FLORIDA STATE FACES GEORGIA TECH IN FIRST ROUND OF 2023 ACC TOURNAMENT

Florida State, which defeated Georgia Tech in the only regular season meeting between the two teams in 2023, faces the Yellow Jackets in the first round of the 2023 New York Life ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C., on Tuesday, March 7, 2023 at 2:00 p.m. Florida State is seeded No. 12 and Georgia Tech No. 13 in the 2023 ACC Tournament. The Seminoles' game against the Yellow Jackets marks the third time the two teams will face each other in the ACC Tournament, with the most recent meeting coming in the championship game of the 2021 tournament. Florida State defeated Georgia Tech, 75-64, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on January 7, 2023 in the first meeting between the two teams earlier this season. The winner of Tuesday's game between the Seminoles and the Yellow Jackets will face No. 5 seeded Pittsburgh on Wednesday at 2:30 p.m. in the second round of the 2023 ACC Tournament.

FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY AGAINST GEORGIA TECH

Including Florida State's victory over Georgia Tech on January 7, 2023, the Seminoles have won six of the last nine and 16 of the last 21 games against Georgia Tech. The Seminoles won a series-record 10 consecutive games in the series beginning with a 66-64 win on December 30, 2007 in Atlanta through a 57-53 win on February 14, 2015 also in Atlanta and won five straight against the Yellow Jackets from an 88-77 win on January 24, 2018 in Tallahassee through a 74-61 win in Tallahassee on December 15, 2020.

THE LAST TIME FLORIDA STATE MET GEORGIA TECH IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

Freshman Scottie Barnes scored his career-high 21 points and sophomore Balsa Koprivica recorded his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds, but their efforts weren't enough as No. 2 seeded Florida State Seminoles fell to No. 4 seeded Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament Championship game by an 80-75 margin at the Greensboro Coliseum on March 13, 2021. Both Florida State and Georgia Tech advanced to the NCAA Tournament following the game in the ACC Tournament – the Seminoles as an At-Large selection and the Yellow Jackets as the automatic qualifier from the ACC. The Seminoles shot 56 percent from the field (28 of 50) and 53 percent from the 3-point line (eight of 15). However, with 25 turnovers, Georgia Tech was able to score 31 points off of Florida State's mistakes. Senior M.J. Walker contributed 15 points and pulled down four rebounds. He was three of five from the 3-point line against Georgia Tech. He moved into ninth place in school history with 173 career 3-point field goals made and into 43rd in scoring in school history with a total of 1,056 career points scored. Florida State was down by just one point at the half (31-30) after a buzzer-beating lay-up from Georgia Tech's Michael Devoe. With 14 turnovers and only 11 made shots, the Seminoles went into the locker room in hopes of regaining focus to start the second half.

SEMINOLES' GREEN JR. FINISHES REGULAR SEASON WITH 88 3-POINT FIELD GOALS MADE

Florida State's Darin Green Jr. finished the 2023 regular season as the ACC co-leader in 3-point field goals made with 88. He finished the 31-game regular season tied with Blake Hinson of Pittsburgh, who also made 88 3-point field goals. The 88 3-point field goals made by Green Jr. is the third highest single-season total by a Florida State player in school history. Green Jr. is one of four players in the ACC who has made 85 or more 3-point field goals entering the ACC Tournament.

SEMINOLES' MILLS IN THE TOP 15 IN THREE DIFFERENT ACC STATISTICAL CATEGORIES

Florida State junior Caleb Mills enters the 2023 ACC Tournament ranked in the top 15 in three different ACC statistical categories -- free throw percentage (seventh, .836), steals (ninth, 1.4 spg), and assists (15th, 3.4 apg).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Georgia Tech and win its second game of the season against the Yellow Jackets. The Seminoles won the only meeting of the 2022-23 regular season by a 75-64 score at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee;
...Defeat Georgia Tech and defeat the Yellow Jackets in the ACC Tournament for the second time in three tournament meetings. The Seminoles defeated the Yellow Jackets by a 63-62 margin in Charlotte on March 9, 2000 in Charlotte and fell to the Yellow Jackets by an 80-75 margin in the ACC Tournament championship game on March 13, 2021 in Greensboro;
...Defeat Georgia Tech and win its third game against the Yellow Jackets in a conference tournament. The Seminoles were 1-1 against the Jackets while both played as members of the Metro Conference (1977 and 1978) and are 1-1 against the Yellow Jackets in two games in the ACC Tournament.

Florida State's victory over No. 13/11 Miami on February 2, 2023 marked Leonard Hamilton's NCAA record 56th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters its game against Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles defeated Duke, 79-78, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles won the most recent overtime game against Georgia Tech on December 20, 2009 with a 66-59 win over the Yellow Jackets in Atlanta.

SEMINOLES RALLY FROM ACC RECORD 25 POINTS TO DEFEAT MIAMI

Florida State trailed Miami at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables on February 25 by a 50-25 margin with 1:29 remaining in the first half – and rallied to win the game on a buzzer-beating 3-point shot by Matthew Cleveland. After falling behind by 25 points late in the first half on the road in ACC play, the Seminoles outscored the rival Hurricanes by a 60-34 margin over the final 21:29 of the game. The comeback of 25 points against Miami is the largest comeback in ACC history – giving Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff the two largest comeback victories in the incredibly storied history of the ACC. The Seminoles rallied from 24 points down against North Carolina on January 22, 2004, to defeat the Tar Heels by a 90-81 margin at the Donald L Tucker Center. The third-largest comeback in ACC history is a 23-point recovery by Duke against Louisville on February 13, 2019.

THE MINUTES PLAYED CHART UNDER HAMILTON

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is not at all accustomed to his players playing as many minutes as they have been asked to this season. With two Seminoles (Darin Green, Jr. and Matthew Cleveland) averaging more than 33.0 minutes played per game, it marks just the third time in Hamilton's 21 seasons at Florida State, that multiple Seminoles are averaging 30 minutes or more played per game for a full season. In addition to Green Jr and Cleveland averaging over 33 minutes played per game, Caleb Mills is averaging 29.6 minutes played per game and Jalen Warley 27.8 minutes played per game. Hamilton asked Seminole great Trent Forrest what he felt the optimum number of minutes a player could play each game, and play well in the Florida State system, at the end of his All-ACC career – Forrest replied in the 23-25 minute range.

FLORIDA STATE VS. GEORGIA TECH – THE LAST GAME

Matthew Cleveland earned his fifth consecutive double-double with 21 points and 12 rebounds to lead Florida State to its third ACC win of the season with a 75-64 win over Georgia Tech at the Donald L. Tucker Center on January 17, 2023. Cleveland led three Seminoles in double figure scoring with Darin Green Jr. (18 points) and Caleb Mills (13 points) with all three scoring 13 points or more. Florida State's victory against Georgia Tech marked Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's 600th career win, and 400th at Florida State. He is the active wins leader in the ACC, and only the fifth coach to win at least 400 games as an ACC head coach. Cleveland became the first Seminole player to earn five consecutive double-doubles since Douglas Edwards during the 1991-92 season. Lance Terry scored a team-high 17 points and Miles Kelly added 16, but Georgia Tech surrendered runs of 11-0 late in the first half and 10-0 early in the second half. Although the Yellow Jackets started off the first half with their largest lead of the game (16-7 at the 15:43 of the first half), Florida State gained momentum and closed the gap quickly. After trailing by nine (16-7) with just under five minutes played in the first half, the Seminoles led 39-36 at the intermission.

9 Freshman Chandler Jackson has made nine consecutive free throws and enters Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament shooting .760 from the free throw line.

17 Caleb Mills' 17 free throws made against Boston College on February 18, 2023 are the most made by a Seminole player since Jim Oler made 17 against Tampa on February 7, 1956 – a span of just over 67 years ago.

21 Caleb Mills' 21 free throws attempted against Boston College on February 17, 2023 are tied for the seventh most in school history, the most attempted by a Florida State player in ACC play, and the most by a Florida State player since Hall of Famer Hugh Durham also attempted 21 free throws (he made 16) against Loyola of New Orleans on February 20, 1957 – a span over 66 years.

21 Florida State forced Boston College into 21 turnovers on February 18 – the most turnovers the Seminoles have forced an opponent into this season.

23 Darin Green Jr. has made at least one 3-pointing field goal in 23 consecutive games – each Florida State games since November 30 against Purdue in the ACC / Big 10 Challenge.

33 Florida State made a season-high 33 field goals in scoring a season-high 85 points in its victory over Miami on February 25 in Coral Gables.

Florida State has three players – junior Caleb Mills (43 steals / 1.4 spg), sophomore Jalen Warley (40 steals / 1.2 spg) and Darin Green (30 steals / 0.9 spg) – with 30 or more steals for the fourth consecutive season. The Seminoles enter the 2023 ACC Tournament with 194 steals and are ranked sixth in the ACC in steals with a 6.4 steals per game average. Florida State totaled 264 steals and an 8.5 steals per game average during the 2021-22 season.

FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO WITH 100+ ASSISTS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Georgia Tech with two players having earned 100 or more assists. Junior Caleb Mills has been credited with 106 assists (3.4 apg) and sophomore Jalen Warley has been credited with 102 assists (3.3 apg). It marks the second time in the last six years that Florida State has two players with 100 or more assists in the same year. The last time was during the 2017-18 season, when Trent Forrest (138 / 4.1 apg) and Braian Angola Rodas (105 / 3.0 apg) both surpassed the 100 mark for assists.

CALEB MILLS IN THE LAST FOUR GAMES

Junior Caleb Mills is averaging 18.3 points (73 total points) while shooting .500 percent from the field (24 of 48) and .793 from the free throw line (23 of 29) in the last four games. 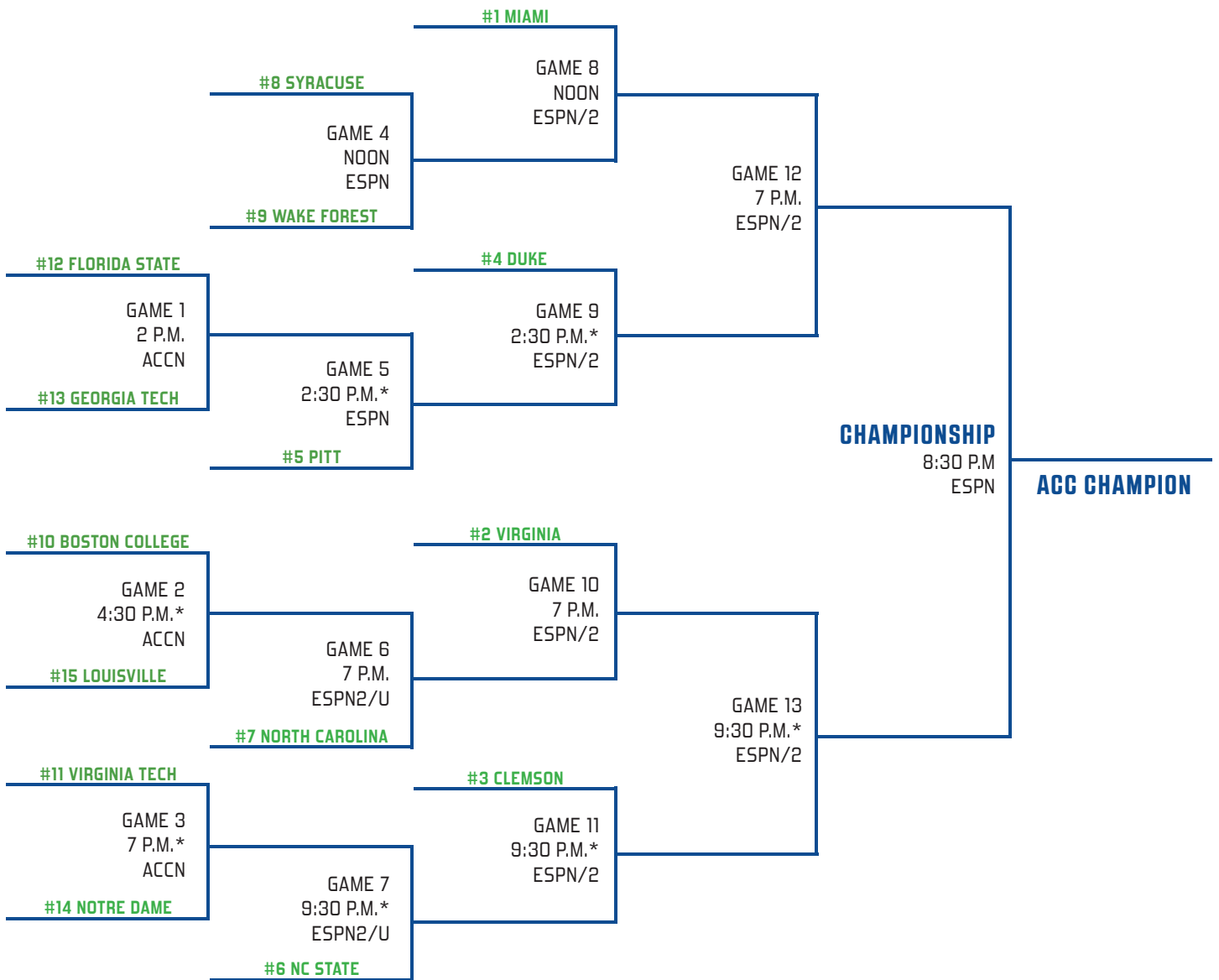

Matthew Cleveland pulled down eight rebounds and Naheem McLeod added a career-high six blocks as the Seminoles secured their first ACC win of the season. It was a career-high night for multiple Seminoles. McLeod blocked a career-high six shots, tied for sixth most in school history and ACC play. Cam Corhen scored a career-high 15 points on four made field goals and six made free throws.

Florida State's lead never wavered against Louisville. The Seminoles opened the game with a 5-0 lead, progressively widening the gap with a 13-3 scoring run that led Florida State to their largest lead of the first half (34-18). Corhen had a perfect night from the free-throw line, shooting six for six. Over the last three games, Florida State is shooting 85 percent (33 of 39) from the free throw line.

Game 29 -- Florida State 85, Miami 84

CORAL GABLES, Fla. -- Florida State's Matthew Cleveland made a well-contested 3-point shot at the buzzer to give Florida State an 85-84 win over Miami after being down by 25 points in the first half. Cleveland's heroics came directly after a Jordan Miller 3-point shot off of an inbound play that gave the Hurricanes an 84-82 lead. Cleveland than inbounded the ball to guard Jalen Warley and got the ball back as he crossed halfcourt before launching his second career buzzer-beating 3-point game-winning shot. The sophomore also beat Virginia on a nearly-identical shot in Charlottesville during his freshman season. The Seminoles' 25-point comeback is the largest in the history of the storied Atlantic Coast Conference. The Seminoles trailed by 25 -- 50-25 -- after Jordan Miller made a free throw to extend the Hurricanes' lead. From that point on, the Seminoles outscored Miami on its home court by a 60-34 margin (6-4 to close the first half and 54-30 in the second half to gain the improbable victory. The Seminoles committed one second half turnover, shot .667 percent from the field (21 of 31) and .833 from the free throw line (10 of 12) to earn their fifth consecutive win on Miami's home court.

Game 30 -- North Carolina 77, Florida State 66

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- North Carolina's RJ Davis scored a game-high 19 points on seven made field goals and two free throws to lead the Tar Heels to a 77-66 victory over the Seminoles at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Davis led four Tar Heels in double figure scoring, Leaky Black (18 points), Caleb Love (16 points), and Pete Nance (15 points) to earn their 11th ACC victory of the season. Junior Caleb Mills led Florida State with 19 points and six rebounds. Sophomore Matthew Cleveland came within one rebound of his 12th double-double of the season as he totaled 12 points and nine rebounds. The Tar Heels took an early 7-2 lead in the opening minutes of the first half. The Seminoles quickly scored back-to-back points to narrow the scoring gap to 7-6. Although North Carolina was off to a hot start with four of five field goals made in the first six minutes, the next four minutes of the half consisted of three turnovers, along with a prolonged scoring drought for the Tar Heels. Florida State took this opportunity to tie the score 12-12 with a made 3-pointer from Chandler Jackson. North Carolina made three field goals within a minute and a half to score nine points versus the Seminoles' zero. This gave the Tar Heels a 10-point lead with less than five minutes remaining in the first half. Scoring six points in 37 seconds, North Carolina's 11-0 scoring run gave them their biggest lead of the game, 43-25, to lead going into intermission. The Seminoles refused to let the first half define them, scoring 41 points in the second half versus the Tar Heels' 34 points. The matchup came down to the final minutes of the game, as Florida State scored 14 points over a three-minute period to narrow North Carolina's lead to only four points.
