- » Florida State is currently 4-1 after two wins over Lipscomb, a win over Purdue and a win over Longwood at the JoAnne Graf Classic.
- » Florida State is ranked No. 4 by USA Softball and No. 5 by the NFCA. The Noles have been ranked in 140 consecutive polls by USA Softball.
- » FSU returns all but two starters from last year's ACC Championship team that went 55-7, including six out of its top seven hitters.
- » Head Coach Lonni Alameda returns for her 15th season at Florida State and her 20th season overall.
- » Alameda received a long-term contract extension this past offseason.
- » The Noles were picked to win the ACC for the 10th-straight season.
- » Five Seminoles were named to the Preseason All-ACC Team. Devyn Flaherty, Mack Leonard, Kathryn Sandercock, Kaley Mudge and Kalei Harding were each named to the team.
- » Sandercock and Leonard were named to the Top 50 Watch List for USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year.
- » The Seminoles are 115-7 against the Rattlers and have won 26 straight games dating back to the 2006 season.
- » The Seminoles have not missed an NCAA Tournament since 1999. 19 out of the Seminoles' 22 players were not born the last time the Seminoles missed the NCAA Tournament.

WELCOME TO THE GAUNTLET

» The Seminoles have one of the toughest schedules in the country this season. The Seminoles will play 20 games against teams ranked in the top 25, 19 of those games being away from Tallahassee. 19 out of the Seminoles road or neutral site games are against teams in the preseason top 25.

THE DACK ATTACK

» Katie Dack made her presence known in her first five games with the Garnet and Gold.
» Dack hit two home runs in back-to-back games this past weekend against Longwood and Purdue.
» Brought in six runs for the Noles this past weekend.

ROYALTY AND MAJESTY

» Allison Royalty began her career with the Seminoles this past weekend and did not disappoint.
» Royalty made two appearances and pitched 7.1 innings while allowing just two hits and one earned run while striking out eight batters.
» Threw 3.1 innings in the win against Longwood on Sunday where she did not allow a hit and struck out five batters.
» Ended the weekend with a 0.95 ERA.

A WHOLE LOT OF EXPERIENCE

» The Seminoles will return seven out of its nine starters from last season and six out of its seven top hitters.
» The Noles return eight fourth or fifth year players from last year's ACC Championship team.

HEADING TO THE HALL OF FAME

» This past December, the NFCA announced that Head Coach Lonni Alameda will be inducted into the NFCA Hall of Fame in December of 2023. Alameda picked up her 800th win as a Division I head coach on April 17, 2022, against North Carolina.

PRESEASON ALL-ACC

» For the 10th-straight season, the Seminoles were picked to win the ACC.
» The Seminoles play preseason ranked No. 2, No. 3, No. 4 and No. 5 all on the road
» The Seminoles once again put the most players on the Preseason All-ACC Team with five total players (Devyn Flaherty, Mack Leonard, Kathryn Sandercock, Kaley Mudge and Kalei Harding).

PRESEASON TOP 100 PLAYERS

» Kathryn Sandercock (No. 7), Kalei Harding (No. 80) and Mack Leonard (No. 84) were all named to D1 Softball's Preseason Top 100 List
» Sandercock, Harding and Leonard were ranked No. 7, No. 57 and No. 60 on Extra Inning's Preseason Top 100 list.

TOP 50 PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR LIST

» Kathryn Sandercock and Mack Leonard were named to the USA Softball's Top 50 Player of the Year Watch List on Jan. 25.
» It marks the 10th season in a row Florida State placed a student-athlete on the preseason watch list as they join Sandercock and Sherrill in 2022, Sherrill in 2020 and 2021, Meghan King and Sherrill in 2019, King and Jessie Warren in 2018, Jessica Burroughs and Alex Powers in 2017, Burroughs in 2016, Lacey Waldrop and Maddie O'Brien in 2015 and Waldrop in 2014.
» Waldrop won the award in 2014 after leading the NCAA with 38 wins and finished third nationally with a 1.13 ERA. Florida State was the first school in the nation with multiple winners of the USA Softball Player of the Year award, as Jessica van der Linden was given the national award in 2004.

AREA 51 IS BACK

» Michaela Edenfield earned her nickname Area 51 last season after hitting 16 home runs last season for the Noles.
» Hit a home run on opening night against Lipscomb.
» Drove in four RBIs and hit a team-high .417 for the Noles on opening weekend.

SANDERCOCK'S DOMINANCE FOR THE SEMINOLES

» On a long list of great Seminole pitchers, Kathryn Sandercock is near the top as she enters her fifth season with the Garnet and Gold.
» Sandercock holds a 81-8 record and a 1.56 ERA in four seasons with the Seminoles.

SANDERCOCK RECORD WATCH

- » Kathryn Sandercock has the chance to put her stamp on the Florida State record during the 2023 season.
- » Sandercock needs just five saves to be the school record holder in saves.
- » She needs 29 wins to be the all-time FSU leader in wins.
- » She needs just 41 appearances from being FSU's all-time leader in appearances.

MAKING HOME A LITTLE MORE COMFORTABLE

- » The Florida State Softball Complex added several features to the facility before the 2023 season.
- » The Noles added a brand new video board that sits in right center field.
- » The Noles added turn in foul territory in the infield.
- » A new deck on what used to be the left field berm now gives fans the opportunity to bring chairs that can sit on a platform while having a drink rail in front of them.
- » In right field, there will now be premium seating where fans will be treated with exclusive food and drink above the batting cages. Fans will also have a terrific seat with the overhang right above the right field bullpen.

NOLES IN THE SPOTLIGHT

The Florida State softball team will appear on national television 16 times throughout the 2023 season ESPN announced on Wednesday morning. The Seminoles' 16 appearances are the most among preseason top five teams and are six more than the second-most team (Florida - 10).

The Seminoles will begin its TV campaign at the 2023 TaxAct Clearwater Invitational where four out of its five games in Clearwater will be on national TV including a battle with Alabama on Sunday, Feb. 19 that will be aired on ESPN.

The ACC Network will carry 10 of the Seminoles' ACC games this season including matchups with preseason top 25 opponents in Duke, Clemson and Virginia Tech.

ESPN2 will carry two of the Seminoles' games against Clemson on Apr. 7 and Virginia Tech on Apr. 20. The Seminoles' matchup with the Florida Gators on May 3 will be aired on ESPNU.

SMART - Being smart, in a wide variety of disciplines, is a cornerstone of the Florida State softball program. In school, it allows you to achieve a degree and plan for a future after softball. At practice, it means training with a purpose, honing your skills and gaining experience by not just going through the motions. In the game, it means having a plan at plate offensively or a pitching and defensive shift plan for opposing hitters based on various scouting reports. Off the field, it means making wise decisions with time management and other activities to be able to be at your best.

A

AGGRESSIVE - You aren't just given things in life, you must aggressively pursue your dreams in order to achieve them. Being aggressive means taking that extra base on a ball in the gap, stealing second when you need to get a runner into scoring position, heading to your teacher's office hours to talk about things you may not have understood in class, going after a hitter with your best pitch in the best location and challenging yourself to become the best you can be because you are passionate about helping the team succeed.

C

COMPETITIVE - A team-based sport is one of the most competitive dynamic there is in life. To be successful, you need to be competitive in many areas. We strive to be competitive on the field, winning individual games, along with conference and national championships. We are competitive with each other on the team, knowing that we make each other better as each one raises their level of skill and accomplishments. We are also competitive off the field, in the classroom and in the workforce as there are many who would seek to be where we are, but only few will attain it.

C

COMMITTED - The previous four core values mean nothing unless everyone is committed to it. Obstacles and challenges will come up. Losses on the field and issues off of it will occur and cause problems that will need to be addressed. But when we are committed - to each other, to the team, to the goals that have been set - very little can disrupt our goals and pursuits. A unified force with a united passion is very difficult to stop and our commitment to the vision and the process will enable us to be successful.



Core Values Shape Culture

- The Seminole Softball team has incorporated these values into all areas of team life, both on and off the field.
- Each fall since 2015, FSU has experienced "The Program", a two-day boot camp event where the team has worked on communication, problem solving, endurance, perseverance, paying attention to details and teamwork while accomplishing tasks on the field, at a pool, on the beach, in the woods, among others.
- Each year, the team has been able to build trust within the team by attaining goals and going through the physical and mental adversity that The Program imposes on them as a collective team and unit.
- The Seminole also start each game and practice at "The GATE", which at JoAnne Graf Field is a physical gate, but it helps to focus on being present for the team, allowing outside distractions to stay outside and to "Give your **A**ll to the **T**eam **E**veryday."

“PLAY FOR THOSE WHO CAN’T”

One of the foundational principles that Florida State softball is built on is, “Play for those who can’t.” The Seminoles have displayed that throughout the years, including recently with people like Taylor Foster, Madison Marshall, Hayden Stone and Monk Bonasorte.

Taylor Foster became part of the FSU family in 2013 through a connection with the ACC, and despite growing up in North Carolina, dreamed of playing softball for the Seminoles. Foster was diagnosed with bone cancer in at the age of 13 and her passion and enthusiasm in the face of such adversity never faltered. The Noles would routinely stop by to see Taylor and her family when playing NC area schools and the players and coaches would often keep touch via calls, texts and video chats. After her passing in April of 2014, an annual memorial tournament and camp was started and organized by FSU softball players, coaches and support staff for youth in North Carolina to share Taylor’s passion for the game and tell of her legacy.

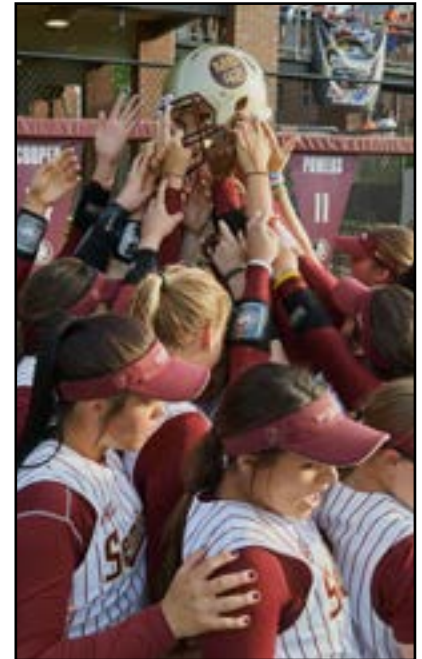
In 2016, and through a partnership with The Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, FSU softball adopted Madison Marshall who had been diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2014 at the age of 14. The Friends of Jaclyn Foundation was created in 2005 and pairs children with pediatric brain tumors with collegiate sports teams, as they have seen the symbiotic relationships that are formed help both the child going through such a difficult situation, but also the teams that are able to come along side a family and help them fight and learn a new appreciation and perspective on life.

In 2019, again in partnership with the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, the Seminoles adopted Hayden Stone, who had been diagnosed with a soft tissue cancer and lives in Tallahassee. Hayden and her family come to nearly every home game and during the 2019 season, the FSU players drew smiley faces on their necks in honor of Hayden as a way for her reduce the stigma of a scar on her neck.

Monk Bonasorte, one of the main FSU athletic administrators responsible for hiring Lonni Alameda as head coach in the fall of 2008, had played football at FSU in the late 70s, and was voted into the FSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1995. As a result, he bled Garnet and Gold and became a significant supporter of FSU softball, as well as all of the other sports on campus. In October of 2015, Bonasorte was diagnosed with brain cancer, yet never wavered in his passion for FSU and life. Right up to his passing in November of 2016, he continued to give his life to this university and be an example of the Florida State “Unconquered” spirit.

In 2017, the Lonni Alameda Softball Camps began the annual Monk Bonasorte Camp (Camp MB42), where the young players in attendance not only learn about the skills of softball, but also about life and who Monk was, what he meant to Florida State and how he battled through such adversity. All of the proceeds of the annual camp go to the FSU Monk Bonasorte Scholarship, and to date, the camp has raised over \$8,500.

There are numerous other relationships that have been formed over the years with young fans like Amber Howard and Maddie Briscoe, and even former players such as Dana Bailey that have battled cancer, the FSU players and staff know that there is much more to life than just this game. Though several are now gone, they are certainly not forgotten and remain a significant part of Seminole softball to this day.

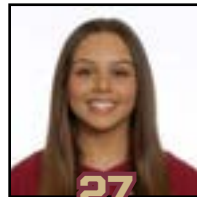
