FLORIDA STATE'S FIRST ROAD GAME OF THE 2022-23 SEASON TAKES THEM TO ORLANDO TO FACE UCF

Florida State plays its first road game of the season as it travels to play UCF at Addition Financial Arena on the UCF campus in Orlando on Friday, November 11, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. The Seminoles' game at UCF marks the 13th game in the series between the two teams and just the second at UCF's arena. Florida State defeated the Knights, 80-68, on November 13, 2013 in the last meeting between the two teams in Orlando. Friday's game between the Seminoles and the Knights is just the fourth game in the series (which began in 1980) to be played outside of Tallahassee. The Seminoles played the Knights at UCF's CFE Arena in 2013, and faced to UCF twice in the Red Lobster Classic (December 29, 1987 and December 28, 1988) in games played at the Orange County (Orlando) Civic Center). The Seminoles won both of those games. Following Friday's game against UCF, the Seminoles play three consecutive home games (their longest home stand of the season) beginning with a match-up against Troy on Monday, November 14, at 7:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE VS. UCF – CONNECTIONS

Florida State will play UCF on November 11, 2022, in the Addition Financial Arena in Orlando, Fla. The Knights are coached by Johnny Dawkins, who will face Florida State and Leonard Hamilton for the second time as a head coach. Dawkins faced the Seminoles 17 times as an assistant coach (1998-99) and then as the associate head coach (1999-08) at Duke. Dawkins did not face the Seminoles as a player at Duke (1983-86) nor as the head coach at Stanford (2009-16). Kevin Norris, who is in his seventh season at UCF, played for Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and Seminole Associate Head Coach Stan Jones at Miami (1995-98). Norris led the Hurricanes to the 1998 NCAA Tournament. Florida State's game against UCF marks the third time Norris will coach against Hamilton and Jones – in 2020 as an assistant coach at UCF and 2009 as an assistant coach at Texas A&M Corpus Christi. Robbie Laing, who is in his sixth season as an assistant coach, will coach against the Seminoles for the eighth time at four different schools. The Seminoles are 6-1 against Laing all-time: 1-0 as the head coach at Campbell (December 22, 2005, 108-73), 1-0 against Florida Atlantic in the Orange Bowl Classic (December 19, 2015, 64-59) and 4-1 against Clemson (1992-93 and 1993-94) in ACC play. Mamadou N'Diaye, who is in his second season at UCF, was an assistant coach at Georgia Tech for two seasons (2014-15 and 2015-16). The Seminoles were 2-1 against the Yellow Jackets with N'Diaye on the staff. As a player at Auburn, N'Diaye was 2-0 against Florida State with wins during the 1998-99 (80-68 in Tallahassee) and 1999-00 seasons (55-54 at Auburn).

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018, and continued on January 18, 2022, with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 395 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 177 career ACC wins at Florida State.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST THE STATE OF FLORIDA

Florida State is 21-3 (.875 winning percentage) against teams from the state of Florida since the start of the 2016-17 season. The Seminoles were undefeated against teams from the state of Florida during the 2016-17 (4-0), 2018-19 (4-0), 2019-20 (5-0) and 2020-21 (4-0) seasons.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat UCF and gain a win over the Knights for the 12th time during the 13 games series that began in 1980;

...Defeat UCF and gain a win for the 12th time in the last 14 games in contests that have been played away from Tallahassee in the state of Florida. The Seminoles have lost only once on the road (true road game or neutral site) in the state of Florida since an 81-59 win over Saint Louis in the Orange Bowl Classic on December 22, 2018.

SEMINOLES PICKED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC RACE

Florida State, which returns its top two and three of its top six scorers from last season, has been selected to finish fifth in the Atlantic Coast Conference men's basketball standings for the upcoming 2022-23 season by the attending media at the ACC Tip Off in Charlotte. It marks the fourth consecutive season the Seminoles have been selected to finish in fifth place or better in the final standings of the nation's top basketball conference. In two of the last three seasons, the team selected to finish fifth in the preseason has won the ACC championship – the Seminoles in 2020 and Virginia Tech in 2022. Florida State won the 2020 ACC Championship with a school record 16 wins and a 16-4 conference record during the regular season. In four of the last six seasons, Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has led the Seminoles to a higher finish in the final standings than was predicted in the preseason. In 2017, the Seminoles were picked to finish eighth and finished second; in 2019 the Seminoles were picked to finish seventh and finished fourth; in 2020 the Seminoles were selected to finish fifth and won the regular season championship; in 2021 the Seminoles were picked third and finished second.

HAMILTON PRESENTED WITH PRESTIGIOUS JOE LAPCHICK AWARD IN NEW YOUR CITY

Florida State men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton received the Joe Lapchick Character Award presented by the Joe Lapchick Foundation during a ceremony at the New York Athletic Club on September 16, 2022. Hamilton was honored with the award which celebrates the life and career of Joe Lapchick, a Hall of Fame coach at St. John's University (1936-47) and the New York Knicks (1947-56), who was well known for his compassion and integrity off the court. The award is given to coaches who exhibit honorable character and who have impacted the game of basketball as did Lapchick. Hamilton is just the fifth head coach from the ACC to earn the award. He joins Georgia Tech's Bobby Cremins, Virginia's Pete Gillen, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, and North Carolina's Dean Smith as Lapchick Award winners from the nation's top college basketball conference.

CLEVELAND NAMED TO JULIUS ERVING AWARD WATCH LIST

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland has been named to the Julius Erving Watch List as the nation's top collegiate small forward by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. It marks the second consecutive season Cleveland has been named to the initial watch list for the prestigious Julius Erving Award. Cleveland is one of three players from the ACC named to the Julius Erving Watch List. He is joined on the list by Dariq Whitehead of Duke and Leaky Black of North Carolina. The award is named for Julius Erving, who attended the University of Massachusetts (1969-71). He averaged 26.3 points and 20.2 rebounds per game, making him one of only six NCAA men's basketball players to average more than 20 points and 20 rebounds per game during his career.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters the 2022-23 season having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles defeated Duke, 79-78, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE VS. UCF – THE LAST MEETING

No. 15 Florida State (4-1) lost their first game of the 2020-21 season, 86-74, as UCF (2-1) defeated the Seminoles at the Donald L. Tucker Center on Dec. 19, 2020. The Seminoles had not lost a game at home since January 2018. Senior M.J. Walker led the Seminoles with 22 points and three rebounds. Redshirt junior RaiQuan Gray scored his career-high of 14 points while fellow redshirt junior Anthony Polite also scored 14 points to tie his career-high. Polite led the Seminoles with six rebounds. UCF was led by Brandon Mahan who scored a game-high 32 points to go along with six rebounds. Isaiah Adams scored 22 and current Seminole Darin Green, Jr., totaled 20 for the visiting Knights. UCF outscored the Seminoles, 52-35, in the second half to gain the win. The Knights shot 57.1 percent from the field (16 of 28), 60.0 percent from the 3-point line (six of 10) and 93.3 percent from the line (14 of 15) as they led by 13 late in the second half.

He scored 949 career points and averaged 11.6 points per game during his 82-game (three-year) career at UCF. Green is one of the top 3-point shooting specialists in UCF and AAC history with 210 career 3-point field goals made. He has scored 630 of his 957 career points (.658 percent) from beyond the arc.

GREEN FROM THE BONUSPHERE ENTERING FLORIDA STATE'S GAME AGAINST UCF

Florida State junior guard Darin Green, Jr., has made at least one 3-point field goal in 15 consecutive games entering Friday night's game against UCF. He is shooting .363 from the 3-point line since making one of five shots from long range at East Carolina on January 18, 2022.

GREEN FROM THE 3-POINT LINE IN THE ADDITION FINANCIAL ARENA

Florida State junior guard Darin Green, Jr. will play his 39 career game at the Addition Financial Arena against UCF on Friday night. Including his career-high 27 point performance against Michigan on December 30, 2021, Green averages 13.3 points (499 points in 38 games) and is shooting .411 percent (109-265) from the 3-point line in the gym. He scored in double figures in the final nine games of the 2021-22 season (127 points in nine games / 14.1 ppg) and extended his scoring streak to 10 on opening night for the Seminoles. Cleveland is averaging 14.3 points scored per game in each Florida State game since scoring 11 points against Wake Forest on February 5, 2022.

CORHEN WITH DOUBLE FIGURE FRESHMAN DEBUT

Freshman forward Cameron Corhen scored 10 points in his Seminole debut against Stetson. He became the first freshman to score in double figures in his Florida State debut since M.J. Walker totaled 12 points in an 87-67 win over George Washington at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Cleveland Looking Forward To Upcoming Season

Florida State basketball is back in the Tucker Civic Center ready to begin the regular season. After last season took a turn, with several unexpected injuries riddling the starting lineup, some players decided to move on to the next level of their playing careers.

While this was the case for several, one athlete in particular felt that his job was not finished. This is none other than the reigning ACC Sixth Man of the Year, Matthew Cleveland.

“That’s been my background—no matter what to succeed. Whether that be school or anything I’m doing...I didn’t feel like that happened last year, and I didn’t want to leave on a bad note. Coming back to win is my biggest thing,” Cleveland said.

Raised by Georgia Tech alumni, ambition is second nature to the athlete.

“My dad was a first-generation college student, and my mom was her second-generation—and they were poor growing up. So they always had to get things for themselves, and do things for themselves,” Cleveland said.

Cleveland has observed and modeled the self-starting attitude exemplified by his parents in every aspect of his life, especially academics.

“From a very young age my parents have made that the biggest thing—basketball or not, you’re going to have an education. In sixth grade I remember, I took school seriously, but not too seriously. Then my dad left me on a limb to figure everything out for myself,” Cleveland said. “I had to contact my teachers on my own, and that’s when I realized school was a big part of our household.”

The values instilled at home are also a large part of his return to FSU. He wants to complete his degree. With accolades such as making FSU’s Academic Dean’s List, the All-ACC Academic Men’s Basketball team, and the ACC Academic Honor Roll, it’s safe to say Cleveland is well on his way to achieving that goal.

However, Cleveland hopes the legacy he will leave behind at Florida State one day is not attached solely to his athletics or academics, but rather to his character.

“I want to be known for my personality. Being the friendly, outgoing person that people can talk to. I’m the person that can make people laugh, and when people see me they know I’m going to put a smile on their face.”

This mentality is a testament to how Cleveland seemingly dealt with the pressure put on him as a freshman with ease. He attributed his success last season to the confidence the coaching staff bestowed upon him. Thankful for everything coaches and former teammates did for him, Cleveland hopes to establish those same themes in his relationships with the new players.

“We went to Canada for a team trip—we didn’t know anybody or how it was in Montreal. We were on our own...we were there for 12 days, so we had to somehow manage each other for 12 days, which made us a lot closer,” Cleveland said. “I would tell them, ‘you’re here for a reason, the coaches wanted you for a reason—because you’re really good at basketball. Don’t abandon what got you here, but also learn and grow, because these coaches have put so many people where we are trying to get to.’”

Cleveland said he's excited to take the court with new 'Noles Cameron Corhen and Darin Green, Jr. Through the team trip, and all the time spent before and after practice, he feels they have gotten very close and instinctively know where they want to be on the court.

Mentioning on several occasions that the draw to Florida State was how comfortable and "at home" head coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff made him feel, Cleveland shared that they still find ways to bring laughter to the sport every week.

"Beginning this week, we were waiting for our coach to come to the film room, and all we hear is this old song playing—and Coach Ham just comes in and starts dancing for five minutes...he took over, he was the star, so we just watched him dance," Cleveland said.

Joking aside, Cleveland says the team is ready and taking injury prevention seriously with new equipment and an elevated focus.

"We're going to put on a show for the fans, we've put in a lot of hard work that we feel needs to be rewarded—we're going to go out and play really hard, and fight 'till the end," Cleveland said.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Darin Green, Jr. scored a team-high 15 points to lead Florida State in a 74-66 exhibition game victory over Newberry College at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Green was four of eight from the 3-point line as the Seminoles' cashed in with 11 made shots from beyond the arc in their only exhibition game of the preseason. Florida State began the game with an 8-0 opening lead, as they held the Wolves scoreless for the first 1:37 of the game. The Seminoles biggest lead of the game came in the second half, as they secured a 16-point lead, ultimately winning by eight points. Freshman forward Baba Miller joined Green in the double figure scoring. Miller scored 11 points with 7 rebounds to help the Seminoles gain the win.
