**ON WALKER:** Earned his bachelor's degree in Social Science from Florida State University on April 23, 2021...two-time team captain...a two-time All-ACC selection – All-ACC Second Team in 2021 and All-ACC Honorable Mention in 2020...earned All-District IV Second Team honors as selected by the USBWA in 2021...an integral member of three NCAA Tournament teams, the Seminoles' 2020 ACC Championship Team and Florida State's 2019 and 2021 ACC Tournament Finalist teams...finished his career with 96 wins as a Seminole player – the third most in school history...Florida State was 96-32 overall (.750 winning percentage) and 51-22 in ACC play (.699 winning percentage) during his career as a Seminole...finished his career ranked sixth in school history with 479 career 3-point field goals attempted, ninth in school history with 173 career 3-point field goals made, 15<sup>th</sup> in school history with a .785 career free throw percentage, tied for 23<sup>rd</sup> with his .391 career 33-point field goal percentage, tied for 24<sup>th</sup> with 82 games started and tied for 25<sup>th</sup> with 120 career games played...finished his career ranked 39<sup>th</sup> in school history with 1,077 points...one of 49 players in school history to score 1,000 or more career points...a member of Florida State's 2020 Regular Season ACC Championship Team...the Seminoles won the ACC Championship with a 16-4 mark and with the 16 ACC victories setting the school record for conference wins in a single season...helped Florida State advance to the championship game of the ACC Tournament in two of his four seasons as a Seminole...played in three NCAA Tournaments and in 10 NCAA Tournament games in his four seasons as a Seminole...the Seminoles were on the precipice of earning a high national seeding when the 2020 NCAA Tournament was cancelled due to the coronavirus...played in 10 career NCAA Tournament games in leading the Seminoles to the Elite Eight of the 2018 NCAA Tournament, as well as the Sweet 16 of the 2019 and 2021 NCAA Tournaments...led Florida State to a 29-8 overall record and a 13-5 record in the ACC during his sophomore season...the Seminoles' 29 overall victories ranks as a program record for victories in a single season...helped lead Florida State to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 record in ACC play in 2020...the Seminoles' 16 ACC wins rank as the most in a single season in conference play in school history...scored 20 points or more eight times – his career-high of 24 at Virginia Tech as a freshman (Jan. 20, 2018), 23 in a win over Louisville as a junior (Jan. 4, 2020), 22 against Colorado State as a freshman (Nov. 19, 2017), 22 at Miami as a sophomore (Jan. 27, 2019), 22 against UCF as a senior (Dec. 19, 2020), 21 against LSU as a sophomore (Nov. 23, 2018), 21 against Notre Dame as a junior (March 4, 2020) and 21 against North Carolina as a senior (Jan. 16, 2021)...helped the Seminoles defeat 20 nationally ranked teams during his career – six as a freshman, six as a sophomore, four as a junior, and four as a senior...finished his career with an undefeated, 4-0 record against the Florida Gators...helped lead the Seminoles into the national rankings in each of his four seasons...Florida State was ranked as high as No. 6 during his freshman season, as high as No. 9 during his sophomore season, as high as No. 4 his junior season and as high as No. 9 his senior season...helped Florida State finish in the final top-10 of the AP Poll as both a freshman (No. 10), a junior (No. 4) and a senior (No. 10)...helped the No. 9 seeded Seminoles to victories over No. 8 seed Missouri (March 16, 2018, 67-54), No. 1 seed Xavier (March 18, 2018, 75-70) and No. 4 Gonzaga (March 22, 2018, 75-60)...the Seminoles' three wins in the 2018 NCAA Tournament marked the third time in school history that Florida State had won three games in a single NCAA Tournament...also marked the first time in school history the Seminoles had defeated three higher seeded teams in the same NCAA Tournament...the Seminoles' victory over the No. 1 seeded Musketeers was the first in school history over a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament...Florida State won the championship of the Inaugural Jamaica Classic and Walker was named to the All-Tournament Team as he scored 22 points in the championship game of the tournament against Colorado State in the first tournament of his collegiate career...a 2017 McDonald's All-American who averaged 27.8 points and 6.5 rebounds as a senior at Jonesboro (Ga.) high school...the 12<sup>th</sup> of 13 McDonald's All-Americans to sign with Florida State and the fifth of six (Walker, Scottie Barnes (2020), Dwayne Bacon (2015), Michael Snaer (2009), Chris Singleton (2008) and Von Wafer (2003)) to sign with Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff...ranked as the No. 8 prep prospect by ESPN.com...the No. 1 ranked shooting guard as a high school senior in 2017...the nation's 22<sup>nd</sup> best prep player according to 247sports.com...participated in the Steph Curry SC30 Select Camp prior to his junior season...credits Curry with helping him understand the game better...his athleticism helped him earn football scholarship offers from Clemson, Miami (Fla.) and Michigan...was an outstanding dual-threat athlete as a free safety and as a wide receiver...earned football scholarship offers despite finishing his football career following his sophomore season...earned the Seminoles' Newcomer of the Year Award at Florida State's Annual Awards Banquet in 2018...earned a special team J.U.I.C.E award (Just Us In Combat Everyday) at the Seminoles' Honors Banquet in 2019...earned the Tip of the Spear Award at the Seminoles' Celebratory Honors Banquet in 2020...the Tip of the Spear Award is presented annually to the member of the men's basketball team who exemplifies Florida State's unconquered spirit and who gives

unselfishly of himself throughout the season...presented with the Golden Nole for the men's basketball team in 2021...the award is presented to a member of each Seminole athletic team and represents significant contributions on the basketball court, in the classroom and in the community.

**AS A SENIOR (2021):** Averaged a career-high 12.2 points (first on the team), a career-high 2.5 rebounds (sixth), a career-high 2.5 assists (second) and a career-high 0.9 steals (fourth) while making a team-leading and career-high tying 44 3-point field goals...established career-highs for points scored (293), average points per game (12.2), field goals made (95), assists (61), field goal percentage (.436), 3-point field goal percentage (.423), rebounds per game (2.5), blocked shots (nine), minutes played (697) and minutes played per game (29.1)...team captain...All-ACC Second Team selection — the second time he earned All-ACC honors during his career...earned All-District IV Honors from the USBWA and All-District Honors (Second Team) from the NABC...the 49<sup>th</sup> player in school history to score 1,000 career points and finished his career ranked 39<sup>th</sup> in school history with 1,077 career points...named as a candidate for the Jerry West Award as presented by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame as the nation's top shooting guard...marked the second time in his career that he has been a candidate for the award...he was also a candidate for the award in 2018 as a freshman...a preseason All-ACC Second Team selection by the attending media at ACC Operation Basketball...a preseason All-ACC First Team selection by *Sports Illustrated*...scored a team-high 17 points (on a perfect six of six from the free throw line) with four rebounds and two assists in Florida State's season-opening 86-58 victory over North Florida in Tallahassee (Dec. 2)...totaled a team-high 19 points and one rebound in Florida State's 69-67 overtime victory over Indiana in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (Dec. 9)...totaled 17 points with three assists and three steals in Florida State's victory over Florida at the Donald L. Tucker Center...was a perfect 12 of 12 from the free throw line against the Gators to tie the single game school record for perfection from the free line (Dec. 12)...scored 14 points, pulled down four rebounds and was credited with one assist and one steal in Florida State's 74-61 win over Georgia Tech to begin ACC play in Tallahassee (Dec. 15)...a team-high 22 points, three rebounds, two assists, one blocked shot and one steal against UCF in Tallahassee (Dec. 19)...totaled seven points, two rebounds and two assists in Florida State's victory over Gardner-Webb in Tallahassee (Dec. 21)...double figures with 11 points, three rebounds and three assists as Florida State played at Clemson (Dec. 29)...scored 19 points on six of seven shooting from the field, three of four shooting from the 3-point line and a perfect four of four shooting from the free throw line in Florida State's 105-73 win over NC State in Tallahassee (Jan. 13)...scored 21 points with three rebounds, three assists and three steals in Florida State's 82-75 victory over North Carolina in Tallahassee (Jan. 16)...totaled two points along with a career-high 10 assists, two blocked shots and one steal in Florida State's 78-65 win at Louisville (Jan. 18)...scored 10 points and added three rebounds and three assists in Florida State's 80-61 win over Clemson in Tallahassee (Jan. 23)...in double figures with 11 points, two rebounds, one steal and one blocked shot in Florida State's victory over Miami in Tallahassee (Jan. 27)...scored 14 points (on three made 3-point shots) with five assists and two steals in Florida State's 92-85 overtime win over Wake Forest in Tallahassee (Feb. 13)...totaled a team-high 17 points, a career-high tying six rebounds and one steal in Florida State's 81-60 win over No. 7 Virginia in Tallahassee...made five of six 3-point shots in Florida State's victory over the Cavaliers (Feb. 15)...totaled nine points, three steals, two rebounds and two assists against North Carolina...surpassed the 1,000 career point mark against the Tar Heels at the Dean E. Tucker for his career (March 3)...totaled 12 points and two assists in Florida State's game at Notre Dame (March 6)...totaled nine points and two assists in Florida State's 69-66 win over North Carolina in the ACC Tournament semifinals...the win sent the Seminoles to the ACC Tournament Championship game for the fourth time in school history (March 12)...scored 15 points with four rebounds and one assist in Florida State's game against Georgia Tech in the 2021 ACC Tournament Championship game at the Greensboro Coliseum (March 13)...totaled seven points, three assists, two rebounds and one steal in Florida State's 71-53 win over Colorado in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at the Indiana Farmers Coliseum...the victory sent the Seminoles into the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season (March 22)...scored 10 points, two rebounds and two assists in 26 minutes of playing time in Florida State's game against Michigan in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Ind. (March 28).

**AS A JUNIOR (2020):** Averaged 10.6 points (third on the team), 1.7 rebounds (ninth), 1.5 assists (fifth) and 0.8 steals per game (sixth) while making a career-high tying 44 3-point field goals (tied for first)...earned All-ACC Honorable Mention Honors as one of the top players in the top conference in the nation...led Florida State to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 record in ACC play...the Seminoles won the ACC Championship as they claimed the ACC Regular Season Championship for the first time in school history...the ACC Champions for the 2020 season as the ACC and NCAA Tournaments were cancelled because of the coronavirus...established career-highs for field goals attempted (229), free throws made (61), free throws attempted (76), and free throw percentage (.803) while tying his career-highs for field goals made (85) and 3-point field goals made (44)...a team captain as named by Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff...scored in double figures 15 times as a junior...he scored in double figures a career-high 15 times as a junior, 14 times as a senior, 11 times as a freshman and 10 times as a sophomore...tied his own personal single season record as he made 44 3-point shots as a junior and made a combined 88 3-point shots as a sophomore and a junior...made three or more 3-point shots in a single game seven times including a season high of five at Louisville (5-7, 23 points) and against Syracuse (5-11, 16 points), four coming at Miami (4-9, 19 points) and at Notre Dame (4-8, 21 points) and three coming against Western Carolina (3-6, 18 points), Clemson in Tallahassee (3-6, 11 points) and at Wake Forest (3-8, 15 points) — Florida State was 7-0 in those games...Walker averaged 17.6 points per game when he made at least three 3-point field goals in a single game...totaled 12 points, three rebounds, one assist and one steal in Florida State's 63-51 victory over No. 6 Florida in Gainesville...finished five of six from the free throw line in the win over the Gators on the road (Nov. 10)... a team-high tying 18 points, four rebounds, two assists and one blocked shot in Florida State's win over Western Carolina...totaled 17 of his 18 points in the second half as Florida State rallied from a 17-point deficit to defeat the Catamounts (Nov. 15)...scored 10 points, pulled down five rebounds and earned two assists in Florida State's victory over No. 16 Tennessee in the semifinals of the Emerald Coast Classic (Nov. 29)...scored 10 points and added four rebounds against Indiana in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on the road (Dec. 3)...scored 11 points and added two assists and one steal in Florida State's victory over Clemson in Tallahassee (Dec. 8)...scored 12 points with three assists in Florida State's 98-81 victory over North Florida (Dec. 17)...totaled 11 points (on six of seven made free throws), two steals and one assist in Florida State's victory over USF in the Orange Bowl Classic (Dec. 21)...a team-high 23 points, three assists and one blocked shot in Florida State's victory over Louisville on the road in ACC play (Jan. 4)...totaled 15 points and two assists in Florida State's victory over Wake Forest in Winston-Salem (Jan. 8)...scored 19 points (all after halftime) with two assists, one steal and one blocked shot in 23 minutes of play in Florida State's victory over Miami on Coral Gables...scored 17 points in the second half on four made 3-point field goals and totaled two points in overtime as Florida State outscored Miami, 14-10, in the extra session to earn the ACC road victory (Jan. 18)...scored 14 points to go along with three assists and one blocked shot in Florida State's victory over Miami in Tallahassee (Feb. 8)...scored 16 points on five made 3-point field goals in Florida State's 80-77 win over Syracuse in Tallahassee (Feb. 15)...scored seven points and added four rebounds and four assists in Florida State's victory over Pitt in Tallahassee (Feb. 18)...a team-high 12 points (all in the second half) with four rebounds and three steals as Florida State won at NC State 67-61 (Feb. 22)...scored 12 points and added two assists and two steals in Florida State's 82-67 victory over Louisville in Tallahassee (Feb. 24)...totaled 21 points (16 in the second half) on four made 3-point field goals (three in the second half) in leading the Seminoles to their 73-71 win at Notre Dame (March 4).

**AS A SOPHOMORE (2019):** Averaged a 7.5 points (fourth on the team), 2.2 rebounds (seventh), 1.6 assists (fourth) and 0.8 steals (second) while making a career-high tying 44 3-point shots (second)...established career-highs for games started (34), field goals attempted (250), 3-point field goals made (44), 3-

point field goals attempted (134), offensive rebounds (14), defensive rebounds (64), total rebounds (78), and steals (29) as a sophomore member of the starting lineup...helped lead the Seminoles to a 29-8 overall record, a 13-5 mark in the ACC, a fourth place finish in the ACC standings, an appearance in the ACC Tournament Championship for the third time in school history and to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season...led Florida State to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in his career and for the third consecutive season...as the No. 4 seed in the West Region, helped Florida State beat No. 14 seeded Vermont (March 21, 2019, 76-69) and No. 12 seeded Murray State (March 23, 2019, 90-62) to advance to the Sweet 16 for the second consecutive season...the Seminoles lost to No. 1 seeded Gonzaga (March 28, 72-58) in the round of 16...helped the Seminoles advance to the championship game of the 2019 ACC Tournament for the third time in school history...the Seminoles defeated No. 16 Virginia Tech in overtime in the quarterfinals (March 14, 2019, 65-63) and No. 2 National Champion Virginia (March 15, 2019, 79-69) to advance to the title game where the Seminoles fell to Duke (March 16, 2019, 73-63)...the Seminoles won a school record eight consecutive ACC games from Jan. 22 (against Clemson) through Feb. 19 (at Clemson)...the Seminoles improved from 1-4 in ACC play to 9-4 in the ACC during the winning streak...third on the team with two 20+ point scoring games – 22 at Miami (Jan. 27) and 21 against LSU (Nov. 23) – both victories for the Seminoles...established his career-high with six 3-point field goals made in scoring his season-high of 22 points in Florida State's 68-62 win at Miami (Jan. 27)...his six 3-point field goals made against the Hurricanes are tied for the sixth highest number of 3-point shots made in an ACC game by a Seminole player...totaled five 3-point shots made in Florida State's 79-76 overtime win over LSU (Nov. 23) in the semifinals of the AdvoCare Invitational...scored 21 points as the Seminoles defeated the Tigers to advance to the championship finals of the AdvoCare Invitational...played his career-high of 42 minutes in the Seminoles' overtime win over LSU...led the Seminoles in scoring in three different games – 22 at Miami, 21 against LSU and 13 in the Seminoles' 73-72 victory over Purdue in the ACC/Big 10 Challenge (Nov. 28)...scored 10 points and added two rebounds in the Seminoles' 81-60 season-opening win over Florida in Tallahassee (Nov. 6)...made two of four shots from the 3-point line in Florida State's victory over the Gators...double figure scoring with 12 points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals in Florida State's 93-61 win over Canisius in Tallahassee (Nov. 19)...a game-high and team-leading 21 points with five rebounds and a career-high tying three steals in Florida State's 79-76 overtime win over LSU (Nov. 23)...made five 3-point field goals in the win over the Tigers...a 3-pointer in overtime against the Tigers and gave Florida State a 73-68 lead early in the overtime period as the Seminoles outscored LSU, 11-8, in the extra session...scored a team-high 13 points with two rebounds in 37 minutes in Florida State's come-from-behind 73-72 win over Purdue in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in Tallahassee...totaled 14 points and two made 3-point shots to go along with two assists and two steals in Florida State's 83-67 win over Troy in Tallahassee (Dec. 3)...in double figure scoring with 12 points, two blocked shots, two rebounds and one assist at Boston College (Jan. 20)...totaled a season-high 22 points on a career-high six made 3-point shots and a season-high five assists in Florida State's 78-66 win over Miami in Coral Gables (Jan. 27)...totaled 11 points, two rebounds and two assists in Florida State's victory over Syracuse in the Carrier Dome (Feb. 5)...totaled 11 points, one rebound, one assist and one steal in 33 minutes played in Florida State's 80-75 overtime victory over No. 16 Louisville at the Donald L. Tucker Center (Feb. 9)...added nine points and totaled two assists in Florida State's 69-47 win over Georgia Tech in Atlanta (Feb. 16)...scored nine points and added two assists in 29 minutes of playing time in the Seminoles' victory at Clemson (Feb. 19)...totaled nine points, four rebounds, two steals and one assist in Florida State's victory over Notre Dame in Tallahassee (Feb. 25)...scored 15 points to go along with two rebounds and one assist in Florida State's 78-73 win over NC State in Tallahassee (March 2)...double figures with 11 points, three rebounds and one steal in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech on Senior Night in Tallahassee (March 5)...scored nine points and added one assist in Florida State's 69-59 win over No. 2 Virginia in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament in the Spectrum Center in Charlotte (March 15)...tied his career-high with six rebounds while adding three assists and one steal in Florida State's victory over Murray State in the NCAA Tournament...the victory sent the Seminoles to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season (March 23)...totaled seven points, four rebounds, and two steals in Florida State's game against Gonzaga in the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament at the Honda Center in Anaheim, Calif. (March 28).
