NO. 11/11 FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO BOSTON COLLEGE ON SENIOR NIGHT

Florida State, which is ranked in the nation's top 11 for the second consecutive week, plays its final home game of the 2020-21 season as it plays host to Boston College on Wednesday, March 3, 2021 at 9:00 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. It's the first meeting of the two teams this season after a game scheduled between the two teams on February 2, 2021 was postponed. The Seminoles will honor six players on Senior Night against Boston College – RayQuan Evans, Justin Lindner, Travis Light, Harrison Prieto, Will Miles and M.J. Walker. The Seminoles have won 24 consecutive ACC home game entering their game against Boston College – the second longest ACC home court winning streak in ACC history. Florida State closes out its 2020-21 regular season at Notre Dame on Saturday, March 6 at 12 Noon at the Purcell Pavilion in Notre Dame, Ind. The 2021 ACC Tournament is March 9-13, 2021 at the Greensboro Coliseum.

FLORIDA STATE ANNOUNCES CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR BASKETBALL COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State University Vice President and Director of Athletics David Coburn announced on March 1 that Florida State has extended the contract with head basketball coach Leonard Hamilton through the 2024-25 season. "Coach Hamilton has done so much for this basketball program and this university that it is hard to express in words," said Coburn. "What he does with his young men, both on and off the court, is truly remarkable. I know both the President and I regard him as a university treasure, and he is just now getting the national recognition he has deserved for so long. He embodies all the qualities that make a great leader, and we are proud and thrilled to have him as our coach as long as he wishes." Hamilton's student-athlete graduation rate of just over 95 percent at FSU will improve even more as eight members of his current team will earn degrees (seven as undergraduate degrees and one as a graduate degree) this spring. Two more players will earn graduate degrees in the summer of 2021. "I've known Coach Hamilton since he was hired in 2002 when I was chair of the FSU Board of Trustees," said Florida State President John Thrasher. "He exemplifies the best of college basketball in terms of developing outstanding players and great citizens. His ability to perform his job at such a high level of excellence is appreciated by the Seminole faithful, and we're thrilled Coach Hamilton will continue to lead our program."

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 24 STRAIGHT ACC HOME GAMES

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Boston College having won 24 consecutive ACC games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Only Duke from 1997 to 2000 has won more ACC home games consecutively (26) in the incredible history of the ACC. The Seminoles' ACC winning streak in their home building began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Their most recent ACC victory at home came as an 81-60 win over No. 7 Virginia on February 15.

...Defeat Boston College and win its second consecutive game against the Eagles. The Seminoles defeated the Eagles, 80-62, on March 7, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker in Tallahassee to clinch their first ever ACC regular season championship in the most recent meeting between the two teams;

...Defeat Boston College and win its ninth game in the last 11 meetings against the Eagles. The Seminoles earned a series best six-game winning streak from February 16, 2013 (69-66 in Tallahassee) through February 20, 2017 (104-72 in Tallahassee) and have only lost to the Eagles twice since the 2012-13 season;

...Defeat Boston College and win its 11<sup>th</sup> ACC game of the season. It would mark the third consecutive season the Seminoles have won 11 ACC games. The Seminoles were 13-5 in ACC play during the 2018-19 season, were 16-4 in ACC play in 2019-20 (ACC Regular Season Champions and a school record for ACC wins in a season) and are 10-3 (and in first place in the ACC standings this season).

**HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES**

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Wednesday's game against Boston College as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 374 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

**FLORIDA STATE IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS**

Florida State enters Saturday's game at North Carolina ranked No. 11 in this week's Associated Press poll and No. 11 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and are the highest ranked team in the ACC for the second consecutive week.

**SEMINOLES' HAMILTON NAMED TO NAISMITH NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST**

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, who has led the Seminoles to a 14-4 overall record and a 10-3 mark in ACC play, has been named to the Late Season Watch List for the Werner Ladder Naismith National Coach of the Year. Hamilton is a candidate for the National Coach of the Year Award for the second consecutive season. He is one of two ACC coaches on the list. Hamilton and his staff have guided the Seminoles to a No. 11 national ranking just one season after losing three players to the NBA and a fourth who is enjoying a significant career as a professional player in Europe. Gone from last season's ACC Championship and NCAA Championship favorite are Patrick Williams (No. 4 overall pick of the Chicago Bulls in the 2021 NBA Draft), Devin Vassell (No. 11 overall pick of the San Antonio Spurs), Trent Forrest (a free agent signee who is currently earning playing time with the Utah Jazz) and Dominik Olejniczak (currently averaging a double double in points and rebounds as a standout in the Polish Basketball League).

**FLORIDA STATE HAS WON NEARLY 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015**

Florida State is 76-4 (.950 winning percentage) in its last 80 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Boston College having won .95 percent of their games (76-4) and .935 percent of their ACC games (43-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles are 11-1 at home this season, were 16-0 at home last season (including 10-0 in ACC play), were 15-1 at home (including 8-1 in the ACC) during the 2018-19 season and were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) in the 2016-17 season.

**FLORIDA STATE SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON**

Florida State is 69-17 (.802 winning percentage) since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 29-8 in 2018-19, 26-5 in 2019-20 and are 14-4 this season. Since defeating Clemson on December 8, 2019, the Seminoles have won nearly 85 percent of their games with a record of 31-6 (.838 winning percentage).

**FLORIDA STATE IN THE ACC SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON**

Florida State is 39-12 (.765 winning percentage) in ACC regular season play since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles finished 13-5 in 2019, 16-4 in 2020 and are 10-3 this season.

**SEMINOLES' NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK**

Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 92-85, in overtime on February 13, 2021 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record tying 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles now hold the all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories of 11 along with Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96)

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE**

With six players who have made at least 10 3-point field goals this season, Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Boston College ranked second in the ACC with a .387 team 3-point field goal shooting percentage. With only two Seminole teams in school history shooting better than 40 percent from the 3-point line, the current Seminoles would rank third in school history for 3-point shooting percentage.

**SEMINOLES' 16 STEALS NEARLY SETS FLORIDA STATE RECORD FOR AN ACC GAME**

Led by Scottie Barnes' career-high six steals, Florida State totaled a near team record for ACC games with 16 steals against North Carolina on Saturday. A total of seven Seminoles totaled at least one steal with four players earning multiple steals against the Tar Heels. Florida State's ACC school record of 18 steals in a single game came on February 4, 1996 against NC State.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. BOSTON COLLEGE – THE LAST GAME**

Balsa Koprivica scored 15 points, and No. 7 Florida State won its first Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title in school history with an 80-62 victory over Boston College on March 7, 2020 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Dominik Olejniczak added a season-high 14 points as the Seminoles had a banner ready to celebrate their accomplishment, which was secured with Virginia's victory over No. 10 Louisville. Koprivica matched his season high in points as both of FSU's 7-footers scored in double figures for the first time in ACC play. Patrick Williams had 10 points and six rebounds. Derryck Thornton scored 13 points for Boston College. The Eagles shot just 9-of-33 (27 percent) from 3-point range.

**T1** Freshman Scottie Barnes and redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray are tied for the team lead with 26 steals each. Barnes averages 1.5 steals per game (17 games) while Gray averages 1.4 steals per game (18 games).

**1** Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray is the only Seminole to start all 18 Seminole games this season. He will start his 40<sup>th</sup> consecutive game on Wednesday against Boston College. He has started every Florida State game since December 17, 2019 against North Florida.

**1** Scottie Barnes is ranked first among ACC freshman in both assists (4.3 apg) and assist:turnover ratio (2.4:1).

**1** Sophomore Balsa Koprivica made (and attempted) his first career 3-point shot in Florida State's 81-60 win over Virginia on February 15 in Tallahassee.

**3** Florida State totaled its season-high of 16 steals in Florida State's game against North Carolina. It marked the third time this season – 16 against North Carolina, 12 against North Florida and 10 in their win over North Carolina on January 16 that the Seminoles had totaled 10 or more steals in a game. Florida State is ranked fifth in the ACC in steals (7.6 spg).

**4** Senior RayQuan Evans has scored in double figures four times this season (24 vs. NC State, 12 at Pittsburgh, 11 at Louisville and 10 against North Carolina) as compared to zero double figure scoring games as a junior in his first season as a Seminole.

**4** Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray is one of just four ACC players to rank in the top 15 of the league statistics in both steals (13<sup>th</sup>) and blocked shots (13<sup>th</sup>). He is joined by Moses Wright of Georgia Tech, Alan Griffin of Syracuse and Steffon Mitchell of Boston College as the top all-around defenders in the ACC.

**5** Five Seminole regulars -- Anthony Polite (.463), M.J. Walker (.446), Sardaar Calhoun (.442), Nathanael Jack (.417) and RayQuan Evans (.409) – are shooting better than 40 percent from the 3-point line.

**7** Redshirt junior Anthony Polite has scored in double figures in seven games and averages a career-high 9.5 points per game this season. He scored in double figure in seven games and averaged 4.1 points during the first two seasons of his career.

**14** Florida State is undefeated, 14-0, when it outscores its opponent.

**WALKER SURPASSES 1,000 CAREER POINTS**

Senior M.J. Walker enters Wednesday's game against Boston College with 1,002 points – he surpassed the 1,000 career point mark in the first half of Saturday's game at North Carolina. The senior will play in his 114<sup>th</sup> career game against Boston College and is averaging a career-high 13.1 points per game as a senior.

Senior M.J. Walker is ranked in the top 12 of three different statistical categories in Florida State's record book. He is ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in career free throw shooting percentage (.798); he is 10<sup>th</sup> with 162 career 3-point field goals made and is tied for ninth with 449 career 3-point field goals attempted.

**GRAY IN DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING IN EVERY SEMINOLE GAME SINCE JANUARY 16, 2021**

Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray has scored in double figures in a career-best 10 games – every Seminole game since scoring 19 in Florida State's victory over North Carolina on January 16, 2021. During that span, he has scored at least 15 points seven times and totaled his career-high of 24 points in Florida State's 92-85 win over Wake Forest on February 13. Gray's 216 total points this season stand as a single season career high as do his three double doubles (10 points and 11 rebounds against Miami, January 27, 2021; his career high of 24 points and 12 rebounds against Wake Forest on February 13, 2021; and 12 points and his career-high of 13 rebounds in Florida State's victory at Miami on February 24, 2021).

**POLITE WITH AT LEAST 1 3-POINT FIELD GOAL IN EACH OF HIS 14 GAMES THIS SEASON**

Redshirt junior Anthony Polite has made at least one 3-point field goal in 15 consecutive games – a streak that dates to the Seminoles' victory over Boston College on March 7, 2020. The Seminoles' clinched the first ACC regular season championship in school history in what was their final game of the 2019-20 season. During that span of 15 games, Polite is shooting .464 from the 3-point line (26 of 56) and averages 1.7 3-point field goals made in each game.

**BARNES WITH SIX STEALS AGAINST NORTH CAROLINA**

Freshman Scottie Barnes totaled his career-high of six steals in Florida State's game against North Carolina on Saturday. He became just the 12<sup>th</sup> player in school history with six or more steals in an ACC game. The school record for steals in an ACC game is nine by Bob Sura against Georgia Tech on March 2, 1995. Trent Forrest totaled eight steals against Duke on February 10, 2020. Barnes has totaled nine game with multiple steals including four in Florida State's overtime win over Indiana in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on December 9, 2020 and six against the Tar Heels.

**BARNES' ASSISTS TOTALS RISING**

Freshman Scottie Barnes totaled his career-high of eight assists in Florida State's victory over Miami on February 24 and enters Wednesday's game against Boston College as the highest ranked freshman in the ACC, averaging 4.3 assists.

## **A For Accountability: How 5th-Year Walk-Ons Play Vital Role In FSU Success**

If a text message exchange could define what is so unique about the Florida State men's basketball team, and help explain some of the Seminoles' unprecedented success, this one was it.

On one end was five-star freshman Scottie Barnes. On the other was fifth-year walk-on Justin Lindner.

"I need you to be on me more," Barnes implored his older but lesser-known teammate. "I want to be great, and I want this team to be great."

Barnes is one of the most decorated freshmen in college basketball and an expected lottery pick in the 2021 NBA Draft. He's a 6-foot, 9-inch point guard averaging 10.2 points, 4.3 assists and 3.7 rebounds per game for the No. 16 team in the country.

Lindner is a 6-foot-1, 180-pound walk-on whose greatest individual achievements at FSU include scoring four points against Chicago State in 2019 and earning a bachelor's degree in applied mathematics last May.

Yet it is Barnes who is not only accepting basketball advice and constructive criticism from Lindner, but soliciting it.

And the story is the same throughout the Seminoles' program.

Florida State has four fifth-year senior walk-ons on the roster -- Lindner, Travis Light, Will Miles and Harrison Prieto -- and while they rarely see extended action on the court, they all have become major factors in the rise of the Seminoles' program.

"Those guys are all graduate students," FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton said. "They have been part of our system for four or five years. So they know all of the principles that we emphasize. And the guys in our program want to be called out because they want to be held accountable. So those fifth-year seniors are able to help us with that during practice and games."

Over time, they essentially have become extensions of the coaching staff, and they each have designated "accountability partners" that they help.

Lindner is paired with the point guards -- Barnes, RayQuan Evans and "point forward" RaiQuan Gray. Light's main guys are the shooting guards, while Miles and Prieto work primarily with the forwards and centers.

During offseason workouts, they help demonstrate fundamentals -- particularly when new players arrive in the program. During practices, they typically participate on the scout team and run the opponents' offense and defense. And during games, they provide extra sets of eyes and ears for the coaching staff.

They digest every detail of the Seminoles' game plan for a specific opponent, and then watch from the bench to make sure the scholarship players are executing that plan correctly.

"We have a certain way we like to close out [on shooters], a certain way we want to switch screens," Hamilton said.

"And if someone doesn't do those things correctly, someone else will hold them accountable. We call each other out."

Each of the walk-ons takes his own personal approach to delivering those messages.

When one of the players in his group comes out of a game, Miles said he usually waits for them to get a drink and to catch their breath.

"A lot of times, I'll start off by asking what they see, and then I'll tell them what I see," said Miles, whose father, Bobby, and uncle Blake Miles both played at FSU. "That kind of helps bridge the gap, because it's a different experience when you're off the court versus when you're on the court."

Miles, who is pursuing his master's degree in finance, also tries to always share a positive pointer when he is planning to offer up a critique. Before reminding a teammate that he made a mistake with a defensive assignment, for example, he'll compliment the way they fought through an opponent's box-out to grab a rebound.

Inside the program, Miles said, they call it giving "a little sugar and hot sauce."

"They're doing so many things out there," the Orlando native said. "A lot of times, they're doing a lot more good than bad. But everyone seems to remember the bad."

Light, who is working toward a master's in business administration, said most of his in-game feedback is offering reminders about the scouting report. Maybe the coaches wanted to force a certain player to one side of the court. Or perhaps they wanted to extend their defense against a shooter with excellent range.

Once a game gets going, he said, it's not unusual for some of those details to get overlooked.

"You get caught up in the moment when you're playing the game," said Light, who came to FSU from Virginia. "Everyone does. So it's nice to have someone on the sideline who can kind of watch and observe everything and let you know what corrections you need to make."

Prieto, who is pursuing a master's degree in meteorology, can't help but be amazed at how the seniors' roles have evolved over the last five years.

When they first joined the program, their main job was to serve as able bodies for the scout team. They all were very good high school basketball players, but they also knew they could be easily replaced by a program like FSU. So their top goal was to learn everything they could and simply not mess things up.

Over time, they feel like they've become well-versed in virtually offensive and defensive scheme being used in college basketball.

"In the first year or two, we learned so much basketball," said Prieto, who hails from Louisiana.

Added Miles: "In high school, you might have three plays and probably two defensive sets. Here, you've got different motions, actions, half-court sets, full-court sets ... it's a lot mentally and physically."

Lindner is the only one of the four who actually plans to go into college coaching. So he is not only watching and listening to the players on the court, but he also is paying close attention to Hamilton and his coaching staff.

With the bench area expanded and spaced out this year due to COVID-19 protocols, the Memphis native will purposefully get within earshot of associate head coach Stan Jones to get a feel for what impresses or concerns him.

"We're able to talk strategy a lot," Lindner said. "And I'm able to hear things he's saying and then relay it to players. He's in the huddle, so he can't say every individual thing to every single player. So I'll hear his thoughts and try to relay them."

Like the others, Lindner tries to pick his spots.



All of the walk-ons know better than to start offering their advice when Hamilton or his assistants are speaking, so Lindner will often chime in before the coaches begin or right when the huddle breaks.

He said one of his constant messages to Barnes is to be more aggressive in transition because the freshman is so dangerous in those situations. With Gray, it might be reminders about attacking the offensive glass or stepping up his defense.

And Gray is constantly asking for that feedback, Lindner said. "He's always on me to remind him to get steals and boards."

Because the seniors have been in the program for so long, they often know the offensive and defensive schemes of upcoming opponents before they even get the scouting reports. And during games, they have fun recognizing what plays the other team is running and calling them out to help the players on the floor.

"When we get a stop on that, that definitely means a lot to us," Miles said. "It means we did our job."

That obviously is a major reward in itself. But sometimes, like in Monday's blowout victory against No. 7 Virginia, they get even more noticeable recognition.

With 1:17 remaining, Hamilton inserted Lindner, Light and Miles into the game for the final few possessions. Prieto is nursing an injury and was not available, but the others have now made appearances in six of 15 games this season.

It's a token of Hamilton's appreciation for the quartet's many contributions behind the scenes. And in the minds of the fifth-year seniors, it's one more symbol of what makes the FSU program so special.

When the walk-ons get those late-game opportunities, the scholarship guys usually stand and cheer and smile, hoping each shot will go through the net. They root them on as a way to say thanks for everything they do for the program and for them individually.

"Guys like Scottie Barnes or [current NBA players] Patrick Williams and Devin Vassell, they'll come in and want to learn from us," Prieto said. "That's very cool. It shows the type of character guys that the coaches are recruiting. That they're not egotistical -- they're willing to humble themselves and listen to guys that don't see much of the court but know what's going on."

"That says a lot about the coaching staff and their ability to scout players as people -- not just players."

## Game 1 -- Florida State 86, North Florida 58

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Senior M.J. Walker scored a game-high 17 points and No. 18 Florida State (1-0) opened its 2020-21 season with an 86-58 win against North Florida (0-4) at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles maintained a steady lead throughout the game in winning its 24th consecutive game at home. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – RayQuan Evans scored a career-high 24 points, M.J. Walker added 19 and Florida State made 70.7 percent of its field goals in beating North Carolina State 105-73. Evans was 9 of 11 from the floor and Walker 6 of 7 as Florida State finished 41 of 58, including 12 of 18 from 3-point range, to set a program best for shooting percentage in an Atlantic Coast Conference game. Devon Daniels added 14 points and Jericole Hellemis had 12 points and six rebounds.

**Game 13 -- Georgia Tech 76, Florida State 65**

ATLANTA, Ga. -- Moses Wright scored 23 points and Georgia Tech beat No. 16 Florida State 76-65 on Saturday, ending the Seminoles' five-game winning streak. Florida State had 19 points from RaiQuan Gray but too little offensive help for the junior. The Seminoles lead the ACC with their average of 79.25 points. Hurt by 20 turnovers, they were held to their fewest points of the season. The Seminoles couldn't overcome Wright and the Yellow Jackets' backcourt duo of Jose Alvarado, who had 21 points, and Michael Devoe, who had 19. Wright had six steals and one block. Alvarado added five. Georgia Tech never trailed in the second half and snapped a two-game losing streak. Gray was the Seminoles' only scorer in double figures. Scottie Barnes had nine points. The Yellow Jackets made only 2 of 12 3-point shots in the first half and 7 of 24 overall. The Seminoles finished 3 of 14 on 3s.

Gray scored in double figures for the seventh straight game. Florida State has won 24 consecutive ACC home games dating to a victory over Clemson on Jan. 22, 2019. Trey Murphy III had 13 points and Kihei Clark added 12 in the second half for Virginia, which had won four in a row. Florida State has taken four of the last five meetings at home. The Seminoles shot a robust 29 of 58 (50 percent) from the floor against one of the nation's stingiest defensive programs. Florida State jumped on the Cavaliers early. Gray and Walker had nine points apiece as the Seminoles went 6 of 10 from 3-point range on the way to a stunning 45-25 halftime lead. Murphy's 3-pointer closed the deficit to 48-41 with 14:24 left, but the Cavaliers couldn't cut into the lead any further. Florida State's depth again was a big factor. Balsa Koprivica (nine points), Anthony Polite (eight), Scottie Barnes (seven) and Sardaar Calhoun (six) helped the Seminoles' bench outscore Virginia's reserves 37-20.

CORAL GABLES, Fla. – Junior Sardaar Calhoun scored a career-high 16 points to lead four Seminoles in double figure scoring and No. 9 ranked Florida State earned an 88-71 win over Miami at the Watsco Center. Balsa Koprivica scored 13 points while RaiQuan Gray and Anthony Polite scored 12 each as the Seminoles rolled to their 10th ACC victory of the season. The Seminoles have reached the 10-win mark in ACC play for the third consecutive season. Gray earned his third career double double with 12 points and a career-high 13 rebounds.
