FLORIDA STATE CLOSING OUT REGULAR SEASON AT VIRGINIA TECH SATURDAY AT 4:00 P.M.

Florida State, which has won six of its last seven games against Virginia Tech, travels to Blacksburg to play the Hokies on Saturday, March 4, 2023, at Cassell Coliseum at 4 p.m. The contest is the only game of the regular season between the two teams and is the final game of the season for both clubs. While the Seminoles and the Hokies have played seven times since their 2016-17 regular season, this game is only the second between the two teams at Cassell Coliseum. In winning six of the last seven games in the series, Florida State has won both of the last two games at Cassell (January 20, 2018, 91-82; February 1, 2020, 74-63) and are 4-1 against Virginia Tech on its home court since a 70-50 victory on February 5, 2014. Following Saturday's game against the Hokies, the Seminoles travel to play at the 2023 New York Life ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C. Florida State plays in the first round on Tuesday at a time, and with an opponent to be decided based upon Saturday's slate of conference games. Saturday is the final day of the regular season for each of the 15 ACC teams.

FLORIDA STATE ON THE ROAD IN ACC PLAY DURING THE 2022-23 SEASON

Florida State enters its game on Saturday at Virginia Tech looking to win its fifth ACC road game of the season. A victory over Virginia Tech would mark the second time in the last five seasons, and the fifth time in Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's tenure, that the Seminoles would have won five or more ACC road games in a single season.

MILLS IS FLORIDA STATE'S LEADER IN CAREER FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE LEADER

Caleb Mills enters Saturday's game at Virginia Tech as the all-time leader for career free throw shooting percentage with a .842 mark in his two seasons as a Seminole. He has made 171 of 203 free throw attempts in his two-year and 56-game career as a Seminole.

GREEN JR. RANKS THIRD IN SCHOOL HISTORY WITH 86 3-POINT FIELD GOALS MADE

Darin Green Jr. enters Saturday's game at Virginia Tech ranked third in school history for a single season with 86 3-point shots made in his first season as a Seminole. He is just the fourth player in school history to make 85 or more 3-point shots in a single season and needs just four made long range shots to become the third Seminole to make 90 or 3-point shots in a single season.

...Defeat Virginia Tech and win its third consecutive game at Cassell Coliseum. The Seminoles have won on the road in Blacksburg in both of their last two games – February 20, 2018 (91-82) and March 1, 2020 (74-63) – in their last two visits to Blacksburg.

FLORIDA STATE WITH WINS OVER TWO NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

Florida State has earned wins over a pair of nationally ranked teams – current No. 15/16 Miami (February 25, 85-84) and current No. 25/25 Pittsburgh (January 21, 71-64) – and is the only team to defeat both Miami and Pittsburgh on its home courts. It marks the 10th consecutive, and 20th season in head coach Leonard Hamilton's 21 years as Florida State's head coach, that the Seminoles have defeated at least one nationally ranked team.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Virginia Tech having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles defeated Duke, 79-78, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have two recent overtime wins against Virginia Tech with wins in back to back games (March 5, 2019 in Tallahassee and March 14, 2019 in Charlotte in the ACC Tournament) during the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles' overtime wins over Virginia Tech during the 2018-19 season marks the only opponent the Seminoles have defeated in overtime multiple times in the same season in school history.

SEMINOLES RALLY FROM ACC RECORD 25 POINTS TO DEFEAT MIAMI

Florida State trailed Miami at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables on February 25 by a 50-25 margin with 1:29 remaining in the first half – and rallied to win the game on a buzzer-beating 3-point shot by All-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland. After falling behind by 25 points late in the first half on the road in ACC play, the Seminoles outscored the rival Hurricanes by a 60-34 margin over the final 21:29 of the game. The comeback of 25 points against Miami is the largest comeback in ACC history – giving Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff the two largest comeback victories in the incredibly storied history of the ACC. The Seminoles rallied from 24 points down against North Carolina on January 22, 2004, to defeat the Tar Heels by a 90-81 margin at the Donald L Tucker Center. The third-largest comeback in ACC history is a 23-point recovery by Duke against Louisville on February 13, 2019.

FLORIDA STATE'S COMEBACK THE LARGEST IN A WIN IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL IN 2022-23

Florida State's 25-point comeback against Miami to defeat the Hurricanes on its home court by an 85-84 is the largest comeback in a win in college basketball during the 2022-23 season. The previous largest comeback nationally this season was a 24-point rally by Middle Tennessee State to defeat FIU, 69-58 on February 18, 2023.

SEMINOLES SCORE SEASON-HIGH 85 POINTS IN VICTORY OVER MIAMI

Led by 20 points each by Darin Green Jr. and Matthew Cleveland, the Seminoles defeated No. 13/11 Miami by an 85-84 score. The 85 points scored was a season high for the Seminoles who enter Saturday's game at Virginia Tech scoring an average of 70.0 points per game. It marked the second time this season that both Green Jr. and Cleveland scored at least 20 points in a game – the pair combined for 53 points in Florida State's game against St. John's in the Orange Bowl Classic. In that game against the Red Storm, Green Jr. scored his career-high of 23 points, while Cleveland scored his career-high of 23 points.

FLORIDA STATE STEALING

Florida State has earned 28 steals in its last three games, and is averaging 9.3 steals per game since totaling its season-high of 15 steals against Boston College on February 18. The Seminoles have earned double figures in steals in two of their last three, and in six games this season. The Seminoles are ranked sixth in the ACC with a 6.3 steals per game average.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State made a season-high 30 free throws, and shot .882 percent from the free throw line in its game against Boston College on February 18. That outstanding shooting afternoon against the Eagles has allowed the Seminoles to shoot nearly .800 percent (55 of 69, .797 percent) in their last three games. Florida State is averaging 13.3 made free throws per game with 400 free throws made per game in the 30 games. The Seminoles' 400 made free throws marks the first time since the 2019-20 season (418 made free throws) that they have made 400 or more free throws in a single season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA TECH – THE LAST GAME

Naheem McLeod scored a career-high 15 points, shooting a perfect seven of seven from the field, but Florida State fell to the incredibly hot shooting Hokies of Virginia Tech, 85-72, on January 29, 2022 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Playing without three starters for the majority of the game, the Seminoles could not match Virginia Tech's 18 3-point field goals made and .720 shooting percentage from the three-point line. Anthony Polite led the Seminoles in scoring with 17 points and six rebounds. He was five of eight from the field (.625 percent) and two of four from beyond the arc (.500 percent). Polite's second 3-points shot of the game in the second half gave him 100 for his career and allowed him to become the 24th player in school history with at least 100 three-point field goals. The Seminoles started slowly, but went into the locker room at halftime only down 39-31. A McLeod dunk at the 11:55 mark of the second half put Florida State ahead, 54-53. That lead proved to be their final lead of the game. With the score at 62-60 with 7:25 remaining, Virginia Tech went on a 14-0 run that was finished off by Hunter Cattoor's 3-point shot, to increase its lead to 76-60 with 4:39 remaining.

1.6 Sophomore Jalen Warley has eight steals in his last five games with four coming against Boston College and three coming against Miami for a 1.6 spg average since February 11. Each of his three steals against Miami came in the second half as the Seminoles' outscored the Hurricanes 14-0 on fast break points in winning the game at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables.

2 Junior Caleb Mills leads the Seminoles in both assists (106 / 3.5 apg) and steals (42 / 1.4 spg). He is looking to become the fifth consecutive Seminole to lead the team in assists and steals. RayQuan Evans led the team in both categories in 2021-22; Scottie Barnes led in both during the 2020-21 season and Trent Forrest led the Seminoles in both categories in three consecutive seasons (2018, 2019, 2020).

2.5 Darin Green Jr. has 10 steals in the last four games (five against Boston College and four at Miami) and is averaging 2.5 spg since earning one steal at Clemson on February 15.

9 Freshman Chandler Jackson has made nine consecutive free throws and enters Saturday's game at Virginia Tech shooting .760 from the free throw line.

22 Darin Green Jr. has made at least one 3-pointing field goal in 22 consecutive games – each Florida State games since November 30 against Purdue in the ACC / Big 10 Challenge.

33 Florida State made a season-high 33 field goals in scoring a season-high 85 points in its victory over Miami on February 28 in Coral Gables.

JACKSON CONTINUES TO IMPROVE HIS 3-POINT STROKE

How Steph Curry, An Unorthodox Shooting Method Prepared FSU Men's Basketball Star Darin Green Jr.

Darin Green Jr. remembers loving basketball since he was young.

His father played college basketball at George Washington University, while his mom was a high school star. So the basketball gene runs rampant through him.

But how early Green showed his love for basketball surprised even his father, Darin Green Sr.

Green Sr. finished playing in a YMCA basketball game when his son was just 3 years old. He was about to experience his son's ability and love for the game.

"After one of my games, my wife put Darin down on the ground and he ran over to the bench," Green Sr. told the Democrat.

"And at three years old, you are still kind of clumsy. I rolled the basketball out to try to slow him down because he was running so fast. And unbeknownst to me, he actually picked the basketball up and started dribbling with his left hand and ran over to me.

"And I was like, 'Whoa, I didn't even know he could do it.' And from that day, on, all the way to the point where we got in the car until we got home, he literally slept with that basketball. The ball was probably bigger than he was. It was certainly bigger than his head."

Green Jr., who is coming off a 24-point performance in an upset road victory over Pittsburgh on Saturday, will look to push the Seminoles' (7-13, 5-4 ACC) win streak to a season-high three games when they square off against rival Miami (15-4, 6-3) at 7 p.m. Tuesday at Donald L. Tucker Civic Center.

The younger Green is in his first year with the Seminoles after transferring from UCF. He is averaging 14.6 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists. He is shooting 42% from 3-point range and 90% from the free throw line, all while averaging 34.1 minutes per game.

Part of the reason Green Jr. chose FSU as his destination is the hope to take his game to the next level and reach the NBA.

"(Head) coach (Leonard) Hamilton and (associate head) coach (Stan) Jones trust me, and they don't hold me back," Green Jr. told the Democrat. "I'm not saying UCF held me back, but I'm in a situation where this offensive system allows more.

"And then of course on the defensive end, we play 94 feet and pressure, everything. So, that allows me to show

3-point shooting first

Green Sr. played at George Washington from 1994-98. He averaged 3.1 points per game in 89 career games. The elder Green saw his playing career impacted by leg injuries. He was an athletic player who made his name with dunks and later developed a jump shot.

So for Green Sr., he wanted his son to develop his jump shot before anything else.

"That's why he taught me how to shoot first so early," Green Jr. said. "Because the athleticism will come as I grow. And then that your athleticism can be taken away from you, but my shot I have that for much longer."

The first lesson for shooting form came early and with an out-of-the-box idea.

A few days following Jr.'s birthday, a few helium balloons that went to the ceiling started losing air and fell to the ground. Green Sr. found an innovative game for him and his son to play.

"What I did was, I actually took one of those balloons and I used it as a basketball. I would shoot it to him right and do the motion so that he could see the arc and the follow through and wait for the balloon to come down, and he had to catch it. And he had to shoot it to me the same way," Green Sr. said.

"So that's how he worked on his form, which is pretty interesting. What is so funny is I never knew that that was

Kicked out by father/coach

It wasn't always fun and games between father and son. Green Jr. will never argue with referees during a game, but that's due to a consequence of a mistake he made when he was 9 during an AAU game.

"My dad threw me out of the gym, in the middle of a game." Green Jr. said. "He literally kicked me out of the gym. I was talking back to a referee. He didn't like it. I remember I tried to say something back to one of the assistant coaches. He kicked me out and told me to go sit in the stands with my mom.

"He gave it to me young, so that way I know not to do it now. That's why I don't say much too much to the refs now."

Green Sr. said a couple of his players were complaining about calls from the refs during the first half, so he told them anyone who spoke back would be thrown out.

"And lo and behold, it's my son that comes out in the second half who had never done anything like this before," Green Sr. said. "I had to make the decision, right, like, I can't go back on that. So I said, 'No, not only do you go in the stands, you go up in the stands with mommy and then you go sit outside the car.'

"Needless to say my wife was pretty mad at me, but the good thing is he's never talked back to a referee ever. Ever since we can laugh at it now but he certainly wasn't laughing."

The call in question was a blocking foul call on Green Jr. He however felt he was in a good position to pick up a

Meeting Steph Curry

Following a move from North Carolina to Florida, Green Jr. fell behind in his grades in the sixth grade. Green Sr. came up with a motivational idea to get his son to perform better in the classroom.

Green Sr. worked with former NBA players Dell Curry and Muggsy Bogues at their summer basketball camps in Charlotte. He also coached a youth team, one which featured current NBA star, Stephen Curry.

That gave the father an incentive idea.

"I told him, 'Hey man if you do well, you start getting straight A's, I'll take you out to a game and we'll get you to go and actually meet Steph Curry since that's your favorite player,'" Green Sr. said. "And so he basically cashed in on it. So he went from making lower C's and B's to all A's."

The game turned out to be a Warriors game against the Miami Heat, featuring LeBron James and Dwyane Wade. Following the game, Green Jr. got a chance to talk to his favorite player.

"Every shooter could say that they learned from (Curry's) mechanics and shot, how quick he releases his footwork, getting into his shot from different areas on the court," Green Jr. said. "He's known as the greatest

Tony's Ice Cream

Green Jr. took only one visit after he entered the transfer portal: Florida State.

"I tell this joke all the time, coach Ham, he didn't ask me to take a visit. He said, 'You are going to take a visit this weekend,'" Green Jr. said. "So I had no choice. So, I just came on my visit, and I liked what I saw."

On his visit, Hamilton and Green Jr. bonded over the fact both his mom and Hamilton came from the same city: Gastonia, N.C.

Tony's Ice Cream, a local favorite in Gastonia, was one of the common places both Hamilton and Green Jr. had frequented.

"My grandparents still live in Gastonia," Green Jr. said. "So, he and my grandfather actually met each other and they know some of the same people. It's just crazy."

Green Jr.'s maternal grandfather, Fred Smith, ran into Hamilton early in the season and the two had a chance to catch up.

"From the area we grew up in, it was kind of a tough area," Hamilton said. "Those experiences kind of make who you are. I enjoyed talking with his grandfather because we related so much to the same circumstances. I think a lot of that toughness and a lot of that grit that you had to exhibit to get through that era and that location it causes you to have a different mindset.

"That's the kind of mindset he has. He's a tough guy. He accepts challenges, he makes sacrifices. He's always

NBA aspirations

Following the 2020 season, Green Jr. entered his name in the NBA draft to hear feedback about his chances to take the leap. He was coming off a season averaging 10.1 points per game on 41% 3-point shooting as a freshman with the Knights.

It was an opportunity to earn feedback from the league to see what his next steps needed to be.

"They wanted to see more passing and want to see my defensive ability and more creating for myself. They know I can shoot the ball well," Green Jr. said.

Outside of the comfortability factor, Green Jr. said getting to the NBA played a factor in his decision to come to Tallahassee.

Both father and son said two players Green Jr. has molded his game after are current NBA stars: the Washington Wizards' Bradley Beal and New Orleans Pelicans' CJ McCollum.

Green Jr. said he's putting his faith in the coaching staff, which has helped many players get to the league.

"(Coach Hamilton) is always saying we're trying to get somewhere we've never been," Green Jr. said. "But he's been there, we have just put it in his hands, and I feel like he can get me where I need to be."

Game 16 -- Florida State 75, Georgia Tech 64

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Matthew Cleveland earned his fifth consecutive double double of the season with 21 points and 12 rebounds to lead Florida State to its third ACC win of the season with a 75-64 win over Georgia Tech at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Cleveland led three Seminoles in double figure scoring with Darin Green Jr. (18 points) and Caleb Mills (13 points) with all three scoring 13 points or more. Florida State's victory against Georgia Tech marked Head Coach Leonard Hamilton's 600th career win, and 400th at Florida State. He is the active wins leader in the ACC, and only the fifth coach to win at least 400 games as an ACC head coach. Cleveland is the first player in school history to earn five consecutive double doubles since Douglas Edwards during the 1991-92 season. Game 19 -- Florida State 84, Notre Dame 71

NOTRE DAME, Ind. – Darin Green Jr. scored a game-high 20 points on six made field goals, four 3-pointers, and four free throws to lead Florida State to an 84-71 victory over Notre Dame at the Joyce Center. Green Jr. led five Seminoles in double figure scoring, Green, Jalen Warley (17 points), Matthew Cleveland (14 points), Caleb Mills (11 points), and Cameron Corhen (10 points) to improve Florida State's ACC record to 4-4. Matthew Cleveland secured his eighth consecutive double against Notre Dame with 14 points and a career-high 16 rebounds. The last Seminole to reach the milestone was Reggie Royals who finished the 1970-71 season with nine consecutive double doubles. Cleveland will have the chance to join Royals in Saturday afternoon's game against Pittsburgh. Cleveland's 16 rebounds are tied for the second most in an ACC game by a Seminole – tied with Al Thornton against Virginia on February 7, 2007. The school record for rebounds by a Seminole in an ACC game is 17 by Michael Joiner against Wake Forest on January 9, 2001. Cleveland's 16 defensive rebounds established a school record by a Florida State player in an ACC game. Warley scored his career-high of 17 points on four made field goals and eight free throws. He surpassed his former career-high of 15 points against Duke in February of 2022 and made the most free throws of his career, shooting eight for 10 (.800) from the free throw line

Corhen led five Seminoles in double figure scoring – Corhen, Matthew Cleveland (15 points), Jalen Warley (14 points), Darin Green Jr. (12 points), and Caleb Mills (11 points) to help Florida State earn its sixth conference win of the season. Corhen led the Seminoles for the second game in a row in scoring. His 16 points at Louisville put him in double figures for the eighth time in his first collegiate season. He is averaging 12.3 points and 4.3 rebounds in his last four games. Corhen remains Florida State's leader in offensive rebounds with 39 total, this being his 12th game with multiple offensive rebounds. He totaled a game-high five offensive rebounds. Cleveland secured his tenth double-double of the season with 15 points and 10 rebounds. He extended his career-best in double figure scoring with Louisville's game being his 17th consecutive game in double digits. He currently holds the second-longest streak in the ACC. In only 24 games this season, Cleveland has already surpassed his freshman year total points scored (333), with 340 points scored in his current sophomore season.

Cleveland's heroics came directly after a Jordan Miller 3-point shot off of an inbound play that gave the Hurricanes an 84-82 lead. Cleveland than inbounded the ball to guard Jalen Warley and got the ball back as he crossed halfcourt before launching his second career buzzer-beating 3-point game-winning shot. The sophomore also beat Virginia on a nearly-identical shot in Charlottesville during his freshman season. The Seminoles' 25-point comeback is the largest in the history of the storied Atlantic Coast Conference.
