturday against North Carolina. Following Wednesday's game at Miami, the Seminoles travel to play at North Carolina on Saturday, February 27 at 4:00 p.m.

SEMINOLES' HAMILTON NAMED TO NAISMITH NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, who has led the Seminoles to a 13-3 overall record and an 9-2 mark in ACC play, has been named to the Late Season Watch List for the Werner Ladder Naismith National Coach of the Year. Hamilton is a candidate for the National Coach of the Year Award for the second consecutive season. He is one of two ACC coaches on the list. Hamilton and his staff have guided the Seminoles to a No. 11 national ranking just one season after losing three players to the NBA and a fourth who is enjoying a significant career as a professional player in Europe. Gone from last season's ACC Championship and NCAA Championship favorite are Patrick Williams (No. 4 overall pick of the Chicago Bulls in the 2021 NBA Draft), Devin Vassell (No. 11 overall pick of the San Antonio Spurs), Trent Forrest (a free agent signee who is currently earning playing with the Utah Jazz) and Dominik Olejniczak (currently averaging a double double in points and rebounds as a standout in the Polish Basketball League). The Seminoles have a 13-3 overall record with four wins over national ranked teams this season. The Seminoles have earned wins over No. 7 Virginia, No. 20 Clemson, No. 25 Florida and No. 25 Louisville and are tied for the ACC lead with four wins over nationally ranked teams this season. Florida State has also earned a win over Indiana in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and has been ranked in the AP and USA Today Polls in 14 of 16 weeks since beginning the season ranked No. 21 in the AP Poll.

WALKER ENTERS WEDNESDAY'S GAME AGAINST MAMI ONLY 7 POINTS FROM 1,000 FOR HIS CAREER

Senior M.J. Walker enters Wednesday's game against Miami with 993 career points and needs only seven points to become the 47th member of the Seminoles' 1,000 career-point club.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC IN THE LAST THREE SEASONS

Florida State is 38-11 (.776 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play in the last three seasons. The Seminoles' 38 wins in ACC play are the most in a three-year span in conference play (Metro Conference and ACC) in the history of the program.

FLORIDA STATE ON THE ROAD IN ACC PLAY

Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Miami looking to win its second consecutive ACC road game after winning at Pittsburgh on Saturday (79-72). The Seminoles are 2-1 in ACC play on the road this season with wins at Louisville and Pittsburgh. Florida State was 6-4 on the road in ACC play during the 2019-20 season and is 8-5 (.615 winning percentage) on the road in ACC play in the last two seasons.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and win its 10th ACC game of the season. It would mark the third consecutive season the Seminoles have reached the 10-win mark in ACC play. The Seminoles won 13 games during the 2018-19 season (13-5 record), won a school-record 16 ACC games during the 2019-20 season (16-4 record) and have won nine ACC games this season (9-2);

...Defeat Miami and gain a season-sweep of the regular season series between the two teams for the third consecutive season;

...Defeat Miami and win its seventh consecutive game against the Hurricanes. The Seminoles' current six-game winning streak is tied for their longest winning streak in the series which dates to the 1950-51 season. Florida State has won six consecutive games from the 1968 through 1971, 2009 through 2012 and now the 2018 through 2021 seasons.

Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

FLORIDA STATE IS THE ACC'S HIGHEST RANKED TEAM

Florida State is ranked No. 9 in the USA Today's Coach's and No. 11 in the Associated Press Poll. As the No. 9 and No. 11 ranked team in the nation, the Seminoles are the highest ranked ACC team in both polls for the third time this season. The Seminoles were also the highest ranked ACC team in December 14 poll (No. 15 in both polls) and week 5 (No. 18 in the AP poll and No. 19 in the Coaches Poll). Florida State has been the highest ranked ACC team in three different polls this season (December 14, December 28 and February 22).

SEMINOLES CONTINUE TO LEAD ACC IN SCORING AND SCORING MARGIN

Florida State leads the ACC in both scoring offense 79.3 points scored per game and scoring margin (+10.2 difference) entering Wednesday's game at Miami. The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC who is averaging more than 77 points per game and are ranked in the top five in the ACC in the categories of scoring offense (79.3 ppg, first), 3-point field goal percentage (.394, second), field goal percentage (.472, third), offensive rebounds per game (11.6, third) and free throw percentage (.740, fourth).

Florida State has blocked at least six shots in eight different games and have blocked seven shots in three different ACC games – in wins over NC State (January 13), Clemson (January 23) and Wake Forest (February 13).

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

Malik Osborne had 11 points and 10 rebounds, RaiQuan Gray added 10 points and 11 rebounds and No. 16 Florida State routed short-handed Miami 81-59 on for its fifth straight victory on January 27, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. M.J. Walker and Sardaar Calhoun also had 11 points apiece for the Seminoles. The Seminoles have won a school-record 22 straight ACC home games. Walker made 5 of 6 shots from the floor, and Calhoun was 4 of 6 shots. Osborne has been a reserve in all of Florida State's games and has now scored in double figures in three of his last four games. Isaiah Wong scored 21 points on 6-of-16 shooting for Miami Anthony Walker and Kameron McGusty each had 13 points. The Seminoles shot 32 of 62 from the floor. The Hurricanes shot 20 of 54. Florida State used a 12-0 run in the second half to extend its lead to 54-33 with 11:06 left. The Seminoles led by 24 points, at 71-47 late in the game.

.474 Redshirt junior Wyatt Wilkes is shooting .474 from the 3-point line (nine of 19) in the last five games. He was a perfect three of three from the bonusphere in Florida State's victory over Wake Forest.

.543 Junior Sardaar Calhoun is shooting .543 from the 3-point line (12 of 22) in the last 10 games (since December 29 against Clemson).

.857 Redshirt junior Malik Osborne is shooting .857 from the free throw line (18 of 21) in the last eight games. He made his season-high of six free throws and scored 12 points in Florida State's 79-72 victory at Pittsburgh on Saturday.

.941 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray is shooting .941 from the free throw line (16 of 17) in the last three games. He was a perfect 10 of 10 from the line in scoring his career-high of 24 points in Florida State's victory over Wake Forest (February 13, 2021).

2 Senior M.J. Walker and redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray are the only two players who have started all 16 games for the Seminoles this season.

4 Senior RayQuan Evans has scored in double figures four times this season (24 vs. NC State, 12 at Pittsburgh, 11 at Louisville and 10 against North Carolina) as compared to zero double figure scoring games as a junior in his first season as a Seminole.

4.3 Freshman Scottie Barnes has a 4.3:1 assists:turnover ratio (13 assists and only three turnovers) in his last three games and 83 minutes played.

8 Florida State has an 8-1 record since senior RayQuan Evans was inserted into the Seminoles' starting lineup on January 13 against NC State.

13 Redshirt junior Anthony Polite has made at least one 3-point field goal in each of the 12 games he has played in this season. He is shooting a career-high .500 from the 3-point line (21 of 42) for the season.

13 Florida State is undefeated, 13-0, when it outscores its opponent.

84.0 Florida State has scored 252 points in its last three games (92 vs. Wake Forest, 81 vs. Virginia and 79 vs. Pittsburgh) and is averaging 84.0 points scored per game.

84 Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray has 84 career steals in 81 career games (1.1 steals per game for his career). He has nine steals in the last five games (including three at Georgia Tech) for a 1.8 steals per game average.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

With six players who have made at least 10 3-point field goals this season, Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Miami ranked second in the ACC with a .394 team 3-point field goal shooting percentage. FSU's Scottie Barnes Thriving As 6-9 Point Guard; South Florida Native Drawing Magic Johnson Comparisons

Let's start with the smile and the unbridled enthusiasm. Then the hugs for his teammates, whether on the court for making a big play or in the dining hall, where Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton has seen his freshman guard, Scottie Barnes, make sure to show how much he appreciates every teammates by giving each of them a hug before they sit down.

"He's always been like that," said Kathalyn Wilkins, Barnes' mom who lives in West Palm Beach.

Now to his size and style. A wiry 6-foot-9 with ball-handling skills and quickness that allow him to facilitate, take a defender off the dribble or back down smaller, helpless opponents.

We're talking about Barnes, but close your eyes and image that same player wearing a green Michigan State uniform four decades ago.

"I watched Magic Johnson a lot," Barnes said last week. "Highlights, Instagram. You see how much of a great point guard he was, how he could find people, get them shots, how flashy he was. Just what he brought to the game. He played with so much excitement. You could see the smile and joy on his face. That's something I got, smile and joy and bring a lot of fun and passion to the game.

"Get assists, score when he wants to score, rebound the ball, push it in transition. You could see all that."

Some get offended when young players are compared to legendary, once-in-a-generation Hall of Famers. Nobody is saying Scottie Barnes is on the same track as an NCAA champion, five-time NBA champion, 12 time All-Star and three-time NBA MVP.

But watch video from FSU's season — or tune in Wednesday when No. 11 Florida State (13-3) and Miami (7-13) tip off at 8:30 p.m. at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables — and when you see Barnes jumping into the arms of center Balsa Koprivica during the Georgia Tech game, you could be watching Magic hugging Kareem Abdul-Jabbar in his Lakers debut. Or when Barnes easily gets to the basket to beat Indiana or send the Wake Forest game into overtime, that could be Magic in the old Boston Garden crushing the Celtics.

Barnes Bound For NBA Draft Lottery

When you hear coaches say of the uber-versatile that they can play 1 through 5 ... Barnes can play 1 through 5.

Which means he can be un-guardable at times.

And with 6-9 point guards a luxury, don't think the NBA hasn't noticed. With a 7-2 wingspan and 9-foot standing reach, Barnes is a virtual lock for the lottery and likely a top-10 pick in this summer's draft.

"His best basketball is ahead of him," Hamilton said. "He's in the transition period and he's doing pretty good."

That transition from power forward to point guard is not one you typically see. Barnes grew up in West Palm Beach, attended Cardinal Newman High School for one year, moved onto University School in Fort Lauderdale for two years before completing high school at Montverde Academy.

While coaches saw a post player and a wing, one who could facilitate but still a forward, Hamilton knew immediately what was best for this unique talent.

“When you see him playing as a high school kid you see an athletic, hard-nosed, tough, physical guy who loves contact, who can rebound, drive,” Hamilton said. “But what I saw was a high-IQ basketball player, a guy that has the ability to make everybody around him better. I saw unselfish spirit.

“He had ball handling skills, dribbling and passing skills unique for a guy of his size.”

Hamilton’s vision is a big reason Barnes chose FSU, becoming the highest-rated recruit in school history, No. 5 overall.

“At point guard the ball’s in my hands I just make a lot of great plays,” Barnes said. “Being here it’s helped me develop a lot more. It’s helped my game out a lot.”

Barnes is averaging 10.3 points, third on the team behind M.J. Walker and RaiQuan Gray. He leads the Seminoles with 4.2 assist and averages 3.9 rebounds. He is second in the ACC with a 2.33 assist-to-turnover ratio. Twice he has been named the conference Freshman of the Week.

Looking for a weaknesses: Barnes is shooting .549 from the free throw line (25 of 51) and .258 on 3s (8 of 31).

“He’s had to make more of an adjustment than anybody in America,” Hamilton said. “Most guys playing point guard at this level on a nationally-ranked team, they’ve been playing point guard since they were in eighth grade.”

Hoops Day and Night In West Palm Beach

Kathalyn Wilkins gets emotional talking about her son. She was overwhelmed when she walked into the Donald Tucker Center in Tallahassee for the first time to watch him play, and she was emotional last week talking about him during a phone interview.

“It brings tears to my eyes,” she said. “I’m so proud of him. When I see him on TV, I say ‘This is my son,’ because I know how hard he worked for it.

“Ever since he was in the third grade he always walked around with a basketball. He’d run track. When he got home from track practice, he went straight to the Salvation Army to play basketball. I used to see him in the middle of the night in the road just practicing.”

Wilkins raised Barnes and his three siblings alone from the time Scottie was around 11. They lived downtown, just north of what is now Rosemary Square. It wasn’t easy. At times she doubted herself, saying sometimes as a single parent “you feel like you may have let them down.”

But it was that reinforcement from her children that kept her strong.

“It was hard for her to raise four kids by herself,” Scottie said. “We’ve been through a lot of things together. To see how strong she is, how she maintains herself. She gives it all for her kids.”

Scottie would play at Alice Mickens Park or the Salvation Army, which is where he was discovered by a travel team, giving him his first real exposure. His one year at Cardinal Newman did not work out, at least on the court, although he still was named to the Palm Beach Post’s All-Area Small Schools second team. He said he met a lot of great people and made a lot of friends at the school and loved school but ...

“I was a little immature coming in,” he said about his basketball experience.

But he matured quickly and by his senior year at Montverde, he was finalist for the MaxPreps National Player of the Year and selected to play in the McDonald’s All-American game, the Jordan Brand Classic and the Nike Hoop Summit. Barnes started the first seven games this season at FSU before turning an ankle and missing one game. Since, he’s been coming off the bench, usually about two minutes after tipoff or after he has warmed up on the exercise bike.

“I think it’s really helped him for a couple of minutes seeing the flow of the game and seeing how the other team’s playing,” Hamilton said. “In two minutes he’s coming in giving us a lift.”

For Barnes, it does not matter. He may not start, but he is certain to be on the floor at the end of a close game ... and probably towering over another smaller defender while making a pinpoint pass or backing him down for another crucial basket.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Senior M.J. Walker scored a game-high 17 points and No. 18 Florida State (1-0) opened its 2020-21 season with an 86-58 win against North Florida (0-4) at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles maintained a steady lead throughout the game in winning its 24th consecutive game at home. The win was the Seminoles' sixth consecutive in the series against North Florida. The win upped Florida State's record at the Tucker Center to 66-3 since a victory over Notre Dame on February 7, 2015. The Seminoles have won at home at a 95.6 percent winning percentage in the last four seasons. Reigning ACC Coach of the Year, Leonard Hamilton, has won his 24th opener in the last 26 seasons. Tonight's win also extends the Seminoles' second longest streak in the nation of 39 consecutive non-conference home games.

After surrendering an old-fashioned three-point play to Indiana's Trayce Jackson-Davis to open the extra session, the Seminoles outscored the Hoosiers 7-2 over the final 4:38 of the extra session. The Hoosiers were unable to score from the floor and managed on two free throws in the final 4:38 of overtime.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – RayQuan Evans scored a career-high 24 points, M.J. Walker added 19 and Florida State made 70.7 percent of its field goals in beating North Carolina State 105-73. Evans was 9 of 11 from the floor and Walker 6 of 7 as Florida State finished 41 of 58, including 12 of 18 from 3-point range, to set a program best for shooting percentage in an Atlantic Coast Conference game. Game 13 -- Georgia Tech 76, Florida State 65

ATLANTA, Ga. -- Moses Wright scored 23 points and Georgia Tech beat No. 16 Florida State 76-65 on Saturday, ending the Seminoles' five-game winning streak. Florida State had 19 points from RaiQuan Gray but too little offensive help for the junior. The Seminoles lead the ACC with their average of 79.25 points. Hurt by 20 turnovers, they were held to their fewest points of the season. The Seminoles couldn't overcome Wright and the Yellow Jackets' backcourt duo of Jose Alvarado, who had 21 points, and Michael Devoe, who had 19. Wright had six steals and one block. Alvarado added five. Georgia Tech never trailed in the second half and snapped a two-game losing streak. Gray was the Seminoles' only scorer in double figures. Scottie Barnes had nine points. The Yellow Jackets made only 2 of 12 3-point shots in the first half and 7 of 24 overall. The Seminoles finished 3 of 14 on 3s.

Gray scored in double figures for the seventh straight game. Florida State has won 24 consecutive ACC home games dating to a victory over Clemson on Jan. 22, 2019. Trey Murphy III had 13 points and Kihei Clark added 12 in the second half for Virginia, which had won four in a row. Florida State has taken four of the last five meetings at home. The Seminoles shot a robust 29 of 58 (50 percent) from the floor against one of the nation's stingiest defensive programs. Florida State jumped on the Cavaliers early. Gray and Walker had nine points apiece as the Seminoles went 6 of 10 from 3-point range on the way to a stunning 45-25 halftime lead. Murphy's 3-pointer closed the deficit to 48-41 with 14:24 left, but the Cavaliers couldn't cut into the lead any further. Florida State's depth again was a big factor. Balsa Koprivica (nine points), Anthony Polite (eight), Scottie Barnes (seven) and Sardaar Calhoun (six) helped the Seminoles' bench outscore Virginia's reserves 37-20.
