## FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO MERCER ON MONDAY AT 6:30

Florida State plays host to Mercer on Monday at 6:30 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in the final game of a season-long three-game home stand. The Seminoles face the Bears for the first time since the 2012-13 season – the year after Florida State won its first ACC Championship in 2012. The series between the two teams dates back to the 1948-49 season – the first year the Seminoles put a men's basketball team on the court for intercollegiate athletics. Following Monday's game against Mercer, the Seminoles travel to Lake Buena Vista, Fla., to play in the ESPN Events Invitational at Disney's Wide World of Sports. Florida State faces Siena in the first round of the tournament on Thursday (Thanksgiving Day) at 11:00 a.m. and plays wither Ole Miss or Stanford on the Friday in the second day of the event.

## FLORIDA STATE VS. MERCER – CONNECTIONS

Florida State plays host to Mercer on November 21, 2022 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles lead the all-time series by a 16-9 margin and have won nine of the last 10 games in the series which dates back to the 1947-48 season. The Bears were the seventh ever opponent for the Seminoles, as the two played during the inaugural season of Florida State basketball. Greg Gary is in his third season at Mercer but is quite familiar with the Florida State Seminoles. As a player and an assistant coach, Gary is 1-6 against Florida State. Gary was the starting point guard on Tulane's Metro Conference Championship team in 1992. He played for three seasons at Tulane including four games against Florida State. As a player at Tulane, Gary averaged 9.5 points and 3.0 assists and had a 1-3 record against the Seminoles. The Seminoles were 2-0 against the Green Wave at the Donald L. Tucker Center. He then served as an assistant coach at Tulane and faced the Seminoles on March 20, 1993 in the NCAA Tournament in Orlando where the Seminoles took a 94-63 win to advance to the round of 32. As an assistant at Miami (Fla.), Gary faced the Seminoles twice with Florida State winning both games. His most recent trip to play the Seminoles at the Donald L. Tucker Center came in the 2018 ACC/Big Ten Challenge as an assistant coach on Purdue's staff. The Seminoles took a 73-72 win over the Boilermakers on a buzzer-beating lay-up by Trent Forrest. Assistant coach Kim Lewis, who also played at Tulane with Gary, faced the Seminoles twice as a player and has a 1-1 record against Florida State. He averaged 18.0 points and 2.5 steals as a player against Florida State. Assistant Coach D.J. Byrd was a graduate assistant at Purdue for Matt Painter when the Seminoles defeated Purdue, 73-72, in Tallahassee.

## FLORIDA STATE AT HOME SINCE 2015

Florida State is 88-11 at home in the last six (plus) seasons (.889 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 88 of their last 99 games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles won their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 85 of 96 home games (.886 winning percentage) in the last six seasons (2018 through 2022).

## HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 395 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 177 career ACC wins at Florida State.

## HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018, and continued on January 18, 2022, with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18.

## SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters the 2022-23 season having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles defeated Duke, 79-78, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

**CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING AWARD WATCH LIST**

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland has been named to the Julius Erving Watch List as the nation's top collegiate small forward by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. It marks the second consecutive season Cleveland has been named to the initial watch list for the prestigious Julius Erving Award. Cleveland is one of three players from the ACC named to the Julius Erving Watch List. He is joined on the list by Dariq Whitehead of Duke and Leaky Black of North Carolina. The award is named for Julius Erving, who attended the University of Massachusetts (1969-71). He averaged 26.3 points and 20.2 rebounds per game, making him one of only six NCAA men's basketball players to average more than 20 points and 20 rebounds per game during his career.

**HAMILTON PRESENTED WITH PRESTIGIOUS JOE LAPCHICK AWARD IN NEW YOUR CITY**

Florida State men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton received the Joe Lapchick Character Award presented by the Joe Lapchick Foundation during a ceremony at the New York Athletic Club on September 16, 2022. Hamilton was honored with the award which celebrates the life and career of Joe Lapchick, a Hall of Fame coach at St. John's University (1936-47) and the New York Knicks (1947-56), who was well known for his compassion and integrity off the court. The award is given to coaches who exhibit honorable character and who have impacted the game of basketball as did Lapchick. Hamilton is just the fifth head coach from the ACC to earn the award. He joins Georgia Tech's Bobby Cremins, Virginia's Pete Gillen, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, and North Carolina's Dean Smith as Lapchick Award winners from the nation's top college basketball conference.

**SEMINOLES SHOOT WELL FROM THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST FLORIDA**

Florida State shot a season-best .933 from the free throw line (14 of 15) against Florida on Friday night at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles made each of their final five free throws of the second half and each of their four free throw shots in the second half and enter Monday's game against Mercer having made nine consecutive free throws as a team. Florida State has made 37 of its last 48 free throws in its last two games (.771 percent) as compared to having made 18 of 34 free throws (.529 percent) in their first two games.

**SEMINOLES TOTAL SEASON HIGH SIX BLOCKED SHOTS AGAINST FLORIDA**

Led by two blocked shots each by Caleb Mills (tying his career-high) and Naheem McLeod, the Seminoles blocked a season-high six shots against Florida on Friday night. The Seminoles had blocked a total of seven shots (two each against Stetson and Troy and three at UCF) in their first three games of the season.

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE**

Florida State enters its game against Mercer averaging 6.0 3-point field goals made per game. The Seminoles made a season-high nine shots from the bonusphere against Troy and six each in their first two games of the season against Stetson and at UCF.

**FLORIDA STATE'S MINUTES PLAYED**

Because of injuries and suspensions, Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has necessarily had to keep his players on the floor much longer than he would absolutely like to during the first four games of the 2022-23 season. Entering Monday's game against Mercer, seven Seminoles are averaging more than 26 minutes played per game with junior Darin Green averaging a team-high 35.2 minutes played per game. Hamilton generally want his players to play between 24 and 26 minutes (approximately) per game.

## FSU Guard Darin Green Finds Success On The Basketball Court

Darin Green's love for basketball came at an early age.

It was hard not to, growing up in a basketball family with both parents having played the sport: Mom in high school and Dad at George Washington University.

His father first put a basketball in his 3-year-old son's hands and eventually taught him how to shoot.

"He played guard as well, but he was more an athlete — a slasher and dunker — who could get above the rim," said Green. "He got hurt and that's when he learned to shoot, so he taught me to shoot early on because he knew that would last longer than your athleticism."

Those shooting skills have helped Green Jr. as he's made his way from high school to college.

Green transferred to Florida State after spending three seasons at UCF, averaging 11.6 points in 82 games for the Knights. The 6-foot-4 guard shot

"It just felt like home," Green said of the decision to transfer to FSU. "They preach the same things my parents preach. The discipline part of this program and the attention to detail. The ability to come off ball screens and show I can do more than just shoot."

It's been a challenging start for Florida State (0-3), which lost its first three games for the first time since 2000-01. A loss to Florida (2-1) on Friday would be the worst start by a Seminoles team since 1959-60.

Injuries and a suspension have reduced FSU's lineup to seven scholarship players, led by Green, averaging 16.3 points and 35.5 minutes per game. It's not an ideal situation, admits coach Leonard Hamilton, who has been forced to lean on the transfer guard more than anticipated.

"It is almost virtually impossible to play 36 minutes a game and live with it," said Hamilton. "But we're doing what we have to do to compete at this level."

Hamilton believes the last time a Seminoles player averaged 36 minutes was Toney Douglas, the former guard who logged 36.5 minutes in 2008-09.

"That's almost abusive, and it might get me arrested," he joked. "My point is that's not healthy, but that's where we are right now."

The extra minutes haven't bothered Green, who is willing to do whatever it takes to help the Seminoles win.

"If I've got to play 36 minutes or if I've got to play three minutes, I'll do whatever coach asks, at least to the best of my ability," said Green. "I'm not focused on how long I've had to play. I don't get tired out there, so I didn't notice it was 36 minutes until after."

Green isn't the only one playing significantly more minutes because of the short bench, with the remaining four starters averaging 29 minutes. Hamilton hopes help will be on the way as center Naheem McLeod (ankle), forward Baba Miller (16-game suspension) and De'Ante Green (knee) and guards Chandler Jackson (broken thumb) and Jeremiah Bembry (undisclosed injury) return.

Meanwhile, Hamilton wants the team to be more efficient, especially on the offensive end. He would like to see the Seminoles pass the ball around more, creating open shots for Green

“We’ve got to make sure that we find ways to get him the looks that allow him to utilize his skills and talents,” said Hamilton.

That was on display against Troy on Monday when Green connected on 7 of 9 3-pointers (78%) on his way to a season-high 24 points.

As one of a handful of veterans on the roster, Green also has been a crucial voice in the locker room and court, especially with a lineup featuring seven freshmen.

“Coaches have been harping on me to become a leader on and off the court,” he said. “In study hall, in class, in apartments and also here in practice or the film room.”

That leadership role is something else he can trace back to his upbringing. His parents stressed the importance of academics, rewarding him for working hard in the classroom.

“I got to meet [Golden State Warriors guard] Stephen Curry off my success in the classroom,” Green recalled. “In sixth grade, my dad told me that if I got straight A’s, he would take me to a Golden State Warriors game. So I did and I got to meet, Steph. He told me how hard work pays off and some shooting things he does.”
