SEMINOLES RETURN HOME FOR DATE WITH TULANE GREEN WAVE

Florida State, which has won 78 of its last 82 games at home, plays host to Tulane at the Donald L. Tucker Center on Wednesday, November 17 at 8:00 p.m. The Seminoles opened their home season with a 105-70 win over Penn on November 10 and have won 21 consecutive home games in the month of November beginning with a 91-67 win over The Citadel on November 25, 2014. Florida State's home game against Tulane marks the first game in Tallahassee between the two teams since an 81-74 Seminole win on December 10, 1994. Following Wednesday's game against Tulane, the Seminoles travel to play at the Jacksonville Classic at the UNF Arena at the University of North Florida. Florida State plays Loyola Marymount on Sunday November 21 at 5:30 in the first round of the Jacksonville Classic. The Seminoles then play their second game in Jacksonville against either SMU or Missouri on Monday at either 6:00 or 8:30 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. TULANE -- CONNECTIONS

Florida State plays host to Tulane on November 17, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. It's the third game of a three-game series in which the Seminoles have won the first two games – at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla., (December 10, 2017, 72-53) and at Devlin Fieldhouse in New Orleans, La. (November 11, 2019, 80-69). The Seminoles and the Green Wave will meet for the 38th time. Florida State leads the all-time series by a 25-12 margin and has won eight of the last 10 games played between the two teams. Florida State and Tulane were members of the Metro Conference from 1975-85 and from 1989-91. Ron Hunter is in his third season as the head coach at Tulane. In three stops as a head coach at IUPUI (1995-2011), Georgia State (2012-19) and Tulane (2020-21), he has never faced Florida State. Ray McCallum is an assistant coach on Hunter's staff and faced the Seminoles at the Donald L. Tucker Center as Detroit Mercy's head coach on November 20, 2016 – a 100-71 Florida State victory. Kevin Johnson, also an assistant on Hunter's staff, was an assistant coach at Nicholls State when the Seminoles defeated the Colonels by an 81-58 margin on November 9, 2007 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Amanda Robinson, the current Associate Director of Athletics for Sports Performance at Tulane, was the athletic trainer for the Seminole Men's Basketball Team (2018-21) and accompanied the team to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments including three straight Sweet 16 appearances.

FLORIDA STATE AND TULANE AS METRO CONFERENCE TEAMS

Florida State and Tulane played as members of the Metro Conference from the 1976-77 season through the 1984-85 season and then again during the 1989-90 and 1990-91 seasons. The Seminoles earned a 15-9 record against Tulane as members of the Metro Conference.

FLORIDA STATE HAS WON MORE THAN 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 78-4 (.951 winning percentage) in its last 82 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game against Tulane having won .951 percent of their overall games (78-4) and .935 percent of their ACC games (43-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season.

OSBORNE BEGINS SEASON ON FIRE

Redshirt senior Malik Osborne enters Wednesday's game against Tulane averaging a near double double of 18.0 points and 9.5 through the first two games of the season. He has scored 18 points against both Penn and Florida while shooting .625 from the field (10 of 16) and .571 from the 3-point line (four of seven). Osborne tied his career-high with three 3-point shots made in scoring 18 points on the road at Florida – tying his personal best scoring mark as a Seminole. His 18 points against the Gators not only marked the second consecutive game he totaled 18 points, but also the most points he had scored in a road game since scoring 20 at FIU (when he was playing at Rice as a freshman) on February 24, 2018. Osborne has now scored 18 or more points in a game six times during his career (four times at Rice and twice at Florida State). Defensively, Osborne tied his career-high with 13 rebounds against Penn and totaled three steals against Florida.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Tulane and win its third consecutive game against Tulane. The Seminoles defeated the Green Wave on December 10, 2017 (72-53 in Tampa) and on November 11, 2018 (80-69 in New Orleans);

...Defeat Tulane and win its 22nd consecutive home game in the month of November. The Seminoles' streak began with a 68-55 win over The Citadel on November 25, 2014;

...Defeat Tulane and gain an eighth consecutive win over a team from the state of Louisiana.

FLORIDA STATE'S NOVEMBER HOME WINNING STREAK

Florida State plays host to Tulane looking to win its 20th consecutive home game on the month of November. The Seminoles' winning streak includes: 2014-15 (The Citadel, Charleston Southern), 2015-16 (Nicholls State, Jacksonville), 2016-17 (Charleston Southern, Iona, Winthrop, Detroit Mercy, and Minnesota), 2017-18 (George Washington, Kennesaw State, The Citadel), 2018-19 (Florida, Canisius), 2019-20 (Western Carolina, Chattanooga, Saint Francis, Chicago State) and 2021-22 (Penn).

SEMINOLES PLAYING STRONG DEFENSE AROUND THE RIM

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Tulane holding their first two opponents to a .392 field goal shooting percentage and an average of 5.0 blocked shots per game. With those two statistics firmly on their side of the statistics sheet, the Seminoles are holding the opponents to 70.5 points scored per game. The field goal percentage defense statistic, of which the Seminoles led the nation in both 2010 and 2011, is Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's favorite statistic. Florida State's defense has forced 73 missed shots and has blocked 10 shots meaning the Seminoles have altered 83 of 120, nearly 70 percent (.692 percent), of the opponents' shots from going in the basket in the first two games of the season.

SEMINOLES ALSO PLAYING STRONG OPEN COURT DEFENSE

Florida State has 23 steals (11.5 spg) and has forced 41 turnovers (20.5 topg) in its first two games of the season as it continues to play the ball-hawking, defensive stopper type of defense which has long been demanded by Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. While taking 127 shots themselves, the Seminoles have limited their first two opponents to 120 shots – and thwarted 64 more opportunities for shots by both Penn and Florida.

FLORIDA STATE SHOOTING WELL FROM THE 3-POINT LINE

As a team, Florida State has made seven 3-point shots in both of its first two games and is shooting .378 from the bonusphere. Illustrating the Seminoles' abilities as a dangerous team from the outside, a total of eight different players have made at least one 3-point shot in the first two games of the season. Malik Osborne made three 3-point shots in the Seminoles game at Florida – only one shy of his career-best for 3-point shots made in a game. Osborne made his career-high of four 3-point shots against Michigan in the Sweet 16 of the 2021 NCAA Tournament. Florida State shot nearly 50 percent from the 3-point line (seven of 15) on the road at Florida on November 14.

FLORIDA STATE'S DEFENSE EARNS 15 STEALS IN WIN OVER PENN

Led by a career-high five steals by Cam'Ron Fletcher, the Seminoles' defense earned 15 steals in their opening night win over Penn. Florida State's 15 steals led the 26 turnovers by the Quakers. For the Seminoles, eight of the 16 players who earned playing time totaled at least one steal with three players – Fletcher (five), RayQuan Evans (three), and Caleb Mills (two) – earning multiple steals. The Seminoles' 15 steals were their most in a single game since earning 16 steals at North Carolina on February 27, 2021.

SEMINOLES' NEARLY UNHEARD OF OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Wake Forest, 92-85, in overtime on February 13, 2021 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record tying 11th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles now hold the all-time national record for consecutive overtime victories of 11 along with Louisville (1968-75), UMass (1991-96) and Virginia (1991-96).

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 380 career wins at Florida State. Hamilton became only the fifth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 375 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Boston College on March 3, 2021.

SEMINOLES PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN ACC RACE

Florida State, which has finished in fourth place or higher in the ACC Basketball standings in the last three seasons, has been selected to finish in second place in the 2022 league standings by the attending media at the annual ACC Tip-Off. It's the highest the Seminoles have been predicted to finish a season since joining the league for the 1991-92 season. The Seminoles received the second highest point total (1,034) and the second highest total of first place votes in the voting during which 81 total votes were counted. The Seminoles were picked to finish in second place in the ACC standings for the first time in school history. The Seminoles have been picked to finish third in three different seasons (1993, 2012 and 2021) and fourth on two occasions (2009 and 2019). Most recently, the Seminoles were picked to finish in third place in 2021 — they finished in second place in the ACC standings and advanced to play in the ACC Tournament Championship game. Florida State was picked to finish in the fifth spot in 2020 and won the ACC Championship with a 16-4 record. In 2019, the Seminoles were picked to finish in seventh place; they finished fourth and advanced to the ACC Championship game.

FLORIDA STATE VS. TULANE – THE LAST MEETING

A trip to the "Big Easy" for Florida State's first true road game didn't quite live up to its name, but the No. 15 Seminoles still had more than enough to handle beating Tulane, 80-69, on November 11, 2018 in New Orleans. In a game that struggled to find flow behind a combined 25 first half fouls and 22 turnovers, Florida State would need to go to its roots in order to remain perfect on the year. Senior forward Terance Mann scored 21 points and had 10 rebounds, and senior swingman P.J. Savoy tallied 14 points on 3-of-6 shooting from distance on the night. Kabengele impressed again off the bench, proving to be one of the top Seminoles in such a role. He finished with 12 points and four rebounds on 4-for-8 shooting in 21 minutes of action.

OSBORNE LEADS FLORIDA STATE IN SCORING IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES; 13 DIFFERENT SEMINOLES HAVE SCORED

With 18 points in the both of the first two game of the season, redshirt senior Malik Osborne led the Seminoles in scoring in both of their first two games of the season. One of the many things that Head Coach Leonard Hamilton preaches about Florida State's success is that his teams are so hard to prepare for because they don't have a dominant scorer. With nine different leading scorers during the 2020-21 season, Osborne is the first player to lead the Seminoles in scoring in consecutive games since RaiQuan Gray last season in back-to-back games against Georgia Tech (19, January 30) and Wake Forest (24, February 13). Only four players (Gray, twice; Scottie Barnes, Sardaar Calhoun, and M.J. Walker led the Seminoles in scoring in consecutive games during the 2020-21 season. A total of 13 players have scored at least two points for the Seminoles in the first two games of the season.

OSBORNE GETTING TO THE FREE THROW LINE

One of Malik Osborne's improvement goals for the 2021-22 season has been to get to the free throw line more often than he has in the first three seasons of his career. He has certainly begun to accomplish that goal as he enters Wednesday's game against Tulane averaging more than eight free throw attempts per games. Osborne attempted a career-high 12 free throws in Florida State's win over Penn and attempted five free throws against Florida. In the past two seasons, Osborne is shooting .796 from the free throw line (43 of 54).

RAYQUAN EVANS IN THE STARTING LINEUP

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans has started both of Florida State's early season games against Penn (14 points and 5 assists) and Florida (six points and three assists). He has been Florida State's starting point guard in each of Florida State's last 20 games. His consecutive games started streak began with a 24-point performance in the first ACC start of his career on January 13, 2021. Evans totaled 24 points, six rebounds and two assists in 19 minutes of playing time in the Seminoles' 105-73 win over the Wolfpack in his first career start as a Seminole.

BUTLER DISPLAYS HIS RANGE FROM LONG RANGE AGAINST FLORIDA

Freshman John Butler was a perfect two of two from the 3-point line and scored eight points in Florida State's second game of the season at Florida. He played an all-around sensational game with 11 points (on five of 10 shooting from the field), with six rebounds, one assist, one steal and one blocked shot.

CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING WATCH LIST

Florida State freshman Matthew Cleveland was named to the 20-player watch list for the 2022 Julius Erving Award by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. The award highlights the best small forward in college basketball. The award will be presented to the nation's top small forward on April 8, 2022 at the College Basketball Awards Show in Los Angeles. Cleveland, who averaged 22.8 points, 10.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists, and 2.0 steals as a senior at Pace High School in Atlanta, is one of seven freshmen and one of only two players from the ACC on the Julius Erving watch list. Cleveland led his team to back-to-back state championships his junior and senior seasons.

Mandeville Native Harrison Prieto Faces Off Against Hometown Tulane University

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (seminoles.com) – Florida State’s Harrison Prieto and the Tulane University basketball team are certainly not strangers. Not only is Tulane located near his hometown in Louisiana, but Wednesday’s meeting between the Seminoles and the Green Wave will be the third between the two teams during his career at Florida State.

Florida State plays host to Tulane on Wednesday night at 8:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in the third of a three-game series. The Seminoles, who were members of the old Metro Conference with Tulane, have won the first two games of the current series with a pair of victories in Tampa (72-53 on Dec. 10, 2017) and at Tulane in New Orleans (80-69 on Nov. 11, 2018).

Prieto made one of the most important appearances of his career in the Seminoles’ 80-69 victory against the Green Wave in New Orleans. Prieto entered the game with Florida State up three at 35-32. After playing a season-high four minutes (to the close out the first half), the Seminoles had extended their lead to four at halftime with a 39-35 advantage.

The opportunity he turned into success came at Tulane’s on-campus arena, which is only about 45 minutes from his home of Mandeville, La. Even more important to Prieto was that he played well in front of about 30 members of his family and friends who attended the game.

Now in his sixth season as a member of the nationally ranked Seminoles, Prieto has firmly entrenched himself as part of the incredibly solid foundation created by Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff.

His longevity at Florida State is not only with the men’s basketball team, but academically as well. Prieto is currently in his graduate studies, pursuing a master’s degree in Meteorology. Along with his course work, he is also a teaching assistant, a position that he values just as dearly as being a forward for the Seminoles.

Prieto’s advancement into the meteorology field began when one of the biggest storms hit, and ultimately wreaked havoc on his hometown region. Growing up in Mandeville, he saw a lot of action when it came to the weather. Hurricane Katrina was the ultimate reason for his dedication to the field.

Experiencing first-hand the type of damage Katrina did to Louisiana was frightening, but exhilarating for the then seven-year-old Prieto. Trying to wrap your brain around it is one thing, but he’s made it his life’s mission to find out what exactly has to come together to produce something so powerful.

“There’s really nothing that I’ve seen since that compares to some of the devastation from Hurricane Katrina,” said Prieto. “Certainly, experiencing that event had a profound impact on my passion for the field of meteorology. Understanding the weather; how and why phenomena happen every day has been a really fulfilling part of my life.”

Hurricane Katrina has not been Prieto’s only encounter with dangerous weather, as he continues to search for “thrilling” experiences. Most recently, he found a weather incident in Tallahassee.

On Jan. 27, 2021, Tallahassee residents woke up knowing rough weather was on the horizon. The dark skies, flashes of lightning, high wind speeds, and uncontrollable weather had nearly all of Tallahassee on tornado watch lockdown. Except one person.

Prieto woke early that morning and decided to chase the tornado, cornering it down to the Tallahassee airport, where his post-tornado photos of the intact weather system's radar went Twitter viral. Many could not believe that the captain of the Florida State men's basketball team was out storm chasing.

"The southeast US is an extremely difficult part of the country to chase weather formations, and at times, it can be dangerous depending on what you can and can't see around you," said Prieto. "Often, trees make it difficult to see where a potential tornado might be, but I felt comfortable enough with the Tallahassee area that I would be able to get myself into a relatively safe area near the airport.

"Once I felt I was in a safe position, I could make a decision on whether I should stay or leave as the storm neared. Ultimately, the tornado was "rain-wrapped" which meant I wouldn't be able to see what was coming, so I got myself into a safer spot. I'm glad I did because when I came back to look for damage it was quite obvious that a tornado had passed through my previous location only a few minutes prior – when I was in that exact spot."

His teammates had no fear, though, as they expected this of, what they call Prieto, "the weatherman."

Prieto not only excels in storm chasing, but his combined role of being a basketball star, a teaching assistant and a graduate student have all come together to benefit him in numerous ways. One of these ways is his understanding that everyone has a different learning style, whether this be courtside or in class.

"I think basketball has helped me in so many ways," said Prieto. "Being one of the leaders on the team has taught me how to interact with so many different people from so many backgrounds. Not everyone reacts to criticism or coaching on the basketball court in the same way, which parallels teaching in that not everyone will learn to understand meteorological principles the same way."

Not only has his cognizance taught him the different responses of his teammates and students, but it also added value to his leadership position in both areas.

Prieto was a team captain of the Florida State men's basketball team in both 2020 and 2021. This season's captains have yet to be named by the Seminoles' coaching staff.

On top of being team captain, he simultaneously managed to keep his studies up to par and made the ACC Academic Honor Roll five years in a row (2017-21).

"Being a team captain for Florida State is without a doubt one of the biggest honors in my life," said Prieto. "The opportunity to lead, be a role model for younger guys, and handle the responsibilities that come with being a team captain has, in my opinion, helped prepare me for my next phases. Difficult, yes. Rewarding? Absolutely."

His career as a Seminole has not come without personal sacrifice.

"The biggest thing that you sacrifice is your time; we spend hours on end practicing, watching film, team building, traveling, playing, and that makes it challenging," says Prieto.

Although this seems taxing, Prieto assures that it's all part of the deal of being a college athlete. In return for giving up a "normal" college experience, he has made lifetime friendships and a spot in the history of a one of the nation's top programs, one that enters its game against Tulane ranked No. 19.

"We love each other, and we like being around each other," said Prieto. "It's easy to make the unselfish play in a game when you're doing it for your best friends. This is a special program, and I hope that helps illustrate why."

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Malik Osborne had 18 points and a career-best 13 rebounds, Anthony Polite scored 17 points, and No. 20 Florida State won its seventh straight home opener, routing Pennsylvania 105-70 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Osborne recorded his fourth career double-double and third at Florida State. The 6-foot-9 forward shot 4 of 6 from the floor and 9 of 12 from the free-throw line in 22 minutes, spending much of the game playing center as the Seminoles went with a smaller lineup. Senior guard RayQuan Evans added 14 points and four assists, while Houston transfer Caleb Mills scored 10 of his 14 points in the second half in his debut with the Seminoles. Mills shot 6 of 13 from the floor while adding five rebounds, three assists and two steals. Cam'Ron Fletcher, a transfer from Kentucky, had nine points and five steals.
