- Pitt returns to action with another road ACC contest Thursday at 8 p.m. against No. 1 Florida State

SERIES HISTORY

- Florida State has won all eight matchups, as the two schools have faced each other every regular season since Pitt joined the ACC for the 2013 season.
- FSU has been ranked for all but one game, including three times as No. 2 and another as No. 3.
- Last year's matchup featured a 1-1 tie at halftime at Ambrose Urbanic Field, and FSU ran away with three second-half goals.

THE PROGRAM'S GOAT, AMANDA WEST

- In just a little over two years, **Amanda West** has proven to be the best player in the program's history.
- This preseason, West became the first Panther to be selected the All-ACC Preseason Team.
- To start the season, she earned the first ACC Offensive Player of the Week award.
- She scored a goal to break the school record in goals along with an assist in the win over Tulsa and then notched the tying goal in the 3-2 overtime win of then-No. 16 Oklahoma State.
- She has been selected for the weekly award in each of three seasons.
- She has scored in each of the first four games in all three years and in the first five games the last two seasons.
- In season-openers, she has averaged four points per game (seven against Loyola Marymount in 2019, two at App State and three against Tulsa).
- With only 40 career games played, she already ranks among the top all-time scorers in program history.
 - First in points (74), 18 ahead of **Roosa Arvas** (2012-14).
 - First in career goals (28), five ahead of **Ashley Cuba** (2009-12).
 - Tied for second in assists (18) with **Katelyn Ruhe** (2008-11) and two behind Arvas.
 - First in career game-winning goals (10), one ahead of **Ashley Habel** (2006-09).
 - First in career three-points plus games (11), four ahead of **Cande Ruiz** (1998-01).
 - First in points per game (1.85) and goals per game (.70).
- Other "program firsts" accomplished by West in her first two years:
 - 2020-21: United Soccer Coaches' All-Atlantic Region First-Team, All-ACC Second Team, multiple All-ACC Academic Team selections, multiple ACC Offensive Player of the Week honors (Aug. 27, 2019, Oct. 13, 2020), multiple TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Week selections (Sept. 15 and Sept. 22), TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Month (September)
 - 2019: United Soccer Coaches' All-Atlantic Region Third-Team, All-ACC Third-Team, All-ACC Freshmen Team
- Last year West ranked in the nation: third in points (33), fifth in goals (13), 10th in game-winning goals (four), 14th in goals per game, 17th in shots (4.12) and shots on goal per game (2.12) and 25th in assists (seven).
- She broke the program record for points, which she set as a freshman with 29.
- She hit the ground running in the fall of 2020, with a goal in the first seven games for the longest goal-scoring streak in program history.
- Her 13 goals were most in a single-season, three ahead of her total last year and Ruiz (1998).
- She was the first Panther to score three-straight game-winning goals, including two golden, all on the road.
- She tied Pitt's single-season assists record (nine) as a freshman and recorded seven last year with two less games played due to COVID.

IN THE POLLS

- Pitt is receiving votes in the United Soccer Coaches' Poll, which was announced Tuesday.
- The Panthers had been ranked in the poll for the three previous weeks (No. 19 last Tuesday and 20 the previous two weeks) for their longest stretch in the rankings in program history.
- Making their debut in the rankings in the 2021 season after the first week of the season, the Panthers received the most points (53) outside of the top-25.
- Five ACC teams are in the poll: No. 1 Florida State, No. 2 Duke No. 24 North Carolina, No. 7 Virginia and No. 22 Clemson with Virginia Tech (29) and Notre Dame (13) also receiving votes.
- Unranked this week in the TopDrawerSoccer Poll, Pitt was No. 20 in the last edition, which was the fourth-straight week of being in its rankings (22, 21 and 23 the previous weeks).
- The Panthers are ranked No. 22 in the College Soccer News Poll.
- Last week Pitt was ranked in the poll for the first time at No. 21 after receiving votes outside the top-30 the last two weeks.
- Last year, Pitt earned its first ranking in the United Soccer Coaches' Poll in program history, debuting at No. 12 in the first poll of the season on Sept. 22 and then No. 14 in the next week's poll.
- The only other time in program history Pitt was ranked was in 2009, selected No. 25 by Soccer America after starting 4-0.
- Head coach **Randy Waldrum** has led five teams to be nationally ranked: Tulsa men's and women's soccer, Baylor and Notre Dame in addition to Pitt.

RPI RANKINGS

- The first RPI rankings of the season were released Monday, and the Panthers debuted at No. 71 (0.580 value).
- The Panthers lone two losses have come to No. 7 TCU and No. 44 Clemson and own a top-100 win at No. 63 Oklahoma State.
- With nine ACC contests left, the Panthers have plenty of top-ranked opponents to bump up its RPI ranking with top-25 matchups against No. 1 Duke, No. 2 Florida State, No. 5 North Carolina, No. 23 Virginia Tech, No. 24 Boston College, a top-50 game against No. 39 NC State and a top-100 contest versus Wake Forest.

LEADER OF THE SUPER FALCONS

- After missing the ACC-opener at Clemson last Thursday, head coach Randy Waldrum returns to the sidelines to guide the Panthers.
- Waldrum missed the game due to obligations from coaching Nigeria's Senior National Team in the Aisha Buhari Cup (Sept. 15-21).
- The Super Falcons split two games in the tournament, shutting out Mali 2-0 and falling 4-2 to South Africa.
- Associate head coach Ben Waldrum assumed head coaching duties for the game.
- Ben has served as interim head coach for his father for Trinidad & Tobago in the first stage of World Cup Qualifying games in August of 2014.
- Aisha Buhari Invitational Tournament was an association football tournament organized by the Nigerian Football Federation for the female national team. The competition comprises six nations: Ghana, South Africa, Cameroun, Mali, Morocco and the hosts Nigeria. First Lady, Aisha Buhari, endorsed the championship, which is one of the programs aimed at uplifting females in the continent.
- On Oct. 5, 2020, Waldrum was appointed the head coach of the Nigeria Women's Senior National Team, known as the "Super Falcons" on the international stage.
- Prior to this season, Waldrum led Nigeria in two international tournament/friendlies and additional training camps, playing the USA and Portugal in the 2021 WNT Summer Series in June and winning all three games in the Turkish Cup against Equatorial Guinea (9-0), Uzbekistan (1-0) and CSKA Moscow (1-0) in February.
- Regarded as the top women's soccer program in its continent, the Super Falcons have won nine of 11 Africa Cup of Nations Titles and been to every World Cup since 1991.
- Waldrum has years of experience at the international soccer level, serving as the head coach of the Trinidad and Tobago national team between 2014 and 2016
- He was the head coach of the United States U-23 National Team that won the Four Nations Cup in 2012 and 2013 as well as the Three Nations Cup in 2012.

BOUNCING BACK

- After suffering its first loss of the season 1-0 to No. 6 TCU last Sunday at home, Pitt has responded with two-straight home shutouts of 2-0 against Towson and 7-0 over Saint Francis, its biggest home margin of victory in program history with a 7-0 shutout of Saint Francis.
- **Sarah Schupansky** recorded her second collegiate brace against the Tigers, with both coming in the second half.
- Schupansky's second goal was a conversion of her first collegiate penalty kick, which she drew after getting tripped in the left side of the box from a pass by **Athalie Palomo**.
- Against the Red Flash, the margin of victory, total points (23), assists (nine), shots (41) were the second-biggest marks for a single-game in program history.
 - 11-1 at Wagner, Sept. 11, 1998: 33 points and 11 assists.
 - 46 shots against Saint Francis, Aug. 21, 2015.

- The Panthers tied for the second-most goals from a 7-1 win at App State last year on Sept. 13.
- The 19 shots on goal were tied for the fourth-most (Robert Morris, Oct. 26, 2001).
- The 11 corner kicks tied for the seventh-most (done nine other times).
- The four goals in the first half were the most in any half this season.
- **Emily Harrigan** scored the game's first two goals for her first collegiate brace and first goal as a Panther.
- **Mackenzie Evers** scored her first collegiate goal in the 42nd minute, heading in a rebound off a free kick from **Krystyna Rytel** that hit the crossbar.

HISTORIC OFFENSE

- The Panthers have displayed a high-powered offense to start the season with 3+ goals scored in all but three games.
- In the nation, Pitt ranks third in assists per game (3.89), eighth in points per game (10.11), 16th in scoring offense (3.11 goals per game), 18th in shots per game (20.33), 19th in shots on goal per game (9.56) and 31st in corner kicks per game (7.00).
- Almost halfway through the regular season, the team already ranks among the best ever in program history for single-season stats:
 - First in total assists (35).
 - Third in points (91).
 - Tied for fourth in goals (28).

STOUT DEFENSE

- While getting attention for its offense, Pitt has featured an impressive defense.
- The Panthers have allowed just five goals in nine games this season with an average of 9.8 shots and 3.4 shots on goal allowed per game.
- Pitt ranks in the nation 11th in shutout percentage (.667) and 31st in goals against average (0.555).
- The team is on pace to set the program record for single-season goals against average (0.57 in 2009).
- The squad is tied for the third-most shutouts (six) in a single-season.

SENIOR DAY

- In the Towson victory, Pitt honored three seniors in a pregame ceremony: Celia Lopez, Kate McKay and Katherine Robinson.
- A mix of four-year seniors and transfers, this senior class has helped head coach Randy Waldrum lead this program to success never seen before, including a single-season record 11 wins last season and two-straight years of a top-25 ranking.
- The three have combined for six ACC Academic Honor Roll sections: three by McKay, two from Lopez and one each for Robinson.
- Multi-year transfer: McKay (Elon) has made a major impact since coming to Pittsburgh. She has started all but one game as a centerback and amassed a double-digit point total in 2020 with three goals and two assists.
- Four-year program members: Lopez and Robinson are the only two members left from head coach Randy Waldrum's first season in 2018. Lopez has accumulated two career goals and five points, while Robinson has been a starting goalkeeper shutouts after a breakthrough season in the fall of 2020 with 11 career wins and six shutouts.

SUCCESSFUL HOMESTAND

- Pitt opened home play at Ambrose Urbanic Field last week with a pair of 5-0 shutouts over Cleveland State (Thursday) and NJIT (Sunday) in the program's first matchups against the two schools.
- The first victory had the most goals and biggest margin of victory for a home-opener in program history.
- Pitt has started 4-0 the last two years under Waldrum.
- The Panthers are 9-2 in their last 11 home games with the two losses coming to No. 6 TCU this fall and No. 1 Florida State last year.
- Against the Vikings, **Sarah Schupansky** recorded her first collegiate brace after coming off the bench.
- **Bri Hilsenteger** scored her first collegiate goal in the 47th minute, and **Emily Yaple** (20th minute) produced a goal for the second-straight game.
- Against the Highlanders, **Ellie Coffield** recorded her second game-winning goal of the season and first score at Ambrose in the 17th minute.
- West extended her goal-scoring streak to four games.
- **Landy Mertz**, **Anna Bout** and **Krystyna Rytel** each scored their first goals of the season.
- 29 Panthers played in the two games, including collegiate debuts by **Elena Hinkson**, **Lacey Bernick**, **Katelyn Kauffman**, **Sara Darlington** and **Madison Vukas**.

BANCFIRST COWGIRL SOCCER INVITATIONAL CHAMPS

- To begin its season, Pitt shut out Tulsa 3-0 and knocked off host then-No. 16 Oklahoma State 3-2 in overtime to win the BancFirst Cowgirl Soccer Invitational Championship.
- Their first win over a ranked opponent in 13 years, the Panthers recorded their fourth overall win against a ranked team and second on the road.
- 2-1 (2OT) vs. No. 19 Georgetown (10/19/08)
- 2-1 vs. No. 10 West Virginia (9/01/05)
- 2-1 at No. 24 Miami, Fla. (10/12/01)
- **Amanda West** was named the tournament's offensive MVP with two goals and an assist, while **Ashton Gordon** was named defensive MVP.
- **Chloe Minas** and **Katherine Robinson** were also selected to the all-tournament team.
- Pitt has started 2-0 all four years under Waldrum.

HOMETOWN HEROES DEBUT

- Freshmen and Pittsburgh locals **Ellie Coffield** and **Sarah Schupansky** made instant impacts in starting in their first two collegiate games.
- Schupansky became the second Panther to reach double-digit points and now leads the team in goals (six) and points (12).
- She is also second in assists (four).
- Coffield is third in points (eight) with two goals and four assists.
- In the first game of the season, Coffield scored the game-winning goal over Tulsa on her first career shot in the 17th minute with Schupansky getting her first point with the primary assist.
- Coffield finished with another assist on the final goal against the Golden Hurricane.
- Schupansky has two braces already (Cleveland State and Towson).
- Coffield scored her first goal at Ambrose Urbanic Field against NJIT.

- Schupansky scored the golden goal at Oklahoma State for her first collegiate goal, notching the game-winner 30 seconds into overtime, and also assisted on the tying goal in the second half to send the game into overtime.
- Both were decorated prep players.
 - Coffield led Mars High School to two WPIAL and PIAA AAA Championships with a No. 1 national ranking last fall and won the Gatorade Pennsylvania Player of the Year in her last two years, was named All-American by Top Drawer Soccer and played in National All-Star Game as a senior, tabbed the Post-Gazette and Tribune Review Girls Soccer Player of the Year in 2020 and earned the inaugural Moe Rosensteel Most Outstanding WPIAL Player of the Year in 2019.
 - Schupansky guided North Allegheny High School to win the 2020 and 2019 WPIAL AAAA Championships and won the 2020 Moe Rosensteel Award, was named to the 2020 and 2019 United Soccer Coaches All-East Region and PCSA All-State Teams ... selected to the All-WPIAL AAAA Team her last two seasons and the WPIAL Big 56 All-Section Team the last three years.

MOVING ON UP THE ALL-TIME HEAD COACH WINS LIST

- With 426 victories, Randy Waldrum ranks eighth in all-time career wins for head coaches at the Division I level.
- Waldrum is sixth among active coaches.
- He recording his 416th career win in 27 years at the Division I level against Navy on Sunday, Oct. 11, 2020 that passed **David Lombardo** (Keene State and James Madison, 35 Years) and **Chris Petrucelli** (Notre Dame, Texas and SMU, 30 Years) for eighth all-time.
- He remains ahead of SMU's Petrucelli, who now has 417 wins.
- Waldrum currently ranks sixth among active head coaches.

UNDEFEATED IN SEASON-OPENERS UNDER WALDRUM

- Pitt has won all three season-openers under fourth-year coach **Randy Waldrum**.
- The Panthers defeated Ohio 2-1 in Waldrum's debut in 2018, topped Loyola Marymount 5-4 in 2019 and shut out App State 4-0 on the road last fall.
- Pitt has an 11-5 goals aggregate in the season-openers, averaging 3.67 goals per game.

FACING HIS OLD TEAM

- In the season-opener, Waldrum faced the first school he coaches at the Division I level, Tulsa.
- Waldrum coached both the men's and women's teams while at Tulsa from 1989-1994, amassing a rec-ord of 61-36-9 with the women and 66-33-6 with the men.
- He led the men's squad to the 1991 MVC Championship and NCAA First Round with a 14-3-0 (4-0-0) record.
- Waldrum coached the father of current Panther, Ashton Gordon, David, from 1989-92.
- David was a Second-Team All-Midwest Region and All-MVC Second Team selections.
- Ashton's mom, Tara, also played for Tulsa from 1995-98 and was a Western Athletic Conference Second-Team selection.

A NEWCOMER'S HOMETOWN ARRIVAL

- Hometown native **Landy Mertz** has produced a point in six of her first 10 games as a Panther.
- A transfer from Dayton joining Pitt for the spring portion of the 2020-21 season, Mertz made quite the impact in her Panthers' debut with two goals in the team's 3-0 shutout victory in the City Game.
- Mertz was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week.
- She then followed up with a goal in the 4-1 win over Kentucky in the season-finale.
- This season, she scored in consecutive wins over NJIT and at Saint Joseph's, assisted on the game-tying goal in the road win at then-No. 16 Oklahoma State and recorded two assists in the home victory over Saint Francis.
- In the two exhibition games this season, she produced a goal in the 2-0 win at Youngstown State and had assists on both goals in a 2-0 victory at RV Ohio State.

RETURNING EVERY STARTER

- Pitt returns every starter from last season.
- Forwards: Amanda West (16 starts), Leah Pais (14) and Landy Mertz (two-both spring games).
 - Combined for 12 goals, nine assists, 100 shots and 52 shots on goal.
 - West has started every game in her career while Pais and Mertz were both new to the team as transfers (Pais-Albany, Mertz-Dayton).
- Midfielders: Anna Bout (16), Chloe Minas (16) and Emily Yaple (16)
 - All three started every game last year
 - Bout has started all but three games in her career, and Yaple and Minas started as true fresh-men last season after enrolling in the previous spring semester.
 - Yaple contributed offensively three goals and two assists while Bout had a goal and assist each.
- Defenders: Hailey Davidson, Mackenzie Edwards (16), Kate McKay (16) and Athalie Palomo (16).
 - All four started every game and were in the top-five for minutes played on the team
 - Limited teams to a .410 shots on goal percentage
 - McKay ranked third on the team in scoring with three goals and five assists while Palomo had a goal and assist.

- Goalkeepers: Katherine Robinson (nine) and Caitlyn Lazzarini (seven)
- The two combined for six shutouts, .743 save percentage, 1.12 goals against average and six shutouts.
 - Robinson was 7-2-0 with 21 saves, .724 save percentage and 0.95 goals against average.
 - Lazzarini was 4-3-0 with 31 saves, .756 save percentage and 1.30 goals against average with all but three games started against ACC opponents.

LAST YEAR'S HISTORY

- Despite playing less games than usual due to COVID, Pitt did many things the previous teams in pro-program didn't accomplish.
- Going 9-5-0 overall in the fall and winning both spring games, it surpassed the 1995 team (10-7-1) for the most wins in a single season and was only the third to ever post a winning record (8-5-5 in 2009).
- Five of the victories were on the road, the most in a single-season in program history.
 - In 2019 on the road, Pitt was 1-7-1 and a combined 2-28-4 in the last four seasons.
- Pitt notched its first ranking in the United Soccer Coaches' Poll in program history, debuting at No. 12 in the first poll of the season and then No. 14.
- Defeating The Citadel 2-1 (OT) and 1-0, Pitt won for the first time as a ranked team.
 - Head coach Randy Waldrum has now led five schools to be nationally ranked: Tulsa men's and women's soccer, Baylor and Notre Dame in addition to Pitt.
- Pitt started the season 6-0 for the first time in program history, which was the second-longest winning-streak in school history, as the 2015 team rattled off eight wins in a row.
- West scored three-straight game-winning goals, something no other Panther in program history has done before.

NEWCOMERS

- Pitt welcomes 15 newcomers to the team.
- 12 freshmen: Lacey Bernick, Ellie Coffield, Sara Darlington, Mackenzie Evers, Bri Hilsenteger, Elena Hinkson, Katelyn Kauffman, Maddie Keister, Ashley Moon, Hailey Schmidt, Sarah Schupansky and Madison Vukas.
- All but Darlington, Evers and Schmidt enrolled early in the spring of 2021.
- Evers graduated a year early at West Allegheny High School.
- Three transfers: Ashton Gordon, Emily Harrigan and Kelly Moss.
- Gordon started two seasons at reigning SEC Champs Arkansas and joined the team last spring.
- Harrigan spent three seasons at Rutgers, and Moss comes from Notre Dame after two years.

SCOUTING NO. 1 FLORIDA STATE

- Returning all but one starter from last year's squad that lost just one game in the College Cup Final in a penalty-kick shootout, FSU has been ranked No. 1 in the nation all season.
- The team has outscored opponents 26-5 that includes three road wins and two victories over top-10 teams.
- Three United Soccer Coaches All-Americans from last season lead the squad – MAC Hermann Award winner senior midfielder Jaelin Howell (First Team), redshirt-senior midfielder/defender Emily Madril (Second Team) and senior midfielder Yujie Zhao (Third Team).
- Sophomore Cristina Roque (0.75 goals against average, two saves and two shutouts) and freshman Mia Justus (0.50 goals against average, three saves and two shutouts) have flip-flopped starts for the full 90 minutes in goal, with Roque picking up the win in FSU's previous game against Boston College (4-1).

O' CANDADA

- Waldrum and his staff have gone north of the border each year to find top talent to fill out the roster.
- Six players grew up playing in the Canadian youth soccer system: Chantelle Parker (Milton, Ontario), Leah Pais (Mississauga, Ontario), Amanda West (Burlington, Ontario), Anna Bout (Cambridge, Ontario) and Chloe Minas (Montreal, Quebec).

ACC PRESEASON POLL

- This year the Pitt was picked to finish 11th in the ACC Coaches' Preseason Poll.
- The Panthers were selected 10th last year (with NC State opting out of the fall) and 11th in 2016 and has been only picked to not finish last in other season, 2019 (13th).

HEAD COACH • MIDWESTERN STATE '81 • 4TH SEASON AT PITT



Randy Waldrum enters his fourth season at the helm of the Pittsburgh women's soccer program in 2021. He was announced as the fourth head coach in Pitt women's soccer program history by Director of Athletics Heather Lyke on December 19, 2017.

The legendary women's soccer coach ranks eighth in NCAA history in career head coaching victories (419) while also ranking seventh amongst active head coaches. Waldrum was appointed the head coach of the Nigeria Women's Senior National Team, the Super Falcons, on Oct. 5, 2020 that serves in addition to his coaching role at Pitt.

In just his third season, he guided the Panthers to a school-record 11 wins despite playing two less games in the regular season than a traditional year due to the pandemic. Pitt earned its first-ever ranking in the United Soccer Coaches' Poll at No. 12 on Sept. 22 and stayed in the poll for an additional week. The Panthers won their first six games of the season, the best start in program history. Pitt earned the record despite being on the road for five of the games, setting another school record for most wins away from home in a single-season.

Waldrum saw star player Amanda West become the first Panther to be named to the United Soccer Coaches' All-Atlantic Region First-Team and All-ACC Second Team. West ranked third in the nation in points (33) and fifth in goals (13), breaking her own school single-season records while becoming the school's leader in career points (62) during the fall. Four Panthers were named to the All-ACC Academic Team, Kate McKay, Athalie Palomo, Emily Yaple and West, which matched the Panthers' combined selections for their previous eight years in the conference.

Waldrum oversaw a marked improvement from the team in 2019 with the team finishing 10th in the ACC standings with eight points (2-6-2) and an overall record of 5-10-3. The team snapped a three-year winless streak (0-25-3) in ACC play with a 2-1 overtime win over Boston College at Ambrose Urbanic Field and then defeated NC State 2-1 the following week, who advanced to the Sweet 16 later in the year.

Picked to finish second-to-last in 13th place in the ACC Preseason Coaches' Poll, the Panthers proved to be a tough out for everyone in the best conference in the country. They led NCAA Tournament Runner-up North Carolina 1-0 late in the second half, limited No. 6 Florida State and a top-five scoring offense in the nation to one goal and took both No. 17 Clemson and Wake Forest into overtime on the road after trailing in both games.

Bringing in one of the best recruiting classes in program history and Waldrum's first guiding the program, the newcomers made a huge impact to the turnaround. As one of the nation's youngest programs in the country, Pitt had nine freshmen combined to start 92 matches in the season.

West etched her name all over the Panthers' record book as a freshman. West broke the school's single-season points record (29) and tied for goals (10) and assists (nine) with four game-winning goals. She became the first Panther to receive All-ACC honors with spots on the third and freshmen teams and the second one to earn a spot on the United Soccer Coaches' All-Region Team with a third-team nod.

Waldrum saw unprecedented success in his tenure at the helm of the perennial powerhouse Notre Dame women's program. In his 14 seasons, he led the Fighting Irish to two national championships, capturing the College Cup title in 2004 and 2010. His teams won eight Big East Tournament titles and appeared in eight NCAA Final Four games in that span.

A two-time national coach of the year (2009 by Soccer America; 2010 by NSCAA), Waldrum was the first coach in NCAA history to lead a team to a national title in his/her first season with a program. He wrapped up his tenure at Notre Dame with a mark of 292-58-17 (.819) and holds an overall record of 399-108-29 (.771) as a head coach on the women's side. His record ranks fourth in all-time wins as an NCAA women's head coach and third in win percentage.

Waldrum joined the Fighting Irish after beginning a program at Baylor, building the Bears into a threat in the Big 12 from scratch. In three seasons with Baylor, Waldrum guided the Bears to an overall mark of 46-14-3 after spending the 1995-96 starting up the program. He was named the Big 12 and NSCAA Region Coach of the Year after a 15-5-1 record in 1998, as the Bears reached as high as 12th in the nation en route to a Big 12 Conference title.

Prior to his tenure at Baylor, Waldrum spent six seasons at the helm of the Tulsa program, serving as head coach for both the men's and women's programs from 1989-1994. He led the men to a record of 66-33-6 and the women to a mark of 61-36-9.

In his playing career, he was a standout at Midwestern State University, earning all-district honors in each of his four seasons in Wichita Falls, Texas. He graduated in 1981 with a degree in physical education and a minor in political science. He moved on to play professionally with the Los Angeles Skyhawks and Indianapolis Daredevils of the American Soccer League.

In addition to his impressive resume in the NCAA, Waldrum also spent time in the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL), becoming the head coach of the Houston Dash expansion team in January of 2014. In his three seasons with the Dash, Waldrum coached seven national team players who laced up with their respective countries in the Rio Summer Olympic Games, including Team USA members Carli Lloyd, Morgan Brian and Pittsburgh native Meghan Klingenberg.

Waldrum has also served as the head coach of the United States U-23 National Team since 2012, winning the Four Nations Cup in 2012 and 2013 as well as the Three Nations Cup in 2012.

Waldrum and his wife, Dianna, have one son, Ben, who currently serves on his staff as associate head coach.
