NO. 4 SEEDED FLORIDA STATE TO FACE NO. 5 SEEDED COLORADO IN NCAA TOURNAMENT SECOND ROUND

No. 4 seeded Florida State, which won its sixth consecutive NCAA Tournament First Round game with a 65-54 victory over No. 13 UNC Greensboro on Saturday, faces No. 5 seeded Colorado at 7:45 p.m. on Monday at the Indiana Farmers Coliseum in the NCAA Tournament Round of 32. The game will be televised on TBS. The Seminoles' game against Colorado marks the first 4/5 matchup in their NCAA Tournament history. Florida State and Colorado will play for a birth in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament with the Seminoles looking for their seventh all-time appearance in the regional semifinals.

SEMINOLES TIE PROGRAM'S DEFENSIVE SCORING MARK AGAINST UNC GREENSBORO

Florida State tied its NCAA Tournament defensive scoring record as it held UNC Greensboro to 54 points in its 64-54 victory over the Spartans on Saturday at Bankers Life Fieldhouse. It marked the third time in Florida State's NCAA Tournament history that it had allowed as few as 54 points — against UNC Greensboro, Missouri in 2018 and in a 73-54 win over Kentucky on its way to the NCAA Championship game in 1972. The Seminoles' defensive scoring effort in holding UNC Greensboro to 54 points was the fewest points allowed by the Seminoles this season and third time they had allowed 60 points or less.

FLORIDA STATE ROLLING IN THE FIRST ROUND OF THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

With its 64-54 victory over UNC Greensboro on Saturday, the Seminoles have won six consecutive first round NCAA Tournament games — the longest winning streak of first round NCAA Tournament games in school history. The Seminoles' current streak began with a 57-50 win over Texas A&M on March 18, 2011 — a victory that led them to their first of three Sweet 16 appearances under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE'S SWEET 16 APPEARANCES

HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME GREATEST ACC COACHES

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters Monday's game against Colorado in the NCAA Tournament as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 377 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18, 2020.

FLORIDA STATE ANNOUNCES CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR BASKETBALL COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State University Vice President and Director of Athletics David Coburn announced on March 1 that Florida State has extended the contract with head basketball coach Leonard Hamilton through the 2024-25 season. "Coach Hamilton has done so much for this basketball program and this university that it is hard to express in words," said Coburn. "What he does with his young men, both on and off the court, is truly remarkable. I know both the President and I regard him as a university treasure, and he is just now getting the national recognition he has deserved for so long." Hamilton's student-athlete graduation rate of just over 95 percent at FSU will improve even more as eight members of his current team will earn degrees (seven as undergraduate degrees and one as a graduate degree) this spring.

SEMINOLES HOLDING OPPONENTS TO .395 FIELD GOAL SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Florida State held UNC Greensboro to a .317 shooting mark from the field (19 of 60) in its 64-54 win over the Spartans in the first round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament. For the Seminoles on the defensive end of the court, they limited UNC to 19 total baskets, a .317 shooting mark from the field, and a .259 mark from the 3-point line while limiting the Spartans to a season-low (as allowed by Florida State) 54 points. The Seminoles, who lead the ACC in field goal percentage defense (.395) have held their last six opponents to a combined shooting percentage of .376 from the field and .295 from the 3-point line.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FIELD IN THE LAST TWO GAMES

Florida State was offensively efficient in its victory over UNC Greensboro in the first round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles attempted a season-low 48 shots but shot .521 from the field – the ninth time they have shot 50 percent or better from the field in a game this season. Florida State shot a season-high .707 from the field (41 of 58) in its 105-73 victory over NC State on January 13.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE BONUS SPHERE

Florida State, which ranks first in the ACC in 3-point field goal percentage shooting with a conference-leading .383 mark from beyond the arc, defeated UNC Greensboro on Saturday despite not hitting a 3-point shot for the first time since February 25, 2018 against NC State. The Seminoles enter Monday's game against Colorado shooting .383 from distance and averaging 7.9 3-point field goals made per game.

SEMINOLES FOLLOWING A LOSS

With its victory over UNC Greensboro on Saturday, Florida State is 6-0 following a loss this season and will not suffer a losing streak (two of more consecutive losses) for the second consecutive season. Since the middle of the 2018-19 season, the Seminoles are 14-0 following a loss.

SEMINOLES IN THE LAST FOUR SEASONS

Florida State enters Monday's game against Colorado with a 99-31 record in the last four seasons for a .762 winning percentage. The Seminoles are 17-6 this season, were 26-5 in the shortened 2019-20 season, won a school record 29 games (29-8) during the 2018-19 season and were 23-12 during the 2017-18 season. The Seminoles are averaging 24.8 wins in each of the last four seasons.

HAMILTON WITH 76 WINS OVER RANKED TEAMS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Monday's game against No. 22/22 Colorado looking for his 77th career win over a nationally ranked team. He earned two wins over ranked teams at Oklahoma State, 17 at Miami and has 57 at Florida State. He has earned four wins over No. 1 ranked teams: against No. 1 Oklahoma (February 4, 1989 while at Oklahoma State); against No. 1 Duke (March 1, 2006 while at Florida State); against No. 1 North Carolina (March 4, 2009 while at Florida State) and against No. 1 Duke (January 12, 2011 while at Florida State).

SEMINOLES' NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 92-85, in overtime on February 23 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record tying 11th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles now hold the all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories of 11 along with Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96)

Florida State Basketball By The Numbers

.853 Redshirt junior Malik Osborne enters Monday's game against Colorado shooting a career-high .853 from the free throw line. He shot a cumulative total of .630 from the free throw line in the first two seasons of his career (2017-18 at Rice, 2019-20 at Florida State). Osborne was a perfect four of four in Florida State's victory over UNC Greensboro and made both ends of a 1 and 1 from the line with 8:44 remaining in the game to give the Seminoles a 49-41 lead.

1 Freshman Scottie Barnes is the first player in ACC history to be named the ACC Freshman of the Year and the ACC Sixth Man of the Year in the same season.

2 Two Seminoles – sophomore Balsa Koprivica (ACC Tournament First Team) and freshman Scottie Barnes (ACC Tournament Second Team) earned All-Tournament honors at the 2021 ACC Tournament.

2 Freshman Scottie Barnes beat the buzzer for the second time in his Seminole career as he made a reverse layup with 0.05 seconds left to play to tie Florida State's game against Wake Forest at 80-80, sending the game into overtime on February 13. Barnes hit a contested running jumper for the game winning basket against Indiana in the ACC/Big 10 Challenge on December 9 with 1.8 seconds remaining in overtime to give the Seminoles the 69-67 win in Tallahassee.

BIG LEADS HAVE LED TO HIGH SCORING MARGIN

Florida State enters Monday's game against Colorado with an ACC leading +8.7 points per game scoring margin. The Seminoles have scored 199 point more than their opponents with their largest margin of victory coming against NC State (+32 points, 105-73) on January 13, 2021 in Tallahassee. The Seminoles defeated No. 7 Virginia (+19 points, 81-60) on February 15 in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST THE PAC 12

Florida State's last game against a team from the Pac-12 came as an 80-77 victory over Cal in the championship game of the Global Sports Classic on December 29, 2008 at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas.

MULTIPLE LEADING SCORERS MAKE FLORIDA STATE TOUGH TO PREPARE FOR

Florida State "Newblood" Hoops Program Has Become A National Force

The coach orchestrating one of the nation's most transformational college basketball programs over the last five years can't remember exactly who came up with the term "newblood," but it's a perfect description to illustrate the evolution of Florida State.

Leonard Hamilton certainly didn't wave a magic wand and instantly turn the Seminoles into an ACC or national heavyweight. FSU struggled mightily for what seemed like forever.

It didn't reach the NCAA tournament until Hamilton's seventh season or claim a Big Dance victory until his ninth year. He was labeled an underachieving coach, a criticism not totally without merit, for his first decade in Tallahassee.

But the venerable Hamilton, now in his 19th season, has elevated previously non-descript FSU into the college basketball upper tier. Not where the 'Noles have blueblood status like Duke, North Carolina, Kentucky or Villanova, but he has raised its profile enough where his team is becoming a consistent threat to those traditional powers.

FSU is a relatively fresh face on the national scene, thus its self-proclaimed identity as a "newblood."

"I don't remember exactly where it came from, it might have been [eight-year FSU assistant coach] Charlton Young," said Hamilton. "We're a program that has found ways to emerge in the upper echelon of schools around the country that's being discussed.

"What happens is programs like Florida State, we're still trying to get invited to the party. We have to crash the party, we don't get an invitation. . . . We realize that it's hard to even think that you can overcome 75 or 80 years of successful earned tradition. It gives us a little bit of identity. It's a catch phrase."

For Hamilton, as in similar circumstances with longtime coaches Scott Drew at Baylor and Matt Painter at Purdue, his program has been a gradual build. But it has emerged into an ACC force, with a .685 winning percentage (61-28) in conference play the past five years that is eclipsed only by Virginia (72-19).

During the previous four seasons, Hamilton's team missed the NCAA tournament and never finished above .500 in league play. Since then, FSU has sent eight players to the NBA (five first-round picks) and had it not been for Saturday's 83-73 loss at Notre Dame, the 'Noles would have repeated as ACC regular-season champions despite losing NBA players Patrick Williams, Devin Vassell and Trent Forrest off last year's squad.

It cannot be overstated how rare it is, particularly in a league like the ACC, for a Power 5 school to make that kind of jump in relevance. You also have to credit FSU's administration for showing patience with Hamilton that would have never happened for its football coach.

"What you have to understand is it takes a while," Hamilton said about building credibility in the ACC. "There's a reason why programs need to be rebuilt or rejuvenated or established – whatever the terms you want to use – but they didn't get to be that way overnight.

"Everybody wants to make progress, but nobody wants to go through the process."

Hamilton has raised FSU's profile with a rather unconventional blueprint, often giving significant minutes to nine or ten players. While there's more NBA-caliber talent now coming through the program, the best players are willing to accept reduced playing time and statistics for team success in Hamilton's by-committee system of up-tempo, suffocating defense.

Senior guard M.J. Walker is a prime example of the program evolution. A McDonald's All-American, he signed with FSU after Malik Beasley was a 2016 NBA first-round pick and knowing Jonathan Isaac was on the verge of achieving the same stature. The team's leading scorer (13.1 points per game) didn't start his first year and would probably take more shots playing elsewhere, but Walker likes being in a program where the team's depth and athleticism can wear opponents out.

Last year, before the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the ACC and NCAA tournaments, FSU was ranked No. 4 in the country and primed for a shot at reaching its first Final Four since 1972. Missing out on back-to-back league championships hasn't altered that narrative.

"No telling what we could have done if the COVID situation hadn't happened," Walker said. "We had a really good one through five on the floor and a lot of firepower coming off the bench. I felt like we were a Final Four team that could win a national championship.

"We continue to get better. We've put ourselves in a position to be better than last year's team. We have the ability to win it all. What's different about this group is the circumstance. There's a ceiling we still haven't tapped into yet." RaiQuan Gray, Scottie Barnes and Walker might be the biggest FSU scoring threats, but there's no telling on any given night who might emerge. Eight different players have been the leading scorer or tied for it this season, including four on a minimum three occasions.

FSU distributing playing time could bode well during March Madness with more rested starters. The ACC tournament, where the No. 2-seeded 'Noles have a double bye and begin play Thursday, is often tougher to navigate because of familiarity everyone has with each other. But the NCAA tournament format, where FSU's style of play and quality depth makes for a tough matchup against teams outside the league, works in its favor.

The biggest problem for opponents is the Seminoles have found a groove. FSU (15-5, 11-4) has developed a system under Hamilton where players understand their roles and fit the team-first approach coveted by the 72-year-old coach.

"One of the reasons we've been successful is they legitimately don't care who gets the credit," said Hamilton. "We're comfortable now. We're attracting guys who want to be part of the way we play. I'm not trying to put a square peg in a round hole."

Scanning the prospective NCAA field, it's hard to convince anyone that Gonzaga, Baylor or somebody from the Big Ten won't be cutting down the nets.

Just don't overlook a certain ACC newblood. The days of Florida State being a basketball underachiever is a thing of the past.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – RayQuan Evans scored a career-high 24 points, M.J. Walker added 19 and Florida State made 70.7 percent of its field goals in beating North Carolina State 105-73. Evans was 9 of 11 from the floor and Walker 6 of 7 as Florida State finished 41 of 58, including 12 of 18 from 3-point range, to set a program best for shooting percentage in an Atlantic Coast Conference game. It was the program's fifth-best percentage, spanning all contests, behind a 72.7% shooting performance against Minnesota in the 1979–80 season. Florida State trailed 9-8 before scoring 31 of the next 37 points to take control. Ten different Seminoles scored during the stretch — led by Nathanael Jack's five points. Devon Daniels added 14 points and Jericole Hellems had 12 points and six rebounds.

CORAL GABLES, Fla. -- Junior Sardaar Calhoun scored a career-high 16 points to lead four Seminoles in double figure scoring and No. 9 ranked Florida State earned an 88-71 win over Miami at the Watson Center. Balsa Koprivica scored 13 points while RaiQuan Gray and Anthony Polite scored 12 each as the Seminoles rolled to their 10th ACC victory of the season. The Seminoles have reached the 10-win mark in ACC play for the third consecutive season. Gray earned his third career double double with 12 points and a career-high 13 rebounds.
