

SEMINOLES BEGIN FALL SEASON AT SCHOONER FALL CLASSIC FOUR-MATCH FALL SEASON BEGINS A SITE OF 2016 CHAMPIONSHIP

NATIONALLY RANKED SEMINOLES BEGIN FALL SEASON AT SCHOONER FALL CLASSIC

Florida State, which is ranked No. 5 nationally by Golfweek, opens its 2021 fall season at the Schooner Fall Classic at the Belmar Golf Club in Norman, Okla. (Sept. 26-27). The Seminoles upcoming season is a special one as it will be their first fall season in play since COVID-19 took over the 2020 fall season. Not only is the Schooner Fall Classic a great event to open the season, but all proceeds are directed towards the Toby Keith Foundation and the OK Kids Korral. In 2014, the Toby Keith Foundation opened the OK Kids Korral, a home for pediatric cancer patients, that is cost-free, convenient, and comfortable, for those receiving treatment at The Children's Hospital at OU Medical Center, Stephenson Cancer Center, and other nearby facilities.

FLORIDA STATE MAKES SEVENTH APPEARANCE AT SCHOONER FALL CLASSIC

Florida State, which won the team championship at the 2016 Schooner Fall Classic, makes its seventh appearance in the tournament this week at the Belmar Golf Club. The Seminoles have finished in the top five of the team standings in three of their first six appearances in the classic. A pair of Seminoles – Morgane Metraux (in 2018) and Frida Kinhult (in 2019) -- have claimed individual medalist honors. Metraux and Kinhult are among six Seminoles who have finished in the top 10 of the individual standings in the events' history.

FLORIDA STATE EARNS PAIR OF NATIONAL PRESEASON RANKINGS

Florida State, which returns four of its five starters from its top-10 national finish in 2021, is ranked No. 5 by Golfweek and No. 7 by the Women's Golf Coaches Association in their respective preseason polls. The Seminoles are one of seven teams ranked in the top 10 of both polls as they begin practice for the 2021-22 season. Florida State begins its four-match fall season at the Schooner Fall Classic at the University of Oklahoma (Sept. 26-27). Florida State returns one of the most complete and competitive lineups in the nation for the 2021-22 fall and spring seasons.

WALLIN NAMED TO ANNIKA AWARD WATCH LIST

Three-time All-American Beatrice Wallin, the 2021 ACC Golfer of the Year, has been named as one of 20 golfers to the Preseason ANNIKA Award Watch List presented by Stifel. Wallin was a finalist for the award as a junior and will be a candidate for every major award in college golf as a senior. She enters the 2021-22 season ranked second in school history with a 71.96 career stroke average. Wallin earned All-American and All-ACC honors and became the first Seminole to earn ACC Golfer of the Year honors in 2021. She was named a First-Team-All-American by both the Women's Golf Coaches Association and Golfweek. Wallin finished her junior season with a career-low 70.72 stroke average, and two individual tournament wins (at the Florida State Match Up and the Pinetree Collegiate). Wallin is one of five returning First-Team All-Americans (Wallin; Karen Fredgaard, Houston; Rachel Ingrid Lindblad, LSU; Emma Spitz, UCLA) and one of three returning All-ACC players (Wallin; Gina Kim, Duke; Rachel Kuehn, Wake Forest) on the preseason ANNIKA list.

SIX FROM SEMINOLE WOMEN'S GOLF TEAM NAMED TO 2021 ACC ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

First-Team All-American Beatrice Wallin headlines an outstanding list of six members of the Florida State Women's Golf Team that were named to the 2021 ACC Academic Honor Roll. Wallin is joined on the Honor Roll by Alice Hodge, Elle Johnson, Kathleen Sumner, Taylor Roberts and Amelia Williamson. It marks the 10th consecutive season that at least six Seminole women's golfers have been named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll. Under Head Coach Amy Bond, the Seminoles earned a 3.57 cumulative grade point average during the spring 2021 competitive season. Roberts earned President's List honors (with a perfect 4.0 GPA) while three players earned Dean's List honors (Hodge, Johnson, Sumner, and Williamson) during the spring. The members of the 2020-21 Florida State Women's Golf Team have earned academic honors 20 times (five President's List and 15 Dean's List) during their careers.

FOUR FROM WOMEN'S GOLF NAMED SCHOLAR ALL-AMERICANS

Four members of the nationally ranked Florida State Women's Golf team — Alice Hodge, Elle Johnson, Taylor Roberts and Amelia Williamson — have been named to the 2021 Women's Golf Coaches Association All-American Scholar Team. The selection of the four women marks the first time each of them have been named to the prestigious WGCA academic team and the eighth consecutive season at least one Seminole has been named to the team. With four Seminoles named to the WGCA All-American Scholar Team, it marks the 22nd season that at least one Seminole has been on the WGCA All-American Scholar Athlete team in the 26 years the team has been named (every year since 1996). Florida State has had 10 players named to the WGCA All-American Scholar team 21 times since 2014 — an average of more than two selections per season under 11th-year Head Coach Amy Bond. Four players — Whitney Brummett, Amanda Doherty, Kim Mettraux, and Morgane Mettraux — have been named to the team a school-record tying four times.

FETCHO NAMED ASSISTANT COACH AT FLORIDA STATE

Justin Fetcho, who led Southern Illinois to two Missouri Valley Conference Championships as its Head Men's Coach, has been named as an assistant golf coach at Florida State. He will work with both the Seminoles' nationally ranked men's and women's programs. In five seasons as the head coach at Southern Illinois, Fetcho led the Salukis to six tournament titles and the MVC Championships in 2016 and 2019. He was named the MVC Coach of the Year in 2019. He coached many of the top golfers in SIU history, including the school's first MVC Golfer of the Year (Peyton Wilhoit in 2018), five different golfers who earned All-Conference honors a total of 10 times, and eight different Saluki golfers who were named MVC Players of the Week. In 2018, Wilhoit became the first Saluki golfer since 1972 to qualify for an NCAA Regional. At the 2019 NCAA Regional, Wilhoit placed 12th overall (-2), which is the best finish for an SIU golfer in an NCAA postseason event in school history.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S LINEUP AT THE 2021 SCHOONER FALL CLASSIC

Charlotte Heath, Sophomore, Baliff Bridge, England (1st Schooner Fall Classic Appearance)

Earned All-America Honorable Mention honors as a freshman in 2021 as named by Golfweek...earned All-ACC Honors as a Seminole freshman in 2021...one of the nation's top players who is in her second season with the Seminoles...helped lead the Seminoles to their ninth place finish in the 2021 NCAA Championship Finals, to the team title at the 2021 NCAA Louisville Regional Championship, to a runner-up finish in the 2021 ACC Championship and to three team titles (at the Florida State Match Up, the Pinetree Collegiate and the Louisville Regional Championship) during her first season as a Seminole...tied the school record with a single round score of 65 in the first round of the Valspar Augusta Invitational on March 13, 2021...enters her sophomore season with the fourth best career stroke average in school history at 72.58.

Alice Hodge, Sophomore, Larchmont, N.Y. (1st Schooner Fall Classic Appearance)

Enjoyed a fabulous freshman season and will be one of the top underclassmen in collegiate golf in 2022...in Florida State's lineup throughout the spring of 2021 and helped the Seminoles to unprecedented heights...the Seminoles were ranked No. 1 in the nation for two weeks, finished in a school-record ninth place in the NCAA Championship Finals, won the team title at the NCAA Louisville Regional Championship, finished as the runners-up in the ACC Championship and won three tournament championships during her first season in Tallahassee...played in all eight matches in the spring including the ACC Championship, the Louisville Regional Championship and the NCAA Championship Finals...helped Florida State win the team championships at the Florida State Match Up, the Pinetree Invitational and the NCAA Louisville Regional.

Beatrice Wallin, Senior, Olofrop, Sweden (3rd Schooner Fall Classic Appearance)

Earned All-American First Team honors from the WGCA and Golfweek in 2021...the 2021 ACC Golfer of the Year...played in the 2020 U.S. Women's Open at the Champions Golf Club in Houston, Texas...at the top of the list of collegiate golfers for the 2021-22 season who will be a leader among collegiate golfers and a candidate for every major award...ranks second in school history with her 71.96 stroke average entering her senior season...owns three of the top-10 single-season best stroke averages in school history — second-best (70.72 in 2020-21), sixth-best (72.24 in 2019-20) and 10th-best (72.77 in 2018-19) during the first three seasons of her career...earned All-American First Team honors from the WGCA as a junior in 2021, All-American Honorable Mention honors from the Women's Golf Coaches Association and Golfweek as a sophomore in 2020 and All-American Honorable Mention honors from Golfweek as a freshman in 2019 and earned All-ACC honors as a freshman (2019) and a junior (2021)...one of only four freshmen in school history to be named to the All-ACC Team...played in the historic inaugural Augusta National Women's Amateur Championship at Augusta National (2019) and the second ANWA in 2021...the only player to finish in the top-10 of the individual standings in the first two ANWA Championships...finished in a tie for 7th place in the individual standings with scores of 71-74-71 for an even par total of 216 (2019) in the inaugural event....finished in a tie for 10th place at the Second Annual Augusta National Women's Amateur with scores of 75-73-72 for a 4 par total of 220 (2021)...one of only nine golfers (Wallin, Caterina Don, Kaleigh Telfer, Allisen Corpuz, Rose Zhang, Olivia Mehaffey, Maja Stark, Emma Spitz and Erica Shepherd) who made the weekend cut at the first two ANWA Championships...the 2021 ACC Championship runner-up with a 7 under par score of 209 in the ACC Championship.

Kaylah Williams, Freshman, Western Province, South Africa (1st Schooner Fall Classic Appearance)

A talented and internationally experienced player who will fit well in to the Seminoles' lineup...her experience will help her compete for playing time upon her arrival at Florida State...is expected to play immediately as a freshman...a great leader who will quickly become a great team player and a great teammate...the first player from South Africa to play at Florida State...ranked 219th in the World Amateur Golf Ranking...currently ranked No. 7 in the Women's Golf South Africa Rankings...earned the WGSA No. 1 ranking in 2018 and was named the 2020 WGSA Open Player of the Year...first represented her country of South Africa on the elite level in Scotland at the R&A Junior Open in 2018...named as the WGSA Open Player of the Year in 2019...is currently the captain of the Women's Golf South Africa team...named as the Western Province Golf Junior Player of the Year in 2016...won the individual title at the Ackerman Championship in October of 2020...won the event with a 210 total and scores of 72-72-66...also won the Ackerman Championship at age 14 in 2016.

Amelia Williamson, Senior, Norfolk, England (3rd Schooner Fall Classic Appearance)

In her fourth season as a Seminole and begins her senior year fully prepared to enjoy the best season of her Florida State career...has played in 24 matches and enters the 2021-22 fall and spring seasons as one of the most experienced players in all of collegiate golf...has played in two ACC Championships, two NCAA Regional Championships and two NCAA Championship Finals during the first three years of her career...enters her senior season ranked 12th in school history with a 74.46 stroke average...has played in 23 consecutive matches entering her senior season...played in each of the Seminoles' 15 matches during her sophomore and junior seasons...best career finish (tied for second) came at the Florida State Match Up and the NCAA Louisville Regional Championship in the spring of 2021...career best score for a single round (66) came in the first round of the Moon Invitational in the spring of 2021...tied her career best for 36 holes (139) at the spring 2021 Valspar Augusta Invitational and for a three-round tournament score vs. par (-3) came at the NCAA Louisville Regional Championship.

Amy Bond, Head Coach, Ocala, Fla. (7th Schooner Fall Classic Appearance)

Amy Bond continues to set the bar extremely high for the Florida State Women's Golf Team and for each of her players. In the last year alone, she led the Seminoles to the nation's No. 1 ranking, the first NCAA Regional Championship in school history and to a program record ninth place finish in the NCAA Championship Finals. She also coached a First-Team All-American, the ACC Golfer of the Year, two NCAA All-Regional selections, and two All-ACC selections. Bond was named as the seventh head coach in Florida State history on June 25, 2010. Now in her 12th season at her alma mater, she continues to lead the way nationally for winning, recruiting, coaching, and most importantly to her and her program, graduating her student-athletes. Under Bond, the Seminoles are one of just six programs in the nation (Florida State, Arizona, Duke, Stanford, Southern Cal and Texas) to play in the National Championship Finals in each of the last five years.
