### QUICK HITTERS

Jacksonville heads back out on the road, facing Florida State for the first time this season and the first time since the end of the 2019 season. Last year was the first time the Dolphins did not face the Seminoles since the 1992 season.

JU is off to its worst start in ASUN Conference play in the program's history and its worst start in conference play in general since 1997, when the Dolphins started 0-6 in their final year in the Sun Belt Conference.

Redshirt-junior Christian Coipel is starting to find the power bat that he displayed in the shortened 2020 season, when he led the ASUN in home runs (5) and finished second in RBIs (20). In his last 10 games, he has three doubles, three home runs, is slugging .639 and leads the team with 10 RBI in that span.

Redshirt-senior Ruben Someillan continues to prove himself effective as a leadoff man, but has hit well with guys on base this year as well. The Dolphins' ever-present top-of-the-order bat is hitting .368 when leading off innings, while hitting .361 with runners on.

Jacksonville pitching has cemented itself as one of the best strikeouts staffs in the land over the last several seasons. Currently, the staff is fanning opposing batters at a 9.39 K/9 rate. The best K/9 in school history was 8.80 in 2019 (519.2 IP).

Freshman Jesus Pacheco is already showing signs of the clutch gene early in his Jacksonville tenure. Of his 11 runs driven in this season, which is second on the team, six of them have come with 2-outs, and he is a perfect 4-4 with a runner on third and less than two outs this season, with a sac fly to his credit.

Freshman LHP Jack Carver has earned opportunities this season due to strong performances out of the pen as of late. Four of his seven appearances have come in the last seven games, and he has allowed only one hit to a lefty batter this season. He also leads the team with a 7.0 K/BB ratio.

**MILESTONE WATCH**

Due to the unconventional nature of the last two seasons, several Dolphins who took advantage of their extra years of eligibility are approaching milestones. R-Sr OF Ruben Someillan played his 200th career game on March 7, and in playing his 213th career game on Sunday, is 10th all-time at JU. R-Sr RHP Tyler Santana is currently t-3rd in games started in his career at JU, with 42 entering the weekend. He is 2nd all-time in strikeouts, with 237, 15 shy of the most all-time. He is also 6th in innings pitched, with 273.1 all-time. R-Sr SS Dakota Julylia has 32 career sacrifice hits, just three shy of the all-time record & 736 career at-bats, and is approaching the top-10 all-time in that category as well.

**WORTH THE WAIT**

R-Sr. OF Ruben Someillan hit his first career home run vs. The Citadel on March 3. His first long ball came in his 685th career at-bat. In what is almost the complete opposite situation, freshman Jesus Pacheco hit his first in his 55th career AB.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**

A whole host of freshman are being relied upon both offensively and in the field so far this season for JU. Jackson Grabsky has led the way, starting 23 games at the hot corner, Jesus Pacheco has started all but one game at second, and Blake Delamielleure has started 15 games in the OF. They hold three of the top four batting averages on the team. Trace Burchard has 11 starts, seven at DH and four in LF, securing his first career RBI and multi-RBI games at home against Wofford.

**UNEXPECTED EXPERIENCE**

Due to the NCAA's decision to grant an extra year of eligibility to all spring sports athletes after last season was cut short due to the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Dolphins return six players who were seniors last year. CF Ruben Someillan leads the way with 202 starts and 213 games played in his career. SS Dakota Julylia is not far behind, having started 199 games in the middle infield, with 203 total appearances. RHP Tyler Santana has logged 69 appearances on the mound, 42 of them starts over the last three seasons. RHP Mike Cassala started his career as a two-way player, playing in 72 games as either a catcher or DH, and has 49 appearances on the mound, 15 of them starts. C/OF Cory Heffron is in his third season with JU after playing one season at both Gulf Coast State and Wright State. He has played 95 career games, starting all but four, most of them in the outfield, though he took over primary catching duties this season. LHP Jagger McCoy is also in his third season with the Dolphins, and has 48 career appearances with two starts on the bump.

**EXTRA, EXTRA!**

Jacksonville played in seven (!) extra inning game in 2019, and added another in the shortened 2020 season, falling to Florida 4-3 in 10 innings. After an astounding eight games that went to extras in 2017, the Dolphins have played free baseball 18 times in Head Coach Chris Hayes' four-years at the helm. JU boasts an 11-7 mark in such contests.

**PRESEASON AWARDS**

Redshirt-juniors RHP Austin Temple and 1B Christian Coipel were voted by the league's coaches to the Preseason All-ASUN Team. Temple led the conference in ERA and finished the season firing 19.1 consecutive scoreless innings, a streak he takes into 2021 when he figures to factor prominently into the weekend rotation again. Coipel led the ASUN in home runs and finished second in RBI's.

**DOWN GOES...**

Jacksonville beat #5 Florida on March 12 to collect yet another win against a ranked opponent. The four-plus year total under Head Coach Chris Hayes is 10, and 16 such victories in the last nine seasons.

**HELLO, MY NAME IS**

Fifteen newcomers join the Dolphins this season, with 11 of them being true freshman, three from the junior college ranks and one a Division II transfer.

**TAKE ONE FOR THE TEAM**

After being hit by a pitch three games in a row last week, redshirt-senior OF Ruben Someillan took over as the career record holder on Thursday in most HBP at JU, with 28. The four-year starter wore one four times his freshman season and 10 times as a sophomore. His 11 as a junior is tied for fourth most in a single season all time at JU, and he passed Seth Dewitt for the most all time, who was hit 26 times in his career from 2014-17.

### UNIQUE CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Due to the desire to reduce travel this season amidst the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the ASUN Conference split the league into a north and a south division. JU is set to compete with North Florida, Stetson and FGCU in the southern split, faces those three programs a combined 21 times. The Dolphins also play Lipscomb twice and North Alabama once as part of a round robin to end the season, and will not see league foes Liberty, Bellarmine or Kennesaw State unless they draw them in the ASUN Baseball Championship.

### CHANGES TO THE CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

The 2021 ASUN Baseball Championship is scheduled to take place over two weeks this year. The first round features a best of three series at the higher seeded opponents home field. The winners of those series advance to the following week, where round two is scheduled to take place in Jacksonville, as a more traditional round robin, double-elimination format.

### DEPTH AN ASSET

Head Coach Chris Hayes had repeated one thing throughout the summer and fall leading into the 2021 season: depth may be his team's greatest strength. The NCAA blanket waiver that allowed all seniors to return for another season in 2021 if they so chose allowed the Dolphins to keep six players they expected to move on, while also adding 15 newcomers.

### WELCOMING THREE NEW SCHOOLS

The ASUN Conference announced that it is welcoming three new schools into the league starting with the fall of 2021. Jacksonville State, Eastern Kentucky and Central Arkansas are set to give the league 12 total members. Jacksonville State and Eastern Kentucky are leaving the Ohio Valley Conference, while Central Arkansas vacates the Southland Conference. The Dolphins are most familiar with JSU, playing the Gamecocks 22 times over the years, and holding a 20-2 all-time mark against them, including a perfect 6-0 mark in their most recent series, in 2018 and 2019. JU is 3-1 all-time against ECU and has never faced Central Arkansas before.

### HEARING THEIR NAMES ON DRAFT DAY

For the 12th consecutive year, a Jacksonville Dolphin was selected in the annual Major League Baseball Draft. Despite the draft being shortened to just five rounds, junior RHP Trent Palmer was selected in the 3rd Round by the Toronto Blue Jays. Going 77th overall, he was the Dolphins' highest draft selection since Chris Anderson went in the first round in 2013. He is the third JU player to go in the third round since 2016. ### DOLPHINS IN THE PROS

RHP Alex McRae made his major league debut July 2019 for the Pittsburgh Pirates. He became the 10th former Dolphin to appear in a game for a major league ballclub. There are currently 12 former JU players active in the professional ranks. Austin Hays made the Orioles Opening Day roster and 12-year pro Daniel Murphy announced his retirement from MLB in February.



## HEAD COACH CHRIS HAYES

Chris Hayes enters his fifth year as the head coach of the Dolphins. Through his first four seasons at the helm of his alma mater, JU has won 117 games, returned to the NCAA postseason for the first time in seven years, won a regular season ASUN Conference Championship and brought the program back to being one of the top in the state of Florida.

The Dolphins' season was cut short in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but the team had begun to find its stride just before the end. The squad won eight of its last 11 contests, and registered a win over ranked West Virginia, road victories at Southeastern Louisiana and Bethune-Cookman, took the series against Austin Peay and won three of four games played in a spring break round-robin with Illinois State and VCU.

The starting pitching excelled for the entirety of the season, headlined by junior right-handers Trent Palmer and Austin Temple, who went on to win a combined three ASUN Pitcher of the Week awards. The staff's 188 strikeouts and 10.60 K/9 were both tops in the ASUN Conference. Palmer led the league in strikeouts and finished 13th nationally with a 0.61 WHIP. Temple finished with a league-leading 0.71 ERA. On the offensive side, Scott Dubrule collected the sixth-most hits in the country on the season, and Christian Coipel showed signs of record-setting power, slugging five home runs in just 17 games played. Jacksonville tested itself early and often again in the 2019 season, hosting three straight eventual NCAA Tournament teams to begin the year. Highlights from the season include winning the season series vs. Florida State, an eventual College World Series participant, for the first time since 2016, and winning conference series over Liberty, NJIT, Lipscomb and Stetson. The ASUN Conference Championship also featured two extra innings victory to open up the tournament.

For the first time in school history, a Dolphin earned ASUN Conference Defensive Player of the Year when redshirt-junior shortstop Dakota Julylia was honored. He was one of two First Team All-ASUN selections along with third baseman Angel Camacho. Four other JU players earned all-conference honors, while two took home All-Academic awards. Three players were selected in the MLB Draft, led by Camacho, who went in the eighth round to Toronto, and followed by RHP Zach Bryant in the 15th round by the Chicago Cubs and RHP Chris Mauloni to Boston in the 35th round.

In 2018, Hayes led JU to a 40-win campaign for the first time since the 2006 season, earning a 2-seed in the Gainesville Regional and picking up an NCAA postseason win over FAU to start the regional. The Dolphins also earned a national ranking for the first time since 1997, reaching as high as #25 in the Baseball America Top-25 and #24 in the Perfect Game/Rawlings Top-25, as well as climbing as high as #16 in the RPI. Going 22-7 at John Sessions Stadium, JU posted its best home winning percentage since 1984. The Dolphins also picked up five regular season wins against eventual NCAA postseason participants, highlighted by an 8-4 win in Gainesville, Fla. over then #1 Florida on April 17.

Many players were recognized for their accomplishments throughout the season and after it. Freshman closer Chris Mauloni, who set a new single-season and career record for saves at JU while leading the nation and earning All-American distinctions from four different organizations. Eight players earned All-ASUN honors at the end of the season, three made the ASUN All-Tournament squad, Angel Camacho was named to the NCAA All-Regional Team and three different players earned ASUN Player of the Week honors four different times. Junior RHP Chris Gau was drafted in the 14th Round by the Tampa Bay Rays in the 2018 MLB Draft and signed a professional contract.

Hayes guided the Dolphins to a 36-24 record in 2017, leading the team to the ASUN Championship final. JU picked up wins against six NCAA Tournament participants, including a 3-2 home victory over eventual national champion Florida. The campaign also included a 13-game winning streak from April 1-22, the program's longest in 26 years.

In Hayes' first season the Dolphins had three players who received weekly ASUN honors during the season. Three players made ASUN All-Conference squads, while three more were honored on the All-Freshman Team, and four were named to the All-Tournament Team. Following the season, RHP Michael Baumann departed the team for the MLB June Amateur Draft, and was selected in the third round by the Baltimore Orioles. LHP Casey Kulina later signed with the Arizona Diamondbacks organization as an unsigned free agent.

Before taking the reins of the program, Hayes spent three years as the Dolphins assistant head coach during his second stint with the team, which began in 2013.

As assistant head coach, Hayes served as the third base coach, coordinated the Dolphin offense, worked with the hitters, baserunners and infielders. He also coordinated and managed team travel, equipment and the strength and conditioning program. Additionally, Hayes spent significant time assisting Dolphin recruiting coordinator, Chuck Jeroloman, with recruiting.

Hayes' credentials as a result of working with the JU offense during his eight years as an assistant are impressive.

During his tenure, the Dolphins posted an eight-year batting average of .288, scored 5.95 runs per game and averaged 78 stolen bases per season and his work with the infield produced an average .964 fielding percentage.

In addition to the on-field statistical performance, Hayes mentored four All-Americans, two freshman All-Americans, 19 Atlantic Sun Conference selections, 12 ASUN All-Freshman team selections, three ASUN Player/Pitcher of the Year award winners. Nineteen Dolphins signed Major League Baseball contracts, including Austin Hays, JJ Gould, Connor Marabell, and Angela Amendolare.

A 1995 graduate of Jacksonville University, Hayes was previously on staff from 2003-08 before taking over the Seminole State College of Florida program as Head Coach for five seasons from 2009-2013. He brings to the JU program 15 years of coaching and nine years of playing experience at the collegiate and professional levels.

In 2013, Hayes returned to the River City after leading Seminole State to a 125-113-1 overall record in five seasons and represented the Mid-Florida Conference in the FCSAA state tournament in 2013. During his tenure, 51 student-athletes moved on to play at four-year universities and 13 were selected in MLB draft, including Cleveland Indians MLB pitcher, Mike Clevinger. Of the student-athletes Hayes mentored, 32 were named all-conference selections, eight earned all-state recognition including the 2013 Mid-Florida conference Pitcher of the Year, 2011 MFC Player of the Year, 2010 MFC Fireman of the Year and 2010 MFC Defensive Player of the Year. Hayes first joined the Dolphins as an assistant coach in 2003, helping the team to back-to-back ASUN Conference championships and NCAA Regional appearances in 2006 and 2007. It marked the first consecutive regional appearances for the program since his final two years as a player with the Dolphins (1994-95). As recruiting coordinator, Hayes received national accolades with back-to-back recruiting classes ranked in Collegiate Baseball's Top 40 Poll.

Prior to his time at JU, Hayes spent two years as an assistant coach at Wolfson High School in Jacksonville from 2002-03, where the team won the district championship in 2002 and 2003, while earning a No. 12 national ranking at the end of the 2003 season. Wolfson also was ranked in the top 10 in the state every year of Hayes' tenure, while seven of his players received college scholarships. Two of his coaching prospects are former first-round selections and MLB players - Eric Hurley and Billy Butler.

Before launching his coaching career, Hayes spent five seasons (1995-2000) with the Toronto Blue Jays organization after being drafted in the 28th round of the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. He played every infield and outfield position in five seasons with the Blue Jays' minor league system finishing with a .276 career batting average. Over the course of his career, Hayes made stops in St. Catharines, Ontario; Hagerstown, Md.; Dunedin, Fla.; and Knoxville, Tenn. while in the minors.
