How Michigan Advanced

- No. 1 seed Michigan advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 for the fourth straight year following an 86-78 win over No. 8 seed LSU in the second round on Monday (March 22) at Lucas Oil Stadium. U-M opened with an 82-66 first round victory over Texas Southern in the first round on March 20 at Mackey Arena.
- In the LSU game, Eli Brooks and Chaundee Brown Jr. each scored 21 points, a season-high for both. Brooks was 7-for-11 from the field, including a career-high-tying five 3-pointers while adding a career-high-tying seven assists.
- Coming off the bench, Brown, Jr. posted his first 20+ point game as a Wolverine and 14th of his career. He finished 6-for-9 with three 3-pointers and was 6-for-6 from the free throw line.
- Franz Wagner added 15 points (nine in the second half) while Hunter Dickinson recorded his sixth double-double of the season with 12 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.
- In the first round against Texas Southern, Mike Smith scored a team-high 18 points, leading four Wolverines in double figures. Dickinson added 16 points while Brandon Johns, Jr. and Brooks each scored 11 points.
- Wagner finished just shy of a double-double with nine points and nine rebounds to go along with a career-high six assists. Zeb Jackson was 2-for-4 from 3-point range against Texas Southern, the first two 3-pointers of his U-M career.

A Look at No. 4 seed Florida State

- Florida State has an 18-6 overall record, going 11-4 in Atlantic Coast Conference play. The No. 4 seed Seminoles opened the NCAA Tournament with a 64-54 win over UNC Greensboro before reaching the Sweet 16 with a 71-53 victory over Colorado.
- The Seminoles have four players scoring in double figures, led by M.J. Walker's 12.3 points per game. RaiQuan Gray adds 12.0 points per contest, along with a team-best 6.5 rebounds, while Scottie Barnes adds 10.4 points per game and Anthony Polite chips in 10.2 points per contest.
- As a team, Florida State leads the ACC, and ranks fifth nationally, with 5.1 blocks per game. Balsa Koprivica leads the Seminoles individually with 1.4 blocks per contest.
- Florida State shoots 47.8 percent from the field, 26th nationally, while holding its opponents to just 39.3 percent shooting, which ranks 15th in the nation.
- Leonard Hamilton is in his 19th season as head coach at Florida State and is the winningest coach in program history. Hamilton has guided the Seminoles to the Sweet 16 in each of the last three NCAA Tournaments.

How Florida State Advanced

- The No. 4 seed in the East Region, Florida State opened the NCAA Tournament with a 64-54 win over No. 13 seed UNC Greensboro at Bankers Field Fieldhouse (March 20). RaiQuan Gray scored a team-high 17 points to pace Florida State.
- Florida State advanced to the Sweet 16 with a 71-53 win over No. 5 seed Colorado at Indiana Farmers Coliseum (March 22). Anthony Polite led the Seminoles with 22 points.

What's Possibly to Come

- The winner of the Michigan/Florida State Sweet 16 matchup will face either No. 2 seed Alabama or No. 11 seed UCLA in the Elite Eight.
- Alabama is the regular season and tournament champions of the SEC. The Crimson Tide have a 26-6 overall record and opened the NCAA Tournament with wins over Iona (68-55) and Maryland (96-77).
- UCLA has a 20-9 overall record. The Bruins opened the tournament with a First Four victory over Michigan State (86-80, ot) before defeating BYU (73-62) and Abilene Christian (67-47).

Quick NCAA Notables

- Michigan currently has three of its programs in its respective NCAA Sweet 16s -- men's basketball (fourth straight), women's basketball (first ever advancement) and ice hockey (38th NCAA trip). The Wolverines have reached the Sweet 16 in four consecutive tournaments (2017, '18, '19, '21). Michigan is one of just two programs, along with Gonzaga, to reach four-straight Sweet 16s.
- In fact, since 2013, the Maize and Blue has reached to the Sweet 16 six times, tied for the most in the country with the Zags. *Note: the 2020 NCAA Tournament was cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic.*
- Since 2013, Michigan has 20 NCAA Tournament wins, more than any other program. Gonzaga has 19 NCAA Tournament wins since 2013 while Duke, Kentucky, North Carolina and Villanova each have 18.
- Juwan Howard is the only coach and player to earn a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. As a player with U-M, he and the rest of the Fab Five were the No. 1 seed in the West Region in the 1993 tournament. After guiding his Wolverines to the Big Ten regular season title, his U-M squad earned the No. 1 seed in the East Region.

All Part of the Plan ... First Timers Lead the Maize and Blue

- Transfers Mike Smith (Columbia) and Chaundee Brown, Jr. have made the most of their first trips to the Big Dance.
- Smith's season-high-tying 18 points were instrumental in U-M's opening NCAA win vs. Texas Southern. He added five assists and four rebounds. He followed with five points, six assists and two rebounds vs. LSU.
- After being held scoreless vs. Texas Southern, Brown posted his first 20+ point effort at U-M in the NCAA win over LSU. Coming off the bench, he drained three 3-pointers, had a massive dunk and hit two key jumpers as he helped the Wolverines advance to their fourth straight NCAA Sweet 16.

Some NCAA Statistics for the Maize and Blue

- After U-M holding Texas Southern to 1-of-12 (8.3%) shooting from 3-point range, the Wolverines followed by LSU going 6-for-21 (28.6%). Overall, opponents are shooting 21.2% from deep.
- Michigan has gone 41-for-51 (80.4%) from the free throw line with back-to-back games of 20+ makes -- Texas Southern (21-for-26) and LSU (20-for-25). Brandon Johns, Jr., leads U-M going 9-for-12 (75%).
- After opening the season with 80+ points in nine of its first 10 games, Michigan had just two more in its next 14. So far in the NCAA Tournament, U-M has posted back-to-back 80+ games with 82 vs. Texas Southern and 86 vs. LSU.
- Michigan is averaging 20.5 assist per game after 19 (on 26 FG) vs. Texas Southern and 22 (on 28 FG) vs. LSU. Eli Brooks leads with 12, while Mike Smith has 11.
- U-M is shooting 50.9 percent from the field as a team, including 37.3 percent from the three-point line as well as 80.4 percent from the free-throw line. The Wolverines are holding opponents to just 37.6 percent shooting from the floor and 21.2 percent from the three-point line.
- Five players are scoring in double figures, led by 16.0 points per game from Eli Brooks. He is shooting 50 percent from the field (10-of-20) and 53.3 percent (8-of-15) from three-point range.
- Hunter Dickinson is posting 14.0 points and 6.5 rebounds per game, shooting 71.4 percent (10-of-14) from the field. Franz Wagner is averaging 12.0 points per game, shooting 50 percent (8-of-16) from the floor, and a team-best 8.0 rebounds per contest.
- Mike Smith is at 11.5 points per game along with a team-high 5.5 assists per game. Chaundee Brown Jr. is adding 10.5 points per contest, shooting 60 percent (6-of-10) from the field and a perfect 6-of-6 from the free-throw line.

Michigan in the NCAA Tournament

- Michigan has made 30 (26*) NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Michigan has a 63-28 (56-24*) all-time record in the NCAA Tournament
- Michigan has eight (six*) Final Four appearances (1964, '65, '76, '89, '92*, '93*, '13, '18)
- Michigan is 7-1 (5-1*) all-time in national semifinal games and owns the best winning percentage, .875, of any school to play in at least five games.
- Michigan has advanced to seven (five*) national championship appearances -- 1965, 1976, 1989, 1992*, 1993*, 2013 and 2018. U-M is 1-6 (1-4*) all-time in the national title games.
- Michigan won the program's first and only NCAA championship in 1989, following a dramatic 80-79 overtime win against Seton Hall when Rumeal Robinson made two free throws to secure the title. During the "Shock the World" run, Glen Rice set the NCAA Tournament record for most points in a single tournament with 184 (30.6 ppg).
- Michigan has national title game appearances under four different head coaches -- Dave Strack (1965 vs. UCLA); Johnny Orr (1976 vs. Indiana); Steve Fisher (1989 vs. Seton Hall; 1992 vs. Duke and 1993 vs. North Carolina) and John Beilein (2013, vs. Louisville and 2018 vs. Villanova).
- Michigan has 17 (16*) Sweet 16 appearances.
- Michigan has 14 (13*) Elite Eight appearances.
- Michigan has earned a No. 1 seeding on three occasions -- 1985, 1993* & 2021.
- Michigan has earned a No. 2 seed on three occasions -- 1986, 2014 & 2019.

Game Notes

Since 2009, Michigan Has Nine NCAA Trips; Two Final Fours

- In 2009, led No. 10 seed Michigan to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. After defeating No. 7 seed Clemson (62-59) in its opening game of the South Regional in Kansas City, Missouri, U-M fell to Blake Griffin and No. 2 seed Oklahoma (73-63).
- In 2011, led No. 8 seed Michigan to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. After defeating No. 9 seed Tennessee (75-45) in its opening game of the West Regional in Charlotte, North Carolina, U-M fell to No. 1 seed Duke (73-71) after a last-second game-tying attempt by Darius Morris went in and out.
- In 2012, led No. 4 seed Michigan to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Opening its first game of the Midwest Regional in Nashville, Tennessee, U-M lost to No. 13 seed Ohio (65-60).
- In 2013, led No. 4 seed Michigan to its first national title game in 20 years before losing to No. 1 seed Louisville (82-76) in the final. U-M opened its NCAA Tournament in the South Regional in Auburn Hills, Michigan, with a pair of victories over No. 13 seed South Dakota State (71-56) and No. 5 VCU (78-53). Heading to Arlington, Texas, U-M defeated No. 1 Kansas (87-85) with a dramatic comeback win in overtime. Down 14 points with 6:50 remaining, a Trey Burke three-pointer with 3.2 seconds left capped off a closing 17-8 run, sending the game into overtime, where U-M would go on for the two-point win. Using an opening 23-5 run, U-M advanced to its seventh Final Four with a 20-point win over No. 3 seed Florida (79-59). Facing No. 4 seed Syracuse in the Final Four in Atlanta, Georgia, Beilein picked up his first win over Jim Boeheim following a 61-56 victory to advance to his first-career national title game. In a back-and-forth 40 minute battle, U-M dropped the title game to Louisville (82-76).
- In 2014, led No. 2 seed Michigan to its second straight Elite Eight, defeating No. 15 seed Wofford (57-40) in the second round and No. 7 seed Texas (79-65) in the third round in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In the Sweet 16 in Indianapolis, Indiana, the Wolverines earned a thrilling 73-71 victory over No. 11 seed Tennessee before falling to No. 8 seed Kentucky, 75-72, on a three in the final seconds.
- In 2016, helped U-M make its first appearance in the First Four, defeating Tulsa, 67-62, to advance to the first round. The Wolverines then fell to No. 6 seed Notre Dame (70-63) in the First Round in Brooklyn, New York.
- In 2017, guided U-M to a 92-91 win over Oklahoma State in the first round in Indianapolis, Indiana. U-M then defeated No. 2 seed Louisville, 73-69, in the second round to advance to the Sweet 16 in Kansas City, Missouri. The Maize and Blue fell to No. 3 seed Oregon in the Sweet 16, 69-68.
- In 2018, took No. 3 seed Michigan back to the Final Four for the second time in six seasons. U-M opened the tournament with a victory over No. 14 Montana (61-47) in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and earned a trip to the Sweet 16 on Jordan Pools dramatic buzzer-beater to top No. 6 Houston (64-63). In Los Angeles in the Regional Semifinals, U-M defeated No. 7 Texas A&M (99-72) before earning a trip to the Final Four with a win over No. 9 Florida State (58-54). At the Final Four in San Antonio, Texas, Michigan defeated South Region champion, No. 11 seed, Loyola Chicago, 69-57, before falling in the national championship game to No. 1 Villanova, 79-62.
- In 2019, guided No. 2 seed Michigan to the Sweet 16 for the third consecutive season. Opening in Des Moines, Iowa in the West Regional, U-M recorded wins over No. 14 Montana (74-55) and No. 10 Florida (64-49) to advance to the Sweet 16 for the third straight year. In a battle of the top two defenses in the nation in Anaheim, Calif., No. 3 Texas Tech defeated the Maize and Blue 63-44 ending U-M's run.
- In 2020, the Wolverines were on pace to earn an at-large bid, however, the tournament was cancelled due to the global coronavirus pandemic.
- In 2021, U-M earned a No. 1 seed for the first time since 1993* and opened the tournament with an 82-66 victory over Texas Southern at Mackey Arena. Michigan advanced to its fourth consecutive Sweet 16 with an 86-78 win over LSU at Lucas Oil Stadium.

Livers Out Indefinitely with Right Foot Injury

- Juwan Howard announced on March 13 that senior guard/forward Isaiah Livers will be out indefinitely after an MRI following the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinal game against Maryland (March 12) revealed a stress reaction injury to his right foot. Livers will wear a protective boot while he begins resting and rehabbing.
- An 2021 All-Big Ten second team selection, Livers helped the Wolverines win the 2021 Big Ten regular-season title and earn the No. 1 seed at the Big Ten Tournament as well as the NCAA Tournament. He was averaging 13.1 points, a career-best 6.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists while knocking down a team-best 50 three-pointers.
- A tri-captain, Livers has played in 118 career games and is 13 points away from reaching 1,000 in his career. During his four-year career, he has helped U-M compile a 102-31 record that includes winning the 2018 Big Ten Tournament and reaching the 2018 Final Four and national title game.
- Brandon Johns, Jr. has moved into Livers spot in the starting five.

How U-M Won a Big Ten Title

- In what has turned out to be a unique season with COVID-19, the Big Ten regular season title was agreed to be determined by overall winning percentage as many schedules fluctuated due to the global pandemic.
- Needing to win one in its last two games (both against Michigan State), Michigan clinched the Big Ten title after a 69-50 win against the Spartans in their first meeting (March 4).
- The regular season crown is the 15th in U-M history and first since the Wolverines won the 2014 title by three games thanks to the play of Big Ten Player of the Year Nik Stauskas.
- The regular season titles made the Wolverines the No. 1 seed in the Big Ten Tournament for just the second time in program history (2014).

Dickinson, Howard Headline Big Ten Awards as Top Freshman, Coach

- Hunter Dickinson was selected as the Big Ten's Freshman of the Year, Juwan Howard was named Coach of the Year by the conference, and three total Wolverines earned Big Ten honors.
- In addition to his Freshman of the Year accolade, Dickinson was named to the All-Big Ten first team (media) and the second team (coaches) and to the All-Freshman squad, while senior guard/forward Isaiah Livers earned a spot on the All-Big Ten second team (coaches and media) and sophomore guard/forward Franz Wagner was an All-Big Ten second team (coaches) and third team (media) selection.
- For the second straight year, graduate student forward Austin Davis was named the Wolverines' selection for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award.
- Dickinson, who was also named to the All-Freshman team, becomes U-M's second freshman to earn a spot on the All-Big Ten first team and first in 43 years (Mike McGee, 1978). He also becomes the eighth Wolverine to earn the conference's rookie of the year honor and first since Ignas Brazdeikis in 2019.
- After guiding the Wolverines to their first Big Ten title in seven years, Howard becomes the first U-M coach to be named coach of the year since John Beilein earned the honor by the media in 2014. Howard is the fourth coach in U-M history to receive the award, joining Johnny Orr (1974, '77), Bill Frieder (1985) and Beilein.

More Postseason Honors Rolling in

- In addition to those Big Ten honors, Hunter Dickinson was named to the Associated Press and the Sporting News All-America Second Team. Dickinson becomes the 33rd player in program history to earn All-America recognition and the first since Ignas Brazdeikis earned AP Honorable Mention All-America honors during his freshman season in 2018-19.
- Hunter Dickinson is a Sporting News and U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) All-America second team member. He was also Kyle Macy Freshmen All-America Team selection.
- Hunter Dickinson was the Associated Press Big Ten Newcomer of the Year and a finalist for the USBW's Wayman Tisdale National Freshman Player of the Year and the Kyle Macy Award for National Freshmen of the Year.
- Juwan Howard was named the Sporting News National Coach of the Year. Howard becomes the first U-M coach to receive the honor since his former coach Steve Fisher (1992).
- Juwan Howard was named the Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year and is a finalist for the Ben Jobe Award (Top Division I Minority Coach) as well as the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) Henry Iba Award, the Werner Ladder Naismith and the Jim Phelan Award (all for the National Coach of the Year)
- Juwan Howard was named the USBWA District V Coach of the Year. He joins John Beilein (2014) as the only two coaches in U-M history to earn USBWA District Coach of the Year honors. Howard was also named the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 7 Coach of the Year.
- Hunter Dickinson and Isaiah Livers were both named to the USBWA All-District V Team. This is the first career All-District accolade for both players. Dickinson and Livers were named to the NABC All-District Second Team.
- Isaiah Livers is a finalist for the Basketball Hall of Fame's Julius Erving Award for the nation's top small forward.

Michigan's Department Pause & Restructured Schedule

- On Saturday, Jan. 23, Michigan Athletics followed a Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) recommendation to pause athletic activities in all sports, including games, team and training sessions due to a positive test for a COVID-19 variant.
- The 14-day stoppage caused U-M to postpone four regular season Big Ten games -- at Penn State (Jan. 27), Indiana (Jan. 30), at Northwestern (Feb. 3) and Michigan State (Feb. 6). With U-M's return-to-play planning, U-M also postponed its game with Illinois (Feb. 11).
- With the changes, U-M did lose three total conference games -- at Penn State, at Northwestern and a home game with Indiana. The conference wanted to assure each team plays everyone at least once.
- Returning at Wisconsin (Feb. 14), the Wolverines won, 67-59, with a second-half rally and went on to win seven straight games, and claim the Big Ten title.

- Michigan is led by second year head coach Juwan Howard. After spending 25 years in the NBA -- 19 as a player and six as an assistant (all with the Miami Heat), Howard embarked on his first stint as a head coach.
- For the second straight season, associate head coach Phil Martelli (2nd year) and assistants Saddy Washington (fifth-year) and Howard Eisley (2nd year) will help Juwan Howard on the sidelines.
- A big believer in culture -- especially from his Miami Heat days with Pat Riley and Erik Spoelstra -- Juwan Howard runs his program by six values -- Discipline, Family, All-In, Accountability, Trust and Sacrifice.
- Juwan Howard wants the Wolverines to be a "solution based" and "player led" team. He continues to give a voice to his players allowing them freedom to express opinions in huddles and on the floor during games and especially in practice.
- Overall, the Wolverines are looking to play at a fast-paced, "read-and-react" offense with several ball screen actions as the primary mainstay in their offensive sets. However, U-M constantly adjusts to its personnel with more cutting, downhill attacks and taking the open shot at a much higher level.
- Some would say, the Wolverines have developed into a "positionless" team with several players playing multiple spots during a game -- i.e. Isaiah Livers, Franz Wagner, Chaundee Brown, Jr. and Brandon Johns, Jr. have played up to two to three different positions giving U-M the ability to play a big or go smaller.
- Defensively, U-M primarily runs a man-to-man defense, however, they do have some zone packages they can employ.

What Else Do You Need to Know about the Maize and Blue

- On March 4, 2020, U-M coach Juwan Howard approached Austin Davis before practice and let him know that if he wanted he had a spot for him for his fifth year in 2020-21. Davis was so excited he dropped the basketball and bear-hugged Howard.
- After naming Austin Davis and Isaiah Livers captains prior to the start of the season, Juwan Howard tabbed a third captain as Eli Brooks was given the honor during a pre-practice meeting on Dec. 10th.
- Coined by Saddy Washington, the Wolverines big men live by a basic philosophy -- "BIG" ... "Basic is Good" -- control what you can control and do your job.
- Austin Davis continues to love the outdoors and is an avid hunter and fisherman. Each year he makes his own jerky and took all the U-M big men on a fishing trip on his grandfather's land in Onsted.
- Hunter Dickinson was the student government class president at DeMatha. He also would dress up as the school's mascot -- a 7-1 Stag.
- Mike Smith is the second graduate transfer to come to Michigan. The first was Jaaron Simmons (2017-18; Ohio), who helped U-M to the 2018 Big Ten Tournament title, Final Four and national title game. Simmons is the program's video analyst.
- An avid dog lover, Eli Brooks has a golden retriever, Finn, as one of his roommates.
- Isaiah Livers and Franz Wagner explored the NBA Draft during the 2020 summer, however, both elected to return to Ann Arbor.
- Franz Wagner is the younger brother of former All-Big Ten Wolverine Moritz Wagner, who led U-M to the 2018 Final Four, was a first round NBA Draft pick (L.A. Lakers) and is currently playing with the Washington Wizards.
- Jace Howard is the son of head coach Juwan Howard. Coach Howard's other son, Jett, is a top 50 recruit in the Class of 2022 and currently plays at IMG Academy.
- Two of Michigan's four freshman are lefties -- Hunter Dickinson and Zeb Jackson. In all, U-M has three lefty shooters on the roster including Luke Wilson.

Jimmy Buckets Meet Mike; Mike Meet Jimmy Buckets

- Mike Smith, a native of Burr Ridge, Illinois, continues to be mentored by former Chicago Bulls G/F Jimmy Butler, now a member of the Miami Heat.
- So how did they become friends? Jimmy Butler attended Mike Smith's high school jersey reveal in Chicago, Ill. as a Jordan representative when Butler was with the Bulls.
- Each high school student got to ask Butler a question, Smith used his opportunity to ask a silly question and used humor to stand out. After the event was over, Smith took a chance and approached Butler asking him if they can work out together
- Butler asked to make sure it was allowed within NCAA rules and passed his trainer's number. Not thinking he would ever call, the next day Butler's trainer followed up and invited Smith to not only the workout but a pre-workout meal
- As they continued to work out, they bonded and continue to form a strong relationship. Smith credits Butler with helping him develop his skills as both a player and a man.

Who are the DMV Boys?

- It is a friendship that started in an 8-and-under AAU league. Hunter Dickinson played with one DC Assault team while Terrance Williams II was on the other DC Assault team.
- As the friendship grew throughout the years they finally started playing together in the sixth grade with ETU Select, before the team transferred over to Team Takeover.
- As they each headed to rival high schools with Dickinson (DeMatha Catholic) and Williams (Gonzaga College) in the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC), they battled for the league title for four seasons -- each winning two titles. Dickinson claimed the 2018 and 2020, while Williams got the 2017 and 2019.
- After Dickinson committed to the Maize and Blue on Dec. 19, 2019, Williams eventually ended up joining him on Jan. 1, 2020. Williams had originally committed to Georgetown, but reopened his recruitment (Dec. 5, 2019).
- As the duo headed to Ann Arbor, Juwan Howard referred to them the "DMV Boys" for being from the District of Columbia, Maryland and Virginia area. It has stuck.
- With the DMV familiarity, Dickinson and Williams were instrumental in rallying the Wolverines against Oakland. Williams hustle saw him grab a key rebound, a key steal and two assists to Dickinson, who had all 19 of his points in the second/OT periods as the Wolverines claimed an 81-71 victory.
- The DMV duo did it again against Central Florida (Dec. 6). As part of U-M's second unit, Dickinson's 14 points and Williams' 10 helped the Wolverines overcome a 12-point deficit and go on for the lopsided 80-58 victory.

Game Notes

Senior Class Reaches an Elite Level -- 100+ Wins

- Michigan has nine players in its senior class with graduate students Mike Smith and Austin Davis, seniors Isaiah Livers, Eli Brooks, Chaundee Brown, Jr., C.J. Baird, Luke Wilson, Jaron Faulds, and Rico Ozuna-Harrison.
- The group of Davis, Livers, Brooks, Baird, Wilson, and Ozuna-Harrison, reached 100 career wins (104-31) at Michigan. This group of six now make it 16 total players in program history with 100 career wins, including former teammates Zavier Simpson and Jon Teske, who set the program record with 108 before the 2020 postseason was cancelled.
- The current group of seniors are responsible for two of U-M's five 30+ win seasons with back-to-back marks -- 33-8 (2017-18; U-M record for wins) and 30-7 (2018-19). They helped U-M to the 2021 Big Ten regular season title, a second straight Big Ten Tournament title in 2018, a third straight Big Ten Tournament title game in 2019, a 2018 Final Four and national title game appearance as well as extend U-M's streak of 10+ conference wins to five straight and eight in the last nine.

Making His Mark in U-M Coaching History

- With the 69-50 win over Michigan State (March 4), Juwan Howard won his 38th game as the head coach of the Wolverines. That total helped Howard become the winningest coach after two seasons patrolling the U-M sidelines. He now has 41 after the win over Texas Southern in the NCAA Tournament First Round (March 20)
- Howard passed his former coach Steve Fisher, who had 37 wins in his first two seasons (non-interim).

A Little Ken Pom Action and the Big Ten

- According to KenPom.com, Michigan is third overall in the nation (+29.29) as the Wolverines have the eighth best offense and the ninth best defense.
- Michigan (#8/9), Illinois (#9/6) and Gonzaga (#1/8) are the three lone teams in the nation listed among the top 10 for offense and defense.
- The Wolverines (#9) are one of two Big Ten teams in the top 10 for defense -- Illinois (#6).
- The Wolverines (#8) are one of four Big Ten teams in the top 10 for offense -- Iowa (#2), Ohio State (#4), Michigan (#8) and Illinois (#9).
- The Big Ten (+18.59) is listed as the top conference with the Big 12 (+15.74), PAC-12 (+15.72), SEC (+14.28), ACC (+13.75) and Big East (+13.42).
- The Big Ten has all 14 teams ranked among the top 20 for strength of schedule by Ken Pom, including all top 14 spots -- Penn State (#1), Northwestern (#2), Indiana (#3), Nebraska (#4), Illinois (#5), Wisconsin (#6), Rutgers (#7), Ohio State (#8), Michigan State (#9), Maryland (#10), Minnesota (#13), Purdue (#14), Iowa (#16) and Michigan (#19).

The Mirror Image Start

- Michigan's season opening 11-game winning streak was snapped with a 75-57 loss at No. 23 Minnesota (Jan. 16).
- Juwan Howard has started out strong in each of his two seasons at his alma mater -- beginning 7-0 last season, winning the Battle 4 Atlantis -- with wins of No. 6 North Carolina and No. 8 Gonzaga -- and vaulting to No. 4 in the nation (largest jump in the poll's history) before falling at No. 1 Louisville (ACC/B1G Challenge).
- In this year's streak, U-M started 11-0, winning all five on its non-conference games and opening with six straight Big Ten victories, including defeating three straight ranked opponents by 19+ points. Again, the Maize and Blue went from unranked to as high as No. 7 in the AP poll during the 11 games.

Michigan vs. the Ranked

A Historic Three-Game Stretch

- According to ESPN, Michigan became the college basketball program ever to win 3-straight games by 19+ points against ranked opponents -- No. 19 Northwestern (W, 85-66, +19), No. 16 Minnesota (W, 82-57; +25) and No. 9 Wisconsin (W, 77-54; +23).
- In the Northwestern game, U-M used a 38-16 run to pull away, while Northwestern's leading scorer Boo Buie was held scoreless for the game (0-for-6).
- In the Minnesota game, U-M used a 39-8 run to pull away, while the Gophers were held scoreless for a five-minute span in the second half.
- In the Wisconsin game, U-M used a 43-6 run to pull away, while the Badgers scored just three points during the first 7:10 minutes of the second half.

- U-M is shooting 48.5% from the field, which is second in the Big Ten (18th nationally).
- U-M has 13 games closing above 50 percent from the field, with seven in Big Ten.
- The Wolverines recorded a season-high 58.8 percent (30-for-51) at Maryland (Dec. 31).
- U-M has 30+ field goals in 12 games, including a season-high 34 against Toledo (Dec. 9).
- Hunter Dickinson (60.6%), is second in the Big Ten (eighth nationally). Among the rest of the U-M regulars, Franz Wagner is shooting 49.4%, Chaundee Brown, Jr. is at 47.2% and Isaiah Livers is at 45.7%
- Michigan has finished a season shooting above 50 percent eight times (105 seasons). The school record? The 1988-89 Wolverines shot an amazing 56.6 percent during its national championship season. In fact, U-M posted a run of six straight seasons shooting above 50 percent for the season -- from 1985 to 1990.

Making Them Count

- U-M is shooting 78.0% on free throw which leads the Big Ten (17th nationally).
- U-M has 10 games with 20+ trips to the free throw line in a game, with a season-high 26 against Bowling Green (Nov. 25) in the season opener and against Texas Southern (March 20) in the NCAA Tournament First Round.
- Eli Brooks leads the Wolverines with his 92.7 percentage as he has missed just three free throws (38-for-41).
- Hunter Dickinson has gone 77-for-100 (77%) from the free throw line this season. Dickinson's 100 attempts are just under a quarter of all of U-M's attempts on the season (451). In fact, Dickinson's 77 made free throws are more than any other Wolverine has attempted -- Franz Wagner (71).

Livers in Final Campaign

- Before his injury, Isaiah Livers posted 16 games in double figures with five 20+ point games -- Oakland (22), Ball State (21), Maryland (20), at Purdue (22) and at Wisconsin (20). He is second on U-M with 13.1 points per game.
- Livers has a team-high 50 3-pointers. Early in the non-conference, he drained a career-high-tying five 3-pointers against Oakland (Nov. 29). He has 164 career 3's needing 25 more to reach the all-time top 10 -- LaVell Blanchard (2000-03; 189)
- Livers' 46 assists (2.0 apg), tops his prior single season best of 25 as a sophomore (2018-19). He had a career-best four assists at Nebraska (Dec. 25) and another at Ohio State (Feb. 21). He has 10 games of 3+ assists.
- Livers has done more than just score as he is third on the Wolverines with career-high average of 6.0 rebounds per game. He has 17 games with 5+ boards with a career-high-tying 10, 2x - at Purdue (Jan. 22) and at Indiana (Feb. 27)
- It's hard to believe with as hard as he plays, Livers only has four career double-doubles -- two of which are against Nebraska. First, he recorded 12 points and 10 rebounds against the Cornhuskers on Feb. 28, 2019. He followed with an 18 point, 10 rebound performance against Nebraska on March 5, 2020.
- This season, the State of Indiana has been good to Livers, as he recorded his third with 22 points and 10 rebounds at Purdue (Jan. 22, 2021) and added a fourth with 16 points, 10 rebound effort at Indiana (Feb. 27, 2021).

What Can Franz Do For You?

- This summer, Franz Wagner added another inch and is sitting just shy of a 6-10 on the tape measure. He also added 20+ pounds over the last year and a half thanks to the Camp Sanderson program.
- Wagner is averaging 12.8 points per game with 16 double figure games to his credit -- including 14 of his last 19 games with a season-high 21 points against Iowa (Feb. 25; 9-for-12 FG) as well as the following game at Indiana (Feb. 27; 6-for-9).
- Wagner is second on U-M with 6.3 rebounds per game thanks to 21 games of 5+ rebounds, with three of 10+ board games with a season-best 13 against Oakland (Nov. 29).
- Wagner has tallied 77 assists (3.0 apg), which more than doubles his rookie campaign (27). He dished a career-best six dimes against Texas Southern in the NCAA Tournament First Round (March 20).
- Wagner has 27 blocks and a team-best 33 steals. He had a career-best five blocks against Northwestern (Jan. 3) and career-best four steals against Wisconsin (Jan. 12).

Mr. Smith Comes to Ann Arbor

- With 18 points and a career-high 15 assists, Mike Smith recorded the first double-double of his career. In fact, he is the first Wolverine to post a point-assist double-dip since Zavier Simpson (11 points, 10 assists) against Nebraska (March 5, 2020).
- With those career-high 15 assists vs. Maryland (March 12), Mike Smith set the Big Ten Tournament record, topping the prior mark of 12 set by U-M's Derrick Walton, Jr., against Indiana (March 11, 2016). Smith was one dime away from tying the all-time U-M mark of 16 set by Walton, Jr. at Nebraska (March 5, 2017).
- After surpassing 500 assists in the season-finale at Michigan State (March 7), Mike Smith now has 534 in his career. His next number he is chasing is 2,000 career points, as he needs 105 (1,895).
- Smith leads U-M and the Big Ten (30th nationally) with 5.4 assists per game as he has had 3+ assists in 24 of 26 games including 10 at Minnesota (Jan. 16) and 15 vs. Maryland (March 12) -- the first two 10+ assist games in his career.
- In his first season with the Maize and Blue, Smith is averaging 9.3 points per game with 11 double figure games. He has a season-high 18 vs. Maryland in the BTT Quarterfinal (March 12) and vs. Texas Southern in the NCAA Tournament First Round (March 20).
- Smith has 91 career double figure scoring games in his 118 games, including 43 20+ point games and seven 30+ games.

Game Notes

What Brown Can Do For You?

- With the biggest exhale, Chaundee Brown, Jr. was finally able to relax after being granted his NCAA waiver this October (30th) after transferring from Wake Forest.
- As U-M's Sixth Man and "energy-giver off the bench", Brown is averaging 7.9 points and 2.9 rebounds and has fully embraced his role. He also combines with Eli Brooks to become U-M's 1-2 defensive stoppers.
- Making a free throw with 25 second left at Wisconsin (Feb. 14) -- his only points of the game -- Brown, reached 1,000 in his collegiate career. To date has 1,081 career points (9.8 per game).
- In the NCAA Tournament Second Round against LSU, Brown came off the bench to go 6-of-9 from the field, 3-of-6 from three, and a perfect 6-of-6 from the free-throw line for a season-best 21 points. Brown was a +19 in the win over the Tigers, helping U-M advance to the Sweet 16.
- In his first game with U-M, Brown scored 18 of his team-high 19 points in the second half as he drained five 3-pointers to guide the Wolverines to the season opening win over Bowling Green (Nov. 25).
- Brown came off the bench midway through the first half against Central Florida (Dec. 6) and was instrumental in U-M's rally as he scored 11 of his team-high 18 points in the first half draining three of four triples.
- Scoring 14 points in 17 minutes, Brown was once again instrumental off the bench as the Wolverines defeated No. 19 Northwestern (Jan. 3). He held the Wildcats leading scorer Boo Buie scoreless.
- In three seasons at Wake Forest, Brown averaged 10.4 points and 4.7 rebounds while starting 74 or 84 games. He scored in double figures in 42 games with 13 20+ point games, including a career-high 26 points against No. 23 Xavier (Dec. 14, 2019), going 11-for-16 from the field.

Well Hello Mr. Brooks

- Eli Brooks averages 9.7 points per game and has 13 double figure scoring games, including a season-high 21 against LSU in the NCAA Tournament Second Round.
- Brooks went 7-of-11 from the field, including 5-of-9 from three-point range, and tied a career-high with seven assists, in the victory over LSU, helping U-M advance to the Sweet 16 for the fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament.
- Overall, Brooks now has 26 career double figure scoring games, including five 20+ point games -- 24 against Appalachian State (Nov. 5, 2019) and vs. No. 6 North Carolina (Nov. 28, 2019, Battle 4 Atlantis), a career-best 25 at Iowa (Jan. 17, 2020), 21 vs. LSU (March 20, 2021) and 20 at Nebraska (Jan. 28, 2020).
- Last season, Brooks led U-M with 52 3-pointers. That total was more than two and a half times his previous single season best set last season (14). It also more than doubled his first two seasons combined (24). This season he has 38 long range buckets, which is second on the Wolverines behind only Isaiah Livers' 50.
- Just under 50 percent of Brooks' offensive shots come via the 3-point line (93-of-192).

Quietly a Big Factor

- Brandon Johns, Jr. has continued to be productive force off the bench. He may be averaging 4.5 points and 2.2 rebounds per game, but it is the effort areas where he is making key contributions -- diving on the floor, taking charges, grabbing a rebound and just being a physical presence down low.
- Johns is near a perfect balance in rebounding as he has 25 offensive and 33 defensive.
- Johns is shooting 51.3 percent (39-for-76) from the field and is 7-for-19 (36.8%) from deep.
- Johns moved into the starting lineup due to Isaiah Livers' injury beginning in the BTT Semifinal against Ohio State (March 13). In three games as a starter, Johns is averaging 8.3 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

Big Country Providing

- Returning from a right foot injury (plantar fasciitis) against Wisconsin (Jan. 12), Austin Davis scored four points and grabbed four rebounds in his return. After starting the first five games, he has moved to a steady role off the bench backing up Hunter Dickinson -- who he has mentored this season.
- One of three captains, Davis is averaging 5.3 points and 2.8 rebounds. In fact, he has had 6+ points in 12 games.
- Davis is shooting 71.0% from the field with 2+ field goals in 16 games.
- After coming off the bench for three years (65 games), Davis started his first ever collegiate game against Bowling Green (Nov. 25) in the season opener.
- In 2019-20, Davis had a career-year averaging 10.7 minutes per game, with 4.9 points and 2.6 rebounds, while shooting a team-high 69.3 percent (52-for-75) from the field. How did that compare to his prior best? Well, before last season he had a best of 3.7 minutes (2018-19), 1.2 points and 1.4 rebounds (2017-18). Davis' 52 total field goals a year ago (2019-20) more than doubled his previous two seasons combined (21).

The First Burger Boys in 19 Years

- Signees Caleb Houston (West), Moussa Diabate (West) and Kobe Bufkin (East) were selected 2021 McDonald's All-Americans, despite the game being cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic.
- The trio are the first signees to make the prestigious all-star game since Daniel Horton in 2002 (19 years). It marks the fifth time the Wolverines have had multiple players selected.
- Bufkin becomes the first player from the state of Michigan to earn a roster spot since Flint native and current Charlotte Hornet Miles Bridges (2016).

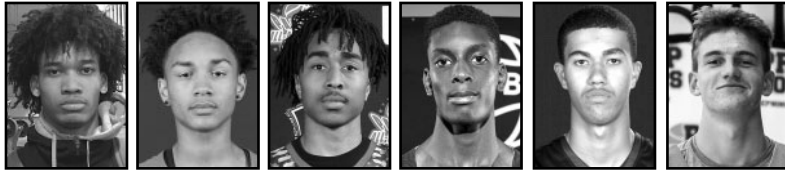

PHIL MARTELLI Associate Head Coach



With over 44 years of coaching, legendary coach Phil Martelli joins the University of Michigan basketball program as an assistant coach following a 34 year tenure at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia.

Starting his career at Saint Joseph's as an assistant coach for 10 years, Martelli spent his final 24 seasons as the head coach building the Saint Joseph's program into one of the most consistent in the Atlantic 10, becoming a perennial postseason participant and a key player on the national scene. He earned his place among the top coaches in the school's storied history and is one of the most respected coaches in the game.

Martelli is the Hawks' all-time leader in career victories with a mark of 444-328. He set the school record for most wins in a season (30) in 2004 and recorded nine 20-plus win seasons -- the most for any Hawks' coach. His Atlantic 10 record of 218-176 ranks second all-time in the league history and trailed only Temple's John Chaney. He won six Atlantic 10 regular season/divisional titles (1997, 2001, '02, '03, '04 and '05) and guided the Hawks to three A-10 Tournament championships (1997, 2014 and '16).

Martelli had 13 postseason appearances (7 NCAA, 6 NIT) advancing to two NCAA Sweet 16s (1997 and 2004) and the school's third Elite Eight appearance in 2004. He guided the Hawks to NIT runner-up finishes in his first season at the helm of the Hawks in 1996 and again in 2005. His 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in Saint Joseph's history.

Prior to his arrival at Saint Joseph's, Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School in the Philadelphia Catholic League, which became Kennedy Kenrick Catholic High School, and is now closed. He compiled a 112-85 record and reached the College League title game in 1980. Current Hall of Fame UConn women's basketball coach Geno Auriemma served as an assistant under Martelli from 1979-81.

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater Widener College in 1977 under C. Alan Rowe, helping the Pioneers reach to the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four and title game. That Widener team set the program record with 26 wins (26-5) -- a mark still held today -- and was inducted into the Widener Athletics Hall of Fame in 2018 as it remains one of only three programs to reach an NCAA title game along with football and polo.

SADDI WASHINGTON Assistant Coach



With almost two decades of college coaching experience, Saddi Washington enters his fifth season as an assistant coach with the University of Michigan men's basketball program.

In his four seasons with Michigan, Washington has helped the Wolverines win 108 games (27.0 per season) including a program record 33 wins during the 2017-18 campaign and follow with a second 30 win season in 2018-19. During his tenure, U-M has won two Big Ten Tournament titles, advance to three straight NCAA Sweet 16s and the Final Four and national title game in 2018.

In his first season with the Maize and Blue, and after a well-documented plane crash, U-M won four games in four days to claim the 2017 Big Ten Tournament title. The following year, the Wolverines repeated their efforts with four straight wins to win back-to-back conference tournament titles. In 2019, U-M made it three straight trips to the championship game, setting the tournament record with 10 straight wins, before falling in the final.

Using the successes in the Big Ten Tournament, the Wolverines made three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament reaching the Sweet 16 in each of the those seasons as well as the national title game in 2018. After defeating Cinderella Loyola-Chicago in the national semifinal, the Wolverines fell to Villanova in the 2018 national title game.

Responsible for coaching U-M's big men, Washington was instrumental in the development of Moritz Wagner, who earned All-Big Ten honors for two straight years and went on to become the 25th overall selection in the NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. It was the second U-M big man drafter under Washington tutelage after D.J. Wilson was selected with the 17th overall pick by the Milwaukee Bucks in 2017.

Washington came to Ann Arbor after spending a decade as a member of the Oakland coaching staff (2006-16). During his tenure, Washington helped the Golden Grizzlies to 198 wins, including five 20-plus win seasons, two straight Summit League regular season and conference tournament titles, and back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament (2010, '11).

At Oakland, Washington developed some of the top mid-major players in the country, including five who led the NCAA in a statistical category.

HOWARD EISLEY Assistant Coach



Following a successful nine years working and coaching in the NBA, Howard Eisley returned to his native state of Michigan and begins his second season as an assistant coach with the University of Michigan basketball program.

Despite his first season with the Wolverines coming to an early end due to the global coronavirus pandemic, Eisley was instrumental in working with the Maize and Blue guards and offensive sets. Before the cancellation of the postseason, U-M had reached a 19-12 record, won the Battle 4 Atlantis tournament following wins over No. 6 North Carolina and No. 8 Gonzaga and finished with a 10-10 mark in Big Ten play.

Prior to moving to the NCAA ranks and Michigan, Eisley spent a near decade moving up the ranks in the NBA starting as a player development assistant with the Los Angeles Clippers to an assistant coach with the Washington Wizards (2014-16) and New York Knicks (2016-19).

Chosen with the 30th overall selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves in the 1994 NBA Draft, Eisley played 12 seasons in the NBA, making stops with eight teams -- Minnesota, San Antonio, Utah, Dallas, New York, Phoenix, the Clippers and Denver. He played in 786 NBA games and recorded 5,116 career points, 2,748 assists, 540 steals and 516 3-point field goals. His career was highlighted by playing five seasons with the Utah Jazz and was developed behind Hall of Fame point guard John Stockton, contributing to two Western Conference titles in 1997 and 1998.

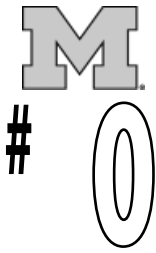
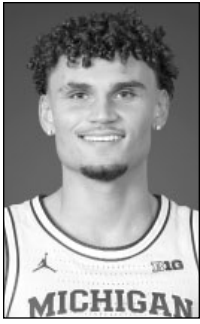
